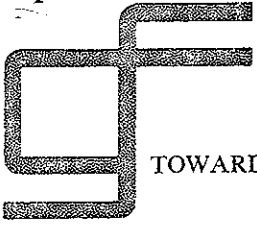

RE: The Kotzebue Center in Northwest Alaska

ATTACHMENTS: The four-page paper attached was prepared by our Kotzebue Center Director for an Alaskan commission on higher education. This will acquaint you with the educational purposes of the program.

The two-page paper, also prepared by Mr. Clark, will give you something of the implications for the church. The program has a double outreach. This paper is well worth reading for its added insights.

PROGRAMMED INSTRUCTION: At present we have a short fall term and a short spring term of concentrated study. It is possible to bridge the gap between these terms with modern educational equipment as described in the yellow folder.

We now have twelve courses readied for programmed instruction. These have been used on campus in Newberg. More courses are under preparation. Through these the students could progress between terms.

EDUTRONIX: The Slide-Sponder and Sound-Sponder described in the yellow folder are inventions of a George Fox professor. They are made locally. We desire to equip the Kotzebue Center with a number of these.

The college is seeking an immediate \$10,000 to establish the center. Three Sound Sponders can be obtained for \$1,000 but this is but part of our needs. A contribution now could be credited to 1972 or 1973 tax deductions. Your interest is invited.
