PRESIDENT JOHNSON WELCOMED TO ALASKA

"An Eskimo dance team was among
thousands of Alaskans welcoming
President Lyndon Johnson and his
wife Lady Bird to the 49th state
early Wednesday morning. The Presi-
dent landed in Anchorage after a
17 day tour of the Pacific perimeter.
He had a few hours sleep in the
Anchorage-Westward before break-
fasting with Alaskan mayors and
Then flying home to the White House.

Johnson said he was glad he
had ended his Pacific journey in
Alaska. "I passed through Hawaii
on the way out- and now Alaska on
the way back. And that fact speaks
of the future of this part of our
country. You are the bridge of a
new partnership. * You are on the
rim of a new era. As the Pacific
prosper and grows, Alaska- and
Portland and Seattle and San
Francisco and Los Angeles and
Honolulu and scores of other Ameri-
can cities- will prosper also."

Of his 28,000 mile trip,
Johnson said: "It has been the
most rewarding, the most encourag-
ing, the most thrilling journey
of my life. I believe it may
also have been the most important
and the most historic."
