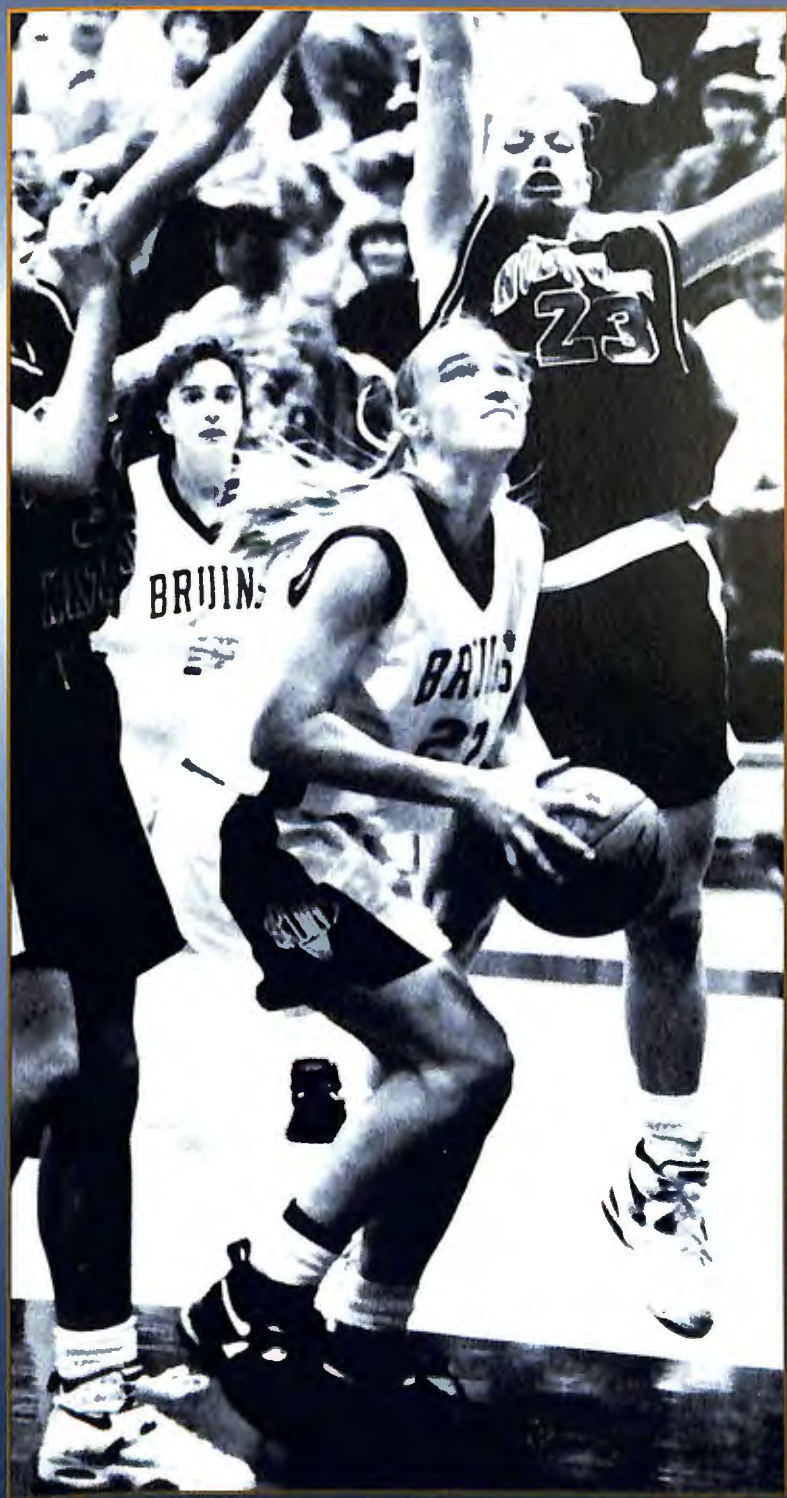

George Fox College, in its 105th year, is one of America's Best Colleges. Eight times it has been given that designation by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. In 1995 GFC was ranked second in academic reputation among Western Regional Liberal Arts Colleges, including colleges and universities from Texas to Hawaii. The magazine also named George Fox to its list of "Top Teaching Schools," second among liberal arts colleges in the western region.

George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing colleges. Enrollment more than tripled from 549 in 1986 to 1,717 in the fall of 1995.

The College offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a Macintosh computer to use and keep upon graduation. When students reach their third year at GFC, they are eligible for the Juniors Abroad program, where the College pays transportation costs for a three-week overseas study tour.

GFC students come from 32 states, one U.S. territory and nine nations. More than 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

George Fox College had its beginnings when early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers established Pacific Academy in 1885 for the Christian education of their children. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox



in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church.

The College is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises nearly 8,000 members in approximately 50 churches in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

Following a merger — to be complete no later than 1997 — with Western Evangelical Seminary (a graduate school of 350 students in

Tigard) the name will again change — to George Fox University.

George Fox is accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. The College is one of 13 members of the national Christian College Consortium. GFC's undergraduate program is administered through three schools: Humanities, Natural and Behavioral Sciences, and Professional Studies. The 15 departments offer 34 majors with more than 400 courses.

An off-campus degree-completion program in management and organizational leadership enrolls working adults in an evening program with classes in Portland, Salem and Eugene, Ore., and Boise, Idaho. Graduate programs offered are a Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D.) in clinical psychology, a Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.), a Master of Education (M.Ed.), a Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.), and a Master of Arts in Christian Studies (M.A.C.S.).

The 74-acre tree-shaded campus a half-hour drive from Portland has undergone major expansion in recent years with 12 new buildings constructed. Part of a \$16 million Centennial Campaign, the \$5.3 million Edwards-Holman Science Center opened in the fall of 1994.

Alumni of George Fox are primarily in service-oriented vocations of Christian ministries, education, social work and medical fields. The College's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

ATHLETIC AFFILIATION

It's a year of transition for George Fox athletics. The College is in its first season in the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC).

The NCIC is leaving the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) for the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division III. Currently a provisional member of the NCAA, George Fox will be eligible for national championship play in 1998-99. Until then, George Fox and the NCIC will continue to compete nationally in the NAIA.

GFC's men's and women's basketball teams play in NAIA Division II, while the College's other 11 sports are not divided into divisions.

The NAIA is an autonomous association administering programs leading to 13 men's and 11 women's national championships. The NAIA includes 364 four-year colleges and universities in 49 states and Canada. They are grouped in nine regions and 44 conferences.

The NCAA administers 80 championships in 21 sports for its member institutions, involving nearly 21,000 men and women student-athletes. There are 392 women's basketball teams in NCAA Division III.



1995-96 POSTSEASON PLAY

Four teams will participate in the Northwest Conference semifinals played Feb. 21. Winner of the Feb. 24 championship game will advance to the 32-team NAIA Division II national tournament March 6-12. There are 174 teams from 18 conferences competing to reach the national tournament at Tri-State University in Angola, Indiana. National tournament berths not going to the conference champions will go to the host institution and at-large teams.

GEORGE FOX ATHLETICS



George Fox College maintains one of the Northwest's most successful small-college athletic programs.

The teams win. George Fox has earned district or conference titles in eight sports during the 1990s. The College's highest national team finish came in the fall of 1992 when the women's cross country team finished as national runner-up.

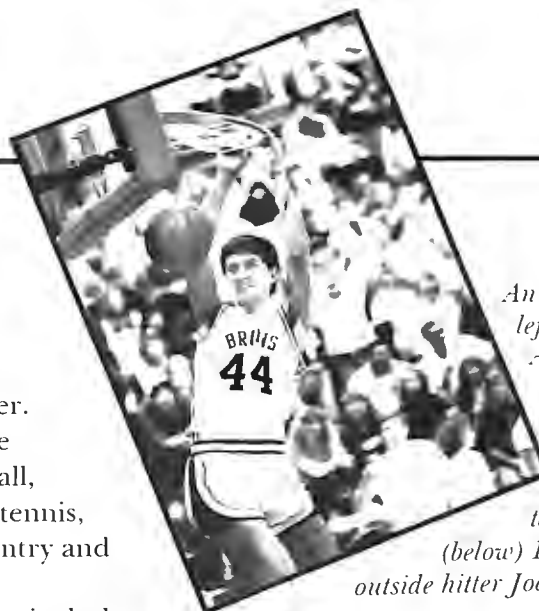
The athletes are successful. In the last six years, George Fox athletes have earned 69 NAIA All-American awards and 34 All-American Scholar-Athlete honors.

The coaches are award winners, as well. Every returning head coach has been named district or conference Coach of the Year at least once.

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall education program at George Fox. About 15 percent of the student body participates in varsity athletics. Men's varsity athletics teams represent the College in baseball, basketball, track, tennis, cross

country and soccer. Women teams are fielded in volleyball, basketball, track, tennis, softball, cross country and soccer.

Athletic facilities include the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education; Colcord Field, which received a new polyurethane surface in the fall of 1993; and the Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Complex containing baseball diamond, softball field and soccer field. In 1994, five tennis courts were installed in preparation for the addition of tennis as a varsity sport.

George Fox head women's basketball coach Sherri Murrell made it to the NAIA Division II national championship game.

For the Lady Bruins, it was too bad the national raters didn't let her bring her team.

George Fox was the last squad to beat both last year's national champion as well as the runner-up. Murrell watched from the stands as Western Oregon State College defeated Northwest Nazarene College for the title in an all-Cascade Conference championship game.

It was a frustrating end to one of the Lady Bruins' best-ever seasons. George Fox tied a school record for wins, finishing 21-11, and Murrell was named conference Coach-of-the-Year for the second time in her two-year tenure.

"We lost some key players last year," said Murrell. "But we had people step up to fill the gaps. All three of our seniors had great years. To finish with 20 wins is a great feeling. The girls are hard workers. That's what it comes down to."

The Lady Bruins beat every team in the conference at least once last year. They tied Northwest Nazarene for second place in the conference regular season, but lost a tiebreaker that sent them to Nampa, Idaho, for the first-round playoff game. Until the 1994-95 season, GFC had never beaten Northwest Nazarene on the Crusaders' home court. The Lady Bruins broke the string in January and knocked off Northwest Nazarene again in the playoffs. With the win, George Fox advanced to meet Western Oregon in the Lady Bruins' first-ever conference championship game.

The Lady Bruins set another record in the title game, this time for

inaccurate field goal shooting. George Fox made just 19 percent of its attempts, but still came within eight points of winning. The loss ended the Lady Bruins' season. Northwest Nazarene received an at-large berth to the national tournament by virtue of its national ranking. The Lady Bruins were never ranked in the top 25 despite leading the conference for nearly half the season.

The schedule was not easy and the start was slow. The Lady Bruins began 1-4 and were 5-7 before tying a school record with an eight-game winning streak. Five of GFC's losses were to NAIA Division I or NCAA Division I schools.

Senior point guard Heidi Rueck of Hillsboro, Ore., wrapped up a successful four-year career with the College's first-ever women's basketball All-American honors. She won NAIA All-American honorable mention while averaging 12.4 points a game this season. Her 5.9 assist average was 12th highest in the nation. Rueck finishes with three school assist records: game (13), season (190 in 1994-95) and career (584).

Two other George Fox players won conference honorable mention:

junior forward Liz Stephens of Bellevue, Wash., and repeat selection senior center Meagan Williams of Forest Grove, Ore. Williams averaged 12.5 points and 7.3 rebounds a game while Stephens led the balanced Lady Bruin offense with 12.5 points a game.

Tigard, Ore., newcomer Nancy Rissmiller adjusted to the college game quickly despite a midseason broken finger. The 5-10 forward led George Fox in rebounding with 7.6 grabs a game.

Senior guard Kerry Aillaud of Port Angeles, Wash., and Williams both earned conference Player-of-the-Week honors during the season.

GFC Brings High Hopes to New Conference

Picking up votes in the NAIA Division II preseason poll for the first time ever, George Fox's women's basketball team faces its own high expectations and a new conference this season.

Last year, the Lady Bruins compiled a school-best 21-11 record and came up one win shy of the national tournament, falling by eight points in the Cascade Conference championship game to Western Oregon State College. Two weeks later, Western Oregon won the national championship game over at-large entry Northwest Nazarene College — a team GFC beat on the road in the conference playoffs.

Now a member of the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges, George Fox won't have to play either team to reach the national tournament in Angola, Indiana. The Lady Bruins can earn an automatic berth if GFC's eight returners can mesh with its seven newcomers and win the NCIC playoffs.

"I feel with what we have, we can again be in postseason play," says Sherri Murrell, who won Cascade Conference Coach of the Year honors in each of her first two seasons as GFC head coach. "After two years of coming up short of the national tournament, we're very hungry for a trip to Indiana."

A big recruiting class has strengthened the Lady Bruins inside, but GFC fans shouldn't buy tickets to Indiana yet. Winning the Northwest Conference is no easy chore.

Murrell says the NCIC has no easily defined top or bottom. "The talent is spread out across the line," she says. "Everybody has a shot."

Last season Willamette University

and Whitworth College shared the conference title. GFC split with Willamette last year and was 6-2 versus NCIC opponents.

The Lady Bruins also must cope with the loss of three of last year's senior starters. Two won national attention. Point guard Heidi Rueck was an honorable mention All-American, and center Meagan Williams earned All-American Scholar-Athlete honors. Replacing Rueck at the point guard position is a big concern. Murrell has three choices.

Tonya Miller (So., West Linn HS, Ore.) begins the season as the starter. Including a redshirt season in 1993-94, she is in her third year in the program.

"Tonya is going to step up to the challenge," says Murrell. "Her two years under Heidi have helped

develop her game. She just doesn't have game experience."

Miller's backup is Sarah Bain (Fr., Salem Academy, Turner, Ore.), an Oregon 2A second-team all-state selection last season.

When she becomes eligible in January, Willamette University transfer Cherish Carroll (So., West Valley HS, Fairbanks, Alaska) will provide GFC with a good penetrator.

On the opposite end of the experience scale are the forward and off-guard positions. Murrell has three returning starters to cover those spots. It's an athletic bunch. Two competed at the NAIA national track meet last season.

George Fox's team leader is forward Liz Stephens (Sr., Newport HS, Bellevue, Wash.). She led GFC with 12.5 points a game last season and Murrell says the track hurdler should be one of the strongest post players in the conference.

The national high jump runner-up, guard/forward Nancy Rissmiller (So., Tigard HS, Ore.) scored in double figures and led GFC in rebounding as a freshman.

Another 1993-94 redshirt, Keelie Keown (So., Oakridge HS, Ore.) is a good shooter who can play forward or guard.

Guard/forward Jamie Courtney (Sr., Pendleton HS, Ore.) started occasionally for the Lady Bruins last year and has improved her strength and driving ability. She'll start as GFC's off-guard.

Five others are vying for time behind Courtney.

Cori Gardea (Sr., Clatskanie HS, Ore.) is a team captain and will give GFC good outside shooting.

For the first time in her collegiate

career, Katie Anderson (Sr., West Linn HS, Ore.) begins the season without injuries. Murrell says she has good shooting range.

Two recruits could factor in. A good outside shooter, Kami Bredeson (Fr., Beaverton HS, Ore.) last year was the leading scorer for Beaverton High School's third-place 4A state tournament team.

A recent addition off GFC's volleyball squad, Rachel Evans (Fr., Hawaii Baptist Academy, Kaneohe, Hawaii) is a good ball handler who could also play the point position.

George Fox is stronger at the center position than in recent years with three players over 6-feet tall.

"Our inside game is really strong," says Murrell. "Our size underneath the basket is going to be a real strength."

Two centers could start. Murrell says 6-foot-1 Angela Pettit (Jr., Sprague

HS, Salem, Ore.) has transformed herself in two seasons from a timid freshman into a physical impact post player.

A transfer from Western Oregon's national championship team, Becci Harper (Jr., Central HS, Independence, Ore.) gives GFC a solid inside player who can also shoot from outside. She was one of the Cascade Conference leaders in 3-point percentage last season.

New to the program is Rachel Powell (Fr., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.), a good post defender.

Murrell has scheduled a tough preseason to prepare for conference play. The Lady Bruins will take two shots at defending national champion Western Oregon. GFC also has scheduled three NAIA Division I schools and Humboldt State University, an NCAA Division II team.

After two years as George Fox head coach, **Sherri Murrell** has two Cascade Conference Coach of the Year awards hanging on her office wall.

The 28-year-old coach guided the Lady Bruins to the NAIA playoffs both years and last season to the Cascade Conference championship game.

Murrell, who spent one year as a George Fox assistant coach, brings six years of NCAA Division I experience as player and coach. She played two years at the University of Southwestern Louisiana before transferring to Pepperdine University. There she started two seasons as a point guard and was honored as a West Coast Conference all-star, averaging 14 points a game as a senior.

Murrell planned to play professional basketball in Germany after

graduation but suffered a serious knee injury three weeks before departure.

Last year she played with the Portland Saints, a club team made up of former college players that finished third in the 1994 Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) National Tournament.

A 1985 graduate of St. Mary's Academy in Portland, Murrell played on the 1984-85 Oregon state championship team.

Murrell received a Bachelor of Arts degree in public relations from Pepperdine in 1991 and served one season as assistant basketball coach. She then moved to Brigham Young University for the 1991-92 season, travelling nationwide as a recruiter.

At George Fox, Murrell also is graduate admissions coordinator in the College's admissions office.

Murrell replaced 12-year head coach Craig Taylor, who voluntarily stepped down to concentrate on his administrative duties as athletic director.



Torrae Harry joins the George Fox College women's basketball team this year as an assistant coach.

A Nike team sales representative for the Pacific Northwest, he has women's basketball coaching experience in the McDonald's Far West Summer Basketball League.

Harry played basketball at Benson High School, Portland, and continued his playing career in the Portland pro-am basketball league.

He earned a bachelor of science degree in education from the cooperative program at Oregon State University and Western Oregon State College.

He competed in football and track at Oregon State and was a track athlete at Western Oregon.

Harry resides in Portland.

Q & A WITH SHERRI MURRELL

Q. For the last two years, you've been named Cascade Conference Coach of the Year. Last season your team was one win away from the national tournament. What reasons can you give for the successes?

A. I have been blessed with talented and motivated athletes. They gave me their all out on the court. My coaching staff and I instilled in them the confidence they needed to succeed against the best teams in the nation. I also was fortunate to coach athletes who are good people. We're a family. We could have had two losing seasons and I still would have walked away with good memories and experiences.

Q. Describe your coaching philosophies.

A. "When players leave my program, I want them to fully understand what it means to be part of a team. Players will be pushed to reach their potential in my program. They will understand how to win and how to learn from losing. I teach players to work hard, be dedicated, and to have confidence in everything they do. I love to coach basketball, and I want each one of my players to love the game, too."

Q. Why are you coaching at George Fox?

A. "There are two reasons. First, I believe in the College and its mission. There is something to say about a growing college that can maintain an outstanding education in a Christian environment. Second, it's the people. The people here genuinely care and support each other. When a recruit visits George Fox College, I tell her that this is not a place where she will be a number in a crowd. She is a face with a name, and people know and care about who she is."



CRAIG TAYLOR is in his eighth year as George Fox College Athletic Director, but he has been associated with the Bruins for 22 years as player, coach

and professor. Taylor, 44, came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior forward on the men's basketball team. In 1972-73, he helped the Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

Taylor graduated from George Fox in 1974, named both Outstanding Man in Teacher Education and Outstanding Physical Education Major. He received a Master of Science degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a residence hall director at GFC.

From 1976 through 1979, Taylor was the Bruin baseball coach while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm from 1979 to 1981.

Taylor was the coach of the women's basketball team from 1981 to 1993, producing a 162-155 record. He also coached GFC softball from 1981 to 1988, and again in 1990. His teams compiled a 77-99-1 record, and in 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

At George Fox, the athletic director is responsible for athletic department functions, including eligibility and compliance with GFC, NAIA and NCAA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management.

Taylor has three children: Leah, a 21-year-old senior at GFC; Bree, 16; and Casey, 6. Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville.



HAL ADRIAN became Associate Director of Athletics at George Fox in 1994. In that position he is responsible for the Bruin Club and general fund-

raising, as well as for special projects such as the George Fox Athletic Hall of Fame and sports banquet.

A 1956 graduate of Lewis & Clark College, Adrian taught and coached in the Beaverton School District until 1961, when he joined North Pacific Insurance. In 1994 he retired as Vice President of Human Resources. For more than 40 years he has been involved in church music leadership, chairing the Billy Graham Crusade music committee in 1992. Adrian also has been active in United Way leadership.

Hal and his wife, Audrey, have three sons: Jay, Greg and Dave, who currently is George Fox's Vice President for Development.



ROB FELTON is in his fourth year as Sports Information Director for George Fox's 13 athletic teams. A 1992 GFC graduate with a degree in communication

arts, Felton was a GFC sports information student assistant for three years.

The GFC Sports Information Office has produced 32 national award-winning publications in the last 14 years. Most recently, the 1994-95 women's basketball guide earned second in a national contest sponsored by the College Sports

Information Directors of America.

Felton, 25, also has additional responsibilities as Assistant Director of Public Information.

A magna cum laude graduate, he was named Outstanding Student in Communication Arts and to Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities. He was sports editor for the student newspaper, The Crescent, for two years and editor as a sophomore.



TIM COMMINS is volunteering his second season as George Fox women's basketball statistician.
