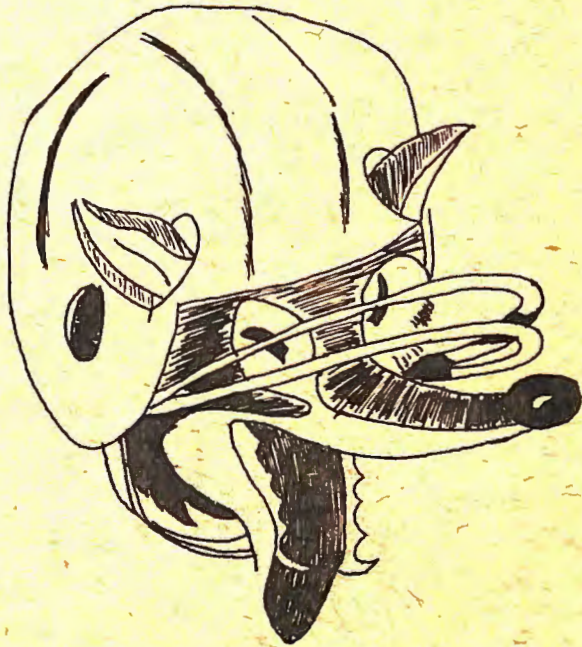

## Coaching Staff

Head Coach Robert Shoup, 33, graduated from the University of California at Santa Barbara after spending two years as a quarterback at Muir College in Pasadena. His MS degree is from USC. An advocate of a wide open passing game, a tough defense, Shoup coached prep ball at Santa Barbara High School and at North Torrance High School. His North High teams rose to prominence in the South Bay area. Twice he was named "Coach of the Year." After six seasons at North, he was the Dean of Bay Area coaches at only 29. Shoup and his wife, Helen, have two children—Ricky, 7, and Gregory, 3.

Backfield Coach Jim Kallas graduated from St. Olaf College and has done advanced work at Luther Seminary, Sorbonne, and University of Durham in England. A great prep and college halfback, Kallas played with the Chicago Bears and Cardinals. A Phi Beta Kappa and 12 sport letterman in college, he is currently Division Chairman and Associate Professor in Theology at CLC. Kallas and his wife, Darlene, and four children live on campus in Mt. Clef Village.

Line Coach Don Garrison has never coached a losing team since graduating from Idaho State College in '56. He has been at North High and Oceanside High. Currently Garrison is finishing his graduate work at ISC. Garrison heads the wrestling program at CLC. He and his wife, Pat, and their four children, live in Thousand Oaks.

Junior Varsity Coach John Hansen graduated from Eastern Washington and has an MA from the University of Idaho. Hansen has had 12 years prep coaching experience and recently has been at Camarillo and Thousand Oaks High Schools. Hansen and wife, Anita and family live in Thousand Oaks.

Assistant Junior Varsity Coach George Engdahl is a '65 CLC graduate. He lettered three years in football, was letterman president and ASB president as a senior. Engdahl and his wife, Sibyl live in Thousand Oaks.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH - - - - Earl L. Craven

Coach Earl L. Craven, B.A. George Fox College; M.S. Kansas State University, began his coaching career at Friends University in Wichita, Kansas where he remained for six years. Following this he coached at Taylor University in Upland, Indiana for three years, and then at William Penn College, Oskaloosa, Iowa for five years. During this time he was president of the NAIA Coaches Association for three years, and for five years served on the National Alliance Rules Committee. Craven is now in his third year as head coach at George Fox College.

ASSISTANT FOOTBALL COACH - - - - Terry Haskell

Coach Terry Haskell, B.A. William Penn College; Graduate work at University of Iowa, came to George Fox College one year ago after a successful season as head football, basketball, and track coach at Olin High School, Olin, Iowa.

## COLLEGE HISTORY AND LOCATION

The early Quaker settlers of historic Willamette Valley were conscious that the democratic structure of their church required a well-educated membership. They made provision, therefore, for the education of their children even before the public schools offered many advantages in this part of Oregon.

Pacific Academy was organized in 1885. Herbert Hoover, the thirty-first president of the United States, was a student of this early institution. He has said, "As a young student there for three years, I received whatever set I may have toward good purposes in life."

Pacific College was organized in 1891 to provide work more advanced than that which the Academy offered. Pacific Academy was discontinued in 1930, and the educational efforts of the Quakers centered about the college, which came to play an increasing role among the colleges and universities of the West.

Because of confusion resulting from a large number of institutions along the Pacific coast embodying the name "Pacific," the school was in 1949 renamed George Fox College, honoring one of the great leaders in the English Protestant reformation and the founder of the Friends Church.
