1994 NAIA MEN'S SOCCER ALL-AMERICA SCHOLAR-ATHLETES ANNOUNCED

Tulsa, Okla. -- A total of 79 individuals have been named 1994 NAIA Men's Soccer All-America Scholar-Athletes as selected by the NAIA Men's Soccer All-America Scholar-Athlete Committee.

The NAIA All-America Scholar-Athlete program recognizes excellence in the classroom as well as the field of play. All-America Scholar-Athletes for men's soccer must be juniors or seniors who have completed the first term of attendance in their junior year and have been in attendance at their nominating institution for a minimum of two full terms. They must have at least a 3.50 cumulative grade point average on a 4.00 scale.

SIMON FRASER'S HOLMES NAMED MEN'S SOCCER REGION PLAYER OF YEAR

Daryl Holmes of Simon Fraser University has been named the player of the year in the Pacific Northwest Region for men's soccer. The all-region team was chosen recently by the region's selection committee.

Holmes, a senior midfielder from Nelson, New Zealand, led the Clansmen to the league title in the Pacific Northwest Athletic Conference with an 8-0-1 record. SFU emerged as the champion in the PNWAC league playoffs and the regional playoffs, and advanced to the national tournament. SFU finished the season with a 12-5-3 record (not including a spit of two pool play matches at the national tournament). Holmes was earlier selected as the PNWAC's player-of-the-year.

GFC Soccer Seniors Waste No Time Getting to Work after Graduation

There was little time for three senior members of the George Fox College men's soccer team to savor graduation Saturday (April 29). They worked that night, when their professional soccer teams played each other in Yakima, Wash.

All started as the Cascade Surge defeated the Yakima Reds 3-1. One grad, Yakima forward Greg Pflieger, scored the lone Reds goal on another graduate, Surge goalkeeper Jeff Nelson.

Following the 2 p.m. commencement exercises on the Newberg, Ore., campus, the Yakima Reds paid for the three players to take a dual-propeller plane from the Newberg Airport at 4:15 p.m.

Two of the three play for the Yakima Reds and the other is a member of Salem's Cascade Surge.

Nelson of Medford, Ore., is a goalkeeper for the Surge. The three-time NAIA All-American this year was named the NAIA's National Goalkeeper of the Year by the Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America.

Playing for the Reds is Pflieger of Battle Ground, Wash., and midfielder Jim Maine of Yakima. Pflieger began the season with the Surge, but recently transferred to the Reds. Pflieger is a three-time NAIA All-American and has led all West Coast NAIA players in scoring for the last four years.

Maine started the season with the Reds and scored their first goal.

They weren't the only former George Fox players on the field. 1992 graduate Marc Waits also plays for the Reds.

Both the Surge and the Reds are part of the United Systems of International Soccer Leagues (USISL).

Nelson Named NAIA National Goalkeeper of the Year by ISAA/adidas

National Goalkeeper of the Year is the title the Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America has given George Fox College senior goalkeeper Jeff Nelson.

The 5-11 athlete from North Medford High School in Medford, Ore., is the top goalie in the NAIA according to the ISAA.

With awards sponsored by adidas, the ISAA honors the top field player and goalkeeper at five levels of college soccer. Other ISAA goalkeeper award winners were David Kramer, Fresno State (NCAA Div. I); Mark Albertus, Presbyterian College (NCAA Div. II); Malleh Sallah, Bethany College, (NCAA Div. III); and Geolge Azcurra, Mercer Community College (junior college).

In 1994, Nelson allowed just 14 goals in 16 games for No. 9-ranked George Fox (15-3). He shut out eight opponents.

In his four-year collegiate career, Nelson has won six All-American awards. Already this year he's been named an NAIA first team All-American by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and Umbro, an NAIA academic All-American Scholar-Athlete, an adidas Scholar Athlete soccer All-American and a second team All-American by the NAIA.

He also was named first team NAIA Far West Region and first team Cascade Collegiate Conference. Twice he was named Cascade Collegiate Conference Goalie of the Week.

A business major, he has earned an accumulative 3.52 grade point average.

In 1993, he was named an NAIA third team All-American and tied for most shutouts in the NAIA (14). He had the fourth-lowest goals-allowed-per-game average in the NAIA (.71). In 1992, he was an NAIA honorable mention All-American.

Nelson Named Men's Soccer NSCAA/Umbro First Team All-American

The awards keep getting bigger for George Fox College senior goalkeeper Jeff Nelson (North Medford HS, Ore.).

The 5-11 athlete has been named an NAIA first team All-American by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and Umbro. He's the only goalkeeper on the first team and the only Northwest player listed on the top three teams.

The NAIA already this season named Nelson a second team All-American, previously the highest honor ever given to a GFC soccer player. He also was named first team NAIA Far West Region and first team Cascade Collegiate Conference.

In 1994, Nelson allowed just 14 goals in 16 games for No. 9-ranked George Fox (15-3). He shut out eight opponents. Twice he was named Cascade Collegiate Conference Goalie of the Week.

Nelson holds George Fox goalkeeper records for best season goals/game average (.71 in 1993); best career goals/game average (.92 1991-94); most career shutouts (34); fewest goals allowed in a season season (1⁴ in 199⁴) and most shutouts in a season (14 in 1993).

GFC Men's Soccer Ranks High in National NAIA Statistics

For the fourth straight year, George Fox College's Greg Pfleger (Sr., Battle Ground HS, Wash.) has led all West Coast NAIA soccer players in scoring.

Pfleger, who scored 19 times in 18 games, was ranked 15th in the nation in goals per game (1.06). No players west of Texas scored more goals, and Pfleger ranked second among the nation's midfielders in scoring. Pfleger this season was named an NAIA third team All-American, and was the Cascade Collegiate Conference Player of the Year.

In his career, Pfleger has scored 84 goals in 77 games and made 23 assists.

In 1993 he was the 10th-highest scorer in the NAIA (22 goals, 7 assists) and was NAIA honorable mention All-American and NAIA District 2 Player of the Year. In 1992 he was the 11th-highest scorer in the NAIA (21 goals, 6 assists) and won NAIA honorable mention All-American honors. As a freshman in 1991, he was the eighth-highest scorer in the NAIA (22 goals, 4 assists).

GFC goalkeeper Jeff Nelson (Sr., North Medford HS, Ore.) ranked seventh nationally in goals allowed per game. Nelson this season became GFC's highest honored soccer player as an NAIA second team All-American. He allowed .88 goals in 16 games and shutout eight opponents.

As a team, George Fox had the third-best defense in the nation, giving up just .89 goals a game. Offensively, the Bruins finished 11th in the NAIA, scoring 3.5 goals a game.

George Fox completed a 15-3 season as the No. 9 ranked team in the NAIA.

George Fox Men's Soccer Puts Five on Conference All-Star Team

The George Fox College men's soccer team dominated the Cascade Collegiate Conference all-star team, putting five players on the first team.

Midfielder Greg Pfleger (Sr., Battle Ground HS, Wash.) was named Player of the Year. Pfleger, a two-time NAIA honorable mention All-American, led the conference in scoring with 19 goals and six assists. Pfleger scored 84 goals in his four-year career, leading all West Coast NAIA goal scorers each of his first three seasons.

Goalkeeper Jeff Nelson (Sr., North Medford HS, Ore.) was the lone goalie selection on the first team. Nelson allowed just 14 goals (.816 a game) this season and collected eight shutouts. Nelson was an NAIA All-American third-team selection last year.

Sweeper Jai Cook (Sr., Willamette HS, Eugene, Ore.), a 1993 NAIA honorable mention All-American, earned first-team conference honors as a defender. Cook anchored a defense that allowed just 16 goals in 18 games.

Mike Nadeau (Sr., Reynolds HS, Portland, Ore.) and Ian Reschke (Jr., Lindbergh HS, Renton, Wash.) made up half of the all-conference forwards. CHAT WITH TSCHAN: (Comments from sixth-year Manfred Tschan, 1993 NAIA District 2 and Area 1 Coach of the Year)

On Evergreen: "It's always good to start with a win. The shutout was gravy. I still saw a lot of things that looked suspiciously like early season. We were a little too cautious in midfield. (Midfielder) **Jim Maine (Sr., Eisenhower HS, Yakima, Wash.)** found his game in the second half. He won a lot of balls. (Defender) **Steve Sterhan (Jr., Milwaukie HS, Ore.)** played the most solid game of anybody. For being injured and not practicing, (goalkeeper) **Jeff Nelson (Sr., North Medford HS, Ore.)** had a great game."

"The newcomers got their first taste and they all did well. Now we can put some more things together. We have a ways to go."

On Fresno Pacific: "They were the most skillful team we played last year. They have a lot of South and Central American players. They are dangerous one-on-one. Last year (in California) in the heat we totally surprised them with our high pressure defense and then we didn't wilt. We'll need to go hard for a long time."

On Northwest College: "We haven't had them on the schedule for a while. They are a program that wants to build up to be in the NAIA. They had an open date and we did too. Hopefully, it will be a good learning experience for them and a chance for us to work out some kinks."

Defending Regional Champions Open Up With Big Win

Newberg--The 16th-ranked George Fox College men's soccer team rolled past Evergreen State 4-0 in the Bruins season and home opener.

Forward Nick Harmon (Fr., Battle Ground HS, Wash.) made an impressive debut with a one goal, two assist performance.

"I'm pretty pleased," he said. "I like the high-pressure offense."

Four minutes in, forward Phil Nelson (Jr., Idaho Falls HS, Idaho) was assisted by Harmon. "I was trying to shoot it," said Harmon. "It was a half-shot, Phil made nice run."

After dominating the first 20 minutes, GFC let up somewhat in the late minutes and took a 1-0 lead into the half. Harmon punched in his goal at the 71-minute mark after a goalie-defender mixup in front of the goal mouth.

Current and former teammate, midfielder Greg Pfleger (Sr., Battle Ground HS, Wash.) upped his career goal total to 66 when Harmon flicked the ball over the goalkeepers head off a quick free kick by Trevor Smith (Sr., South Medford HS, Ore.) at 86 minutes.

Sixty seconds later Pfleger had a penalty kick blocked, but converted on the rebound.

George Fox finished 1993 as the NAIA District 2 and Area 1 champions, advancing to the NAIA national tournament in San Antonio, Texas. GFC's next game is in Newberg Tuesday (Sept. 6) versus Fresno Pacific.

George Fox Men's Soccer 1994 Outlook

The task of defending George Fox's status as the top NAIA men's soccer team in the Northwest returns to the same players who earned it in 1993.

While NAIA Area 1 now goes by the name Pacific Northwest Region, the players who won the championship game last year are the same. The entire GFC starting unit that blanked a school-record 15 opponents while surging into the college's first-ever NAIA national tournament is back.

GFC's preseason position is a complete reversal from 1993 when a young Bruin squad entered the year riding darkhorse status and a completely remodeled defensive unit.

"It's a unique situation to have 18 players returning from a championship team," says a confident but cautious sixth-year coach Manfred Tschan. He knows the title makes GFC the target. "We're the rabbit not the hunter. We're very much aware of the fact there are many teams out there who can beat us. I expect our players have a good understanding of how small a difference there is between winning and losing. We know we're going to need every ounce of experience and talent if we want to repeat as regional champions."

Tschan touts a major team strength as its defense — which last year held GFC opponent offenses to below half of the Bruin scoring total (51-23). On the goal line is 1993 NAIA third-team All-American goalkeeper Jeff Nelson (Sr., North Medford HS, Ore.). An athletic leaper, Nelson last season sported the fourth-lowest goals-allowed-per-game average (.71) among NAIA goalkeepers and tied for most shutouts (14). "He's the best one I've been around," says Tschan. Right in front of Nelson played Jai Cook (Sr., Willamette HS, Eugene, Ore.) who took NSCAA/Umbro third team All-American honors as a sweeper. Cook, a converted midfielder, may move back to his original position to take advantage of his ability to play both ways.

It fits with what Tschan says is a common trait among the Bruins. "The main strength of the team is we have people who are willing to accept roles and be disciplined," he says.

Tschan matches the Bruins' talents to the team style of play. "We have great team speed compared to most teams," says Tschan. "And we play fast. If you have an 80 mile an hour team, you don't play at 50 miles an hour. This team was best suited to play wide-open. I like to train them to play wide-open and to survive when they're isolated offensively or defensively."

George Fox attacks with three forwards rather than the more-conservative two-forward approach that most of its opponents use. One of the trio up front this season may be two-time NAIA honorable mention All-American Greg Pflieger (Sr., Battle Ground HS, Wash.). Pflieger has led all West Coast NAIA players in scoring each season since showing up as a fleet-footed freshman in 1991.

Despite the luxury of 18 returners, Tschan predicts a few freshman possess the talent to make the starting unit. "We have some players very much in the George Fox mold, guys that may not have been all-everything in high school, but they're still hungry and still have goals to achieve. They recognize they have an opportunity to go as far as they want. We're getting the types of people who are looking for a good education first and a good soccer team second."

Tschan thinks GFC's three senior All-Americans have a chance to continue their sport professionally in the U.S or possibly Europe. "It's a possibility with the several leagues running. Those three might have the talent to play past college."
