LAST AT-BAT RALLIES CARRY PIONEERS TO SWEEP OF BRUINS

PORTLAND, Ore. --- Not once, but twice, the Lewis & Clark College Pioneers scored the winning run in their last at-bat, pinning 4-3 and 2-1 defeats on the visiting George Fox University Bruins in Northwest Conference softball action Tuesday afternoon (Apr. 18) here at the Huston Sports Complex.

In the opener, the Pioneers entered the last of the seventh down 3-0 but scored four times to pull it out. In the second game, after George Fox had scored a run in the top of the seventh for a 1-1 tie, the home team pushed across a run in its half to squash any hopes the Bruins might have had of a split.

In the first game, the Bruins' Beth Davis, going for her second straight shutout, took a three-hitter into the final frame. With one out, Lauren Dunnigan started the winning rally with a single, and Margot Lindsay reached on an error by Brittany Baird at third. Annie Stockton singled to load the bases, and a walk to Casie Runksmeier pushed in the first Pioneer run. Consecutive run-scoring singles by Tracy Jonas, Rhonda DeVore, and Rochelle Hawkins then produced the runs needed to stun the Bruins.

Davis, 3-8, was the hard-luck loser, while Stockton, 9-14, benefitted from the rally. Baird led the George Fox offense, going 3-for-3 with a double. Cori Wulf scored an unearned run in the first, and Amy Larson's sacrifice fly and an RBI single by Sarah Jertberg drove in two Bruin runs in the fourth.

In the nightcap, the Pioneers scored an unearned run in the fourth, but the Bruins tied it in the seventh on a two-out home run by Anita Orlowski, her fifth. Runksmeier drew a one-out walk off Rachel Camp, 0-1, to start the Pioneers' seventh, and Jonas and DeVore singled off reliever Larson to produce the winning run. Stockton went the route to improve to 10-14.

George Fox fell to 6-22 overall and 3-15 in the conference, while Lewis & Clark improved to 10-17 overall and 6-11 in the NWC. The Bruins host Willamette University Friday, Apr. 21, in a 1:00 p.m. doubleheader, while the Pioneers visit the University of Puget Sound for a single game on Thursday, Apr. 20, at 4:00 p.m. All are NWC games.

BRUINS DROP PAIR OF 8-0 GAMES AT LINFIELD

McMINNVILLE, Ore. --- Collecting only four hits on the day, one in the first game and three in the second, the George Fox University Bruins dropped a doubleheader to the Linfield College Wildcats in Northwest Conference softball action here Saturday afternoon, both games by an 8-0 count.

Only Amy Larson's single stood in the way of a no-hitter by Linfield's Karissa Way, who fanned six and walked no one, in the opener. Laura Steenson took the loss for the Bruins. Stacy Nielsen went 3-for-3 and drove in a pair of runs to pace the Wildcats to victory.

In the nightcap, Anita Orlowski went 2-for-2 for the Bruins, but it was not enough to beat the Wildcats' Nikki Coplin, who struck out five in as many innings and walked only one. Larson went the first two innings and suffered the loss for the Bruins, but did strike out three in her stint. Jamie Jones and Courtney Stewart had two singles apiece to lead the Linfield attack.

The losses dropped the Bruins to 1-5 on the season. The same two teams will be back in action Sunday, March 12, in a single game at 1:00 p.m. at Linfield.

BRUINS LOSE 2-1 10-INNING HEARTBREAKER AT LINFIELD

McMINNVILLE, Ore. --- Laura Steenson scattered seven hits and struck out eight in a strong pitching performance, but it was not quite enough to give the George Fox University Bruins their first Northwest Conference win of the season as they dropped a 2-1, 10-inning contest to the Linfield College Wildcats in softball action here Sunday afternoon (Mar. 12).

The Bruins scored an unearned run in the top to the first as Anita Orlowski doubled home Cori Wulf, but that was the only time George Fox would cross the plate as Linfield hurlers Kacey Brice and Karissa Way combined on a six-hitter, Way eventually picking up the win. Wulf and Orlowski each went 2-for-4 for the Bruins.

Stacey Springer singled in Deb Meyer in the home half of the sixth to tie the game at 1-1, then singled to drive in Jenny Dominguez with the winning run in the bottom of the 10th. Steenson fell to 1-3 on the season with the hard-luck loss, while the Bruins dropped to 1-6 overall and 0-3 in the NWC.

The Bruins return to action this weekend in the University of Redlands Tournament in Redlands, Calif. The tournament schedule finds the Bruins playing Friday, Mar. 17, at 10:00 a.m. vs. Redlands, 12:00 p.m. vs. Biola University, and 4:00 p.m. vs. Redlands. On Saturday, Mar. 18, the Bruins will face Biola at 9:00 a.m. At 11:00 a.m., the No. 2 and No. 3 seeds face each other, followed by the championship game at 1:00 p.m.

DAVIS PITCHES, HITS BRUINS PAST BOXERS 6-0 FOR FIRST NWC WIN

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Beth Davis fired a four-hit shutout and went 3-for-3 at the plate, spraking the George Fox University Bruins to a 6-0 win over the Pacific University Boxers in a Northwest Conference softball game Sunday afternoon (Apr. 2) here at the Morse Softball Field.

The victory was the first of the year for the Bruins in conference play after eight losses, and gave the team a 4-14 overall record. The Boxers, who took the first two games of the series 5-3 and 14-6 on Saturday, fell to 4-9 overall and 2-4 in league play.

Davis struck out five and did not walk a batter in collecting her first win to make her 1-5 on the season. She also scored the Bruins' final run in the third inning.

The Bruins wasted no time in getting to Baxers' starter Jennifer Barnes in the first inning. Cori Wulf led off with a double and Kelsey Bates promptly singled her home. Brittany Baird tripled in Bates, and then scored on Rachel Camp's sacrifice fly.

The Bruins knocked out Barnes with two more in the second, Amy Larson doubling home Miriam Liesch, who had singled, then scoring herself on a base hit by Wulf.

Davis' teammates, who had entered the game with a fielding average under .900, backed her up by playing a flawless game in the field, their first errorless game of the season

BOXERS DROP BRUINS TWICE, 5-3 AND 14-6

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Using big late-inning rallies and a 7-for-8 day by Liz Copeland, the Pacific University Boxers swept a Northwest Conference softball doubleheader from the George Fox University Bruins, 5-3 and 14-6, Saturday afternoon here at the Morse Softball Field.

The wins were the first of the year in the conference for the Boxers, who are now 4-8 overall and 2-3 in the league, while the Bruins remained winless in conference play at 0-8 and dropped to 3-14 overall.

In the first game, the Boxers broke a 2-2 tie with three runs in the top of the seventh, the big blow to cap the inning a two-run double by Copeland, who was 3-for-4 in the game and collected three RBI and a pair of stolen bases. The runs made a loser of righthander Beth Davis, 0-5, who only allowed one earned run while striking out five in seven innings.

The Pacific winner was Jennifer Barnes, who scattered five hits in a route-going job and also went 2-for-4 with a double and a pair of runs scored at the plate.

In the second game, Copeland went 4-for-4 and drove in five runs. She singled in the first run of the game for the Boxers in a three-run first inning that made a loser of Amy Larson, 0-4, had a two-run single to cap a four-run second, and singled for two more runs in the midst of a seven-run uprising in the fifth that salted the game away.

Larson doubled in a pair of runs for the Bruins and Davis scored twice, but it was not enough as Jessie Wachter collected the win for Pacific.

The two teams will play again Sunday, April 2, here at 1:00 p.m.

NO. 1-RANKED PACIFIC LUTHERAN SWEEPS GEORGE FOX

PARKLAND, Wash. -- Collecting only four hits on the day, the George Fox University Bruins were swept in a Northwest Conference softball doubleheader by Pacific Lutheran University, the nation's No. 1-ranked NCAA Division III team, 9-0 and 8-0 here Saturday afternoon (Apr. 8).

PLU improved its record to 21-1-1 overall and 5-0 in the conference, while the visiting Bruins dropped to 4-17 overall and 1-11 in league play.

GROSS STEPS DOWN AS SOFTBALL COACH AFTER EIGHT SEASONS

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Chris Gross, head softball coach at George Fox University for the past eight seasons, has announced her resignation from that post, effective immediately, in order to devote more time to her full-time profession as a sales representative for the JUGGS pitching machine company in nearby Tualatin, Ore.

Gross compiled a 106-135-2 record in her eight years as the Bruins' coaching, including a 6-22 record this past spring. She was hired as coach in 1993, and in her second year guided the team to the 1994 NAIA District 2 and Cascade Conference titles, earning District 2 Coach of the Year honors. The Bruins then advanced to the regional playoffs and came up one win short of a trip to the NAIA national tournament.

Gross has been a presence on the George Fox campus for the past 17 years, having first come to the school in 1983 after earning valedictorian honors at Greenleaf Friends Academy in Idaho. She was a catcher on the George Fox softball team for four years and was a member of the basketball squad for one season. She graduated in 1987 with a degree in business and economics, and joined the George Fox admissions department that year. After two years in undergraduate admissions, she switched to the Department for Continuing Education in 1989. In 1995, she left her position as Director of Admissions for Continuing Education to pursue a Master of Science degree in human performance at Oregon State University, then went to work the JUGGS company.

George Fox Director of Athletics Craig Taylor, who coached Gross in softball, said of his former player, "What I admired most about Chris' efforts as a coach was her level of commitment to the program despite having to juggle her coaching with a full-time professional career; that's a hard thing to do any time. She gave our players her very best, and I know she was well-respected by both the players and her coaching peers."

"It just became too much for me to be away from the team so much with my full-time job," said Gross. "I was having to spend more and more time in the sales field and less and less time with the team, and I felt that this was the right time to step aside for someone who can give the players and the program the attention they all deserve."

The search for a replacement will begin immediately, but no target date for naming a new coach has been set yet, according to Taylor.

Beth Davis (Sr., Salem, Ore.), George Fox University's versatile shortstop/ pitcher, has been named to the All-Northwest Conference Softball First Team for the second year in a row as a utility player as chosen by a vote of the nine conference coaches, while her Bruin teammate, third baseman **Brittany Baird (Jr., Lincoln City, Ore.)**, received Honorable Mention.

Davis was only 3-11 on the mound, but that was half the team's wins in a 6-25 season. She posted a fine 2.92 earned run average with a team-leading 42 strikeouts in 84 innings, and led the staff in appearances (17), starts (13), complete games (9), and shutouts (2). At the plate, the switch-hitter finished strong to wind up with a .250 average, leading the Bruins in triples with three.

BRUINS DOWN WHITWORTH FOR ONLY WIN IN CW TOURNAMENT

RICHLAND, Wash. --- Opening their season here in the multi-divisional Central Washington Tournament, hosted by Central Washington University but played 100 miles from its Ellensburg campus, the George Fox University Bruins' softball team went 1-3 playing exclusively against fellow Northwest Conference members.

The Bruins opened the tournament against Pacific Lutheran University on Friday (Mar. 3), and the defending NWC champions showed why they are unanimous favorites to repeat as the Lutes rang up a 21-2 victory. setback on the Bruins. The Lutes pounded out 23 hits against two GFU hurlers, **with Beth Davis (Sr., Salem, Ore.)** taking the loss. **Anita Orlowski (So., Banks, Ore.)** went 2-for-2 with a pair of doubles to lead the Bruins.

In Friday's second game, the Linfield College Wildcats got the best of the Bruins 10-6. GFU starter **Laura Steenson (Fr., Milwaukie, Ore.)** took the loss in her first college start, while **Cori Wulf (Fr., Salem, Ore.)** went 2-for-3 and Orlowski hit the Bruins' first home run of the year, a three-run shot in the first. Orlowski, Davis, and **Sherilyn Gerig (Sr., Mt. Angel, Ore.)** scored two runs apiece.

The Bruins picked up their first win of the season Saturday (Mar. 4) with a 6-4 win over the Whitworth College Pirates in a game shortened to five innings by rain. Steenson, 1-1, picked up the win, with Davis shutting out the Pirates in the fifth for a save. A four-run rally in the third, sparked by a Davis triple and all with two outs, put the Bruins ahead for good.

The Bruins could manage only three hits on Sunday (Mar. 5), two of them by Wulf, including a double, as they dropped an 8-0 decision to the University of Puget Sound Loggers.

"We learned a lot about ourselves this first time out," said Bruins coach Chris Gross. "We learned that it's tough to be indoors and then have to face the caliber of opponent that PLU is the first time you're able to get outside!

George Fox University Bruins 2000 Softball Outlook ---

BRUINS TO RELY ON PITCHING STRENGTH TO OFFSET LACK OF EXPERIENCE

A "youth movement" is under way for the George Fox University softball team as the 2000 spring season approaches, a situation that has head coach Chris Gross unsure of what her Bruins may accomplish during the 2000 campaign.

"We have lots of freshman and very few upperclassman," notes Gross, beginning her eighth season at the Bruins' helm, "and we lost most of our hitting -- but we do have pitching, pitching that could take us places if the rest of the lineup comes around."

Righthander **Beth Davis (Sr., Salem, Ore.)**, a First Team All-Northwest Conference selection, returns to the hill for the Bruins, bringing a 10-8 record with a 3.39 earned run average and team-leading numbers in complete games (13), innings (115.2), and strikeouts (58). She also hit .395 and led the team in triples (6) and stolen bases (13) while playing a steady shortstop. "Beth is a four-year veteran who does a great job wherever she plays, and is a very dominating presence on the mound because she's so tall," says Gross.

Expected to step in as the No. 2 pitcher for the graduated Rachel Camp (7-10, 3.38 ERA) is rookie righty **Laura Steenson (Fr., Milwaukie, Ore.)**. "Laura comes to us from the excellent program at Central Catholic, and has plenty of experience in the very competitive ASA program, so we expect her to step right in for us on the hill, as well as playing some infield," Gross predicts.

Two key returning players for the Bruins will be left fielder **Anita Orlowski (So., Banks, Ore.)** and versatile **Sherilyn Gerig (Sr., Mt. Angel, Ore.)**. Orlowski hit

.342 with a team-leading three home runs, while Gerig played everywhere but first and third and hit .305. "Anita is explosive and smooth at bat with excellent hand-to-eye coordination," Gross says of her Honorable Mention All-NWC flychaser, "while Sherilyn is a good thinker and organizer behind the plate who can throw out anyone."

Cori Wulf (Fr., Salem, Ore.) is expected to step into the starting spot in center field, as well as seeing occasional duty at shortstop. "'Cori brings us an enthusiastic, energetic attitude that rubs off on people; she's very relaxed and can take the edge off of any tough situation," says Gross. **Kelsey Bates (Fr. Stayton, Ore.)**, who "is a lot like Cori in enthusiasm, and is fundamentally sound with a good work ethic", notes the coach, is projected as the starting right fielder.

The team's top two hitters, first baseman Rebecca Dean (.414, 12 stolen bases) and All-NWC First Team selection Camp (.414, team-high 15 doubles and 28 RBI), who played first when she wasn't pitching, are gone, to be replaced at first by **Sarah Jertberg (Fr.,)**, who may also do some catching. "Sarah has quick reactions in scooping throws at first or handling Davis' spin and movement on the ball behind the plate," Gross observes. Also getting a look at first will be **Natalie Ashley (So., West Linn, Ore.)** and **Maria Nava (Fr., Pacifica, Calif.)**, who can handle outfield duties as well.

Brittany Baird (Jr., Lincoln City, Ore.) returns as the starter at third after hitting .234 with 19 RBI, and **Amy Larson (Fr., Portland, Ore.)** is expected to take over at second base, providing she has suitably recovered from a leg injury that hampered her during the junior varsity basketball season.

"Our roster is rather limited this season, and as a result, everyone is going to be asked to fill many roles, to fit in wherever there is a need on a particular day," says Gross. "But the team has come together well and understands the necessity of 'flexibility'. We should be able to hold our own this season, although our hitting is questionable. Our conference is a very competitive one -- PLU is always strong, UPS had a great year and I expect the same because their pitchers are great, and Linfield is always among the frontrunners, just to name a few -- but there are always some surprises, and maybe we'll be one.

"The main thing this team must develop is each player having confidence in herself and in one another, because we are going to be very young."

BRUINS PICKED FOR 6th IN NWC PRE-SEASON COACHES' POLL

In the 2000 Northwest Conference pre-season coaches' poll, the George Fox Bruins were picked to finish 6th in the eight-team softball race, while defending league champion Pacific Lutheran University was a unanimous choice to defend its crown.

The Bruins (17-18, NWC 8-8 in '99) received 14 points from the six NWC coaches who participated in the poll, while PLU (39-6, 15-0) got 54 points to overwhelm the rest of the teams. The University of Puget Sound (29-11, 11-3) tallied 40 points for 2nd, followed by Linfield College (20-17, 11-5) with 36 points in 3rd. Willamette University (11-28, 5-11) rounded out the top half of the conference with 30 points for 4th.

The bottom half of the poll had Pacific University (9-24, 3-9) 5th with 25 points, George Fox 6th, Whitworth College (9-26, 5-9) 7th with 13 points, and Lewis & Clark College (13-18, 2-12) 8th with 10 points. Whitman College, the 9th member of the NWC, does not play softball.

George Fox coach Chris Gross is beginning her 8th season at the Bruins' helm with a 100-110-2 record.
