### SOCCER BRUINS WIN STRING ENDS

Pacific University brought its soccer team to Newberg Thursday and walked away with the honor of being the first team to out do the George Fox College soccer club this year.

Coming off Saturday and Tuesday wins over Hillsboro and Concordia, the Bruins were topped by a 3-1 final score.

Sophomore Amadu Koroma scored the one Bruin talley.

The Bruins now sport a sharp 6-1-1 record on the season with one scheduled contest remaining--a trip to rival independent Warner Pacific College in Portland on Tuesday (Oct.16). The two teams knotted 14 in an earlier contest this season.
