# Young Guns?

Can youthful Bruins make it 14 winning seasons in a row with only three returning starters?

If the George Fox University Bruins are to continue their string of winning seasons — on the plus-side of .500 for the last 13 years — they are going to have to do it with one of the youngest squads veteran coach Manfred Tschan has ever had.

"We lost nine seniors from last year's team," notes Tschan, who begins his 11th season as the Bruins' mentor, "and they were the last group who were here under our 'talent grants,' backed up by non-scholarship players." (GFU is now in its first year as an NCAA Division III member only, after having dual membership in the NAIA for the last four years.)

The '98 team started off 8-1 and were ranked in the NAIA's Top 25, but faded to a final 10-9-1 record after suffering a first-round defeat in the NAIA regionals. Tschan recalls, "Our offense dropped off; we couldn't buy a goal the second half of the season!"

A large part of the Bruins' attack departed in that senior group, including top gun Wade Fleming, an All-Northwest Conference performer who contributed almost one-third of the team's offense (12 of GFU's 37 goals and 30 of the team's 105 total points). Josh Turpen — who tied for third with 16 points and is now with the Portland Pythons of the World Indoor Soccer League — and Second Team All-NWC goalkeeper Curtis Selby were other key losses.

The '99 Bruins will build around three returning starters: forward **Bryan Erickson** (So., Chehalis, Wash.), the

team's "Rookie of the Year" who was second on the team with 18 points; midfielder **Merrick Brownlee** (Jr., Eugene, Ore.), who contributed 16 points; and defensive midfield whiz **Kyle Langeliers** (So., Creswell, Ore.), whose early fall status is unfortunately questionable due to a stress fracture in a bone on the outside of his foot.

"From our bench, our junior varsity and our newcomers, several people are going to have to step it up," Tschan says. With 35 names on the pre-season roster, he will have plenty of players to choose from and lots of decisions to make.

At goalkeeper, **Chad Baker** (So., Post Falls, Idaho) and **Todd Mason** (So., Tigard, Ore.) are JV-experienced players who will compete for the wide-open starting role.

Erickson returns up front, "but he can't do it alone," Tschan acknowledges. **Jamie Johnson** (So., Newberg, Ore.), who scored the last goal of the '98 season, is one who will be expected to provide additional scoring punch. Others vying for forward berths include returnee **Ryan Melvin** (So., Pleasant Hill, Ore.) and newcomers **Jason Bradley** (Fr., Poulsbo, Wash.), **Nick Chapman** (Fr., Newberg, Ore.), **Scott Greene** (Fr., Beaverton, Ore.), **Jeremy Johnston** (So., Medford, Ore.), and **Adam Carlsen** (So., Cannon Beach, Ore.).

With the entire starting backfield gone, Brownlee and Langeliers are likely to move in as defenders, leaving the competition for midfield spots fierce. Among the candidates Tschan can choose from are returning lettermen **Nigel Hunter** (Jr., Eugene, Ore.), **Greg Lutze** (Jr., Manitou Springs, Colo.), **Kevin Whitaker** (Fr., Corvallis, Ore.), **Jesse Johnson** (Fr., Grants Pass, Ore.), **Adam Moore** (So., Shasta Lake, Calif.), and **Kris Sorensen** (Jr., Bothell, Wash.). Others who could

get a look include **Casey Bergh** (Fr., Milwaukie, Ore.) and **Neil Cantrall** (So., Salem, Ore.).

In deciding upon his backfield, Tschan says "we can go with speedy backs, or physical backs, or a combination." Brownlee and Langeliers, if healthy, are solid. Among the new faces, **Chris Shields** (So., Kennewick, Wash.), **Kevin Fleming** (Fr., Oregon City, Ore.), and **Ben Vance** (Jr., Portland, Ore.) have looked good in the early going. Others who could see action as defenders include **Ryan Austin** (So., Eugene, Ore.), **John Fordice** (So., Shoreline, Wash.), **John Wilson** (Fr., Tigard, Ore.), **Tim Barrans** (Fr., Salem, Ore.), **Conley Bergh** (Fr., Milwaukie, Ore.), **Kyle Dixon** (So., Springfield, Ore.), **David Lloyd** (So., Tigard, Ore.), **Ben Neuman** (So., Tolovana Park, Ore.), **Sam Osterud** (Fr., Lake Oswego, Ore.), and **Demetri Tsohantaridis** (So., Newberg, Ore.), the son of GFU women's soccer assistant coach Tim Tsohantaridis.

Tschan anticipates a dogfight in the Northwest Conference race. "Seattle University had pretty much dominated over the last two years, even winning a national championship, but now that they have decided to go Division II, it's wide open. I expect Pacific Lutheran, Willamette and Linfield to have good young teams this year, while Pacific and Whitworth are old standbys who always have good teams. Puget Sound was down some last year, but they won't stay there."

As for the '99 Bruins, Tschan admits, "We may not strike fear into anyone looking at us on paper — we lost too many starters — and for sure we'll be nobody's favorite in just about every match. It's just a rebuilding year for us, one we must use to make progress toward regaining a place of prominence in the game in this area. But as we gain more experience, and if we stay healthy, well, we're going to step up and bite somebody!"

If the Bruins can bite enough opponents, that 14th consecutive winning season just might happen.

## 1998 Review

## Thirteen and Counting...

Despite a late-season slump, the George Fox Bruins men's soccer team finished the year on the plus side of .500, the 13th winning season in a row for the team.

It was a season of contrasts for the Bruins, one that began with a fast start and ended with the team wondering what happened to its offense. In their first seven games, the Bruins went 5-1-1, with the tie coming against defending NAIA national champion Seattle University, and climbed as high as 19th in the NAIA polls.

The middle third of the season, mostly Northwest Conference games, was characterized by narrow defeats. In eight games, the Bruins went 5-3 — and all three losses were by one goal each.

But from that point on, the Bruins simply could not "buy a goal." Four

straight 1-0 losses, two of them in overtime, ended the regular season, but an at-large berth to the NAIA playoffs still awaited the team, despite the end-of-the-year scoring drought. The slump continued, however, as the Bruins bowed out of the NAIA Pacific Northwest Regional semifinals with a 2-0 defeat at the hands of Seattle in a game played on artificial turf at Simon Fraser University in Burnaby, B.C., Canada.

There was much to be proud of, however. Coach Manfred Tschan picked up his 200th career victory in 16 years as

head coach at George Fox, Concordia University, and with the women's team at the University of Oregon.

Four seniors earned All-Northwest Conference accolades. Midfielder Josh Turpen and forward Wade Fleming each made their third consecu-

tive appearances on the All-NWC First Team, while goalkeeper Curtis Selby and defender Tommy Kolodge were Honorable Mention. Fleming was second in the NWC in points with 30 (12 goals, 6 assists), and Turpen was 11th with 16 points (5 goals, 6 assists). Selby, who posted 6 shutouts, was 15th in the nation in goals-allowed-per-game average (1.09) and 2nd in the conference, while Kolodge helped anchor the league's leading defense. As a team, the Bruins ranked 17th in the nation with 1.15 goals allowed per game.

Fleming went on to receive NAIA All-Pacific Northwest Region First Team and NAIA All-American Honorable Mention honors, while Turpen and Selby were All-Region Second Team selections.

With four other seniors finishing their eligibility (Chad Pohlman, Jeff Wells, Chris Wood, and Jonathan Williams), the Bruins lose eight starters from the '98 team and thus will be very young this year. But if the past 13 years are any indication, the George Fox men's soccer team could well make it 14 winning seasons in a row in 1999.

# Coaches

## The Staff of Champions

### Manfred Tschan

Entering his 11th year as the head coach at George Fox University, Manfred Tschan guides one of the most successful soccer programs in the Northwest and the nation. Tschan's teams have won almost seven out of every ten games they have played (136-60-8, .694) and were ranked at some point in six of the past seven seasons in the NAIA Top 25. Under Tschan's guidance, George Fox has finished first or second in its district or conference nine times. The Bruins have received national exposure during his tenure by winning two National Christian College Athletic Association national championships and by making one NAIA National Tournament appearance. Nine of his players have earned NAIA All-American awards. In 1993, he himself won NAIA District 2 and Area 1 Coach of the Year honors.



BRUINS

A former player in the Swiss First Junior and First Amateur divisions, the 43-year-old Tschan has 16 years of coaching experience. Prior to settling in Newberg, he coached at Concordia University in Portland and the University of Oregon. During his two seasons at Oregon, the Swiss native guided the fledgling women's program to a No. 4 Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America national ranking and into the 1981 ALAW national tournament. His over-

all career record stands at 200-89-17, a .692 percentage, entering this season. An assistant professor of health and human performance at George Fox, Tschan earned a bachelor of science degree in education at The Teachers' College of Hofwil, Switzerland; received a master of science degree in motor learning from Oregon; and has completed Ph.D. course work in sports psychology. He is fluent in German, French and English, and has been published in numerous journals and newspapers in Switzerland and the United States.

Coach Tschan and his wife, Vicki, reside in Newberg and have two children: Twila, 9, and Heidi, 7.

### Ian Reschke



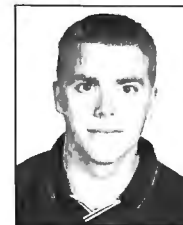
A former George Fox All-American midfielder, Ian Reschke returned to his alma mater last fall as an assistant coach for the men's soccer program.

Reschke was named First Team All-American (NAIA) by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) and an Honorable Mention All-American by the NAIA in 1995. He was the MVP of George Fox's 1995 Northwest Conference championship team that finished 16-5. He ranks in George Fox's top 10 in career points, goals, assists and games played. He was also named a NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete, a First Team Adidas Scholar-Athlete All American, and was honored as George Fox's outstanding student in his athletic training major.

Reschke earned his undergraduate degree from George Fox in 1996, and a master of art in teaching from George Fox in May 1998. For the past three summers, he has played with the USISL Cascade Surge team in Salem. He and his wife, Carrie, live in Tigard.

### Todd Williams

Todd Williams begins his second season as coach of both the men's and women's goalkeepers at George Fox this year. He



was a member of the George Fox men's soccer team from 1990 to '93, with a career goals-against average of 1.69 that ranks as the fourth-best ever in team history.

Williams is a 1990 graduate of Churchill High School in Eugene. He earned a bachelor's degree in biology from George Fox in 1994 and now works in outside sales for PML Microbiologicals in Wilsonville, Ore. He currently lives in Tigard and is preparing for graduate school.

### Scott Diefenbaugh

Scott Diefenbaugh will handle responsibilities for the George Fox junior varsity program, his second straight year in that capacity.



Diefenbaugh graduated from George Fox in 1995 with a degree in athletic training and spent the 1997 season as an assistant for the boy's soccer team at

South Eugene High School before joining the soccer staff at his alma mater.

Diefenbaugh is married to current George Fox senior and women's soccer player Megan (Brownlee) Diefenbaugh. They live in Newberg. His brother-in-law, Merrick Brownlee, plays for the Bruins' men's soccer team.

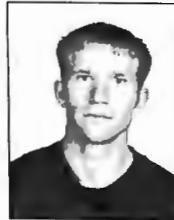

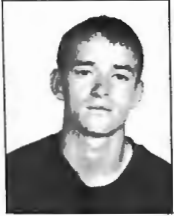

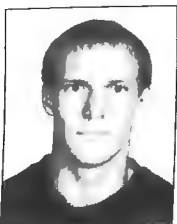
