### **4/22 – ALL-NWC: Bruins' Gonzales Named to All-Northwest Conference First Team**

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Playing match after match against the toughest opponents the Northwest Conference could offer, George Fox University No. 1 player Joe Gonzales made a strong impression on every Bruin opponent with his tenacity and never-say-die attitude on the court. As a result, Gonzales' efforts have earned him a spot on the All-Northwest Conference Men's Tennis First Team for 2002.

Gonzales, a junior from Roseburg, Ore., posted a 4-10 record at #1 singles for the Bruins, and was 3-9 at #1 doubles, playing every match with Derek Dougherty.

**4/19-20 – NWC TOURNAMENT: Neagle Wins Three Times but Bruins Finish 8th**

**YAKIMA, Wash.** – For the George Fox University Bruins, the 2002 Northwest Conference Men's Tennis Tournament played out true to form – the Bruins were seeded 8th, and that is exactly where they finished after dropping all three of their matches here Friday and Saturday (April 19-20).

The Bruins opened tournament play Friday morning against #1 seed Linfield College at West Valley High School, and the Wildcats won every match in a 7-0 win.

Dropped into the consolation bracket, the Bruins took on Willamette University in a consolational semifinal match on the Yakima Tennis Club indoor courts Friday afternoon, and fell 6-1 to the Bearcats. Dave Neagle gave the Bruins their first singles victory with a 7-5, 6-3 win over Greg Ishmael at #2, and Neagle and Jared Jost teamed up to defeat Ishmael and Andrew Behrendt 8-6 at #2 doubles, though Willamette did win the doubles point by taking the other two doubles.

In the 7th-place match, George Fox and Whitworth College met Saturday at the YTC indoor courts, and the Pirates made off with a 6-1 win. Neagle posted his third win for the Bruins with a 6-3, 5-7, (10-8) victory over Tyler Van Horn at #1 singles.

After losing in the tournament finals each of the previous two years, the third time turned out to be the charm for Linfield as the Wildcats defeated the Pacific Lutheran University Lutes 4-3 to claim their first-ever NWC men's tennis tournament title.

### **3/25 – Men's Coaches Involved in Accident on Spring Break Trip with Women's Team**

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Rick and Rob Cruz, the head coach and assistant for the men's and women's tennis teams at George Fox University, were injured in a van accident while traveling with the women's team to California on their spring break trip Saturday morning (Mar. 23).

A tire blowout along Interstate 5 near Redding, Calif., resulted in a loss of control and rollover of the university-owned van carrying nine members of the Bruin women's tennis team.

The accident resulted in injuries to all nine passengers in the van, though none are life-threatening. Three players were airlifted from the scene to nearby Redding hospitals, with all but one person being released Saturday evening.

The most serious injury was to **Kristin Miller**, who suffered a compression fracture of the vertebrae between her shoulder blades and is expected to remain in Redding for several days. Head coach **Rick Cruz** was remaining with her until her parents arrived from Pendleton. Her prognosis is good, as there was no paralysis after the injury.

Others involved in the accident were Cruz and his brother, assistant coach **Rob Cruz**, and players **Keri Ingraham, Rebecca Kromer, Katie Metier, Anne Robinson, Lisa Trefts, and Marcy Walter**. Redding hospital personnel arranged to have all the team members flown home,

with Walter going home with Ingraham. Two other squad members, **Stephanie Selid** and **Heidi Stagge**, were not traveling to California.

The Bruins had stopped in Ashland, Ore., Friday afternoon to play Southern Oregon University, and were on their way to Los Angeles, Calif. According to reports, the van was traveling about 70 miles an hour on the interstate when the left rear tire blew, causing the van to roll over several times along an embankment.

"I haven't seen a police report yet, but from what I've heard, we could have had a number of fatalities if our people had not been wearing their seat belts," said George Fox director of athletics Craig Taylor. "We are very fortunate that what is certainly a serious accident was not nearly as bad as it could have been."

The Bruin women, who are having their best season ever at 6-3, were to have played Occidental College Thursday, Mar. 28, but that match has been cancelled. No decision has been made on the rest of the team's spring season.

"To be honest, that issue has not even come up yet; our number one concern is to be sure everyone is safe and cared for," said Taylor. "I'll sit down with Coach Cruz on Friday to discuss several matters surrounding the accident, and we will probably talk about it then. There were some significant injuries, such as damage to soft tissues and some broken bones, that could weigh heavily in the decision."

Brad Lau, vice-president for student life at George Fox, said in a statement to university personnel and students via e-mail, "I'm sure that I echo our thoughts as a GFU community in thanking God from the very depths of our souls that the accident (while certainly serious) was not near as serious as it could have been. I also trust that our prayers will continue to be with the coaches, students, and their families as they recover from the physical and emotional trauma of the accident. This also serves as another reminder to pray for the many GFU teams, Serve trips, students, faculty members, and staff members who are still traveling over the break."

### **BRUIN BITS:**

#### **\* Gonzales Honored as NWC "Player of the Week":**

**Joe Gonzales (Jr., Roseburg, Ore.)**, the George Fox Bruins' No. 1 player, has been honored as Northwest Conference "Men's Tennis Player of the Week" for Mar. 18-24. In their only match of the week, he led the Bruins to their first win of the season, a 4-3 decision over Pacific, with wins at both #1 singles and #1 doubles. He defeated Tom Chewenda 6-2, 6-4 in singles, and he and **Derek Dougherty (So., Springfield, Ore.)** teamed up for an 8-3 win over Chewenda and Douglas Dang in doubles. Gonzales is 4-2 in singles and 4-1 in doubles this season.

#### **3/21 - GEORGE FOX 4, PACIFIC 3: Bruins Take Top Four Singles from Boxers for First Win**

**FOREST GROVE, Ore.** - Taking the top four singles matches, the George Fox University Bruins captured their first men's tennis match of the season with a 4-3 decision over the Pacific University Boxers here Thursday afternoon (Mar. 21).

The Northwest Conference encounter was the make-up of a match originally scheduled for March 9 but postponed twice by weather.

Pacific opened the match by taking the doubles point. The Boxers' Eric Yukumoto and Scott Sato won over the Bruins' **Dave Neagle (Fr., Canby, Ore.)** and **Jared Jost (Fr., Bellingham, Wash.)** 8-4 at #2, and Jeff Bellerud and David Slick defeated GFU's **Nate Chamberlain (So., Dundee, Ore.)** and **Jeremy Johnston (Sr., Medford, Ore.)** 8-5 at #3. The Bruins' **Joe Gonzales** and **Derek Dougherty** were victorious over Tom Chewenda and Douglas Dang 8-3 at #1.

Bruin singles winners were Gonzales over Chewenda 6-2, 6-4 at #1; Neagle over Bellerud 6-4, 6-1 at #2; Dougherty over Yukumoto 1-6, 6-3, 7-6 (7-6) at #3; and Jost over Jason Kina 6-0, 6-1 at #4. Pacific got wins from Sato over Chamberlain 6-2, 6-2 at #5, and Dang over Johnston 6-4, 6-1 at #6.

George Fox is now 1-5 overall, 1-4 vs. NWC opponents, and 1-2 in NWC tournament seeding matches (the conference does not play a double round-robin schedule, so only one match per opponent counts for the NWC tourney.)

The Bruins take spring break off this week, not returning to the courts until Friday, April 5, when they host Green River Community College in an exhibition. On Saturday, April 6, the Bruins return to conference play, hosting the University of Puget Sound at 10:00 a.m. and Pacific Lutheran University at 2:30 p.m.

### **BRUIN BITS:**

#### **\* Gonzales a Bright Spot at Top of Bruins' Order:**

In the midst of all the battles to improve by a very young George Fox men's tennis team, **Joe Gonzales (Jr., Roseburg, Ore.)** is emerging as one of the best players in the Northwest Conference. As the team's #1 singles player and always one half of the #1 doubles team, Gonzales is constantly paired up against the top talent each opponent has to offer. Facing such challenges, he has put together a 6-3 record in the first half of the season, going 3-2 in singles and 3-1 in doubles. He posted the only George Fox wins in the Bruins' last outing, a 6-1 loss at Lewis & Clark, defeating Chris Upjohn 6-4, 6-3 in singles, and teaming with **Derek Dougherty (So., Springfield, Ore.)** to defeat Upjohn and Brendan Livingston 8-6 in doubles.

#### **BIGGER ROSTER MEANS INCREASED HOPES FOR IMPROVEMENT BY BRUINS IN 2002**

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – With only six players on the team all season (and only five in the first few matches), the George Fox University Bruins were at a decided disadvantage in most of their matches during the 2001 men's tennis season and struggled through a 2-15 campaign. But a 50 percent increase in the roster size and some talented newcomers has head coach **Rick Cruz** and his assistant, twin brother Rob, smiling about the upcoming 2002 season.

"We'll definitely be better," admits Cruz, "although we're certainly not ready to challenge the top teams in the Northwest Conference yet; a couple of them could be regional and even national contenders. We'll probably be more of a 'middle-of-the-pack' sort of team, but that means we are headed in the right direction."

The Bruins lost only one player, Ben Yliniemi, who was 0-17 at #3 singles and 1-16 at #2 doubles, and have four newcomers who could make significant contributions this season.

Heading the list of returnees is **Joe Gonzales (Jr., Roseburg, Ore.)**, who was 7-10 at #1 singles, 5-12 at #1 doubles), and whose experience should enable him to be competitive with most of the top players in the conference. **Derek Dougherty (So., Springfield, Ore.)**, Gonzales' doubles partner, returns after going 4-13 at #2 singles, 5-12 at #1 doubles.

The bottom half of the order also returns with **Nathan Chamberlain (So., Dundee, Ore.)**, who was 1-16 at #4 singles, 2-15 at #2 doubles; **Yu Shoji (So., Tokyo, Japan)**, with a record of 2-15 at #5 singles, 2-13 at #3 doubles; and **Jeremy Johnston (Sr., Medford, Ore.)**, who went 0-15 at #6 singles, 1-14 at #3 doubles.

The top newcomer for the Bruins is **David Neagle (Fr., Canby, Ore.)**, a transfer from Clackamas Community College, which he attended briefly but did not play tennis there.

"David was a state runner-up in high school doubles in Missouri a few years ago, then he went into the military service and also worked for a while, so he's a bit rusty," notes Cruz, "but it's obvious from watching him that he knows the game and is going to be a pretty solid player. He will probably play #2 for us, sliding Derek down to #3."

Also expected to move into the rotation at #4 is **Jared Jost (Fr., Sehome, Wash.)**, moving Chamberlain into the #5 hole. Shoji and Johnston will battle for the #6 slot.

Providing depth for the Bruins will be two more rookies, **Paul Headley (Fr., Newberg, Ore.)** and **Charles Weathers (Fr., Salem, Ore.)**.

Gonzales and Neagle will probably form the #1 doubles team this year, with Dougherty pairing off with Chamberlain at #2, and Jost and Shoji at #3.

"We will certainly be in most matches with our top three," predicts Cruz. "The biggest question for us will be if we are mentally tough enough to pull out those 4-5-6 matches that we had trouble winning last year. Our returning players got some good experience, but several of them were playing in a higher spot than they probably should have been, ability-wise, but they had to. This year, they should have more success because of the level they will be at, and that will go a long way toward boosting their confidence."
