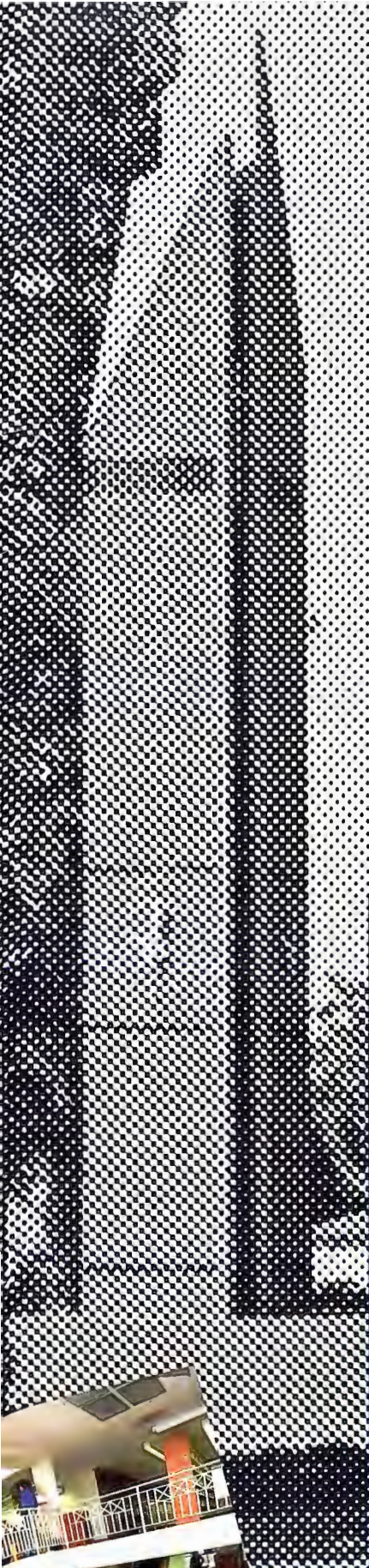

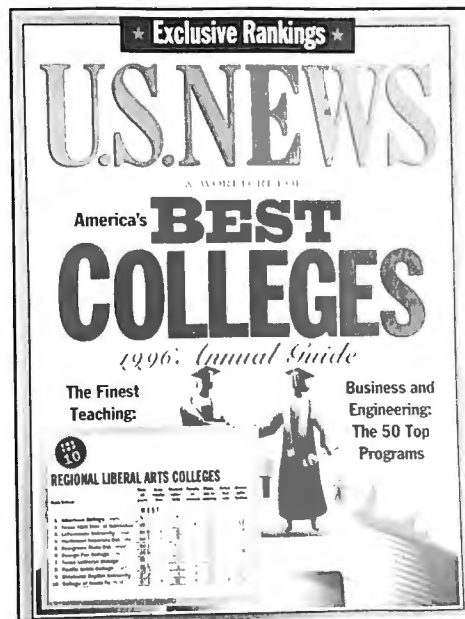
George Fox College, in its 105th year, is one of America's Best Colleges. Eight times it has been given that designation by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. In 1995 GFC was ranked second in academic reputation among Western Regional Liberal Arts Colleges, including colleges and universities from Texas to Hawaii. The magazine also named George Fox to its list of "Top Teaching Schools," second among liberal arts colleges in the western region.

George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing colleges. Enrollment more than tripled from 549 in 1986 to 1,717 in the fall of 1995.

The College offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a Macintosh computer to use and keep upon graduation. When students reach their third year at GFC, they are eligible for the Juniors Abroad program, where the College pays transportation costs for a three-week overseas study tour.

GFC students come from 32 states, one U.S. territory and nine nations. More than 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

George Fox College had its beginnings when early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers established Pacific Academy in 1885 for the Christian education of their children. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the



Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. The College is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises nearly 8,000 members in approximately 50 churches in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

George Fox is accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. The College is one of 13 members of the national Christian College Consortium. The College's undergraduate program is administered through three schools: Humanities, Natural and Behavioral Sciences, and Professional Studies. The 15 departments offer 34 majors with more than 400 courses.

An off-campus degree-completion program in management and organizational leadership enrolls working adults in an evening program with classes in Portland, Salem and Eugene, Ore., and Boise, Idaho. Graduate programs offered are a Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D.) in clinical psychology, a Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.), a Master of Education (M.Ed.), a Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.), and a Master of Arts in Christian Studies (M.A.).

The 74-acre rural tree-shaded campus a half-hour drive from Portland has undergone major expansion in recent years with 12 new buildings constructed. Part of a \$16 million Centennial Campaign, the \$5.3 million Edwards-Holman Science Center opened in the fall of 1994.

Alumni of George Fox are primarily in service-oriented vocations of Christian ministries, education, social work and medical fields. The College's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

Men's Soccer Finishes No. 9 in National Poll

George Fox surprised many by reaching the 1993 NAIA national tournament. In 1994, the Bruins were even more shocked to be left home.

Nationally, the Bruins had the third-best defense (.89 goals allowed per game) and the 11th most-productive offense (3.50 goals per game) in the NAIA. GFC roared through the regular season with a 15-2 record and ranked No. 9 in the final NAIA national poll.

Taking a bye into the Cascade Collegiate Conference championship game, the Bruins hosted Westminster College of Salt Lake City. George Fox was the defending champion and heavily favored. The Parsons were the lowest seed in the three-team conference playoffs and had lost 5-0 in Newberg earlier in the season. Meanwhile, George Fox — with a senior-dominated squad — boasted a streak of 16 straight home wins.

The Bruins struck for two first-half goals, and as the game came within half an hour of completion, it appeared George Fox was capable of scoring more.

It took just 10 minutes to unravel a year's worth of hopes. Westminster knocked in three quick goals on difficult shots and hung on for the title.

"It was a very successful season that came up a little short," said head coach Manfred Tschan. "All year long we didn't lose to anybody we weren't supposed to. That one at the end got us. We were within inches of blowing that game open, but we had a bad spell."

The loss did not automatically end the season. As the only nationally ranked team in the Northwest, the Bruins thought they had an excellent chance to win the single at-large berth to the four-team NAIA Pacific Northwest Region playoffs.

When the official decision came, it seemed more amazing than the 3-2 Westminster upset.

Unranked Concordia College — with a 7-11 record — was selected by a power-point rating system. Concordia earned more points than George Fox by playing five nationally ranked teams, including a 1-0 GFC win in Portland in which Concordia received more points for losing than GFC did for winning.

For the fourth straight year, forward Greg Pflieger led all NAIA West Coast players in scoring, ranking 15th in the nation.

Tschan passed a milestone in 1994, winning his 150th career game.

New-Look Bruins Aim for Northwest Conference Playoffs

Seven seniors, including three All-Americans, are gone from the 15-3 squad that finished No. 9 in the final national NAIA poll, but a talented young George Fox College's men's soccer team will be shooting for a sixth consecutive NAIA playoff berth.

To achieve its goal, George Fox will need a top-three finish in its first year in the tough Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges. The 26th-ranked Bruins are one of four Northwest Conference teams receiving votes in the NAIA preseason poll.

"It'll be tough to keep the playoff streak alive," says seventh-year coach Manfred Tschan. "We're a young team in a strong conference."

Success in the face of long odds would not be uncharacteristic of recent GFC teams. The last time the Bruins graduated half its starters, they advanced to the 1993 national tournament.

Five starters return and a crop of 19 freshmen are on the roster. The makeup of the 1995 team is different, but George Fox likely will stick with its aggressive, attacking style of play that averaged 3.5 goals a game last year, 11th-best in the NAIA.

"I think most of the time we'll use three forwards," says Tschan. "We're not as athletic as last year, but probably we're more skillful."

Tschan has some options up front. Returning are two Cascade Conference first-team forwards. Ian Reschke (Sr., Lindbergh HS, Renton, Wash.) gives George Fox slick moves, and 1993 pro baseball draft pick Mike Nadeau (Sr., Reynolds HS, Portland, Ore.) possesses blazing speed and is fourth on the GFC career assist list with 26. Reschke scored eight goals last season, as did Phil Nelson (Sr., Idaho Falls HS, Idaho), who ranks sixth in GFC career assists.

In the 1994 season opener against Evergreen State, the Bruins got a

taste of Nick Harmon's (So., Battle Ground, Wash.) capabilities. The freshman scored once and assisted twice in his debut, but was lost for a month when he broke his collarbone in the next scrimmage.

Tschan expects to move one of those four back into the midfield, where he has two small but skillful additions.

Oregon 4A third-team all-state midfielder Wade Fleming (Fr., Lake-ridge HS, Oregon City, Ore.) and first-team all-Kingco center midfielder Josh Turpen (Fr., Sammamish HS, Bellevue, Wash.) give GFC what may be its most talented midfield ever. Neither weighs more than 150 pounds.

"They may need some bodyguards with experience," says Tschan. He can call on returning starters Greg Shaffer (Jr., North Medford HS, Medford, Ore.) or Ryan Gwaltney (So., Roseburg HS, Ore.).

The offense doesn't worry Tschan as much as the backfield. "We're still going to be tough to stop," predicts Tschan. "We've added a lot of players with good touch, but the preseason hasn't shown me we're ready to repeat our defensive achievements of the last couple of years."

The lone returner off the GFC defense that gave up .89 goals a game and ranked third nationally is Steve Sterhan (Sr., Milwaukie HS, Ore.). He's joined by Oregon 4A third-team all-state sweeper Tommy Kolodge (Fr., Aloha HS, Beaverton, Ore.), first team all-Wesco League defender Chad Pohlman (Fr., Shorecrest HS, Seattle, Wash.), and Jeff Wells (Fr., Evergreen HS, Ridgefield, Wash.).

The Bruins have three goalkeeper candidates attempting to replace Jeff Nelson, who the Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America named NAIA National Goalkeeper of the Year.

Oregon 4A first-team all-state selection Curtis Selby (Fr., Aloha HS,

Beaverton, Ore.) has the top credentials. If the Bruins need size, they can go to 6-1 Chris Wood (Fr., Bothell HS, Wash. Jeff Gillespie (Jr., Sam Barlow HS, Boring, Ore.) is coming off two seasons on the junior varsity squad.

The early-season schedule is weighted in the Bruins' favor with four of their six non-conference games at home. Tschan says his team has depth, which will be needed during the double-round-robin conference season.

"It'll be easy to play 18 players without losing much," says Tschan. "There will be plenty of time for everyone to contribute."

ATHLETIC AFFILIATION

This year, George Fox joins the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC) and National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division III.

Until 1998, the NCIC will compete nationally in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

After a double-round-robin Northwest Conference regular season, the top four teams will qualify for the NCIC playoffs. No. 4 will play at No. 1 and No. 3 at No. 2 on Nov. 2, with the championship hosted at the highest remaining seed on Nov. 4.

The conference champion will advance to the four-team Pacific Northwest Region playoffs (Nov. 9 and 11), to meet the champion of the Pacific Northwest Athletic Conference and two other at-large teams from the Pacific Northwest Region determined by Longo ratings. The 12-team NAIA national tournament will include each of the eight regional champions, the host institution and at-large selections.

Members of the NCIC are George Fox College, Lewis & Clark College, Linfield College, Pacific University, Pacific Lutheran University, Whitman College, Whitworth College, and Willamette University.

Manfred Tschan is giving George Fox College's men's soccer team national exposure.

The Swiss coach's seven years with the GFC staff are highlighted by one NAIA national tournament appearance and two Christian college (NCCAA) national championships.

During his six-year tenure as head coach, the Bruins have become regulars in the NAIA playoffs, never finishing lower than second among Oregon and Idaho NAIA teams. Since 1989, his George Fox teams have compiled a record of 87-30-5, with an impressive winning percentage of .744.

In 1993 he became the first GFC coach to earn NAIA District 2 and Area 1 Coach of the Year awards.

A former player in the Swiss First Junior and First Amateur divisions, the 39-year-old coach has 12 years of coaching experience. Prior to settling in Newberg, Tschan held head coaching positions at Concordia College in Portland and the University of Oregon. During his two seasons at UO, Tschan guided the fledgling women's program to a No. 4 Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America national ranking and into the 1981 national tournament.

An assistant professor of health and human performance, Tschan earned a Bachelor of Science degree in education in Switzerland, received a Master of Science degree in motor learning from UO, and has completed Ph.D. course work in sports psychology. He is fluent in German, French and English and has been published in numerous journals and newspapers in Switzerland and the U.S.

Manfred and his wife, Vicki, have two children: Twila, 5, and Heidi, 3.

Tim Tsohantaridis brings professional soccer experience and a ministerial background to the Bruins.

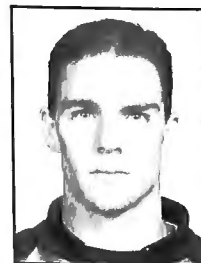
A Greek-born U.S. citizen, he has played with the Rhode Island Oceaners of the American Soccer League; the New England Teamen of the North American Soccer League; the Rhode Island Rangers of the Coastal Soccer League; and the U.S. select team.

As a high school senior, he was selected for an exhibition game in which he was matched up against soccer legend Pelé. He later played and coached soccer at Barrington College in Rhode Island.

Tsohantaridis has worn plenty of hats during his eight years at George Fox. On the soccer coaching side, the 41-year-old mentor has held three different titles. He came aboard in 1985 as an assistant, was named head field coach the next season, and in 1989 shared the co-coach title with Tschan. While under his tutelage, the Bruins made three National Christian College Athletic Association national tournament appearances and won the 1988 national title. His four-year record totaled 50-23-4. After a two-year stint as pastor of a Greek Evangelical Church in Massachusetts, Tsohantaridis returned to George Fox as an assistant coach.

In the academic field, he is an assistant professor of religion with a B.A. from Barrington and an M.A. from Ashland Theological Seminary. From 1986 to 1990, he served as George Fox's chaplain.

Tim and his wife, Valerie, have two children: Demetrius, 15, and Thaddeus, 13.

None have better credentials to be George Fox's goalkeeper coach than Jeff Nelson. A 1995 GFC grad, he was named NAIA National Goalkeeper of the Year by the Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America. Three different national associations have labled him an All-American.

A North Medford High School graduate, Nelson holds George Fox season and career records for most shutouts, fewest goals allowed, and best goals-per-game average.

This summer, he played for the Cascade Surge professional soccer team in Salem, Ore. He and his wife, Christy, live in Tualatin.

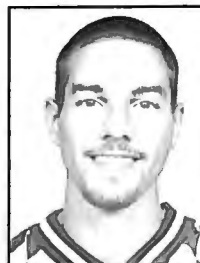

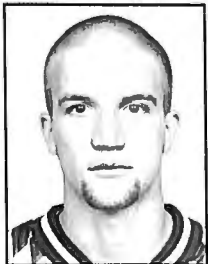

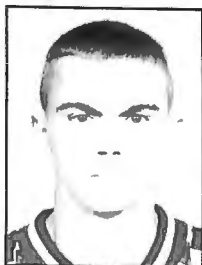
