We will be leaving Noorvik within the next ten days, and the feeling I have tried to convey to you is one felt tight around the heart. I realize that words just won't

#### JOB CORPS REPRESENTATIVE TO COME TO NOORVIK

Tim Kennedy recently received a letter stating that a representative from Job Corps would be coming to Noorvik in the near future. Before he comes, Job Corps would like a list of those boys between the ages of 16 and 22 who are interested in signing up.

Job Corps is a voluntary training program for out-of-school, out-of-work young men and women. Enrollees must be school dropouts for three months or more and unable to find or hold an adequate job. The goal of Job Corps is to prepare young men and women for jobs in which they can earn a decent living. Enrollees are sent to training centers where they work on useful conservation projects, learn job skills and basic academic subjects, and earn a modest living allowance. Job Corps does not guarantee a job to enrollees who complete the training program but they try to help each graduate learn of job opportunities for which he is qualified.

#### WEEKLY HEALTH FILMS BEGUN

Last Thursday night there were some health films shown to the adults of Noorvik. One was "Stop Rheumatic Fever", "Fluoridation, For Children Because We Care" and "What is Disease". Our village is buying the Fluoride liquid and in tablets. We would urge all mothers to be sure and give them to the children.

One big problem here is impetigo and the doctor said if you have these sores for a long time the germs would get in the blood stream and may cause damage to the heart. If they do not complete their course of antibiotic the germ stays a long time in the blood stream. Also if you do not get treated a long time for strep throat.

These films were ordered by the Health Workers and Rosaire Kennedy, our Registered Nurse, and the Medical Fund Committee is paying the return postage. We will have a showing of these health films every week if they come. There were over 70 people that came. I hope more people could come next time.
