(Overall 7-12-0, Northwest Conference 5-9-0)

HIGHLIGHTS:

Young Bruins Conclude Season with Win Brownlee Named NWC "Player of the Week"

George Fox finished its 1999 season with a 5-2 rout over neighboring Pacific, boosting the Bruins to a sixth-place finish in the Northwest Conference. George Fox, with only three juniors and no seniors on its roster, was one of the youngest teams in the NWC.

With just three returning starters from last year, the Bruins finished 7-12 overall, setting a school record for most losses in a season. However, six of those losses came by single goal margins, all of them on the road. Road games proved to be the Bruins' nemesis, as they were 6-3 at home, but at opposing fields only 1-9, with the sole road win coming over Pacific in overtime.

The Bruins were led by midfielder **Merrick Brownlee (Jr., Eugene Ore.)**, who finished the season as the Bruins' top goals scorer with 11 and, with 7 assists, the top points producer with 29 points. He now ranks 9th in career goals scored with 19 and 11th in career points with 50 through three seasons with the Bruins.

Bryan Erickson (So., Chehalis, Wash.), last season's second-leading scorer, led the 1999 team in assists with eight. He repeated as the team's number two scorer, tying forward **Jamie Johnson (So., Newberg, Ore.)** with five goals.

In his first season, goalkeeper Chad Baker (**So., Post Falls, Idaho**) finished second in the conference in saves per game with 79 in 16 games for a 4.94 average.

BROWNLEE WINS NWC "PLAYER OF THE WEEK" HONORS

A spectacular game in George Fox's season-ending 5-2 win over Pacific earned **Merrick Brownlee** Northwest Conference "Player of the Week" honors in men's soccer.

Brownlee scored three goals and assisted on a fourth. With that performance, Brownlee finished the year as the Bruins' top goals scorer (11) and total points producer (29) and as the No. 2 man in assists (7). He is now 11th in points (50) and 9th in goals (19) on the all-time George Fox charts.

BROWNLEE, ERICKSON SPARK BRUINS PAST PACIFIC 5-2

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Merrick Brownlee scored a "hat trick" of three goals and assisted on another, and **Bryan Erickson** scored twice and had two assists to spark George Fox to a 5-2 win over Pacific University in Northwest Conference soccer action on Saturday (Nov. 6) at muddy Morse Athletic Field.

The Bruins struck for three first-half goals while holding the Boxers scoreless and were never really threatened thereafter. Midfielder Brownlee scored five minutes into the game and again at 29 minutes, sandwiched around an Erickson goal at 22 minutes. **Ryan Austin (So., Eugene, Ore.)** assisted on the first two goals, Erickson on Brownlee's second.

Erickson made it 4-0 with a header off a pass from Brownlee at the 50-minute mark, but the Boxers responded with goals by Chris Burke at 52 minutes and Dustin Sackett at 80 minutes, cutting the GFU lead to 4-2. Brownlee's third goal off a header from Erickson at 85 minutes sealed the Bruin win.

BRUIN BITS:

***George Fox set a new school record for most losses in a season with 12, breaking the old record of 10 set in 1984 and tied in 1996. The Bruins also had a string of 13 straight winning seasons snapped.

***Veteran coach Manfred Tschan finishes his 11th year as George Fox's men's soccer coach with a record of 143-72-8 at the school, and an overall record in 18 years of college coaching with a 207-101-17 mark. This was his first losing season ever as a coach.

TSCHAN SAYS: (Quotes from 11th Year Head Coach Manfred Tschan)

On Pacific: "This was the kind of game I thought we could play all season long. We played according to our game plan. We crossed the ball well, went aggressively to the goal, and didn't let them beat us on defense."

On the Season: "This was a new experience for me and my players. We were close so many times. Looking to next year, I think we'll be fairly strong in the middle, but we still need to strengthen ourselves in the backfield, and up front, we could use a little more firepower. But we've got a good nucleus coming back; they just need to work hard in the off-season to improve themselves."

BROWNLEE, ERICKSON SPARK BRUINS PAST PACIFIC 5-2

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Merrick Brownlee scored a “hat trick” of three goals and assisted on another, and Bryan Erickson scored twice and had two assists, sparking the George Fox University Bruins past the Pacific University Boxers 5-2 in men’s soccer action here Saturday afternoon (Nov. 6) at muddy Morse Athletic Field.

The season-ending win left George Fox with a 7-12-0 overall record and a 5-9-0 Northwest Conference mark, leapfrogging Pacific Lutheran University into 6th place after the Lutes lost 1-0 at the University of Puget Sound. Pacific fell to 10-8-2 overall and in 4th place in the conference at 7-7-0 on the conference.

The Bruins struck for three first-half goals while holding the Boxers scoreless and were never really threatened thereafter. Midfielder Brownlee scored five minutes into the game and again at 29 minutes, sandwiched around an Erickson goal at 22 minutes. Ryan Austin assisted on the first two goals, Erickson on Brownlee’s second.

WILDCATS HAVE THEIR WAY WITH BRUINS IN 5-1 WIN

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Shanon Hopkins scored two goals and assisted on two others, leading the visiting Linfield College Wildcats to a 5-1 win over the George Fox University Bruins in a Northwest Conference men's soccer match Saturday afternoon (Oct. 30) here at the Morse Athletic Field.

The Bruins, hoping to avenge a narrow 1-0 loss to their Yamhill County rivals in McMinnville three weeks ago, took an early lead as Jamie Johnson took a headed pass by Nick Chapman on a throw-in and headed it in past Linfield keeper David Waarick at the 19:48 mark.

Hopkins responded with a tying goal two minutes later, driving it in from the right wing off a feed from Jim Mooney. A minute-and-a-half later, Hopkins fed Tim Bishop in front of the GFU goal, who drilled it home from point-blank range off the hands of Bruin keeper Chad Baker.

Those two quick scores enabled the Wildcats to take a 2-1 halftime lead, and they added three more in the second half to turn the game into a rout. Hopkins booted a rebound of his own deflected shot at 51:28, then Chris McDonald added a pair of goals at 58:56 and 71:26, Jake Riley assisting on the first and Hopkins on the second.

"Today we saw why they're a second-place team and we're where we are," said a disappointed George Fox coach Manfred Tschan afterward. "After we got our first goal, the defense just let down. We let them get too many long passes over our heads, and with their speed and quickness, they beat us to every ball and had some wide-open shots."

The Bruins had numerous opportunities to score also, taking 22 shots to Linfield's 27, but Waarick had four saves and the rest of the GFU shots were off the mark. Baker had 10 saves in goal for the Bruins.

Linfield improved to 12-6-1 overall and 8-4-1 in the conference, while George Fox fell to 6-12-0 overall and 4-9-0 in the league. The Wildcats visit Willamette University and the Bruins will host Pacific University, both games next Saturday, Nov. 6, at 2:30 p.m. in regular-season finales.

BRONWLEE BOOSTS BRUINS BY BEARCATS IN SOCCER SHOOTOUT 4-3

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Midfielder Merrick Brownlee scored a pair of goals, the second snapping a 2-2 tie with less than ten minutes to play, boosting the George Fox University Bruins to a 4-3 win over the Willamette University Bearcats in a hotly-contested Northwest Conference men's soccer match Friday afternoon here at the Morse Athletic Field.

After a scoreless first half (George Fox had one goal disallowed on a foul), Brownlee, the Bruins' leader in goals, assists, and points, gave George Fox a 1-0 lead 48 minutes into the game with a kick into the left side of the net, assisted by Bryan Erickson, that deflected off Willamette keeper John Goldwater. One minute later, the Bruins went up 2-0 when an errant Bearcat pass sailed into their own goal.

Willamette bounced back with a goal at 54 minutes, Scott Tomlins scoring on a rebound shot, and Michael Semenza knotted it at 2-2 with a fast break goal off a cross from Kenji Wright.

Brownlee put George Fox ahead for good 3-2 following a corner kick, scoring after a scramble in front of the box at the 82-minute mark, giving him eight goals on the season and, with six assists, a team-leading 22 points. Two minutes later, Nick Chapman notched his second goal of the year, taking a pass from Erickson and drilling it past Goldwater in a one-on-one drive.

Chapman's goal provided much-needed insurance, for after yet another Brownlee goal was called back, the Bearcats scored again, Trevor Frank drilling home a breakaway from Chase Jordan with three minutes to play, closing the Bruin lead to 4-3, but there it ended.

It was a rough, physical match, as 41 fouls were whistled (GFU 23, WU 18), and three yellow cards were drawn (WU 2, GFU 1).

"It's always nice to get a win, especially in a tough match like this," said GFU coach Manfred Tschan, "but we've got to do a better job playing with a lead. We're still let too many people get behind the defenders after we've scored."

George Fox improved to 6-11-0 overall and 4-8-0 in the NWC, while Willamette fell to 7-11-3 overall and 4-6-2 in the league. Both teams are in action Saturday afternoon at 2:30 p.m., George Fox hosting Linfield College and Willamette visiting Pacific University.

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Greg Lutze's first career goal tied it with two minutes to play, and Merrick Brownlee's second score of the game won it 12 minutes into overtime as the George Fox University Bruins squeezed past the Whitman College Missionaries 3-2 Saturday afternoon here at the Morse Athletic Field.

"Nothing like waiting 'til the last minute," said a relieved GFU coach Manfred Tschan after the Bruins had avenged an earlier 3-0 loss to the Missionaries in Walla Walla back on Sept.26. "Actually, we were very fortunate to win; Whitman played well, and we weren't moving around on offense as much as we needed to until the end of the game. It was good to see we still had enough to pull it out."

Whitman got on the board first 18 minute into the game when Ross Good drilled in an indirect kick from inside the box off a feed from Rob Tonnsen. The kick had been set up when Bruin goalkeeper Chad Baker erred by picking up a ball that had been returned to him by a teammate.

"We're a very young team that's still making too many mental mistakes," Coach Tschan admitted.

Brownlee, the Bruins' top point producer this season, knotted thing two minutes later by dribbling through three defenders and nailing a breakaway shot past Whitman keeper Joe Capp.

Scott Burns put the Missionaries on top 2-1 at the half when he scored off his own deflected shot at the 39-minute mark.

Lutze, playing only his fourth game of the season, rebounded Ryan Austin's deflected shot and booted it into the left corner of the goalpost from 15 yards out at 88 minutes, sending the match into the extra period.

"Nothing wrong with Lutze's offense," said Coach Tschan. "He was about the only one really moving into position on offense, and that just goes to show you that good things can happen if you keep moving."

The Bruins had a chance to the lead a few minutes into overtime with four rapid-fire shots within 10 yards of the goal, only to have two bounce off Whitman defenders, and Capp saved the other two. The Bruins would not be denied, however, as Brownlee chipped a winner over Capp on a center from Bryan Erickson at the 12-minute mark of the extra period.

Whitman fell to 3-9-0 overall and 1-7-0 in the Northwest Conference, while George Fox improved to 5-8-0 overall and 3-5-0 in the conference.

Whitman visits Pacific University Sunday afternoon, Oct. 17, while George Fox hosts Whitworth College Sunday at 2:30 p.m., following the George Fox-Whitworth women's match at 12:00 p.m.

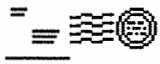

BRUINS RALLY TO DEFEAT KNIGHTS 5-2, SPURNED ON BY FOUR SECOND HALF GOALS

NEWBURG, Ore. --- Jamie Johnson led the charge in the second half with two goals in the final four minutes of play, as George Fox used four scores in the final six minutes to down visiting Warner Pacific 5-2. Johnson, the sophomore forward and Newburg, Ore., native put the Bruins (2-3) on the board midway through the opening period to tie the score 1-1. He would later add two goals within a minute of each other, the latter goal a streaking shot from the right side that glanced off keeper Ardale Bates.

“If we play 90 minutes of soccer the rest of the way like the way we played the final ten minutes today a lot of good things can happen for us, said forward Jamie Johnson. We’re a young team that if we compete could surprise many teams this season, because we are definitely not favored in our conference.”

The Knights (1-3-2) appeared to have the game in command, however at 84:18 mark of the second half Chris Endrikat was issued a red card for kicking, which gave George Fox a man advantage for the final six minutes of play. The Bruins capitalized twenty seconds later when Merrick Brownlee connected off the assist from Bryan Erickson to even the game 2-2. Brownlee returned the favor at 84:52 with an assist to Erickson to give the home team an insurance score, before Johnson added two more scores at 85:52 and again at 86:44.

George Fox now rides a two-game winning streak into this weekend’s road trip to play Whitworth on Saturday, followed by Whitman on Sunday. In addition the Bruins held the advantage on shots 27-9, limiting the Knights to only four second-half shots. Bates the Warner Pacific keeper recorded 16 saves on the day.

“We have a long way to go and a lot of work to do, said Bruin head coach Manfred Tschan. We need to limit our touches and play smarter during games. It’s a process and the players need to dedicate themselves to playing the ball early, and we need to have better focus headed into conference play.”

***CAN YOUTHFUL BRUINS MAKE IT 14 WINNING SEASONS IN A ROW
FOR GEORGE FOX MEN'S SOCCER PROGRAM?***

If the George Fox University Bruins are to continue their string of winning seasons – on the plus-side of .500 for the last 13 years – they are going to have to do it with one of the youngest squads veteran coach Manfred Tschan has ever had.

“We lost nine seniors from last year’s team,” notes Tschan, who begins his 11th season as the Bruins’ mentor, “and they were the last group who were here under our ‘talent grants’, backed up by non-scholarship players.” (GFU is now in its first year as an NCAA Division III member only, after having dual membership in the NAIA for the last four years.)

The '98 team started off 8-1 and were ranked in the NAIA's Top 25, but faded to a final 10-9-1 record after suffering a first-round defeat in the NAIA Regionals. Tschan recalls, “Our offense dropped off; we couldn't buy a goal the second half of the season!”

A large part of the Bruins' attack departed in that senior group, including top gun Wade Fleming, an All-Northwest Conference performer who contributed almost one-third of the team's offense (12 of GFU's 37 goals and 30 of the team's 105 total points). Josh Turpen, who tied for third with 16 points and is now with the Portland Pythons of the World Indoor Soccer League, and Second Team All-NWC goalkeeper Curtis Selby, were other key losses.

The '99 Bruins will build around three returning starters, forward Bryan Erickson (So., Chehalis, Wash.), the team's “Rookie of the Year” who was second on the team with 18 points, midfielder Merrick Brownlee (Jr., Eugene, Ore.), who contributed 16 points, and defensive midfield whiz Kyle Langeliers (So., Creswell, Ore.), whose early fall status is unfortunately questionable due to a stress fracture in a bone on the outside of his foot.

“From our bench, our junior varsity, and our newcomers, several people are going to have to step it up,” Tschan says. With 35 names on the pre-season roster, he will have plenty of players to choose from and lots of decisions to make.

At goalkeeper, Chad Baker (So., Post Falls, Idaho) and Todd Mason (So., Tigard, Ore.) are JV-experienced players who will compete for the wide-open starting role.

Erickson returns up front, “but he can't do it alone,” Tschan acknowledges. Jamie Johnson (So., Newberg, Ore.), who scored the last goal of the '98 season, is one who will be expected to provide additional scoring punch. Others vying for forward berths include returnee Ryan Melvin (So., Pleasant Hill, Ore.) and newcomers Jason Bradley (Fr., Poulsbo, Wash.), Nick Chapman (Fr., Newberg, Ore.), Scott Greene (Fr., Beaverton, Ore.), Jeremy Johnston (So., Medford, Ore.), and Adam Carlsen (So., Cannon Beach, Ore.).

With the entire starting backfield gone, Brownlee and Langeliers are likely to move in as defenders, leaving the competition for midfield spots fierce. Among the candidates Tschan can choose from are returning letterman Nigel Hunter (Jr., Eugene, Ore.), Greg Lutze (Jr., Manitou Springs, Colo.), Kevin Whitaker (Fr., Corvallis, Ore.), Jesse Johnson (Fr., Grants Pass, Ore.), Adam Moore (So., Shasta Lake, Calif.), and Kris Sorensen (Jr., Bothell, Wash.). Others who could get a look include Casey Bergh (Fr., Milwaukie, Ore.) and Neil Cantrall (So., Salem, Ore.).

In deciding upon his backfield, Tschan says “we can go with speedy backs, or physical backs, or a combination.” Brownlee and Langeliers, if healthy, are solid. Among the new faces, Chris Shields (So., Kennewick, Wash.), Kevin Fleming (Fr., Oregon City, Ore.), and Ben Vance (Jr., Portland, Ore.) have looked good in the early going. Others who could see action as defenders include Ryan Austin (So., Eugene, Ore.), John Fordice (So., Shoreline, Wash.), John Wilson (Fr., Tigard, Ore.), Tim Barrans (Fr., Salem, Ore.), Conley Bergh (Fr., Milwaukie, Ore.), Kyle Dixon (So., Springfield, Ore.), David Lloyd (So., Tigard, Ore.), Ben Neuman (So., Tolovana Park, Ore.), Sam Osterud (Fr., Lake Oswego, Ore.), and Demetri Tsohantaridis (So., Newberg, Ore.), the son of GFU women’s soccer assistant coach Tim Tsohantaridis.

Tschan anticipates a dogfight in the Northwest Conference race. “Seattle University had pretty much dominated over the last two years, even winning a national championship, but now that they have decided to go Division II, it’s wide open. I expect Pacific Lutheran, Willamette, and Linfield to have good young teams this year, while Pacific and Whitworth are old standbys who always have good teams. Puget Sound was down some last year, but they won’t stay there.”

As for the '99 Bruins, Tschan admits, “We may not strike fear into anyone looking at us on paper – we lost too many starters -- and for sure we’ll be nobody’s favorite in just about every match. It’s just a rebuilding year for us, one we must use to make progress toward regaining a place of prominence in the game in this area. But as we gain more experience, and if we stay healthy, well, we’re going to step up and bite somebody!”

If the Bruins can bite enough opponents, that 14th consecutive winning season just might happen.
