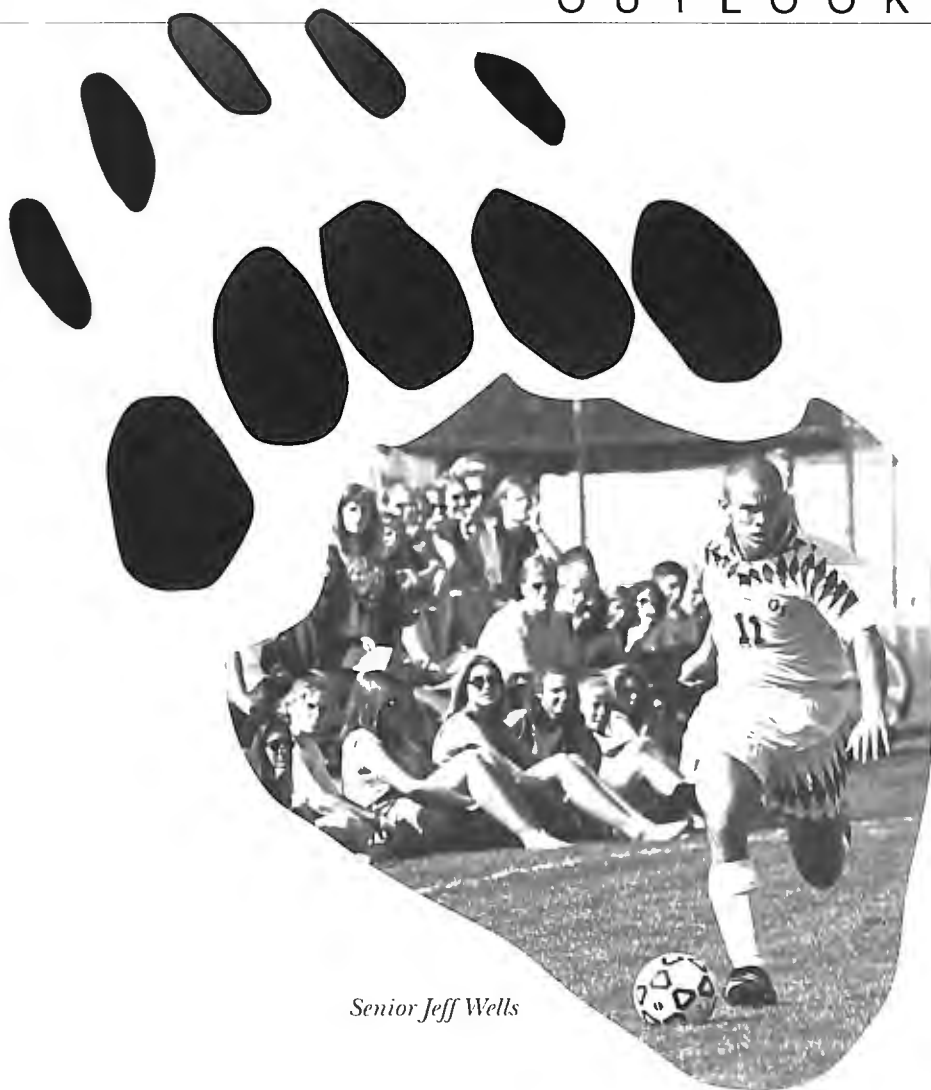

Men's Soccer Outlook 1997

Can the Bruins make it a perfect decade?

George Fox's men's soccer team has finished first or second in its league for nine consecutive seasons, and is aiming for another high finish in the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC) in 1997.

Despite the loss of three starters from last year's NCIC runner-up squad, the Bruins may be even better than a year ago.

"We have a little more talent than we had last season," says ninth-year Head Coach Manfred Tschan. "This is an upperclassman-dominated team. Our key players are in their third or fourth season. They know exactly what to expect."

A large and often-honored junior class will provide the team's foundation. At its core is a duo of center midfielders: **Wade Fleming (Jr., Lakeridge HS, Oregon City, Ore.)** (13 goals, 6 assists) and **Josh Turpen (Jr., Sammamish HS, Bellevue, Wash.)** (10 goals, 11 assists) — who led the Bruins in scoring last season. Fleming was an NAIA Honorable Mention All-American and Turpen received NAIA Pacific Northwest Region Honorable Mention.

The Bruin goal will be defended by a pair of former high school teammates. Goalkeeper **Curtis Selby (Jr., Aloha HS, Beaverton, Ore.)** and sweeper **Tommy Kolodge (Jr., Aloha HS, Beaverton, Ore.)** both won NAIA

Pacific Northwest Region honors last year. Selby is third in career shutouts at George Fox with 15.

Three other juniors will guard the back. Defender **Jeff Wells (Jr., Evergreen HS, Ridgefield, Wash.)** was voted the team's Most Inspirational Player last year and defender **Jonathan Williams (Jr., Mead HS, Wash.)** moved up from junior varsity to earn the team's Most Improved Player honors.

After an injury-plagued season, **Chad Pohlman (Jr., Shorecrest HS, Seattle, Wash.)** gives Tschan another solid defensive option and a howitzer throw-in.

Outside midfielder **Michael Moody (Jr., Inglemoor HS, Bothell, Wash.)** and forward **Joe Crown (Jr., Kent-Meridian HS, Kent, Wash.)** round out the juniors on the varsity roster. Both will start or see considerable playing time.

Three seniors are back for their final hurrah. Outside midfielder **Erik Sorensen (Sr., Bothell HS, Wash.)** is attempting to return from a concussion suffered last season. **Travis Johnson (Sr., Hidden Valley HS, Grants Pass, Ore.)** — a 1996 NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete — and **Greg Shaffer (Sr., North Medford HS, Ore.)** will provide experience to a young corps of forwards.

Tschan is hoping for more offense up front than he got last year. "Our forwards should get a steady diet of balls from the midfield," he predicts. "It's just a matter of how they produce."

Newcomers **Marc Misiewicz (So., Renton HS, Wash.)**, **Nick Cook (Fr., North Medford HS, Ore.)** and **Matt Tinder (Fr., Kapaa HS, Hawaii)** all will get their chance to prove they can find the back of the net.

Another freshman battling for a starting position is outside midfielder **Merrick Brownlee (Fr., South Eugene HS, Ore.)**.

Two new goalkeepers, **Brandon Reyna (Fr., Boulder City, Nev.)** and **Bryan Ercanbrack (Fr., Roy HS, Utah)**, as well as defender **Kris Sorensen (So., Bothell HS, Wash.)** will provide depth and offer potential for the future.

Youthful Bruins Reach Regional Tournament

Led by its sophomores, George Fox kept alive a string of nine consecutive first- or second-place finishes in its district or conference.

For the first time in four years, the Bruins weren't ranked in the national top 20, but they advanced to their second-highest postseason ever.

After finishing second in the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges, the Bruins had No. 9-ranked Simon Fraser University on the ropes in the NAIA Pacific Northwest Regional Tournament. George Fox led twice, but suffered a heart-breaking 4-3 sudden-death overtime loss.

Four sophomores won regional honors. Midfielder Wade Fleming earned NAIA All-American Honorable Mention after leading the Bruins with 13 goals and six assists. George Fox's other center midfielder, Josh Turpen recieved All-Pacific Northwest Region Honorable Mention, as did defender Tommy Kolodge.



Goalkeeper Curtis Selby recorded eight shutouts and earned all-Pacific Northwest Region Second Team honors.

Entering his ninth year as George Fox head coach, Manfred Tschan guides one of the most successful soccer programs in the Northwest and the nation.

His Bruins have won nearly three out of every four games they've played (114-45-6, .717) and have ranked in the NAIA national top-20 four of the past five seasons. Under his guidance, George Fox never has finished lower than second in its district or conference. In the Swiss coach's nine years on the George Fox coaching staff, his teams have received national exposure, winning two Christian College national championships and making one NAIA national tournament appearance. Eight of his players have earned NAIA All-American awards.

In 1993, he won NAIA District 2 and Area 1 Coach of the Year awards.

A former player in the Swiss First Junior and First Amateur divisions, the 41-year-old coach has 14 years of coaching experience. Prior to settling in Newberg, Tschan held head coaching positions at Concordia University in Portland and the University of Oregon. During his two seasons at Oregon, Tschan guided the fledgling women's program to a No. 4 Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America national ranking and into the 1981 AIAW national tournament.

An assistant professor of health and human performance, Tschan earned a bachelor of science degree in education in Switzerland, received a master of science degree in motor learning from Oregon, and has completed Ph.D. course work in sports psychology. He is fluent in German, French and English and has been published in numerous journals and newspapers in Switzerland and the U.S.

He and his wife, Vicki, have two children: Twila, 7, and Heidi, 5.

During his playing days at George Fox, Mike Nadeau wrote himself into the record books in two sports. He was a fearless forward on the nationally ranked men's soccer team, making George Fox's top five in career points, goals, goals per game and assists. He earned first team honors in NAIA District 2 (1992), the Cascade Conference (1994) and the Northwest Conference (1995).

On the baseball diamond, he was a standout third baseman, leading the entire NAIA in runs scored (1.37) as a sophomore. He was named NAIA District 2's 1994 Player of the Year as a junior before being drafted by the Baltimore Orioles. The two-time team MVP is No. 1 at George Fox in season runs scored, stolen bases, and at-bats. He also is in the top 10 in RBI, triples and hits.

Nadeau graduated from Reynolds High School in 1991 and from George Fox in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in history.

He continues to play professional baseball each summer for the Bend Bandits in the Western Baseball League.
