George Fox Men's Soccer 1998 Outlook

Seven senior starters—including four with all-region credentials—will have one last season to leave their mark on George Fox's men's soccer program.

Their accomplishments during the last three seasons already include one Northwest Conference regular season title and appearances in two Northwest Conference championship games, but the Bruins wish to wash away the bitter taste left from the end of last season. Despite a 12-6-1 record and a top-25 national ranking, George Fox missed the NAIA playoffs for the first time since 1989. Playing in the rugged Northwest Conference—which produced last year's NAIA national champion—the Bruins finished in a tie for fourth and were edged from the playoffs by a tie-breaking formula.

Eight starters from that team are back, including 1996 Honorable Mention All-American **Wade Fleming (Sr., Lakeridge HS, Oregon City, Ore.)**, whose knack for weaving through defenders has produced 20 goals in the last two seasons.

Fleming and George Fox's other center midfielder **Josh Turpen (Sr., Sammamish HS, Bellevue, Wash.)** both repeated on the Northwest Conference first team last season. They should be in peak condition after spending the summer playing for Salem, Ore.'s USISL Premier Development Soccer League team, the Cascade Surge.

Head Coach Manfred Tschan is considering splitting up the talented duo and moving Fleming up front to striker.

"He's such a weapon, you don't want to put him in a place where he's duplicated with Josh."

Wherever Fleming attacks the goal from, it will be as part of the 4-4-2 set-up that most teams use, a change from George Fox's high-pressure 3-4-3 teams of recent history.

"The run-and-gun has been shelved for the moment," says Tschan. "We're not going to shove ourselves down anybody's throat. We're going to play cookie-cutter soccer. We'll work the ball around and take what they give us. We have a lot of experienced players coming back. We're going to take fewer risks than we have in the

last few years."

Tschan says he expects his defense—which has notched 25 shut-outs over the last three seasons—to continue to be stingy.

Goalkeeper **Curtis Selby (Sr., Aloha HS, Ore.)** ranked No. 15 in NAIA national statistics last season by allowing just 1.16 goals per game. He's well acquainted with his speedy sweeper **Tommy Kolodge (Sr., Aloha HS, Ore.)**, who's played in front of him since high school.

Both earned NAIA all-region honors as sophomores.

Two freshmen who could break into the starting line-up are forward **Bryan Erickson (Fr., W.F. West HS)**, the Black Hills League MVP, and defender **Kyle Langeliers (Fr., Pleasant Hill HS, Wash.)**, an Oregon 3A honorable mention all-state selection.

But it's up to the seniors to lead this team.

"Our seniors have been a dominant force since their sophomore year when the four were all-region," says Tschan. "They'll have to show they're willing to lay it on line for their senior year. If they stay healthy and keep their focus they could go out champions."

Bruins Earn Fifth National Ranking in Six Years

A 12th consecutive winning season wasn't quite enough to push the men's soccer team into the post-season in 1997.

Behind First-Team all-Northwest Conference midfielders Wade Fleming and Josh Turpen, George Fox raced out to a 7-1 start before finishing 12-6-1.

At their peak, the Bruins ranked No. 18 in the NAIA national poll, their fifth national ranking in the last six years. George Fox could have finished second in the Northwest Conference with a win in the final game of the regular season, but a loss to eventual national champion Seattle University dropped the Bruins into a tie for the fourth and final playoff berth. The Bruins came up short on the tie breaker criteria and were omitted from the playoff invitations for the first time since 1989.

Goalkeeper Curtis Selby recorded eight shutouts and ranked 15th in the NAIA in goals allowed (1.13). As a whole, the Bruin defense ranked 18th, giving up just 1.16 goals a game.

Entering his tenth year as George Fox head coach, Manfred Tschan guides one of the most successful soccer programs in the Northwest and the nation.

His Bruins have won nearly three out of every four games they've played (126-51-7, .712) and have ranked in the NAIA national top-20 five of the past six seasons. Under his guidance, George Fox has finished first or second in its district or conference nine times. In the Swiss coach's ten years on the George Fox coaching staff, his teams have received national exposure, winning two Christian College national championships and making one NAIA national tournament appearance. Eight of his players have earned NAIA All-American awards.

In 1993, he won NAIA District 2 and Area 1 Coach of the Year awards.

A former player in the Swiss First Junior and First Amateur divisions, the 42-year-old coach has 15 years of coaching experience. Prior to settling in Newberg, Tschan held head coaching positions at Concordia University in Portland and the University of Oregon. During his two seasons at Oregon, Tschan guided the fledgling women's program to a No. 4 Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America national ranking and into the 1981 AIAW national tournament.

An assistant professor of health and human performance, Tschan earned a bachelor of science degree in education in Switzerland, received a master of science degree in motor learning from Oregon, and has completed Ph.D. course work in sports psychology. He is fluent in German, French and English and has been published in numerous journals and newspapers in Switzerland and the U.S.

He and his wife, Vicki, have two children: Twila, 8, and Heidi, 6.

Reschke was named a First-Team All-American (NAIA) by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) and an Honorable Mention All-American by the NAIA. He was the MVP of George Fox's 1995 Northwest Conference champion team that finished 16-5. He lists in George Fox's top-10 in career points, goals, assists and games played. He also was named an NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete, a First-Team adidas Scholar-Athlete All-American and was honored as George Fox's outstanding student in his athletic training major.

Reschke earned his undergraduate degree from George Fox in 1996. He earned a master's of art in teaching from George Fox in May 1998.

For the past three summers, he has played with the USISL Cascade Surge team in Salem.

Reschke is an adjunct professor in George Fox's health and human performance department this year.

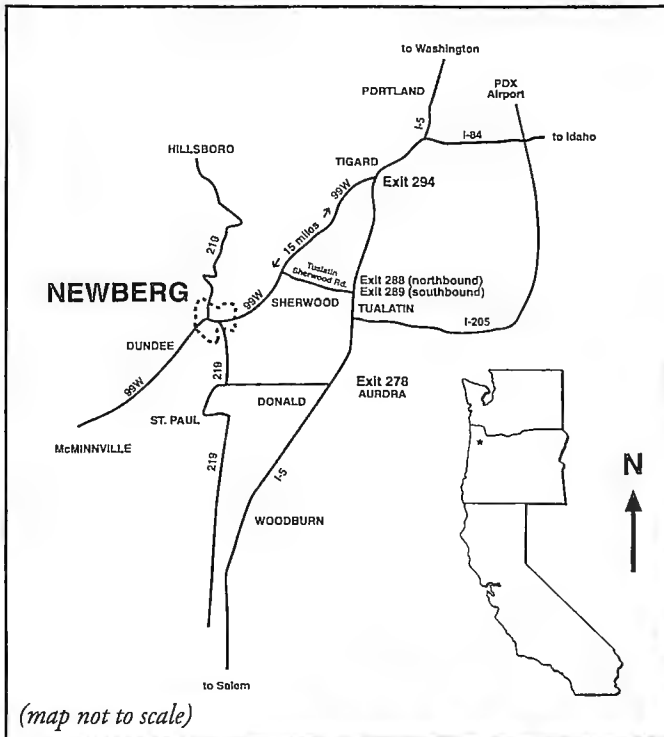
ROUTES TO THE CAMPUS
