THE TERRAIN AT WAINWRIGHT

Some one here in the Village ask me to write something about Wainwright, Alaska.

Alfred K. Wells Sr., Daniel Sheldon, Wilbur Sampson, Isaac S. Smith Sr. and Fred Jackson were hired by Yutan Brice to operate equipment on the airport construction at Wainwright which is situated about 90 miles south east of Pt. Barrow along the Arctic Coast, Pt. Barrow is said to be the Top of The World.

The terrain at Wainwright is flat, I don't mean level, you could get on higher ground and you could see as far as the horizon if the weather is clear, and you wouldn't see a hill or a mountain, not even a willow big enough for a toothpick.

The village itself consist of about 350 people, B.I.A. 2 class room school, Native Store, 2 private owned stores, 1 Poolhall Coffee Shop, 1 Movie Hall and 2 Churches, Assembly and Presbyterian.

People there own underground cold storages, they dig these by hand of course, the shaft itself is about 4' X 4' X 15 to 20' deep and about 8' X 10' room at the bottom, in these they store ice for drinking water during summer and all their fresh meats.
