

# 1977-78 PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

GEORGE FOX COLLEGE Newberg, Oregon

The 1977-78 academic and fiscal year has been most significant in the history of George Fox College: record enrollments, the addition of four new buildings and the start of construction of a fifth, continuing fiscal growth and balanced budgets, outstanding educational and cultural programs, and significant spiritual advance. All have been part of an exciting year, one showing the faithfulness of God in the life of a Christian college.

George Fox is a college with many successes and innovations—ideas, people, and projects about which we think you should know. The following is a brief summary, touching only the highlights of all that transpired. However, I hope it serves to show you the excitement that is George Fox College. We are grateful to the Lord for His blessings and guidance. There is, however, much more that still needs to be completed and accomplished—and by His grace, will be done!

George Fox has a singular mission and purpose for existence—to honor and prepare workers for Jesus Christ and His kingdom. It's a commitment made generations ago and one to which we hold strongly today. Through that commitment, God has honored, providing the people and the resources necessary for the task. May we count upon you to be one of those committed to the work and goals of George Fox College?

### **ACADEMIC**

George Fox College continues to be one of the Northwest's fastest growing colleges. Fall term 1977 opened with a record enrollment of 708 to start the school's 87th year. The increase was 12 percent and boosted the College's enrollment over the last three years by 50 percent. The total included 313 men and 395 women.

Coming to the College were students from 20 states and 7 foreign countries. Oregonians continue to predominate with 514 registered fall term, up 19 percent over the previous year, and they made up 72 percent of the student body, three fourths of them coming from the Willamette Valley. More than 93 percent of the students studying at George Fox were from Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and California. Of the incoming freshman students, two thirds had high school grades above a 3.00 average and 35 percent were above 3.50.

Although the College was founded and is still governed by the Friends Church (Northwest Yearly Meeting), more than 40 denominations were represented on campus. Quaker students composed 28 percent of the student body with 16 percent of students Baptist and 10 percent members of the Evangelical Church of North America. Those three denominations account for just over half (52 percent) of all students.

The 1977-78 academic year opened with a miniterm "How Should We Then Live," studying the thoughts of Christian philosopher Francis Schaeffer. Ninety-nine students participated.

Although classes started October 4, the formal opening came October 17 with the traditional convocation, this year featuring Oregon Senator Mark Hatfield, a member of the George Fox board for 18 years. But the date also had special significance, for it marked the official completion of four new buildings that added \$4.4 million in new facilities to the campus: the Coleman H. Wheeler Sports Center, the Herbert Hoover Academic Building, and two residence halls—the Charlotte Macy and Mary Sutton Halls. The day-long "Day of Dedication" program, with addresses, workshops, entertainment, seminars, and the formal ceremonies marking the occasion, was a significant development in the life of any college.

During the 1977-78 academic year the College continued to expand its outreach to older adults in the community. Seeking increased senior citizen involvement in higher education, the George Fox program encourages older people to consider college, and a significant number have responded, some sitting in on classes, others taking them for credit. Twenty-two were enrolled with another 16 persons in Continuing Education classes.

Another significant project during the current year, but begun the year before, is the experiential education program that operates under a three-year \$125,000 grant from the Kellogg Foundation. It allows students to participate with local and Northwest business and industry, giving students opportunity to apply their education to career options in their majors. The goal of the program is to relate liberal arts education directly to career preparation with on-the-job experience. During the year more than 50 students were involved with area business and organizations. As part of the program six faculty members during the summer spent from 5 to 10 weeks in business and industry learning how they operate so they can better relate needs to their students.

Academically, the College's in-service course program for teachers continued to grow with registrants for the independent study courses from throughout Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Alaska, and British Columbia. The College now offers home study for teachers in science and language arts as well as mathematics.

This year marked the 20th anniversary of the start of the College's successful Intensified Studies Program which allows accelerated learning for gifted youth, and 24 were participating in special

seminars and in progress with original research and study.

The academic strength of the College was shown in January when George Fox became the first western college to be admitted to Sigma Zeta, a national science honor society.

For the fifth year the College participated together with some of the nation's leading evangelical Christian colleges in the Christian College Consortium, with the emphasis on the integration of faith and learning and upon cooperative endeavors. Eleven students participated in an exchange program with other campuses and two students participated in the consortium's Washington, D.C., American Studies Program.

Several significant conferences and meetings were hosted by the College during the year: Spiritual Life Week in October featured Lanson Ross, head of a missionary and social support organization in Seattle; Quaker Heritage Week in early January brought together Northwest pastors, teachers, and students under the theme "A New Call to Peacemaking"; the 12th annual Missions Conference in mid-January featured Marty Ensign; in April Rev. Earl Lee, pastor of the Pasadena First Church of the Nazarene and author of Recycled Living, was speaker at the annual Deeper Life Conference, as the College's annual Staley Distinguished Christian Scholar Lecturer for 1978. The largest conference of all—drawing some 300 off-campus guests—was the Christian Education Conference in February featuring author/speaker Ethel Barrett and 30 other speakers.


Students continue to be taught by committed, competent, and caring faculty members, who are involved in a wide variety of academic activity, ranging from presiding over professional associations to the publication of significant material in their fields. Credit hours taken by students rose 10.4 percent to near the 10,000 total at 9,997. The average class size was 23.4 and the faculty/student ratio was 1 to 16.5 with a goal of 1 to 20. It is important to keep in mind that our primary goal is for a college of quality and significance capable of producing achievers. A faculty-student ratio of 1 to 20 is a secondary goal reflecting stewardship and good management.

The 87th academic year closed May 27 with commencement ceremonies featuring Josh McDowell, author of Evidence That Demands a Verdict and More than a Carpenter. Baccalaureate services featured Carl Lundquist, president of Bethel College and Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota. McDowell addressed the 93 graduates on the topic "Is It Worth It All?" with "compassion" as the key word. Lundquist spoke on the topic "The Christian Mind," telling graduates to "relate everything in life to Christ."

## STUDENT LIFE

Student life at George Fox College is nearly as broad as life itself. It includes a variety of departments, concerns, and activities that involve GFC students outside the classroom. It's career planning, financial aid, living situations, health care, religious life, athletics, and the wide range of student activities. The integration of faith and learning and living is an essential component to the George Fox College experience.

On the administrative level, the Career Planning and Placement Center has more involved alumni in its services, primarily through the first "System for Identifying Motivated Abilities" workshop on campus for both alumni and current



students, with 56 involved. Other seminars included those on graduate school application, job search tips, and resume writing.

The financial aid program of the College continues to expand and for the first time aid distributed by the College from all sources topped the \$1 million level, totaling \$1,129,000.

Through the Chaplain's Office 75 students were involved in 10 discipleship groups; 17 Bible study, prayer and sharing groups were organized in the residence halls; and Action teams of five to eight members each participated in 45 services and programs this year in the deputation program. As a result of Missions Week, George Fox students raised some \$1,500 used to send seven students as summer missionaries around the world. The religious life of the campus must never be taken for granted. It is not an additive to the curriculum but must be, and is, thoroughly integrated, providing a perspective and a point of reference to the entire learning and living enterprise.

Students also showed their care and concern for their fellowman in many other ways. They gave 299 pints of blood during the year in three drawings on campus to push their total to 2,063 pints since collections began 10 years ago. Nearly 50 were involved during the year in volunteering time to help elderly in Newberg care centers, reading to patients, participating in games, and accompanying a senior citizen friend for a walk. Students also volunteered to teach Sunday school classes, helped with tutoring of students in public schools, and on an organized basis through their student government gave away to specific needs more than \$5,000, representing a 10 percent tithe of their total student government budget.

In music and drama students also were active, bringing inspiration and entertainment to others. Fall term performances included the annual community Christmas gift, The Messiah, sung by a 160-voice oratorio choir. The stage production of A

Christmas Carol, titled Scrooge, was presented in December. A musical version of John Bunyan's traditional Pilgrim's Progress was staged in January, and The Miracle Worker, the celebrated life story of Helen Keller, came to life in March. The biggest undertaking of all was the May performances of the well-known Sound of Music. All this was in addition to the regular performances by the 60-piece band and 52-voice choir.

Athletically, the George Fox Bruins gained prominence and provided spectators with quality collegiate sports. The men's cross-country team won the NAIA District 2 title. The track team was just four points out of first place in the district championships. And Rich Allen, who coaches both sports, was named the district's Coach of the Year in all sports. The basketball Bruins, for the seventh time in the last eight years, reached the district playoffs. Women fielded teams in field hockey, volleyball, softball, basketball, tennis, and track.

New to the campus were two interest groups organized for the first time: a Veterans Organization with about 25 participating and a Married Students Association for the 66 couples on campus.

## DEVELOPMENT/FINANCE

It is easy to depict the physical and fiscal growth at George Fox College: the new campus facilities are here and visible and the financial growth and strengthening can be illustrated through graphs and charts. It is not so easy to illustrate the growth in quality. But we believe the improvements in physical facilities merely mirror the improved quality of our faculty, the academic program, the student life program, the support staff, and all other aspects of the organization that is George Fox College.

The visible growth is in the four new structures completed and dedicated during the year. From throughout the nation major corporations, foundations, and businesses contributed funds for four new buildings-the 51,000-square-foot Coleman

Wheeler Sports and Physical Education Center, completed at a cost of \$2.4 million; the new \$850,000 Herbert Hoover Academic Building with its 20,000 square feet; and two new residence halls -the Mary Sutton and Charlotte Macy Hallswith 31,000 square feet in a combined \$1.2 million project. All were opened for use in October and impressively added to our space (now 287,564 square feet, an increase of 36 percent) and abilities this year.

But the new construction did not end there. In December the College broke ground for another new building: the Milo C. Ross Center. The former Hester Gym during the year was undergoing a "recycling" into a new 24,000-square-foot facility in a \$1.3 million project completed in time for the opening of school in 1978.

Yesterday's dreams are today's realities under God's direction and with the support of many. And more is still to be done. Fund raising will begin soon to complete the new Ross Center with a 1,100-seat Chapel/Auditorium as Phase II of the total project.

While the new building has been evident, it has not been at the expense of current (or general) fund operations. The College again, for the seventh consecutive year, operated soundly in the black. Assets of the College climbed by more than \$1.2 million to nearly \$14,700,000 during the fiscal year, with a fund balance of nearly \$11 million.

Gifts and financial support from a variety of sources continue to be the strength of George Fox financially. The support of alumni, churches, the community, friends, and individuals not only is necessary on a monetary basis, but is a moral support and an indication to others of the overall and wide strength of the George Fox constituency. Student tuition pays only about two thirds of the total education costs; therefore, the College must raise annually the remaining one third necessary for total operation obligations. That's a process that involves so many others, and we hope you.




