George Bales - - New Quaker Coach



BALES

Leading the Quaker gridiron machine in its jaunt through the 1948 season is Pacific College's new athletic director, George Bales, who graduated from here in 1943, took graduate work in 1944 and after holding a Friend's church pastorate at Talent, Oregon, for three years attended the National YMCA college at Springfield, Mass., where he received his advanced training in physical education. Bales came back to Pacific as coach this fall and already has proved his ability as a football mentor.

The Quaker coach is not new to Pacific athletics or to Newberg athletics, for that matter. While in high school he was an outstanding wrestler and while at Pacific he played guard on the college football team. In 1944, while taking a Th. B. degree, he coached the college athletic teams.

If enthusiasm, aggressiveness and work are attributes of a successful coach, then the Quakers' new athletic head should go to the top rung of the well-known "success" ladder. Bales is the first full-time athletic head Pacific has had in many a moon and already the sports department is feeling the results of his forward look into the athletic scope of this school.

"Jayvee" Coach Assists Stagg At P. U.

Assisting Dr. Paul Stagg in shaping up the 1948 Pacific University football force is Harold Wolf, coach of the Jayvees that are on the field here today. Spending his first season with Pacific, Wolf comes from Colorado State college where he gained fame as a backfield ace, and served as assistant coach of the varsity gridmen.

Wolf attended Pueblo Centennial high school where he lettered in football, basketball, and track. He went on to Pueblo Junior college and continued to do big things in football and basketball. He entered Colorado State just at the start of the war, but his career was interrupted by four years of naval service.

After the war he returned to Colorado State, where he received his bachelor of arts degree in health and physical education, and later earned his masters degree in education.

What About Today's Game?

That football teams have their "off" days is clearly distinguishable when you notice the inconsistency of certain teams. Certainly the Quakers are in that classification this year as one compares the scores and statistics of the various games. But last week the Quakers managed to kill two birds with one stone when they coupled their strong defensive and offensive punch of the line with the potential speed and aggressiveness of their backfield combination and made the effects of an "off" day take a back seat as they soundly rapped Linfield's JV's 13-0. But the question is raised today: "Will the Quakers be able to repeat their outstanding performance of last week?"

With all four of Bales' original backfield starters opening the game today, the Quaker's should have an early game punch, but the Jayvees from Pacific University, second stringers of a powerful Northwest Conference squad, is certain to exhibit some expert football tactics. Last year the Baby Badgers nudged the Earl Craven-coached Quaker squad 26-7 in the first fracus of the season. The Jayvees so far this year have beaten Battlground, 13-6; and have fallen to Oregon State Frosh, 46-0. Last week the "Jayvees" whipped Reed 46-6. Quakers' scores so far: PC—22, Reed—0; PC—6, OCE—33; PC—0, Willamette JV's—13; PC—0, Lewis and Clark JV's—0; PC—13, Linfield JV's—0.

Only remaining game for the Quakers after today is a tilt with Reed college of Portland on this field next Thursday, November 11. The P. U. JV's have a tilt with Willamette JV's, November 11, at Oregon City, and a game with Lewis and Clark JV's, November 19 at Portland.
