PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

A growing student body, strong academics, new buildings, fiscal management—these are all strong indications of success in the life of a college. But at George Fox it's even more. These all witness to God's faithfulness. They give evidence of His blessing. Therefore, we rejoice in what God has done for George Fox College over this last year. Surely He has been honoring the prayer and vision of all those involved with the college. As a community of scholars, workers, and supporters of George Fox we are called to accomplish a God-ordained mission. This 1977 Annual Report is a look back into that mission as a witness to God's leadership and faithfulness this last academic and fiscal year.

Academic:

Enrollment at George Fox College continued to set a pace for Oregon. Fall term opened with a record enrollment of 630 to start the school's 86th year. The increase was 13 percent, a rate maintained each following term. The enrollment increase has been 30 percent in two years and 44 percent in the last four. Nearly half of all students were new to the campus, as 300 new students enrolled. Standards have not been lowered to increase the student body. In fact, just the opposite has happened. Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores have climbed from 461 to 482 for incoming students and the mathematics skill test measured 465, compared to the national average of 460. The western states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and California contribute almost 92 percent of all students enrolled, but 20 states are represented on campus along with 4 nations. The college continues to have more Friends (Quaker) students than at any other U.S. college. Thirty-four percent are Friends students, but again, 39 other denominations are represented on campus.

The academic year opened with a miniterm "Futuristics," featuring a spacecraft developer, physical researcher, sociologist, college president, minister,

and futurist. A maximum 180 students participated in the week-long program along with nearly two dozen professors and administrators. The formal opening of the year was the traditional convocation, with Willamette University President Robert Lisenky, a former Methodist minister, delivering the address.

Faculty members started their year with a conference highlighted by the leadership of Arthur Holmes, author of *The Idea of a Christian College*.

During the year the college began an outreach to older adults in nearby counties through a federally funded program. Aimed at senior citizen involvement in higher education, the program encouraged older people to consider college through a series of seminars and the provision for help in improving reading skills. A significant increase in older persons attending classes was noted.

Another significant project started in the year was an experiential education program begun with a three-year \$125,000 grant from the Kellogg Foundation. It will allow up to 45 students a year to participate with business and industry in the Portland-Newberg area, giving students opportunity to apply their education to career options in their majors. Up to five faculty members each summer also will enter nonacademic work fields related to their teaching. Goal of the program is to relate the liberal arts education directly to career preparation with on-the-job experience.

Several significant conferences and meetings were hosted by the college during the year. Quaker Heritage Week, for three days in February, brought Friends Church leaders to campus for discussion. Featured were Keith Sarver, general superintendent of California Yearly Meeting; Everett Cattell, former Malone College president and missionary to India, and our own Arthur O. Roberts, professor of religion and philosophy.

"Ministering to Youth," a two-day conference, brought youth ministers and workers from Oregon, Washington, California, and Idaho to the campus. They were guided in the sessions by Warren Benson of Dallas Theological Seminary. A "Women's Emphasis" for two days in April featured six women who discussed their professions with the participants.

George Fox joined the Evangelical Teacher Training Association and now will offer ETTA diplomas along with standard degrees for Christian education majors. The certificate indicates proficiency in Bible and Christian education and an ability to teach church lay leadership. Ten diplomas were awarded in graduation ceremonies. The college's in-service mathematics course program for teachers continued to expand with a 39 percent increase in registrants for the independent study courses. Students from Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Alaska, and British Columbia were enrolled. And for the fourth year the college has participated, together with some of the nation's leading evangelical Christian colleges, in the national Christian College Consortium, with the emphasis on the integration of faith and learning and upon cooperative endeavors.

Students continued to be taught by committed, competent, and caring faculty members. Faculty members and administrators were involved in a wide variety of academic activity during the year, ranging from presiding over professional associations to the publication of significant material in their fields.

The academic year closed at the end of May with the graduation of 104 seniors in ceremonies featuring W. Stanley Mooneyham, president of World Vision International, who challenged the graduates about "Living in a High Risk World." Dr. Robert Bletscher, pastor of the Lents Evangelical Church in Portland, brought the baccalaureate address.


Student Life:

It would be nearly impossible to describe all the activities of students outside the classroom. Involvement ranged from spiritual victories to athletic victories. And in between were music, drama, conferences, and projects to help others.


The year opened with Spiritual Emphasis Week in early October, with Kent Hughes, pastor of the Bre-Olinda Friends Church in Southern California, as the week's speaker. Missions Awareness Week in the winter term allowed students to participate with 10 missionary representatives and their displays of worldwide efforts. Theme for the week was "Your Future—His Plan," with Arthur Beals, executive director of World Concern Ministries and vice-president of King's Garden, Inc., Seattle, as guest speaker for this 11th annual event. In the spring term, Jay Kesler, national president of Youth for Christ, was speaker for the annual Deeper Life Conference, with thought-provoking messages for both morning chapels and evening services. As a result of the missions week conference six students during the summer were literally around the world in missions work, sponsored by the \$2,000 raised by fellow students in faith-promise pledges. Seven other students participated with the Continental Singers in locations throughout the United States, Europe, and Central America.

Students' concern for their fellowman was openly displayed many times during the year. Students

sponsored a Christmas party for area mentally retarded youth, volunteered to teach Sunday school classes, helped with tutoring, and on an organized basis through their student government gave away to specific needs more than \$4,700, representing a 10 percent tithe of their total student government budget.

Musically, and in drama, students were active both on and off campus. The 52-piece concert band toured for 10 days on the West Coast, and the 54-member choir toured in Washington. Both participated in music festivals, including a choir festival sponsored by the college. Music and drama productions included *Requiem* by the Christmas oratorio choir, *Spoon River Anthology*, *Play of Daniel*, *Godspell*, *Story Theater*, *The Glass Menagerie*, and *Show Boat*.

Interest groups also gained prominence. The campus radio station, owned and operated by the students and featuring a "contemporary Christian" format, was expanded and moved to new headquarters in Brougher Hall. A couples organization was founded for married students, a Spanish Club was organized, and the GFC Film Society brought quality films to campus for the college community.

Athletically, the Bruins again gained prominence, with the men's basketball team producing its winningest season ever with 20 wins, participating in the NAIA District 2 playoffs with a game in Hawaii. Track men finished second in the district and three men went to the NAIA national championships. Both the women's hockey and softball teams produced winning seasons, and in track one participant was sent to the AIAW nationals.

Development/Finance:

Perhaps nowhere else does God's working show more visibly than in the new facilities on campus. He has provided—in miraculous ways—funding for four new buildings under construction during the year. The new \$2.2 million, 51,000-square-foot

Coleman Wheeler Sports and Physical Education Center was completed. The new \$850,000 Herbert Hoover Academic Building, with 20,000 square feet, was also finished. And a new \$1.2 million, 31,000-square-foot, two-building residence hall complex for 120 students was being readied for fall occupancy.

But even more is planned. Demolition of the old Hester Gym was started and it is to be recycled into the new Milo C. Ross Fine Arts Center. And even another residence hall is needed for the fall of 1978, with planning in progress. What were only dreams—with God's direction—a year ago today are reality, and we are trusting Him to help us continue to put foundations under them.

During the fiscal year the college again, for the sixth consecutive year, has operated soundly in the black. Assets of the college climbed by more than \$2 million to nearly the \$13.5 million level, with a fund balance of nearly \$10 million.

Gifts and financial support from a variety of sources continued to be the strength of the college financially. The support of alumni, churches, friends, and individuals not only is necessary on a monetary basis, but it is a moral support and an indication to others of the overall and wide strength of the George Fox College constituency.

George Fox College continued to take its purposes and plans directly to the people with a series of dinners throughout the West. More than 3,500 persons attended dinners in Portland, Boise, Seattle, Newberg, Los Angeles, Eugene, Medford, and Coos Bay. The 10th anniversary of the first dinner was celebrated in March at the annual Southern California Dinner held at the Disneyland Hotel.

Personal:

The past year, my tenth at the college, has been an extremely busy one. In addition to college responsibilities I served my first year as chairman of the board of the national Council for the Advancement of Small Colleges. This has given George Fox

much visibility across the nation. I also serve as a member of the executive boards of the Christian College Consortium, the Christian College Coalition, and as a member of the American Council on Education. In April my wife Becky and I visited missions work in Mexico and Costa Rica and ministered at an inter-mission retreat in Guatemala.

Summary:

This, of course, is not a complete summary of all that has transpired in the life of the college during the year. However, I hope the highlights will serve to give a sense of the excitement that is George Fox College, as we are honored by God as we carry out His will.

I believe that George Fox College is on the cutting edge of higher education. Our singular commitment to Christian higher education is narrow, but this is not a naive parochialism about what constitutes true education. It simply indicates a commitment to the fact that all truth is God's truth and that Jesus Christ is the only valid starting point for all complete knowledge. Knowing Him and making Him known—that is the ultimate mission of George Fox College. God has abundantly blessed George Fox College during this past year. But past blessing will not suffice for the future. Only as we prayerfully and carefully seek God's will and are obedient to His leading as an institution, can we be assured of His blessing in the days ahead. And, the future will demand resources in greater measure than we have ever received, or thought of, or even prayed for! But, if our purpose and mission is intact, God will honor our labors together. May we count on your prayer and financial support toward this goal of honoring Him?



Combined Assets and Liabilities- all Funds
