A REPORT FROM THE ALASKA NATIVE HOUSING
COMMITTEE

As you have read in the paper the Congress is soon to give its final approval to the Bartlett Native Housing Bill.

This means that at long last there will be a federal housing program to benefit Alaska natives.

We are writing to report to you on Sen. Bob Bartlett's housing program because of its great importance to you and your village.

The bill authorizes as a start a \$10 million housing program. It will be carried out by the State of Alaska, and it is expected that natives will play an important role in its operation. The houses will be simple, inexpensive, but well built. Up to 75 percent will be

paid by the federal government.

It is Sen. Bartlett's hope that the initial \$10 million program will be so successful that the Congress will authorize an expanded program so that every family in rural Alaska will be able to have the kind of housing every American deserves.
