## Bruins Claim District, Area Titles

In 1993, the George Fox men's soccer team shed the runner-up role that's haunted it since 1988 and, in its most successful season ever, advanced to its first NAIA national tournament.

Five of the past six years, George Fox proved itself one of the top two small-college teams in Oregon and Idaho and played in the NAIA District 2 championship game. Twice the Bruins went to overtime, and once GFC was later awarded a forfeit win, but not until 1993 did George Fox take the title on the field.

"We have established ourselves as one of the top NAIA teams in the Northwest—period," said head coach Manfred Tschan, 1993 District 2 and Area 1 Coach of the Year. GFC, with no senior starters and a completely reorganized defense, finished the season 18-5.

"It goes down as one of those years you'll always remember," says Tschan. "What we accomplished on the field is only a minor reason for it. I think about the spirit we had on the team, the closeness, the togetherness, the uniformity of purpose. It made it fun even when things didn't go well. The leadership was better than it's probably been on most teams I've coached. The guys who were expected to be leaders took the role seriously and reached out to everybody."

After knocking off seventh-ranked Concordia College 2-1 for the district title, GFC needed overtime to get by Simon Fraser University 2-0 for its

first-ever NAIA Area 1 championship.

From there, GFC went as the Northwest's representative to the 12-team national tournament. The Bruins received the worst possible seed and ran into the NAIA's No. 1-ranked team—undefeated Lynn University of Florida—in the first game. On a controversial referee call, GFC's goalie Jeff Nelson was ejected for a handball outside the box, and

the Bruins played a man short for three-fourths of the game. The shorthanded Bruins became just the sixth team to score on Lynn, but fell 8-1. In the second game of pool play, Bloomfield College in New Jersey slipped by George Fox 2-1 on a penalty kick in the final two minutes.

"We probably played our two worst games back-to-back," Tschan now says. "We were sluggish and we were slow."

Defense carried the Bruins through the record-breaking regular season. It cost Tschan, who promised to buy his team steak dinners if they broke the school record of 10 shut-outs in a season. The Bruins outdid themselves, holding their opponents scoreless 15 times and allowing a record-low 12 regular-season goals.

The young George Fox squad opened the season with an unexpected seven-game winning streak over NAIA opponents from Washington and California and appeared in the NAIA top-20 rankings. After a three-game skid, GFC rode an 11-game win streak into the national playoffs. During the second streak, the Bruins outscored their opponents 27-2, both goals coming on penalty kicks.

"The main thing that made it memorable was that absolutely nobody expected anything from us because we had lost six seniors," says Tschan. "When you lose half your starters, it's hard to come back and do as well or better. But that's what we did."

## Seniors Hope for Return Trip to National Tournament

The task of defending George Fox's status as the top NAIA men's soccer team in the Northwest returns to the same players who earned it in 1993.

While NAIA Area I now goes by the name Pacific Northwest Region, the players who won the championship game last year are the same. The entire GFC starting unit that blanked a school-record 15 opponents while surging into the College's first-ever NAIA national tournament is back.

GFC's preseason position is a complete reversal from 1993, when a young Bruin squad entered the year riding darkhorse status and a completely remodeled defensive unit.

"It's a unique situation to have 18 players returning from a championship team," says a confident but cautious sixth-year coach Manfred Tschan. He knows the title makes GFC the target. "We're the rabbit not the hunter. We're very much aware of the fact there are many teams out there who can beat us. I expect our players have a good understanding of how small a difference there is between winning and losing. We know we're going to need every ounce of experience and talent if we want to repeat as regional champions."

Tschan touts a major team strength as its defense — which last

year held GFC opponent offenses to below half of the Bruin scoring total (51-23). On the goal line is 1993 NAIA third-team All-American goalkeeper Jeff Nelson (Sr., North Medford HS, Ore.). An athletic leaper, Nelson last season sported the fourth-lowest goals-allowed-per-game average (.71) among NAIA goalkeepers and tied for most shutouts (14). "He's the best one I've been around," says Tschan.

Right in front of Nelson played Jai Cook (Sr., Willamette HS, Eugene, Ore.), who took NSCAA/Umbro third team All-American honors as a sweeper. Cook, a converted midfielder, may move back to his original position to take advantage of his ability to play both ways.

It fits with what Tschan says is a common trait among the Bruins. "The main strength of the team is we have people who are willing to accept roles and be disciplined."

Tschan matches the Bruins' talents to the team style of play. "We have great team speed compared to most teams," says Tschan. "And we play fast. If you have an 80-mile-an-hour team, you don't play at 50 miles an hour. This team was best suited to play wide-open. I like to train them to play wide-open and to survive

when they're isolated offensively or defensively."

George Fox attacks with three forwards rather than the more-conservative two-forward approach that most of its opponents use. One of the trio up front this season may be two-time NAIA honorable mention All-American Greg Pflieger (Sr., Battle Ground HS, Wash.). Pflieger has led all West Coast NAIA players in scoring each season since showing up as a fleet-footed freshman in 1991.

Despite the luxury of 18 returners, Tschan predicts a few freshman possess the talent to make the starting unit. "We have some players very much in the George Fox mold, guys who may not have been all-everything in high school, but they're still hungry and still have goals to achieve. They recognize they have an opportunity to go as far as they want. We're getting the types of people who are looking for a good education first and a good soccer team second."

Tschan thinks GFC's three senior All-Americans have a chance to continue their sport professionally in the U.S or possibly Europe. "It's a possibility with the several leagues running. Those three might have the talent to play past college."

### CONFERENCE INFORMATION

George Fox is in its first and last year in the unofficial Cascade Collegiate Conference (CCC) and will join the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC) in 1995.

Because CCC does not have the required number of men's soccer teams, the NAIA does not recognize it as a conference but labels it an independent section. Until this season, members of both the NCIC and CCC were a part of NAIA District 2. The district format by which teams qualified for NAIA national tournaments has been eliminated in favor of affiliated conferences. Also different are the 10 NAIA areas, now converted into eight regions. The Pacific Northwest Region playoffs will include the champion of the CCC, NCIC, the Pacific Northwest Athletic Conference, and an at-large team with the highest "Longo" rating (an NAIA rating system based upon record, scores and national ratings). The 12-team national tournament will include each regional champion, the host institution and at-large selections.

Members of the CCC are George Fox, Concordia and Western Baptist of Oregon; Albertson and Northwest Nazarene of Idaho; and Westminster of Utah.

The Swiss coach's six years with the GFC staff are highlighted by one NAIA national tournament appearance and two Christian college (NCCAA) national championships.

During his five-year tenure as head coach, the Bruins have become regulars in the NAIA District 2 championship game, never finishing lower than second among Oregon and Idaho NAIA teams. Since 1989, his George Fox teams have compiled a record of 72-27-5, with an impressive winning percentage of .727.

In 1993, he became the first GFC coach to earn the NAIA District 2 and Area 1 Coach of the Year awards.

A former player in the Swiss First Junior and First Amateur divisions, the 38-year-old coach has 11 years of coaching experience. Prior to settling in Newberg, Tschan held head coaching positions at Concordia College in Portland and the University of Oregon. During his two seasons at UO, Tschan guided the fledgling women's program to a No. 4 Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America national ranking and into the 1981 national tournament.

An assistant professor of health and human performance, Tschan earned a Bachelor of Science degree in education in Switzerland, received a Master of Science degree in motor learning from UO, and has completed Ph.D course work in sports psychology. He is fluent in German, French and English and has been published in numerous journals and newspapers in Switzerland and the U.S.

Manfred and his wife, Vicki, have two children: Twila, 4, and Heidi, 2.

Tim Tsohantaridis brings professional soccer experience and a ministerial background to the Bruins.

A Greek-born U.S. citizen, he has played with the Rhode Island Oceaners of the American Soccer League; the New England Teamen of the North American Soccer League; the Rhode Island Rangers of the Coastal Soccer League; and the U.S. select team.

As a high school senior, he was selected for an exhibition game in which he was matched up against soccer legend Pelé. He later played and coached soccer at Barrington College in Rhode Island.

Tsohantaridis has worn plenty of hats during his seven years at George Fox. On the soccer coaching side, the 40-year-old mentor has held three different titles. He came aboard in 1985 as an assistant, was named head field coach the next season, and in 1989 shared the co-coach title with Tschan. While under his tutelage, the Bruins made three National Christian College Athletic Association national tournament appearances and won the 1988 national title. His four-year record totaled 50-23-4. After a two-year stint as pastor of a Greek Evangelical Church in Massachusetts, Tsohantaridis returned to George Fox as an assistant.

In the academic field, he is an assistant professor of religion with a B.A. from Barrington and an M.A. from Ashland Theological Seminary. From 1986 to 1990, he served as George Fox's chaplain.

Tim and his wife, Valerie, have two children: Demetrius, 14, and Thaddeus, 12.

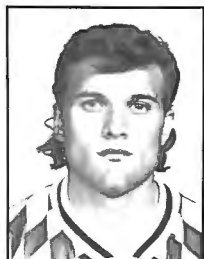


**Charlie Harrell**
