Coach Earl Craven began his coaching career at Friends University in Wichita, Kansas where he remained for six years. Following this he coached at Taylor University in Upland, Indiana for three years and then at William Penn College, Oskaloosa, Iowa for five years. During this time he was president of the NAIA Coaches Association for three years and for five years served on the National Alliance Rules Committee. Craven is now in his second year as head coach at George Fox College.

Coach Terry Haskell comes to George Fox College this season from Olin High School, Olin, Iowa, where he had a successful year as head football, basketball and track coach.

PROSPECTS

In December 1962 the Board of Trustees of George Fox College adopted a policy of "wholehearted support" of the athletic program. The first step to implement this policy was the contracting of a well-known Christian College coach, Earl Craven, who is now Director of Athletics. In the fall of 1963 a very young and small squad gave a fine account of themselves against four varsities and three reserve teams. There is very little basis of competitive experience to predict what they will be able to do on the schedule that faces them in 1964. A brief spring practice session highlighted by a closing full intrasquad game among the total turnout of 32 boys did more to raise football spirits than the actual past season.

Forty-one boys reported for football for the 1964 season, by far the largest in the history of the school. The squad was almost evenly divided between returning men and new enrollees. Of the twenty-one new men only two are transfers. There is only one senior on the squad. A letterman is available at all offensive positions except right halfback. The vigor and enthusiasm with which the boys hit and the tremendous mental and technical progress threatens to create an over confidence which is certainly not justified. The team will almost certainly be giving away size to most of its opponents. There is no outstanding speed. On the plus side, the boys returning give every evidence of genuine sincerity in their task.

Dr. Ross was in pastoral service in the Oregon Yearly Meeting of Friends (Quakers) from 1933 through 1953. From 1953-60 he served as the Minister of THE QUAKER HOUR, radio voice of the Friends Church. He was elected president of George Fox College in 1954 and has led the college in its remarkable period of growth the past decade.

College History and Location

The early Quaker settlers of historic Willamette Valley were conscious that the democratic structure of their church required a well-educated membership. They made provision, therefore, for the education of their children even before the public schools offered many advantages in this part of Oregon.

Pacific Academy was organized in 1885. Herbert Hoover, the thirty-first president of the United States was a student of this early institution. He has said, "As a young student there for three years, I received whatever set I may have toward good purposes in life."

Pacific College was organized in 1891 to provide work more advanced than that which the Academy offered. Pacific Academy was discontinued in 1930, and the educational efforts of the Quakers centered about the college, which came to play an increasing role among the colleges and universities of the West.

Because of confusion resulting from a large number of institutions along the Pacific coast embodying the name "Pacific," the school was in 1949 renamed George Fox College, honoring one of the great leaders in the English Protestant reformation and the founder of the Friends Church.

Accreditation and Membership

George Fox College is accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools, and is a member of the National Council of Accrediting, the Association of American Colleges, the Association of Schools of Religious Education, the Friends Council on Education, and the Association of American Friends Colleges. The College, also, is approved by the Federal Government and the State of Oregon for the education of veterans, by the United States Attorney General for the admission of alien students, and by the Oregon State System of Higher Education for the training of elementary teachers in conjunction with the Oregon College of Education in a joint-degree program.
