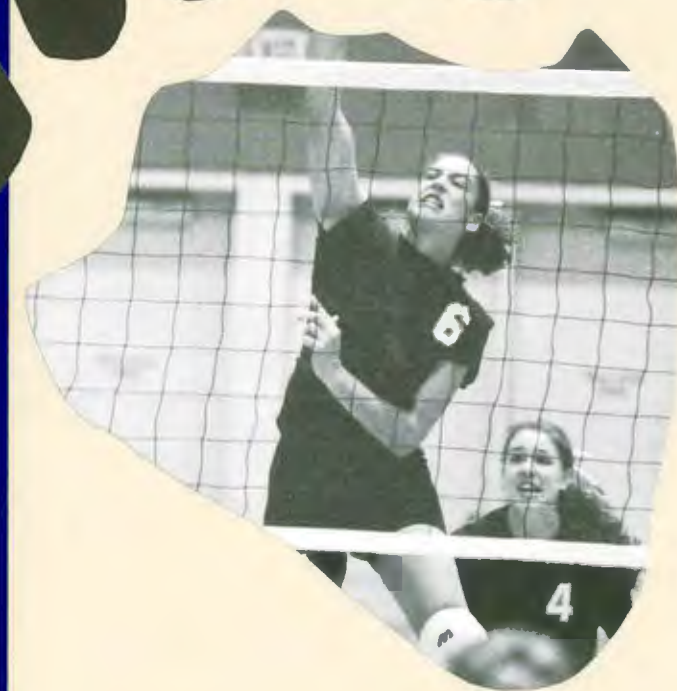

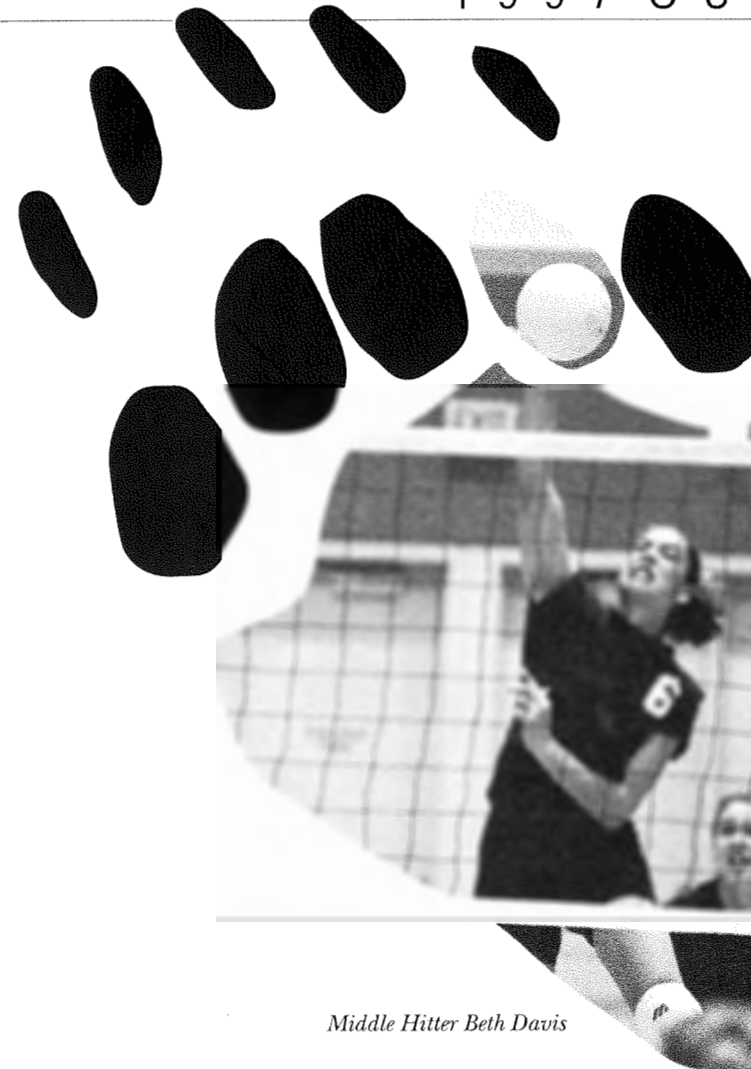

## Depth Makes George Fox a Contender

Three talented transfers and the return of its entire 1996 team makes George Fox a contender for the 1997 Northwest Conference volleyball title.

The Lady Bruins will try to improve on their third-place NCIC finish with additional firepower.

"This is the deepest team we've ever had," says 16th-year head coach Steve Grant. "We have more viable options to go to than in previous years."

Any of his top 10 could start. They have the credentials: seven received all-state honors during their prep careers and his roster is loaded with players who have already proved themselves at the college level.

Setter **Kari Guyer (Sr., North Medford HS, Ore.)** was a Northwest

Conference First Team selection as a sophomore. She enters her final year fourth on the George Fox career assist list.

Outside hitter **Sharon Barnett (So., Salem Academy, Ore.)** led the team in kills (3.7) and digs (4.2) per game last season and was the only freshman selected to the Northwest Conference First Team. Grant hopes his extra depth will allow Barnett to play less and stay healthier.

After earning Northwest Conference Honorable Mention last season, outside hitter **Michelle Harper (Sr., Central HS, Monmouth, Ore.)** put in extra effort this summer to prepare for her senior season. At 6-foot-1, she provides a powerful punch on the left side.

A familiar set of 5-foot-11 identical

twins will be major contributors on the front line. Middle hitter **Amy Schultens (Jr., The Dalles HS, Ore.)** and outside hitter **Jen Schultens (Jr., The Dalles HS, Ore.)** — who earned Northwest Conference Player of the Week honors in 1996 — return after starting for NCIC champion Willamette University last year. Both played for George Fox's 1995 NCIC runner-up squad.

Middle hitters **Charysse Chowning (So., Bend HS, Ore.)**, **Beth Davis (So., Salem Academy, Ore.)** and **Amy Redenius (Jr., Douglas HS, Tenmile, Ore.)** all have been college starters. Davis and Redenius led George Fox in blocks last year. After taking a year off volleyball, Chowning transfers from Linfield College, where she started in 1995.

"Our blocking will be improved over last year," says Grant. "We've particularly improved our blocking on the right side."

Grant will have veterans in the back as well, where new NAIA rules will allow more frequent substitutions.

Defensive specialist **Rachel Evans (Jr., Hawaii Baptist HS, Kaneohe, Hawaii)** was voted George Fox's Most Valuable Defensive Player last season. She'll be joined in the back row by defensive specialist/outside hitter **Coby Van der Meer (Jr., Barlow HS, Gresham, Ore.)** and defensive specialist **Janette Monckton (Sr., David Douglas HS, Portland, Ore.)**.

Capable back-ups will be setter **Jennie Rennie (Jr., Curtis HS, Tacoma, Wash.)** and outside hitter **Angela Powell (So., Roseburg HS, Ore.)**.

No freshmen made the varsity squad this year.

Grant predicts the NCIC will be tougher than last year when Willamette, Puget Sound, George Fox and PLU made up the four-team conference tournament. "We would like to be in contention for the top spot," he says. "But our nemesis might be injuries to a couple key people."

### George Fox Overcomes Inexperience to Reach Playoffs

With just two starters returning from the previous year's conference runner-up squad, seniorless George Fox used a late run to secure its 13th consecutive NAIA postseason appearance.

The Lady Bruins (19-13, 11-5) made the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges tournament by winning six of their final seven conference games, finishing third in the NCIC standings. In the conference semifinal, they lost in the fifth and final game, finishing one match away from returning to the championship match.

The youthful Lady Bruins did it despite losing five full or part-time starters from the year before, including NAIA honorable mention All-American Joanna Lofgren.

Freshman outside hitter Sharon Barnett burst on the scene, winning the team's Most Valuable Offensive Player award and becoming the only freshman to make the NCIC first team. She was named NCIC Player of the Week after helping her team win the Pacific University Invitational Tournament.

Two juniors won Northwest Conference honorable mention: setter Kari Guyer and outside hitter Michelle Harper. Guyer also became just the third George Fox volleyball player to be named to the GTE Academic All-District VIII team.

Sophomore defensive specialist Rachel Evans was named the team's Most Valuable Defensive Player and sophomore defensive specialist Coby Van der Meer took Most Inspirational honors.

**Head Coach  
Steve Grant**

Over the last decade and a half, Steve Grant has established a winning volleyball program at George Fox.

Just once in his 15 seasons has one of his teams finished with a losing record. His teams have a 351-231 (.603) record under his guidance. They've won two National Christian College Athletic Association national championships (1984 and 1987), and each time he was named NCCAA national coach of the year. NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year honors came his way in 1984 and 1990.

George Fox no longer competes in the NCCAA or NAIA District 2, but his teams continue to win. George Fox has finished second and third in the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges the last two years.

During the nineties, three of his athletes have won NAIA All-American awards, two also named NAIA All-American Scholar-Athletes.

Grant took the head volleyball coaching job in 1982. He served as basketball assistant coach until 1995.

Grant is a 1969 graduate of Biola University, where he was a three-sport athlete. As a guard for the basketball team, he was named team MVP both his junior and senior years. He earned first-team all-conference, all-district and all-Far West honors as an Eagle defender on the soccer team and played baseball his freshman and junior years.

After graduation, Grant stayed two years as a basketball and soccer assistant coach.

In 1971, Grant moved to Salem, Ore., to become head boy's basketball coach and head baseball coach at Salem Academy. In 1975, he switched from baseball to volleyball.

At Western Baptist College in 1981-82, Grant coached the women's

basketball team and was head men's soccer coach.

Grant earned a master's degree in education from Linfield College in 1985. In addition to coaching duties, he teaches courses as associate professor of health and human performance.

Grant and his wife, Kathy, live in Newberg and both work at George Fox. Kathy is an admission counselor for the Continuing Education Department. They have two children, Jeff, 25, and Bryan, 22, who is a senior business major at George Fox.

Rueck was an All-League volleyball setter and established assist records at Port Angeles High School in Washington. She also was an All-State basketball guard before she moved on to play basketball at Skagit Valley Community College.

She earned her bachelor of arts degree in elementary education from George Fox in 1995.

Rueck is the reading specialist and teaches middle school language arts and math for the St. Paul School District. She and Scott Rueck, George Fox's women's basketball head coach, were married July 13, 1996. They live in Newberg.

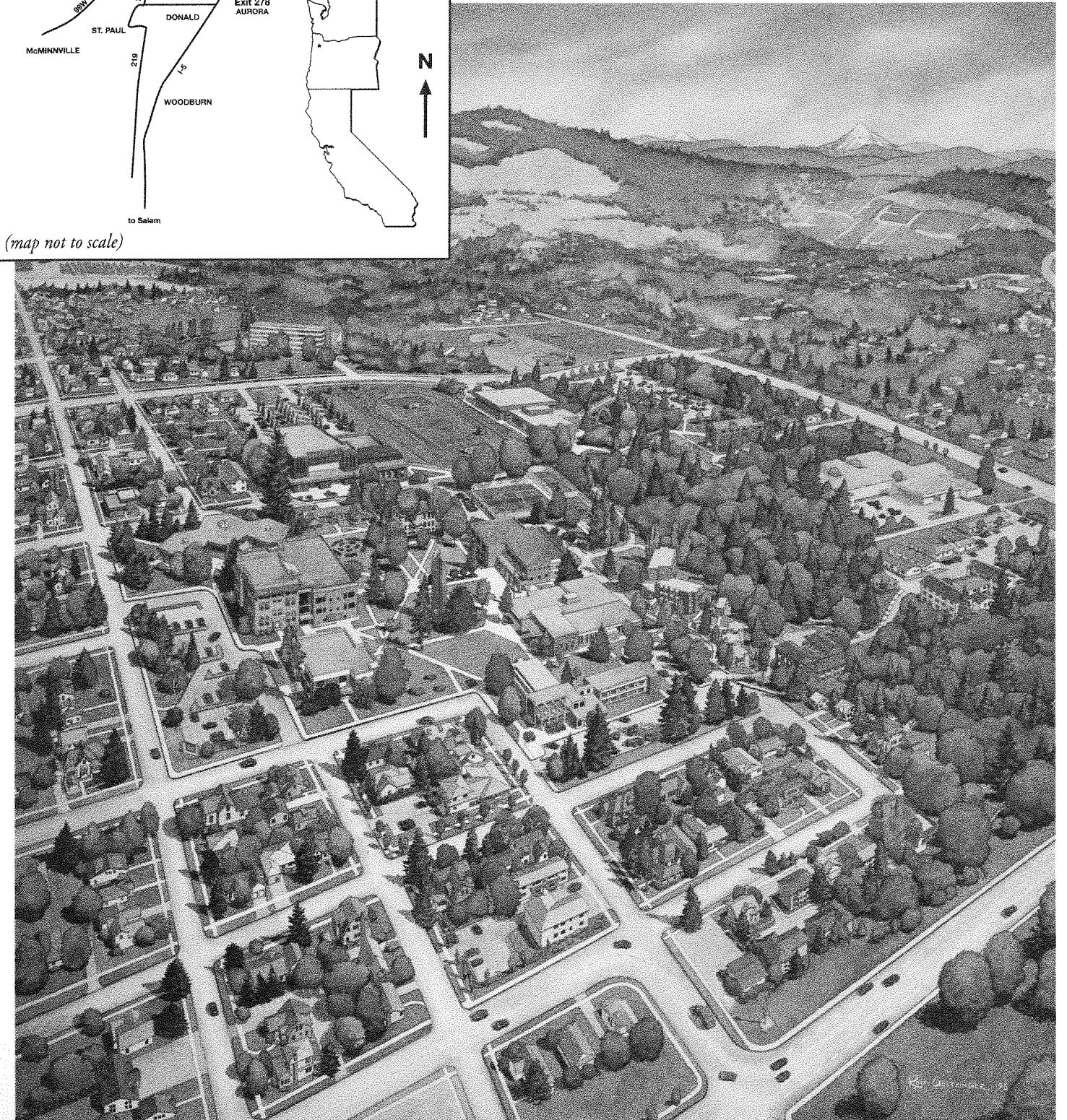
### ROUTES TO THE CAMPUS
