COLLEGE HISTORY AND LOCATION

The Quaker settlers of the Willamette Valley recognized the value of education. They made provisions for this need, even before Oregon public schools offered many advantages, by organizing Pacific Academy in 1885. It was of this school that former president Herbert Hoover stated: "As a young student there for three years, I received whatever set I may have toward good purposes in life."

Pacific College, organized in 1891, provided more advanced work, and in 1930, the Academy was discontinued so that the educational efforts of the Quakers could be centered around the college which came to play an ever-increasing role among the colleges and universities of the West. In 1949, because of the many "Pacific" colleges, the school was renamed George Fox College, honoring the founder of the Friends Church.

ACCREDITATION AND MEMBERSHIP

George Fox College, accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools, is a member of the National Council of Accrediting, the Association of American Colleges, the Association of Schools of Religious Education, the Friends' Council of Education, and the Association of American Friends' Colleges. It is also approved by state and federal government for the education of veterans, admission of alien students, and the training of elementary teachers in conjunction with the Oregon College of Education.

DIAMOND JUBILEE

During the 1966-67 school year, designated the "Year of Jubilee," George Fox College looked back on 75 years of progress. In these years, much has been accomplished: the many new buildings, thirteen built or remodeled in just the last ten years; progressively higher faculty salaries, which have doubled in the last ten years; increasingly excellent faculty qualifications, including many doctorates; students from many states and foreign countries; unrestricted accreditation, a loyal and interested alumni; and an unprecedented program of tri-college cooperation including George Fox, Cascade, and Warner Pacific.

TOWARD THE FIRST CENTURY

To state it simply, George Fox College is on the move; the next 25 years will be crucial ones, indeed, in the history of the school. Our personalized approach to Christian higher education cannot help but appeal to those discouraged with an impersonal multiversity; our student body, therefore, will continue to grow. Additional building plans are underway, including a \$1,800,000 chapel-fine arts building. New courses will be added with their highly-qualified personnel, and new equipment ordered and installed. It promises to be a busy, fruitful quarter century.

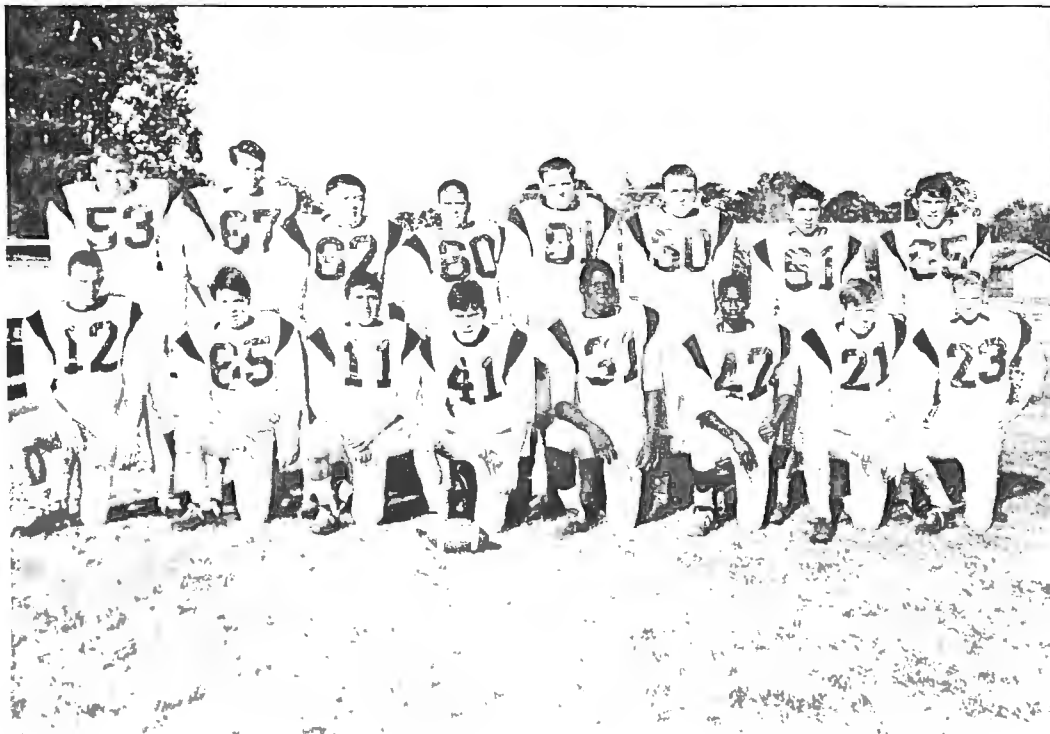

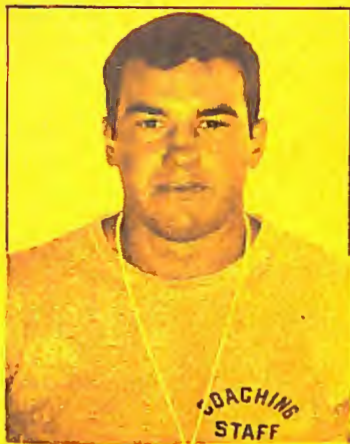
ALMA MATER
