### **DIEFENBAUGH NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA SECOND TEAM**

**Megan Diefenbaugh**, a starting defensive back for George Fox University's women's soccer team, has been named to the CoSIDA/GTE Academic All-America Second Team, Women's Fall/Winter At-Large Sports, College Division.

Diefenbaugh, a senior from Eugene, Ore., had already been named to the CoSIDA/GTE Academic All-America Team for District VIII (West), Fall/Winter Women's At-Large Sports, College Division. The Academic All-America teams are voted upon by all members of CoSIDA, the College Sports Information Directors of America. The College Division includes schools in NCAA Divisions II and III and NAIA Divisions I and II.

Diefenbaugh, a four-year starter for the Bruins at virtually every position but goalkeeper, played in 17 games this past season, helping the Bruins to an 11-8 record. She was an anchor in the middle of the George Fox defensive backfield that allowed only 1.47 goals per game. Though playing up front only occasionally, she finished her career with five goals and five assists for 15 career points while playing in 76 games. She was a Second Team All-Northwest Conference pick this past season.

### FOUR BRUINS RECEIVE ALL-CONFERENCE WOMEN'S SOCCER HONORS

**NEWBERG, Ore.** --- Highlighted by the selection of forward **Karli Holub (So., Pleasant Hill, Ore.)** to the First Team, four George Fox University Bruins have received All-Northwest Conference honors for the 1999 season, according to an announcement from the conference office.

Joining Holub in receiving conference accolades are **midfielder Megan Diefenbaugh (Sr., Eugene, Ore.)**, who was named to the Second Team, and defender **Beth Liljenberg (So., Portland, Ore.)** and midfielder **Noelle Miller (So., Lake Oswego, Ore.)**, who were Honorable Mention.

Holub is a repeat First Team performer from her freshman year, when she led the NWC in scoring. This season, she finished second in scoring (1.58) to Willamette's Natalie Flindt (1.81). She led the Bruins with 14 goals, one short of the school record she set last year, and 30 total points, the 3rd-best ever in a single season. With 29 goals and 67 points in her two-year career, she already ranks second all-time at GFU for career goals and points, trailing only record-holder Gegi Bonera's 32 goals and 79 points.

Diefenbaugh, a four-year starter (with a year out in 1997 to get married!), was an anchor for this year's defensive unit which only allowed 1.47 goals per game. A versatile player who has seen duty at every position but goalkeeper, she is also a nominee for Academic All-American honors.

Liljenberg, an All-Conference First Team defender and Honorable Mention NAIA All-American last year, had another fine season as a sophomore in helping the Bruins to an 11-8 record. Miller was third on the team in scoring with 5 goals and a team-high 6 assists for 16 points, and was fifth in the conference in assists per game (0.32)

"All four are certainly deserving of recognition," said George Fox coach Byron Shenk. "Karli truly had a wonderful season. Since she led the conference in scoring last year, she was tightly marked all year long, and had to work harder than ever for every goal."

"Megan was a steady player we could count every game. She plays the game very intelligently, and is one of our smartest players, as evidenced by the fact that she's an Academic All-American candidate with a perfect GPA."

"Beth is a tireless, hard worker on defense who just won't quit; I don't think she came out of a game at all until the last few minutes of the season. Noelle brought power and speed to our team, and would have had an even better year if she hadn't been battling injuries all season."

Katie Edmonds of conference champion and 3rd-ranked Willamette, who was third in the conference in scoring (1.38) and first in assists (0.52), was named Northwest Conference "Player of the Year", while Randy Hanson of Puget Sound, which was league runner-up and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Division III Tournament, was named NWC "Coach of the Year."

### **NO. 3 WILLAMETTE DOWN BRUINS 2-1**

**NEWBERG, Ore.** --- Willamette's Buffy Morris scored in the 44th minute for the deciding goal, giving the Bearcats, ranked No. 3 nationally in the NCAA Division III, a 2-1 victory over George Fox in a Northwest Conference match Friday afternoon here at Morse Athletic Field Friday afternoon (Oct. 29).

**Tori Taylor (Fr., M, Portland, Ore.)** helped the Bruins capture the early lead with a goal at 15:47 in the match, **Jen Overstreet (Sr., F, Beaverton, Ore.)** assisting Taylor on the play with a cross pass. However, the lead would not hold up as the Bearcats controlled the play in the match, and held a 19-9 advantage in shots.

Jenny Bellone, who assisted on the winning goal, also set up a Natalie Flindt header at 19:55 to tie the game, before Morris kicked in the winner just before halftime.

"It's always disappointing anytime you lose a match", said Bruins head coach Byron Shenk. "We did play with an improved effort in the second half, but you have to give credit to Willamette because they played a good game. We are extremely frustrated with losing these close matches."

Willamette goalie Anna Haegel continued to show why she is the Northwest Conference's most respected keeper, as she turned away four of George Fox's nine shots. Bruins' keeper **Cori Wulf (Fr., Salem, Ore.)** recorded eight saves to increase her NWC lead in total saves to 120 on the year.

### GEORGE FOX FINISHES SEASON WITH 4-1 WIN OVER LINFIELD

**NEWBERG, Ore.** --- Forward **Karli Holub (So., Pleasant Hill, Ore.)** and midfielders **Valerie Cole (Sr., Eugene, Ore.)** and **Rachel Denning (Fr., Boring, Ore.)** each scored a goal and an assist as George Fox concluded its 1999 season with a 4-1 Northwest Conference win over Linfield Saturday (Oct. 30) at the Morse Athletic Field.

George Fox nabbed the first score at the 19-minute mark when a corner kick from **Jen Overstreet** ended in a goal box scramble and Cole nailed a hard-angled shot to the left post. With one minute left in the half, Cole sent a high cross to forward **Becky Long (Fr., Enumclaw, Wash.)**, who chipped a header for her first collegiate goal.

Linfield's only score came on a somewhat questionable penalty kick.

The Bruins finished the scoring with Holub and Denning assisting each other five minutes apart. At 63 minutes, Holub's drop pass went to a wide-open Denning, who chipped to the right post for a 3-1 George Fox lead. Denning returned the favor at 68 minutes with a center to Holub, who beat an out-of-position keeper to cap the scoring.

The Bruins outshot Linfield 19-10, and allowed only two Wildcat shots in the first half. Keeper Cori Wulf had four saves for GFU.

Three Bruins played the final game of their collegiate careers: Cole, Overstreet, and defender **Megan Diefenbaugh (Sr., Eugene, Ore.)**.

**NEWBERG, Ore.** --- Forward Karli Holub and midfielders Valerie Cole and Rachel Denning each scored a goal and an assist as George Fox University concluded its 1999 season with a 4-1 Northwest Conference win over Linfield College here Saturday (Oct. 30) at the Morse Athletic Field.

George Fox nabbed the first score at the 19-minute mark when a corner kick ended in a goal box scramble and Cole nailed a hard-angled shot to the left post. With one minute left in the half, Cole sent a high cross to forward Becky Long, who chipped a header off the keeper's arm for her first collegiate goal.

Linfield retaliated in the second half when keeper-turned-midfielder Cherish Kaaa converted a penalty kick after a George Fox defender was called for a foul in the box.

The Bruins finished the scoring with Holub and Denning assisting each other five minutes apart. At 63 minutes, Holub's drop pass went to a wide-open Denning, who chipped to the right post for a 3-1 George Fox lead. Denning returned the favor at 68 minutes with a center to Holub, who beat an out-of-position keeper to cap the Bruins scoring.

The Bruins held the offensive advantage, outshooting Linfield 19-10, and allowed only two Wildcat shots in the first half.

Keeper Cori Wulf had four saves for George Fox, while Linfield's Kaaa made five saves before moving to the midfield at 54 minutes.

**NEWBERG, Ore.** --- Willamette University sophomore Buffy Morris scored in the 44th minute for the deciding goal, giving the Bearcats a 2-1 victory over the George Fox University Bruins in a Northwest Conference women's soccer match Friday afternoon here at Morse Athletic Field.

Tori Taylor helped the Bruins capture the early lead with a goal at 15:47 in the match, Jen Overstreet assisting Taylor on the play with a cross pass. However, the lead would not hold up as the Bearcats controlled the play in the match, and held a 19-9 advantage in shots over George Fox.

Jenny Bellone, who assisted on the winning goal, also set up a Natalie Flindt header at 19:55 to tie the game 1-1, before Morris kicked in the go-ahead goal just before halftime.

"It's always disappointing anytime you lose a match", said Bruins head coach Byron Shenk. "We did play with an improved effort in the second half, but you have to give credit to Willamette because they played a good game. We are extremely frustrated with losing these close matches."

Willamette goalie Anna Haegel continued to show why she is the Northwest Conference's most respected keeper, as she turned away four of George Fox's nine shots. Bruins' keeper Cori Wulf recorded eight saves to increase her NWC lead in total saves to 120 on the year.
