40 of 47 precincts in Northwest  
Alaska:

For Governor: William A. Egan,  
2660; Walter J. Hickel 1185; John  
F. Grasse 40.

For U.S. Senate: E.L. Bartlett,  
3107; Lee L. McKinley 713.

For U.S. House: Ralph J. Rivers,  
2415; Howard Pollock, 1413.

For State Senate: R.R. Blodgett,  
2005; Jerry Crow, 766; Les Bone, 126.

All bonding issues passed  
handily.

The unofficial vote throughout  
the state for ~~the~~ Governor was  
Hickel, 30,638 and Egan, 28,257.

Howard Pollock defeated Ralph  
Rivers by some 32,000 votes state-  
wide.

William Hensley had little  
trouble defeating Evelyn Conwell  
1129 to 343 for the State House  
of Representative seat from Election  
District 17.
