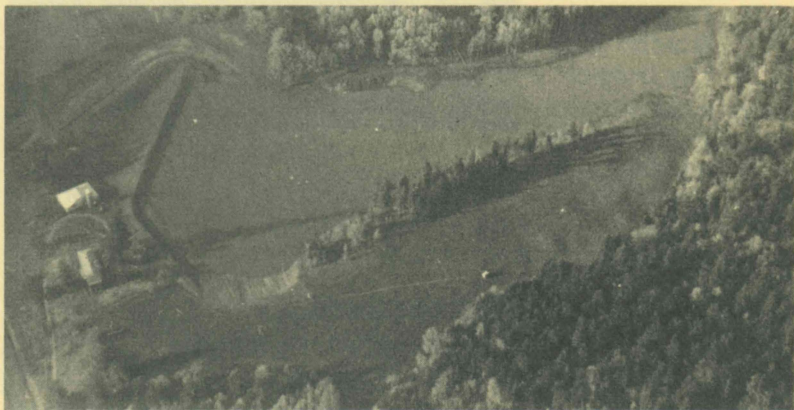
Announcement of Camp Tilikum in 1971

What is Camp Tilikum?

- nonprofit retreat and rustic camp facility
- seven miles from Newberg, Oregon, in the Chehalem valley
- 92 acres of timber and meadow property
- 15-acre lake
- donated by Russell and Irene Baker
- managed by eleven-member board
- owned by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends
- being developed to follow Northwest Indian motif in architecture and program
- Tilikum meant "Friends" in the Chinook trade language of many Indian tribes.

What is Tilikum's program?

- Present: picnics, day camps, school groups, mini-retreats, parties.
- Future: buildings for larger retreats, day camps, outings, training activities for George Fox College students.

Who is the director?

- Gary K. Fawver, his wife Susan, and their three children residing at Tilikum
- a graduate of Wheaton College and Gordon Divinity School
- experienced in resident camping on



the local church level, in development of wilderness camping experiences, in counselor training programs, and directing small group retreats.

What are Tilikum's retreat facilities?

- Entire lower floor of the director's home
- Accommodations for 20-25 people
- Spacious meeting room with fireplace, recreation room, sleeping areas, rest rooms, kitchen
