


#### What Are Open Textbooks?

Published under a <u>Creative Commons license</u>, open textbooks are faculty authored textbooks available to students for free.

- Open textbooks are distributed online at no cost and can often be purchased in print at a low cost.

**Open textbooks are open educational resources (OERs)** - Open educational resources (OER) are free and openly licensed educational materials that can be used for teaching, learning, research, and other purposes.



Example: Introductory, algebra-based, two-semester college physics


#### Academic Impact of the High Cost of Textbooks

<u>Survey</u>: Students' report that in their academic careers, the cost of required textbooks has caused them to:

2012	2016	
63.6%	66.5%	Not purchase required textbook
49.2%	47.6%	Take fewer courses
45.1%	45.5%	Not register for a specific course
33.9%	37.6%	Earn a poor grade
26.7%	26.1%	Drop a course
17.0%	19.8%	Fail a course


#### Beyond Cost - Why Open?

- Allows higher education to take ownership of its content

#### The 5R Permissions of OER

Retain	<ul> <li>Make and own copies</li> </ul>
Reuse	• Use in a wide range of ways
Revise	Adapt, modify, and improve
Remix	Combine two or more
Redistribute	Share with others



#### Abstract:

Our study found that most students considered OER to be as good or better in terms of quality and engagement as traditional texts, while also allowing them to put saved funds toward their educational pursuits. As rising costs in higher education affect current and potential students, faculty and students are looking for ways to cut costs where possible. Open educational resources (OER) are a viable option to replace expensive traditional textbooks without sacrificing quality. This article presents the results of a study conducted with students...


