ADVISORY COUNCIL

In the fall of 1972 George Fox College developed a program of college classes in Northwest Alaska, under the direction of its extension program department. To provide liaison with the local community, an ADVISORY COUNCIL from the area has been selected, with the following purpose and duties:

I - STRUCTURE AND PURPOSE:

Twenty prominent citizens in the Kotzebue-Noatak-Kobuk area have been chosen by the George Fox College trustees to serve as an ADVISORY COUNCIL for the Kotzebue Center, to work directly with the college administration and the extension program director. This council is not a policy-making or administrative body. Its function is to provide counsel and assistance for greatest effectiveness to the community. While matters of policy decision are reserved to the college Board of Trustees, recommendations made by the Advisory Council will be given highest consideration by the college administration and trustees.

II - DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Members of the ADVISORY COUNCIL are selected annually by the George Fox College administration and recommended to the college trustees for approval. Members are carefully chosen from the professional, commercial, educational, and religious leadership in the community for the following purposes:

1. To provide the college with a group of prominent citizens to serve as a connecting link between the college and the community.
2. To counsel and advise on matters of public relations - the interpretation of the college to the community and the community to the college.
3. To counsel and advise on matters concerning curriculum, educational programs, class scheduling, and ways in which the college may best serve the community.
4. To receive regular reports from the college concerning the Kotzebue Center, to evaluate the effectiveness of the program, and to assist in plans for the development of the center, including budget projections and recommendations for funding.

III - ORGANIZATION AND MEETING:

The Advisory Council elects a chairman, vice-chairman, and secretary, who constitute an executive committee to work closely with the George Fox College administration and the extension program director. The council meets semi-annually during the fall and spring terms, or at the call of the chairman.
