- Constitution -

- Preamble -

We, the students of Pacific College and Academy, to promote our interests along literary and forensic lines, do hereby adopt for our government: this constitution and by-laws.

Art. I.

Sec. I.

The name of this society shall be:
The Euronian Literary Society.

Art. II.

Sec. I.

Registered students in the Academy and College departments of Pacific College are eligible to membership in this society.

Members of the Faculty shall be considered honorary members of this society.

Sec. II

Eligible persons, paying the dues and signing the Constitution and By Laws, shall become members.

Sec III

One officer and four members shall constitute a quorum.

Art. III

Sec. I

(Officers)

The officers of this society shall consist of: a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Marshall.

Sec II

The duties of the President shall consist of: calling meetings to order and presiding over them, and enforcing the Constitution and By Laws.

The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President in his absence, and make and post all programs.

The Secretary shall keep a correct record of the proceedings of all the meetings, and attendance of members.

The Treasurer shall receive and pay out all monies^{exp}, and keep a correct

account of same.

He shall submit a report at the end of each Semester.

The Marshall shall be the Society Janitor, and keep order at all meetings.

Sec. III

Election of officers shall occur at the first regular meeting in each semester.

Sec IV.

The first Semester shall begin with the opening of school and extend to Feb. 15. The second Semester beginning with Feb. 15. shall extend to the close of school.

Art IV.

Sec. I

An auditing committee, consisting of two members appointed by the chair, shall audit the Treasurer's accounts and see that the collection of fines

balances with the Secretaries account of fines due.

Sec II.

This auditing committee shall be appointed by the President.

Art. IV.

Sec. I.

Amendments, or alterations of this Constitution, shall be presented in writing at any regular meeting, but shall not be voted upon until one week after first reading.

Sec II.

Amendments, or alterations, shall require the votes of a majority of the members of the Society.

- By Laws -

Art I.

Sec I.

The regular meetings of this Society shall be in the College Chapel on Friday evening of

each week at 7:00 P.M.

Sec II

The first meeting of the first Semester shall be held on the second Friday after the opening of school.

Sec. III.

The President, or by the request of three members, may call a meeting at any time for the transaction of business.

The regular dues shall be Twenty-five (25¢) Cents per. Semester.

Sec. II.

A fine of Five (5¢) Cents shall be imposed for absence from first roll-call, and Ten (10¢) Cents for second.

Sec. III.

A fine of Ten (10¢) Cents shall be imposed for every failure to take part on programme when a duty is assigned.

Sec. IV.

Members may be exempt from fines only upon written excuses read before the Society, and accepted by it.

Art IV

Sec. I.

The President shall appoint a critic for each evening.

Art. V.

Sec. I.

Robert's Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary guide in matters not provided for in this Constitution and By Laws.

Art. VI.

Sec. I.

These By Laws may be amended or altered at any regular meeting of the Society, by a two-thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) vote of the members present.

Not finding the roll book the Sec. took the names of those present. The program was carried out, as posted, with one exception. The minutes of the preceeding meeting were read and accepted. The minutes for the call meeting, with correction, stood approved. The program for the next meeting, Nov. 4, was read.

Ellis Picket, David Hayes, Claude Colkins, and Oscar Colkins were received into the membership of the club.

The club met Nov. 5 at the usual time. The roll was called, and the posted program rendered. With a grammatical correction, the minutes of the preceeding meeting were accepted.

A discussion arose concerning the time the dues should be in after signing of Constitution. The Society decided that the standing rule should be: "If the dues of the Soc; as stated in the By-Laws are not payed within two weeks after signing of Constitution, that person failing to pay such dues forfeit his membership in Soc; or, if an officer, that office be declared vacant.

A motion carried that the Soc. after each meeting, make a list of those absent and hand the list to the Treas.

The choir appointed a Com. consisting of three members, Ethel Weed, Mary Cook and Claude Lewis, to superintend the social feature of the Club.

Bruce Douglas, Maude Gregory, Claude Lewis, Riley Kaufman, Rea Smith, Lucy Mills, Myrtle Mills and Gladys Hannon were excused by the Club for their absence from the

former meeting.

A name for membership, Dorothy New^{all}, was proposed, which was considered and admitted into Soc.

Harvey Wright gave the critic's report. Remarks were heard from Prof. Wesner.

The second roll-call was answered by the title of the member's favorite song, some of which were very impressive.
