4/18 – LINFIELD 7, GEORGE FOX 2: Bruins' Season Comes to a Close with Setback to Wildcats

NEWBERG, Ore. – Bringing their season to a close because they did not make the six-team field for the Northwest Conference Championships, the George Fox University Bruins dropped a 7-2 decision to the Linfield College Wildcats in women's tennis action Wednesday here at the GFU campus courts.

Linfield took the top two doubles matches to start the afternoon as Traci Sorensen and Kelli Sides defeated Courtney Ngai and Kelsie Dalke 8-1 at #1, and Megan Rodgers and Molly Nelson downed Lindsay Hagler and Kelsie Howell 8-3 at #2. The Bruins captured the #3 doubles as Valerie Ring and Laura Rogers edged Marina Orcutt and Melissa Maebori 9-7.

The Wildcats secured the match by taking the top five singles. Rodgers defeated Dalke 6-1, 6-1 at #1, Sorensen downed Howell 6-1, 6-1 at #2, it was Sides over Ring 6-1, 6-2 at #3, Nelson rallied to beat Rogers 3-6, 6-1, 6-1 at #4, and Orcutt won at #5 after splitting sets with Rebecca Crinnion 6-4, 1-6, (10-6). The Bruins' lone singles win came at #6 as Lelaini Jackson bounced back to defeat Maebori 5-7, 6-3, (10-8).

George Fox ends its season 3-15 overall and 3-13 in the conference for a 7th-place tie with Lewis & Clark College. Linfield enters the NWC Tournament April 21-22 at Yakima, Wash., as the top seed after going 19-2 overall and 16-0 in the conference.

BEAVERTON, Ore. – With their scheduled morning match moved indoors and to the evening, the George Fox University Bruins were left feeling high and dry after the Pacific Lutheran University Lutes handed them a 9-0 setback in a Northwest Conference women's tennis match Saturday here at the Tualatin Hills Tennis Center.

In doubles, it was the Lutes' Erika Feltus and Nicole Petrzalka over the Bruins' Courtney Ngai and Kelsie Dalke 8-1 at #1, Bria Smith and Amanda Anuraga over Kelsie Howell and Lindsay Hagler 8-0 at #2, and Liz Currey and Roz Currie over Valerie Ring and Laura Rogers 8-3 at #3.

The Lutes also took the singles, with Petrzalka defeating Ngai 6-1, 6-0 at #1, Feltus downing Howell 6-0, 6-1 at #2, Currey knocking off Rogers 6-0, 6-1 at #3, Anuraga beating Rebecca Crinnion 6-3, 6-0 at #4, Smith over Lelaini Jackson 6-4, 6-1 at #5, and Katie Osin dropping Shanna Lesire 6-0, 6-1 at #6.

4/10 – GEORGE FOX 7, PACIFIC 2: Bruins Sweep All Six Singles to Overcome Boxers in Makeup Match

FOREST GROVE, Ore. – In a Northwest Conference women's tennis match that was postponed from Saturday because of rain, the George Fox University Bruins rallied from a 2-1 deficit in doubles to sweep all six singles and drop the Pacific University Boxers 7-2 Monday afternoon here at Pacific's Holce Courts.

The Bruins took the #1 doubles as Courtney Ngai and Valerie Ring defeated Tara Tanoue and Lisa Kjorstad 8-5, but the Boxers bounced back in the other two doubles matches. Erin Bayne and Lauren Sargent downed the Bruins' Lindsay Hagler and Lauren Miller 8-4 at #2, and Tessa Krebs and Samantha Richards defeated Kelsie Howell and Lauren Schuetze 8-6 at #3.

It was all Bruins in the singles, however. Kelsie Dalke defeated Sargent 6-1, 6-1 at #1, Valerie Ring knocked off Tanoue 6-3, 6-3 at #2, Laura Rogers dropped Kjorstad 6-4, 6-2 at #3, Rebecca Crinnion rallied to beat Bayne 2-6, 6-1, 6-2 at #4, Lelaini Jackson downed Krebs 6-2, 6-1 at #5, and Shanna Lesire overpowered Richards 6-2, 6-2 at #6.

PORTLAND, Ore. – After dropping all three doubles to start the match, the George Fox University Bruins bounced back to split the six singles matches but still fell 6-3 to the Lewis & Clark College Pioneers in a Northwest Conference women's tennis match Saturday here at the Lewis & Clark indoor courts.

NEWBERG, Ore. – Playing on the year-old courts at nearby Newberg High School because the men's team was playing on the campus courts, the George Fox University Bruins picked up a pair of wins but still dropped a 7-2 decision to the University of Puget Sound Loggers in a Northwest Conference women's tennis match here Saturday afternoon.

The Loggers had swept the Bruins 9-0 the first time they met on Feb. 25 in Tacoma, but the Bruins this time got a win at #3 doubles by Laura Rogers and Valerie Ring over Katie Russell and Katie Schultz 8-1, and by Kelsie Howell over Melissa Snyder at #2 singles when Snyder retired due to injury with the score 3-3 in the first set.

3/19 – LINFIELD 9, GEORGE FOX 0: Wildcats Win 55th Straight Conference Match by Blanking Bruins

McMINNVILLE, Ore. – Winning their 55th straight Northwest Conference match over the last five seasons, the Linfield College Wildcats rolled past the George Fox University Bruins after defeating the Pacific University Boxers earlier in the day, both by 9-0 scores, in women's tennis here Sunday.

Linfield took every match in straight sets, with George Fox showing the most resistance at #3 doubles as the Bruins' Valerie Ring and Laura Rogers pushed the Wildcats' Kelli Sides and Traci Sorensen to the edge before falling 8-6. The other two doubles were both 8-0 wins by Linfield, with Becca Johnson and Megan Rodgers defeating Courtney Ngai and Kelsie Dalke at #1, and Kasey Kuenzli and Hollin Buck blanking Kelsie Howell and Lindsay Hagler at #2.

The Wildcats also cruised through the singles, with Johnson defeating Ngai 6-0, 6-0 at #1, Kuenzli over Howell 6-0, 6-0 at #2, Rodgers over Dalke 6-0, 6-1 at #3, Sorensen downing Ring 6-1, 6-0 at #4, Sides swiping Rogers 6-2, 6-0 at #5, and Buck beating Rebecca Crinnion 6-2, 6-2 at #6.

George Fox dropped to 2-10 overall and 2-8 in conference play, while Linfield is now 12-2 overall and 10-0 in the league. The Bruins are off until spring break, when they will travel to New Braunfels, Texas, for some competition at the John Newcombe Tennis Ranch March 24-29. The Wildcats play again on Monday, March 27, when they visit the 17th-ranked University of California-Santa Cruz Banana Slugs.

NEWBERG, Ore. – Continuing to show steady improvement, the George Fox University Bruins gave both of their Saturday women's tennis opponents a run for their money before falling twice, to the Albertson College Lady 'Yotes 5-4 in the morning in a non-conference match and 6-3 to the Whitworth College Pirates in a Northwest Conference contest.

The Albertson match was played at the GFU campus courts, and that is where the Whitworth match started. Because the Pirates had a long match with Lewis & Clark College earlier in the day, however, the George Fox-Whitworth battle got a late start, and when darkness halted play, the teams wound up at the Tualatin Hills Tennis Center in Beaverton to complete play indoors.

The Bruins started the day off well, taking two of three doubles matches from the Lady 'Yotes. Bruin wins came from Laura Rogers and Lelani Jackson over Katie Webster and Mariah Armstrong 8-4 at #2, and by Alayna Shaw and Jenny Pink over Karin Hayashida and Kathleen Kuehn 8-4 at #3. Albertson took the #1 doubles as Kyla Westerberg and Anna Moylan triumphed over Lindsay Hagler and Kelsie Howell 8-4.

2/16 – PREVIEW: Bruins Have Plenty of Players but Seek a Star for 2006 Women's Tennis Season

NEWBERG, Ore. – For the George Fox University women's tennis program in 2006, it is one of those "good news/bad news" situations.

"The good news," says head coach **Rick Cruz**, entering his 6th year with the women's team, "is that we have lots of athletes who can play; we probably run 11 deep in the number of player who will get some significant time on the court. The bad news is that we really don't have that true #1 player, the one who can go out and give you a reasonable chance to win every time out. I'm hopeful we will be competitive in every match, but we will be strongest in the 4-5-6 positions."

The Bruins went 4-12 last year and finished 7th in the Northwest Conference with a 4-8 record. With eight letterwinners returning, Cruz believes the Bruins' experience gives them a chance to make the conference's new six-team tournament format, but rising beyond that is still a ways off.

Courtney Ngai (Jr., Portland, re. / Sunset HS) played the most at #1 singles for the Bruins last year, going 1-9, but missed several matches due to shoulder problems. She appears fully recovered and will probably again see the most time at #1. **Kelsie Dalke** (So., Salem, Ore. / South Salem HS) was 3-12, mostly at #4 singles, but has picked up her game and could start the year at #2.

Valerie Ring (Jr., Sherwood, Ore. / Sherwood HS), who was 6-10 at #2, should have an even better record this year at #3. Newcomer **Kelsie Howell** (Fr., Lake Oswego, Ore. / Lakeridge HS) is ticketed for the #4 slot, with **Laura Rogers** (Sr., La Habra, Calif. / Whittier Christian HS) returning at #5 after going 5-10.

"Our top five can be expected to play a majority of the time," says Cruz, "but because they are all so close in terms of skill level, it is hard to say, 'Here's my definite No. 1', or 'this girl is going to play in this spot all the time'. We could see a good bit of juggling of the lineup early in the season."

Rebecca Crinnion (So., Seattle, Wash. / Lake Washington HS), who was 5-10 at #6, has the inside track on that slot because of her experience, but is being challenged by rookie **Leilani Jackson** (Fr., Warren, Ore. / McMinnville HS). "Leilani will play quite a bit; she's probably been our biggest surprise," admits Cruz.

Other returnees who will see considerable action include **Lindsay Hagler** (So., Selah, Wash. / Selah HS), who was 2-13 at #3 singles, **Alayna Shaw** (So., Salem, Ore. / Blanchet Catholic HS), 5-6 at #3 doubles, and **Jenny Pink** (Jr., The Dalles, Ore. / The Dalles HS), 4-7 at #3 doubles. **Lauren Schuetze** (So., Hillsboro, Ore. / Hillsboro HS) was on the roster last year but did not get into a match, though that could easily change this year.

Cruz has several other newcomers he can call on as well, including **Shanna Lesire** (Fr., Silverton, Ore. / Silverton HS), **Paula Lockwood** (Sr., Sandy, Ore. / Sandy HS), **Beth Haynie** (So., Newberg, Ore. / Newberg HS), and **Lauren Miller** (Fr., Pendleton, Ore. / Pendleton HS). With 15 total players, it is one of the biggest rosters the program has had since its inception in 1995.

"Consistency in the lineup is one thing every team needs," says Cruz, "and our early matches are going to have to help us develop that. We have to find out who is consistent on the court and who is not, and we haven't had a lot of court time to be able to do that. The sooner we can solidify the lineup, the quicker we can improve as a team."

The season gets under way this weekend with a conference road swing to eastern Washington. The Bruins are at Whitworth College Friday for a 4 p.m. season opener, followed by Whitman College Saturday at 10 a.m.
