Dear Miss Davis:--

The financial affairs of Pacific College are in the best condition, and the worst, in the history of the college; the best as to permanent support, and the worst as to ready funds. The raising of the endowment cut off practically all of the money that had been coming in on regular expenses, the income on most of the endowment is not due till next January, and the hard times have been so keenly felt that we have had to take more tuition notes this year than ever before. As a result, the faculty are awaiting, with what patience they can command, the payment of their January salaries, and the board have instructed me to do what I can to relieve the financial stringency before the close of the year.

The college has your scholarship note, dated April 24, 1912, for \$44.00, to be paid as soon as practicable after you left the college. I do not know, of course, just what your financial condition is at present, and if it is not practicable to pay the note at the present time, then the note is not due. But if you could pay the note or any part of it, it would be greatly appreciated.
