They won the Barbershop Quartet title in Forest Grove two years running. The first year Harlow was not with them because of illness and Roy Clark filled in. Roy was one of our music teachers.

The original "Four Flats" had Connie Phillips instead of Harlow Ankeny.

I think they were known as the "Visionaires" when they made recordings and traveled so much.

The summer of 1947 they and several others of us, under the direction of Roy "Pop" Knight, disassembled a very large building at Camp Adair and moved it on campus to be reassembled into two buildings.
