Director's Report for College Year 1974-75

The third year of our college extension program in the native community of Kotzebue, Alaska, has been completed. Course offerings were somewhat reduced this year because of limited finances for this program. In lieu of major funding the extension program for this year was underwritten by a special subsidy from the California Yearly Meeting Mission Board and concerned individuals.

A total of 12 courses were scheduled during this year, offering a total of 27 hours of college credit. The composite class registration was 96. Faculty for these classes were Paul Mills, Mark Ocker, Earl Perisho, Harold Wilhite, and Roy Clark. Courses programmed were:

Principles of Communication	2 hours
Church Administration	2 hours
Theology of the Holy Spirit	2 hours
Literature of the Bible	3 hours
Principles of Accounting	3 hours
Introduction to Business	3 hours
Income Tax Computing and Reporting	2 hours
History of Friends	2 hours
Friends Doctrine and Beliefs	2 hours
World Events and Bible Prophecy	2 hours
Arab-Israeli Conflicts	2 hours
Audio-Visual Techniques	2 hours

In addition faculty personnel gave personal instruction in music theory and techniques, advanced mathematics, sermon preparation and delivery, and preparation for GED tests. The director also served as speaker at the mid-year conference of Alaska Yearly Meeting held at Kiana in March.

A review of the records for the past three years shows a total of 37 college courses programmed in Kotzebue, offering 80 hours of college credit, and drawing a total class registration of 464. The response has been approximately 80 percent native, indicating that the program is meeting a need among the Eskimo people. As a search for adequate funding for the extension program is made, it is fervently hoped that resources can be found to provide a solid base for the continuation of this innovative educational venture.
