PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

Beginnings are always important! Throughout the nation we have been recalling the birth of our country, the Bicentennial of the American Revolution. It was an important beginning. So was the beginning of higher education in America: it all started with Christian colleges. Just as beginnings are important, so is the continuance, the "going on," the continued growth of an ideal and purpose. During this national year of celebration and remembering, perhaps we ought to carefully consider again the role of the Christian and the task of higher education. At many colleges today (including some of those very first ones) Christ has become a stranger. But today, as in 1891 when George Fox College was founded, Christ is the very center and the purpose of its existence. The following is a look into the past year and a witness to God's leadership and faithfulness to us.

Academic:

George Fox College opened its 85th year with an enrollment increase that led all Oregon colleges. Enrollment fall term reached 557, an all-time high, and a 16 percent increase over enrollment the year before. Registration increases were even higher winter term (18 percent) and spring term (21 percent) for an average increase of 18 percent over the year. For incoming new students (274) the increase was an amazing 30 percent. Despite the increases there was not a lowering of academic standards. On the contrary, the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores in both the verbal and math averages for incoming students were higher than the previous years and above the Oregon and national average. Statistically, students came from 20 states and four nations. And the college continues to have more Friends (Quaker) students on campus than at any other U.S. college. Forty percent were Friends students, but there were also 39 other denominations represented on campus.

The academic year started with a special miniterm in Washington, D.C. A plane load of 127 left the Newberg campus for the nation's capital for a week-long program, "The Continuing American Revolution." Faculty members and students listened to senators, congressmen, legislative and department heads, a White House television correspondent, an editor, and professors, in addition to visiting the capital's many important institutions and landmarks.

One of the most significant academic achievements was the complete reapproval for the college's teacher education programs by the Oregon Teacher Standards and Practices Commission following a four-day campus visitation. All programs reviewed by the accreditation team were approved: health, language arts, speech, drama, pre-algebra and general mathematics, algebra and geometry, advanced mathematics, music,

physical education, biology, integrated science and social studies. "The small size of George Fox College is conducive to good student-faculty-administration communication," the commission said, also calling attention to an "exceptionally high morale that was evident on campus."

During the year the college hosted several important conferences, including two through the Exposures to Creative Learning program. All programs were open to the public, in fact, most were specifically designed to serve the off-campus public as well as students. A creative writing conference utilized nationally-recognized authors and poets as well as faculty members and alumni describing and reading their work. A two-day career conference for women featured six women in a variety of professions, including medicine, law, education, business, ministry, and politics. The seminar series was the first under the college's new Women's Studies program. Started winter term, the program featured a course "Christian Women Today" spring term, and will provide continuing leadership in counseling women in academic matters, careers and other concerns. Adult children of retirement-age parents were the target of a five-session series of classes on retirement relationships and problems hosted by the college's social science division in cooperation with a local senior citizens council.

The college's in-service mathematics course program for teachers throughout the Northwest continued to expand with a total of 150 participating during the year in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Alaska. And the college participated for its third year in the National Christian College Consortium which brings together some of the nation's leading evangelical Christian liberal arts colleges with the emphasis upon the integration of faith and learning and upon cooperative endeavors.

Academically, students continue to be taught by dedicated, concerned faculty members, nearly 65 percent with earned doctorates. The caliber of the GFC faculty was shown dramatically when Dr. David Myton, the college's director of teacher education, was picked to become the Coordinator of Teacher Education for the State of Oregon, leaving the college to take the position with the state's Teachers Standards and Practices Commission. Several professors wrote books and articles, many attend regional and national academic conferences, and several have assumed positions of regional and national leadership.

The academic year closed at the end of May with the graduation of 78 seniors in ceremonies featuring nationally-known author-lecturer Elisabeth Elliot Leitch.

Student Life:

George Fox students are active, literally, around the world. The campus, of course, is the center of that

action, but students have taken their concern and talents to thousands during the year. Musically, students took their sounds throughout the Northwest and California, and even to Europe with the 33-piece concert band spending 24 days sightseeing and performing in eight nations in the first part of June. The 48-voice a cappella choir toured the West Coast on an 11-day tour during spring break. It also was featured twice on the statewide educational television network. In keeping with the Bicentennial emphasis and beginnings, Music Theater students produced "The Way It Was," a full dramatic musical winter term written by college music division faculty and students. There were several other major musical and dramatic productions.

Athletically, the GFC basketball Bruins again dominated Northwest small college basketball, the men producing a 19-8 record, the best in the district, and the basketball women a 6-2 record, the best in their league. In track, three Bruins represented the men in the NAIA national championships.

Spiritually, students openly showed their love with actions and travels to honor God and His working. Bolstered by on-campus special weeks, students could be found sponsoring a Christmas party for mentally retarded youth, painting in an armory to help a day care center with many disadvantaged youth, fasting for a day to save money for relief work in earthquake stricken Guatemala, and venturing to Arizona to help with a missionary Indian school. Community concern was shown by setting a new campus record for blood donations, receiving an award from American Red Cross officials for having the best record of any college in the Northwest.

Spiritual Experience Week fall term featured Bufe Karraker. The winter term Missions Conference featured eight missions organizations and was highlighted by former kidnapped missionary nurse, Debbie Dortzbach and her husband, Karl. Spring term the Deeper Life Conference featured Dr. Timothy L. Smith. As a result of the missions conference and "faith promise" giving, students pledged and raised \$2,000 to send five students this summer as short-term missionaries to such places as Taiwan, Belgium, and New Guinea. During the year, students operated for the first time under a new campus community government system that abolished the traditional senate and executive council in favor of several committees that include faculty and administrators. The chapel program underwent a major change spring term with the addition of a third program each week for "chapel with a choice." Students still must attend two each week as previously when just two programs were scheduled. Expanded funding and extra effort in scheduling is leading to renewed interest.

Development/Finance:

We can only marvel at the way the Lord is providing for our needs in miraculous ways. George Fox College has made no little plans as we work on a campus master plan we believe is part of the Master's Plan as we maintain a Christ-centered campus. It has been a year of amazement as God has honored. During the fiscal year the college again has operated soundly in the black. Assets of the college climbed more than \$2 million to top the \$10.5 million level, with a fund balance of nearly \$7.5 million.

A capital fund drive—the first in more than 60 years—has been a nearly completed with more than \$3.2 million raised for construction of two major new buildings. They are no longer dreams but are in the process of becoming reality. Ground breaking was held May 22 for the new \$2.2 million sports/ physical education complex to be named after longtime Oregon lumberman Coleman Wheeler. It will contain the Jim and Lila Miller Gymnasium. As fast as the present gymnasium is vacated, sometime next spring, it will be "recycled" into a new \$1.5 million Fine Arts/Chapel building containing a 1,100 seat auditorium.

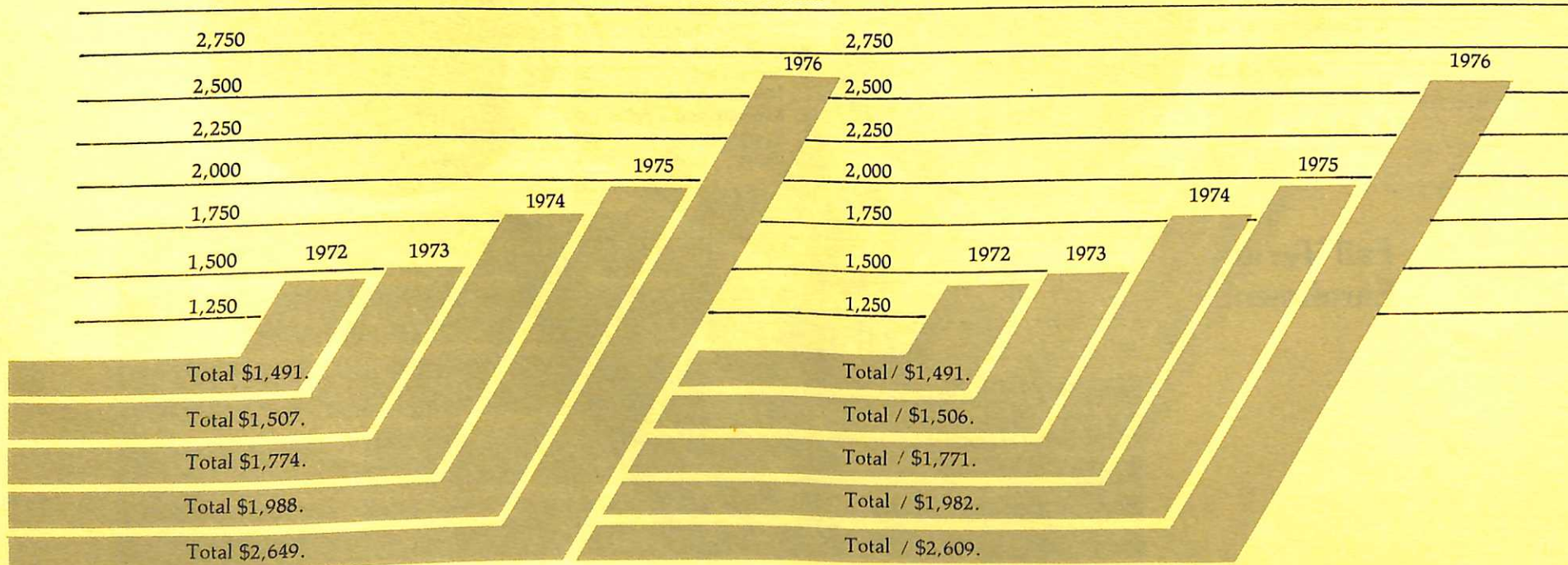
And Phase II of the master plan already is underway even as Phase I is continuing. Ground breaking was May 29 for a new \$850,000 academic center to be called the Herbert C. Hoover Academic Building and

containing the Howard E. Kershner Center for Business and Economics. It is expected to be completed in early 1977 and will contain new classrooms, and administrative offices.

Major gifts continue to be a source of strong support. Received in December was a single gift of \$1.5 million from the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust—the largest gift ever made to the college. It was designated for the capital campaign. Several other large gifts included \$420,000 from an anonymous donor in Portland for the sports center, \$200,000 from alumnus and board member M. Lowell Edwards for the academic building, \$250,000 as a challenge grant from the J. Howard Pew Freedom Trust towards the academic center, \$150,000 from the Collins Foundation and \$100,000 from the Kresge Foundation for the Fine Arts/Chapel, and \$100,000 from the Fleischman Foundation for the academic building. In addition, the college was the recipient of \$140,000 through the will of a Seattle couple, with the fund designated for scholarships.

George Fox College Dinners throughout the West—from Los Angeles to Seattle and including Portland, Boise, Newberg, Eugene and Medford—continue to "take the college to the people." More than 3,400 persons attended the programs. And the development office also sponsored the highly successful national tour of duo-pianists Tim Bletcher and Roger House, both 1975 graduates who traveled more than 50,000 miles and performed in over 200 concerts from coast to coast.

This of course, is not a complete report of all campus life during the 1975-76 fiscal year. It's difficult to summarize an active, growing, vital campus, but perhaps these highlights show the outpouring of God's blessing upon us and allow you to share with us in the excitement that is George Fox College. Christ is the irreducible minimum purpose of the College. He is that which gives meaning and direction. Eighty-five years ago, George Fox was founded with this purpose. George Fox College had a good beginning! And the purpose has not been diminished; indeed our mission and vision has only been enlarged! I am convinced the hope of higher education in America rests with the small Christian college that is still anchored to the Rock. It is my prayer that George Fox College might always be that place of strength and hope for the days that lie ahead. Prayer and financial support toward this goal are appreciated, and your continued support in this work is encouraged.

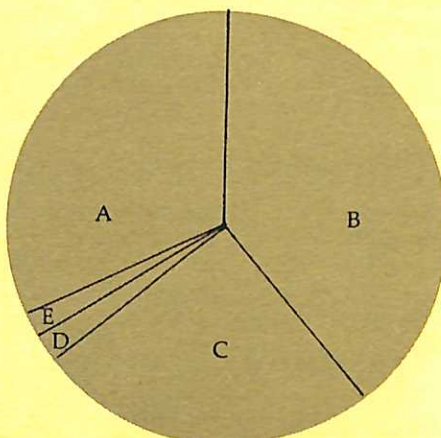

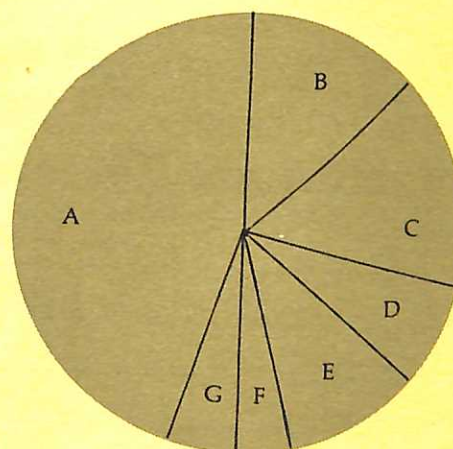
Current Revenues by Source

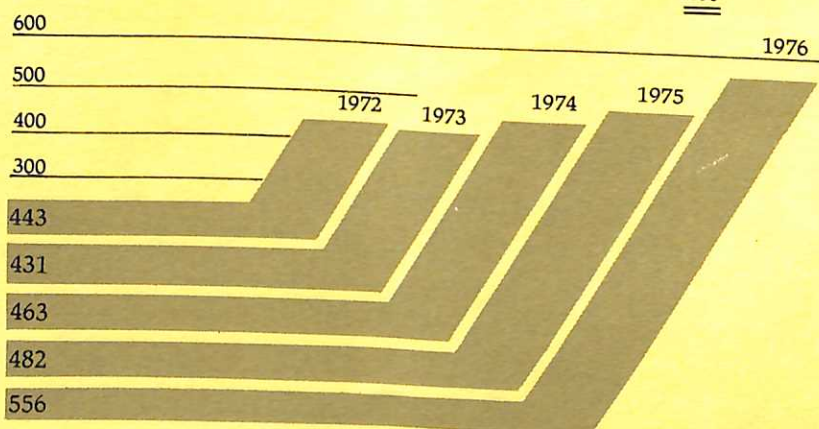


Current Expenditures by Object

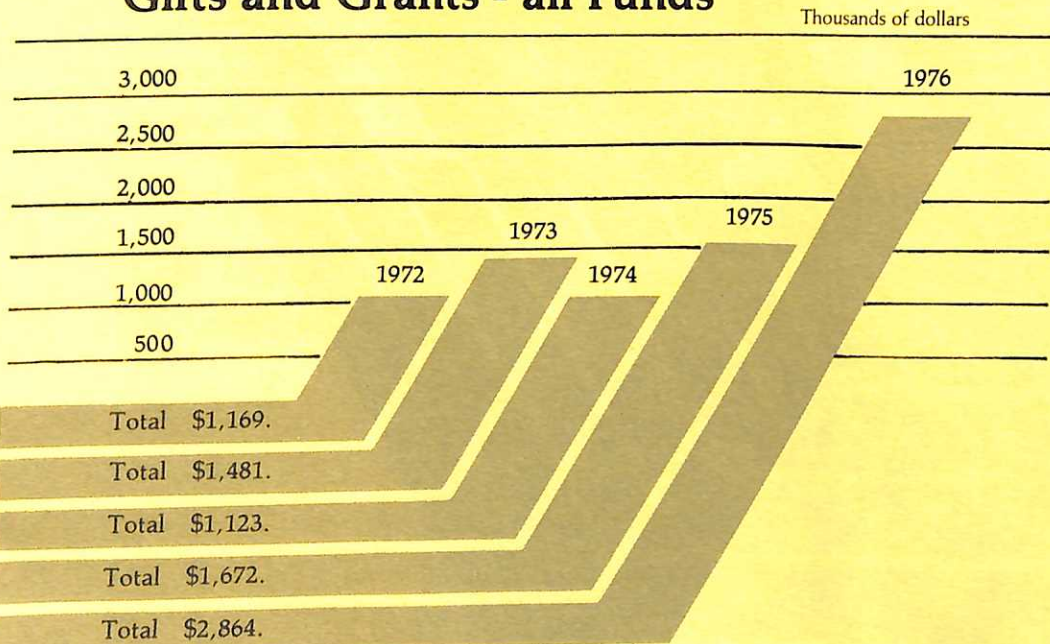
