George Fox College, in its 103rd year, is one of America's Best Colleges. Five times it has been given that designation by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. In 1993, GFC was ranked third in academic reputation among western regional liberal arts colleges, including colleges and universities from Oklahoma to Hawaii. The magazine this year also named George Fox to its list of "The Nation's Most Efficient Institutions," second in the West.

This year, for the fifth time, the College was named to the Templeton Foundation Honor Roll for Character Building Colleges, the only Oregon college selected and one of 111 in the United States.

George Fox College is the outgrowth of a desire by early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers to provide a Christian education for their children. Pacific Academy was established in 1885, and the college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. The College is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises nearly 8,000 members in 53 churches in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing colleges.

Enrollment has risen from 549 in 1986 to 1,550 in the fall of 1993, a 184 percent increase.

GFC students come from 30 states and 12 nations. Nearly

40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

The 65-acre rural, tree-shaded campus, a half-hour drive from Portland, has undergone major expansion in recent years with 12 new buildings constructed. The latest academic building is the M.J. Murdock Learning Resource Center, dedicated in 1989. Two new residence halls—Willcuts and Beebe—were opened in 1990 and 1991, respectively. Currently underway is construction of a \$5.3 million science building and renovation of Heacock Commons. Both are part of a \$16 million comprehensive Centennial Campaign through which \$13.5 million already has been raised.

Alumni of George Fox are primarily in service-oriented vocations of Christian ministries, education, social work and medical fields. The College's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

George Fox College maintains one of the Northwest's premier small-college athletic programs. In the past four years, George Fox athletes have earned 47 NAIA All-American awards and 22 academic All-American Scholar-Athlete honors.

In the 1992-93 seasons, nine of 11 George Fox teams qualified for postseason play, with men's cross country, women's cross country and baseball winning NAIA District 2 titles. George Fox has won district titles in six different sports during the 1990s. The women's teams ranked second in the district and 13th in the nation in the NAIA All-Sports

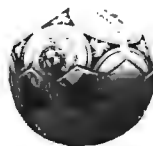


compares programs on postseason finishes. The men's teams were fourth-highest in the district and 35th in the nation.

George Fox's highest national team finish came in the fall of 1992, when the women's cross country team maintained a No. 1 ranking for its entire season before finishing as national runner-up.

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall educational program at George Fox. Men's varsity athletic teams represent the College in baseball, basketball, track, cross country and soccer. Women's teams are fielded in volleyball, basketball, track, softball, cross country and soccer.

For students not participating in the varsity program, a complete intramural program is available, including flag football, basketball, volleyball, racquetball, indoor soccer, skiing, floor hockey and tennis.

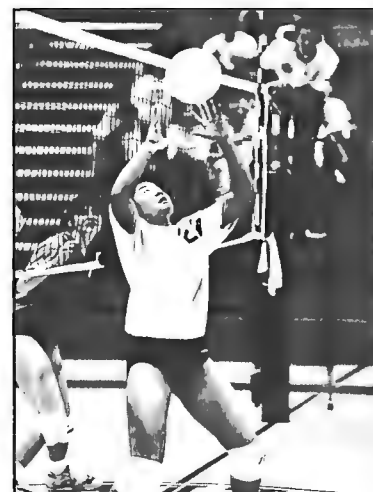

## NAIA

George Fox College joined the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) in 1965. The NAIA is a completely autonomous association administering programs leading to 23 national championships in 13 events. The NAIA includes 33 percent of America's collegiate athletic programs, representing 413 accredited four-year colleges and universities in 32 geographical districts spread over 49 states and Canada. The colleges have a total enrollment of more than 800,000, including approximately 60,000 varsity athletes.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball, the NAIB evolved from the institution of a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" that was inaugurated in 1937. In 1952, the organization was renamed the NAIA.

NAIA national headquarters and staff are located in Tulsa, Okla. The NAIA is governed by two bodies. The Council of Presidents, composed of one president from each district, is responsible for fiscal matters and supervision of the national staff. George Fox College president Edward F. Stevens represented NAIA District 2 from 1987 through 1993 and was one of five U.S. college presidents selected to serve on the NAIA Council of Presidents Executive Committee, serving as chairman in 1992. The national Coordinating Council, elected by the membership, is responsible for organizing championship events, maintaining academic standards, and overseeing the committees and associations.

Eligibility rules within the NAIA govern all play of all sports recognized by the Association, not just post-season play. All eligibility guidelines must be adhered to by all members, including those holding dual affiliation with other associations.

## NAIA DISTRICT 2

### Cascade Conference

George Fox College is competing one final year in NAIA District 2. In 1993, the NAIA voted to eliminate the district format in favor of affiliated conferences. Men's and women's basketball made the switch to conferences this season.

Eleven teams make up the District 2 in baseball, all but two within Oregon. The district is divided into two conferences. George Fox plays in the Cascade Conference along with Albertson College, Concordia College, Eastern Oregon State College, Northwest Nazarene College, Western Baptist College and Western Oregon State College. Members of the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC) are Lewis & Clark College, Linfield College, Pacific University and Willamette University.

A six-team district tournament will be held May 11-13 in McMinnville, Ore. The top three Cascade teams and the NCIC's best two automatically qualify. The sixth is selected from those remaining by best conference record.

## Bruins Ring Up Third District Title

George Fox College's quest for its third consecutive NAIA District 2 baseball title was about as difficult as its season-long quest for dry, playable fields.

Under six-year head coach Pat Casey, GFC hasn't lost a district playoff game in three years – winning 11 in a row. The 1993 Bruins stormed undefeated through three games at the district tournament, but spring rainstorms scrambled the regular season.

An exceptionally damp spring forced the rescheduling of 10 regular-season games and the cancellation of another 10.

The choppy schedule and an ugly 1-8 start against mainly NCAA Division 1 opposition produced doubts if George Fox could become the first district school since 1976 to win more than two titles in a row.

After a 2-0 loss to Northwest Nazarene College in Nampa, Idaho, on April 23, George Fox found itself 4-3 in league play and looking at a long road both home and to the playoffs.

The next day the Bruins swept the Crusaders in a double-header and began a 13-game winning streak that would reach through the district playoffs. George Fox overtook Albertson College of Idaho, which began 9-0 in league, in the final weekend of the regular season by sweeping the Coyotes in a three-game series. That week, shortstop Matt Capka hit 11-23 (.478) with four doubles, one triple, one home run and 13 RBIs, earning NAIA National Player of the Week honors.

Then it was on to Boise, Idaho, for the district tournament. In the championship game, the second-

seeded Bruins used an 11th-inning home run from senior Michael Burton to top No. 1 seed Linfield College 7-6.

Their third try at the Far West Region playoffs held no charm for the Bruins. George Fox hosted the event but had its season ended by the nation's No. 1 and No. 17 ranked teams, Lewis-Clark State and Hawaii Pacific.

George Fox's season ended at 26-16-1 overall and 21-8-1 versus NAIA opponents. Included in the Bruin victories were first-ever wins over NCAA opponents – the University of Washington and the University of Portland – and defending NAIA national champion Lewis-Clark State.

Senior designated hitter Tony Robertson received honorable mention All-American honors and joined sophomore third baseman Mike Nadeau and senior first

baseman Josh Gilbert on the all-district team. Senior pitcher Clark Anderson took honorable mention.

*The Bruins knocked over a few records enroute to their third consecutive NAIA District 2 championship. Most were felled by their bats. Seven Bruins in the starting lineup hit over .300 at the plate. GFC rewrote five team hitting records and set or tied six individual hitting and pitching marks. That potent offense helped George Fox produce its best winning percentage in history: .619. The Bruins' 26 wins is second only to the 29-18 season in 1992.*

### The individual school record breakers:

- Sophomore third baseman **Mike Nadeau**, Portland, scored 59 runs, most in the district. He topped Gary Boyer's 1991 record of 43.
- **Nadeau** also collected the most GFC hits in history with 58. Both he and senior designated hitter **Tony Robertson**, Portland, (55 hits) bested teammate Fernando Pol's 1992 record of 53.
- Senior first baseman **Josh Gilbert**, Portland, came within three of the RBI school record, but logged himself into the records with 24 strikeouts, a tie with 1990 Bruin Tony Downs.
- Senior pitcher **Clark Anderson** pitched more innings than any pitcher in the district or any previous Bruin—86.1. He surpassed 1985 Bruin Greg Mozel, who worked 78.2 innings.
- **Anderson** tied three other GFC pitchers and himself with six wins in a season. He accomplished the same feat in 1992.
- **Anderson's** six complete games tied three other pitchers. The last to go the distance in six games was teammate Rob Gehrke, who did it in 1992.

## Bruins Hope for Four in 1994

After winning three straight NAIA District 2 titles, the 1994 George Fox College baseball team might sense the burden of high expectations.

Not so, says seventh-year head coach **Pat Casey**. "This club is looking for just one district title. It's a new experience for most of these guys."

All but three starters are gone from the teams that stormed without a loss through the last three district tournaments. This year's squad bears little resemblance to the 1993 Bruins whose solid senior core made them preseason district favorites. "This year, we're like everybody else," says Casey. "It takes the pressure off of us. We're trying to find out if we're a mediocre club or a good club."

So what's going to happen in McMinnville in mid-May when the district tournament begins? "If I had to make a guess, I'd say we have as good a chance as anybody," is Casey's answer. "I'd like to think we've made the lineup stronger top to bottom. We'll be different from last year when we had more of a big, power-type situation. This year we'll do more hit-and-run and try to run aggressively. I like the work ethic and the makeup of this club. We're going to be very competitive."

The Bruins lost a huge chunk from their powerhouse lineup that led the district with a .313 batting average. George Fox's two senior all-district players will be difficult to replace. Designated hitter Tony Robertson hit .401 and earned honorable mention All-American honors. First baseman Josh Gilbert led the district with 48 RBIs.

Casey has proved he has a knack for starting from scratch. In 1992, he

took three returning starters and won a school record 29 games. For 1994, he scoured the Oregon and Washington community colleges to restock his cupboards with players capable of keeping the Bruins in championship contention. "We definitely knew we were losing the core of the club," he says. "We put our emphasis on the junior college players. Next year it will be the opposite. Most of our kids will be seniors then, so we'll go for high school players."

### MYSTERY ON THE MOUND

New arms will abound on the Bruin mound. GFC no longer has the services of its three senior starters. Five-game winners Rob Gehrke (52 strikeouts) and Jason Carroll (1.5 shutouts) have moved on, and Clark Anderson joined the San Francisco Giants organization after back-to-back six-win seasons. "They'll be

tough spots to fill," says Casey. "But top-to-bottom, I think we can be as good as last year. We may be better in the middle."

Senior **Tom Bohlman** was solid as the Bruins' top reliever. In 19 innings, the submariner compiled two wins, four saves and a 2.37 earned run average.

Junior **Brian Meyers** (12.0 innings), sophomore **Todd Saperstein** (8.0 innings), and senior southpaw **Brian Berkley** (16.0 innings) all gained experience last season and could receive more time on the hill. **Noel Barnett** redshirted 1993 and could make an impact.

Newcomers to watch include Portland State University transfers **Jeremy Greene** and lefthander **Troy Schrenk**. Mt. Hood Community junior transfer **Brent Wheeler** may find himself a spot in the rotation as a lefty. Casey also picked up a pair of pitchers from Linn-Benton

Community and three from Tacoma Community. **Danny Graham**, a southpaw, **Ben Bodwell** and **Tom Marsh** combined for 16 wins last season at Tacoma, while **Phil Lyman** and **Mark Andersen** both kept their ERAs under 3.00.

## BEHIND THE PLATE

GFC's lack of depth at catcher may be its greatest vulnerability. Casey is counting on **Ryan Corey**, a sophomore transfer from Eastern Oregon State College, to collect the pitches thrown by the mound newcomers. His backup, senior **Eric Nielsen**, came out of knee surgery in December, and Casey would prefer he showed up elsewhere in the field.

## WHO'S ON FIRST

Nielsen will be involved in a three-man battle for playing time at first

base. Sophomore **Brycen Fast**, a 1991 high school USA Today Honorable Mention All-American, can contend after spending last year recovering from shoulder surgery. Sophomore **Scott Mansur** also may earn playing time thanks to his offensive skills.

## INFIELDER'S CHOICES

There's no question that pro prospect **Mike Nadeau** will start for George Fox. Where, is what puzzles Casey. Nadeau has been a defensive gem at third since his freshman season, but the loss of shortstop Matt Capka may force a move.

Junior **Tony Iranshad** last year worked his way into the starting lineup at second. He'll compete with junior transfers **Adam Kershaw** and **Aaron Knots**, both heavy hitters at the plate. Casey expects to shuffle

those four around and will try to squeeze senior **Tate Seals** in occasionally.

## OUTFIELD OVERHAUL

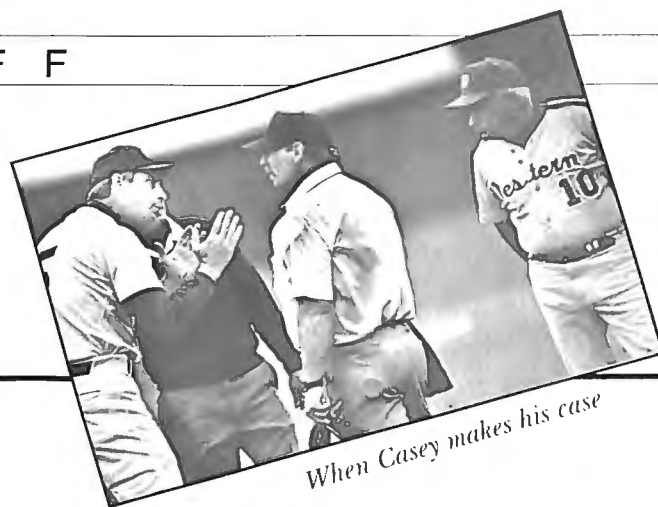
Casey feels the Bruins greatly improved themselves in the outfield this season. "Defensively, we're much better than last season," he says. Four new potential starters give GFC significant depth. Seals could show up here, as could Nielsen and Mansur, but the front runners are junior transfers **Jon Bukowski**, **Kevin Watson**, **Michael Thompson** and sophomore transfer **Chris Wakeland**.

Casey lists Wakeland — the 1992 Oregon 3A Player of the Year — and Watson among the Bruins' top hitters, and Thompson and Bukowski should both be threats to steal as base runners.

### Pat Casey

Baseball at George Fox College hasn't been the same since Pat Casey became the head coach in 1988.

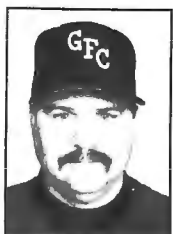
A Newberg High product with seven years of pro baseball experience, Casey has transformed GFC into a Northwest baseball powerhouse. It's been an astounding turnaround. In his first season, he brought George Fox its first winning record since 1974. The three-time NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year enters his seventh season with an impressive 133-56-1 (.703) record versus fellow NAIA opponents. Overall, his teams are 140-100-1 (.583) including games against NCAA opponents. In the six years prior to Casey's arrival, GFC was 36-126-1.

Casey, 34, has a successful baseball background. He was drafted by the San Diego Padres after his junior year at the University of Portland, where he was an all-region left fielder.

With San Diego, he played AA ball in Virginia and Texas; with the Seattle Mariners organization, AAA ball in Calgary. He finished his pro career with the AAA Portland Beavers. A center fielder, he batted over .300 at each level.

Casey, a 1977 graduate of Newberg High, was a Coast Valley League all-star in baseball, basketball and football.

In addition to coaching, Casey works in his family's real estate business. Casey and his wife, Susan, have three children: Jonathan, 8, Brett, 7, and Ellie, 3.



### Ron Northcutt

Ron Northcutt has assisted Casey since 1988, but the connection between the coaches goes back farther.

Northcutt, 34, and Casey played baseball together at Newberg High and both graduated in 1977. Northcutt was a first team all-league infielder. After taking first-team all-league honors at Clackamas Community, he rejoined Casey at the University of Portland.

Northcutt assisted at Newberg High for five years. He became GFC's pitching coach in 1991. Ron and his wife, Linnea, have one son: Ben, age 2.



### Tim Casey

A younger brother of Pat, Tim joined the Bruin coaching ranks in 1993. Tim spent eight years playing for the Houston Astros, Oakland Athletics and Milwaukee Brewers organizations. The outfielder was drafted by the Brewers after playing 1982-84 at the University of Portland. His 32 career home runs for the Pilots puts him second in U of P records.

Tim and his wife, Carrie, have three children: Austin, 7, Loren, 4 and Ryan, 2.



### Darrell Dirks

One of GFC's top four-year pitchers, Darrell Dirks has assisted the Bruin pitchers since 1993.

Dirks, a 1993 grad, compiled a 13-4 record for the Bruins between 1989 and 1992.



### Matt Capka

Matt Capka, a four-year GFC starter, will assist the Bruin infielders in 1994 while completing his bachelor's degree. Capka, a two-time district honorable mention infielder, was named NAIA National Player of the Week for May 3-8, 1993.

### Statistician - Mike Booth

Mike Booth, NAIA District 2 Information Director, will keep Bruin stats for his fourth straight year.

### Craig Taylor

Craig Taylor is in his sixth year as George Fox College Athletic Director, but he has been associated with the Bruins for 20 years as player, coach and professor.

Taylor, 42, graduated from George Fox in 1974 after playing two seasons on the Bruin basketball and baseball teams. He received a Master of Science degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a residence hall director at GFC.

The AD was the coach of the GFC's women's basketball teams from 1981 to 1993, producing a 162-155 record. From 1976 through 1979, Taylor was the Bruin baseball coach while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm from 1979 to 1981. He coached GFC softball from 1981 to 1988, and again in 1990. His teams compiled a 77-99-1 record, and in 1985, he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

Taylor is a member of the NAIA District 2's Executive Committee, serving since 1985. In 1992, he was named NAIA District 2 Male Athletic Administrator of the Year.

At George Fox, the athletic director is responsible for athletic department functions, including eligibility and compliance with GFC and NAIA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management.

Taylor has three children: Leah, a 19-year-old sophomore at GFC, Bree, 14, and Casey, 4. He and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville.



### Rob Felton

Rob Felton is in his second year as Sports Information Director for George Fox's 11 athletic teams. A 1992 GFC graduate with a degree in communication arts, Felton was a GFC Sports Information Assistant for three years. Felton, 23, replaced

Barry Hubbell, who held the position since 1970. Hubbell remains in a supervisory role as Executive Assistant to the President. The GFC Sports Information Office has produced 26 national award-winning publications in the last 12 years. Most recently, the 1993 baseball media guide earned fourth in a contest sponsored by the NAIA Sports Information Directors Association.

In 1993, Felton was also given the title of Assistant Director of Public Information.

A 3.8 honors student, Felton was named Outstanding Student in Communication Arts and to *Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities*. He was sports editor for the student newspaper, *The Crescent*, for two years and editor as a sophomore.



### Steve Curtis

Steve Curtis is in his seventh year as trainer for the baseball Bruins. A 1982 GFC graduate with a degree in physical education, Curtis received a master's degree in teaching from Portland State University in 1987. He is a certified athletic trainer by the Board of Certification of the National Athletic Trainers Association.

Curtis, 34, was head trainer, teacher and activities director at Franklin High School, Portland, prior to joining the GFC athletic staff. He is a native of Monmouth, Ore., and a graduate of Salem Academy. During the 1982-83 school year, he served as assistant coach for the track Bruins.

Curtis was the NAIA District 2 hammer throw champion for three consecutive years, 1980-82, finishing 11th and 12th nationally in the event. He also was third in the district in the discus his senior year, when he was named the Bruin MVP.

During the summer of 1993, Curtis was the trainer for Portland's professional roller hockey team, The Rage. At GFC, Curtis not only is an athletic trainer but an instructor in physical education, teaching athletic training classes and the exercise science classes. He and his wife, Karen, live in Portland and have three children: Christopher, 7, Kendall, 4, and Caitlin, born June 6, 1993.

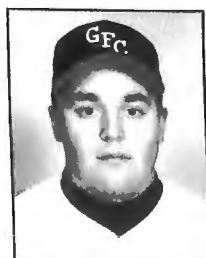

### CURTIS AND MARGARET MORSE COMPLEX

George Fox College baseball, soccer and softball teams have played home games on the Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Complex since 1989.

Across from Wheeler Sports Center on Fulton Street and Villa Road, the complex was renovated using a \$40,000 donation from Curtis and Margaret Morse. Using labor from Volunteers on Wheels, new dugouts and a press box were constructed for the baseball field.

The Morse family has a long association with George Fox. Four generations have attended the Newberg college.

The baseball diamond was moved to the current location in the early '80s when construction on Bauman Auditorium displaced the old field. For two straight

seasons — while the new field was being put in — George Fox played all games on the road.

The baseball facility continues to improve yearly. In 1991, Smurfit Newsprint Corp., Newberg, donated all lumber for an indoor hitting facility located in the north-west corner of the complex.

The baseball Bruins are tough to beat at Morse Field. George Fox lost just one home game last season, and in the last three seasons has lost just twice to a visiting NAIA opponent.

Field dimensions are 335 feet down the left field line, 375 in the left center field alley, 400 to straight away center, 370 in right center and 330 down the right field line.

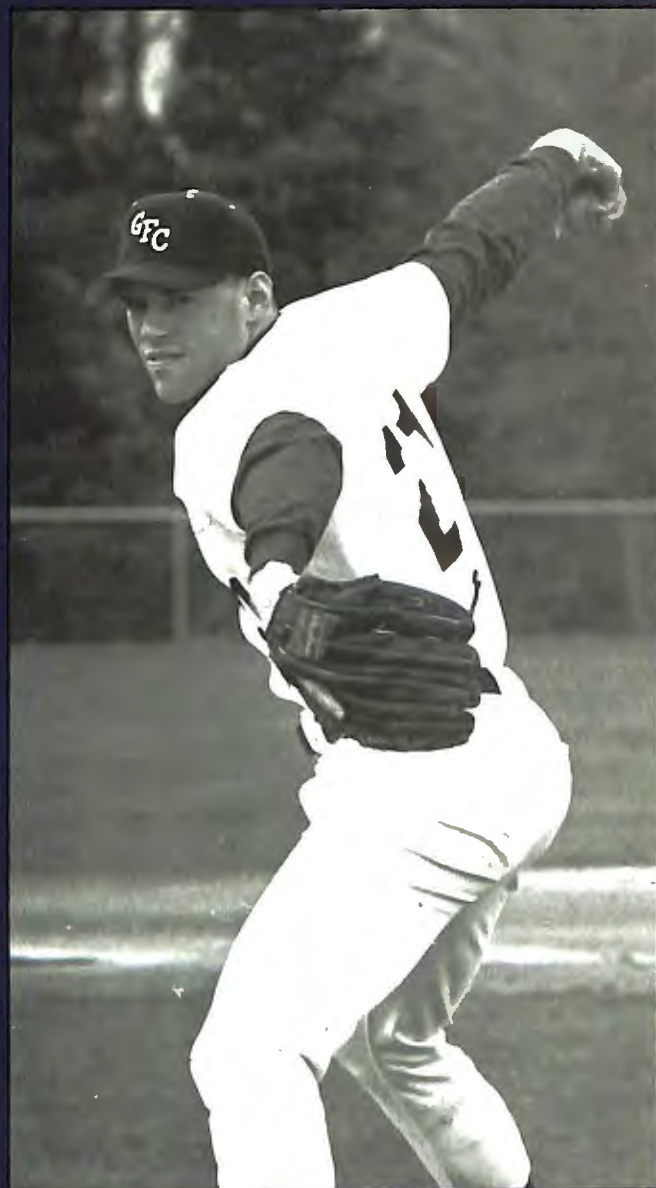
