Cascade Conference Honors Five From George Fox Softball

The Cascade Conference honored five George Fox softball players, including two first team selections, on the 1995 all-conference team.

Pitcher **Sarah Swanson (Fr., Beyer HS, Modesto, Calif.)**, the conference earned run average leader, and infielder **Melanie Parker (Sr., Richland HS, Wash.)** both made the first team.

Swanson's ERA was 1.66 in 67.1 innings pitched. Her record was 5-4.

Parker had George Fox's best slugging percentage at .466. She hit .301 and collected a team-leading 20 RBIs, five doubles and 22 hits.

Given honorable mention were third baseman **Jeanette Jacobson (Thurston HS, Springfield, Ore.)**, catcher **Angie Jordan (Sr., Thurston HS, Springfield, Ore.)** and designated hitter **Allison Vaubel (Fr., Gervais HS, Ore.)**.

Jacobson led the conference with two home runs and had a .431 slugging percentage. Her high school and college teammate, Jordan, hit four triples in 1995, tying for third-most in the conference. Both finished their senior years with identical .227 batting averages.

Even as a freshman, Vaubel led the Lady Bruins in batting average, .357. She had 15 hits in 42 at bats.

Coming off a conference and district championship season in 1994, the young George Fox squad finished the season 10-15.
