One of the highlights of Thanksgiving Day here in Noorvik was the snow-traveler and dog race.

There were six entries in the snow-traveler race to Second Island which began at 9:30 A.M. They were: Levi Coffin, Vincent Schuerch, Raymond George, Laurie Schuerch, and Robert Newlin and Danny Thompson. The trail was a difficult one and in many spots there was no trail at all. The winner was Vincent Schuerch of Kiana, who donated his \$20 prize money to the Noorvik Medical Fund.

At 11 A.M. the six dog teams began to line up on the river in front of the mission home for the 11 mile race to Jones Portage and back. The teams ranged in size from 6 dogs (Gilbert Field) to 12 dogs (Clifton Jackson) and left at two minute intervals. The results were as follows:
