Outlook

Family Matters

Coach-daughter combo and improved defense are keys to better Bruin softball in 2003

Bob Steenson takes over for Tim Hill, who took a full-time position at Pacific University, as the new coach of the George Fox University softball program this season. With his daughter, **Laura Steenson Seratt** (Sr., RHP, Milwaukie, Ore.) as the staff ace, he knows the Bruins will be competitive every time she is on the hill.

"Laura will do a good job as long as we can keep her healthy, and we have another pitcher this year who can take some of the strain off of her arm, she won't have to pitch every game as she did last year," says the 1st-year college coach. "But if we are going to have a chance to win more games, we are going to need some good solid defense, and that's what we'll be working on hot and heavy from now until the season starts."

The Bruins, after starting last season 5-2, slumped to a final 9-17 overall mark and finished 6th in the Northwest Conference at 6-14. Defense was the primary culprit as the Bruins made 51 errors and allowed 45 unearned runs. Cutting down on those mistakes should go a long way in improving the Bruins' fortunes in 2003.

Pitching

Seratt has been one of the best softball hurlers in Bruin history, although that might not be reflected in her won-lost record. In 3 years, she has a 27-31 record with a 1.89 ERA, 276 strikeouts, and only 67 walks in 392.2 innings, 52 complete games, 9 shutouts, and 2 no-hitters. Last year, she was 9-16 with a 2.25 ERA and 132 Ks, and pitched all but 6 innings of the season!

Providing some relief for Seratt on the mound this year will be **Lacey Wade** (Fr., RHP, Junction City, Ore.), although the ace will still get the majority of the work. Adding that extra pitcher was critical, Steenson notes, "because the conference voted this year to play 4-game series instead of 3, and that would have just killed us without someone to ease Laura's load."

Catching

Letterwinner **Talle Ann Thompson** (Jr., Dundee, Ore.) and rookie **Elizabeth Hawkins** (Fr., Sandpoint, Idaho) have big shoes to fill now that Jennifer Kennedy, a solid rock behind the plate for 4 seasons, has graduated. Thompson hit .192-0-6 last year as a regular at 1st base, and could still see some playing time there.

Another possible backstop is Clackamas Community College transfer **Julia Driggers** (Jr., Canby, Ore.), although Steenson expects to use her more as a designated hitter, citing past difficulties with her knees. He likes her bat, though, commenting that "when she gets the bat on the ball, it's going to go somewhere hard. She will probably bat cleanup for us."

Infield

The only settled infield spots appear to be **Kim Backhaus** (So., Hillsboro, Ore.) at 3rd and **Anna Carkin** (Fr., Gaston, Ore.) at 2nd. Backhaus did not make an error until the 17th game of the season and hit .188 as a freshman, but has shown improvement with the stick in early practices. Carkin can also play short.

Carice Fell had been targeted for shortstop, but opted to concentrate on her studies at the last minute, leaving that key position wide open. **Cassie Halvorson** (Fr., Hillsboro, Ore.), who had been slated for center field, could play there, or it could be **Heidi Collier** (Jr., Blaine, Wash.), an excellent all-around athlete who also plays for the Bruins basketball team. Collier has played outfield and caught as well.

Outlook

Cori Wulf, the Bruins' top hitter a year ago (.311-1-16) chose not to play her senior season, so 1st base is up for grabs. If Thompson is not at 1st, it might be **Laura Koval** (Jr., Tacoma, Wash.), another Bruin basketball player who is also an outfield candidate. Seratt is another who can play 1st.

have the luxury of putting her in the regular lineup because he couldn't take a chance on her getting hurt on the bases, since she was the only pitcher he had, but we're in a little better shape this year, and she's a good hitter."

Outfield

Moving from 2nd base to right field to take advantage of her arm and

defensive speed is **Sarah Camp** (Jr., Hubbard, Ore.), who was Honorable Mention All-NWC after batting .246-0-1 with a .429 on-base pct. that included 14 walks and a league-leading 8 hit-by-pitches. She also led the conference with 15 stolen bases, and is a lock for the leadoff spot in the order.

Halvorson will play center if she is not needed on the infield, and Camp has played in center before. Left field could be a tossup between Koval and Collier. **Brea Cohen** (Fr., Salem, Ore.), a hard worker who has shown tremendous improvement but still lacks playing experience, will provide depth in the outfield this season.

Summary

Steenson, who has coached for many years in local ASA leagues, ran the Bruins' fall practices while the search for a new coach continued and was having so much fun with the team that he offered to take the team on a permanent basis. He faces a rugged task in aiming the Bruins toward the top of conference standings, but is excited about the opportunity.

"This was something I wanted to try, and not just because my daughter is in her senior season; I hope to be here for several more years at least," admits Steenson. "This year, we don't have a lot of depth, so we have to avoid injuries. The main thing I want this team to do is improve defensively; if we can do that, and get a few more runs, then we will have an opportunity to win a lot of games. I'm looking forward to the challenge."

Bob Steenson

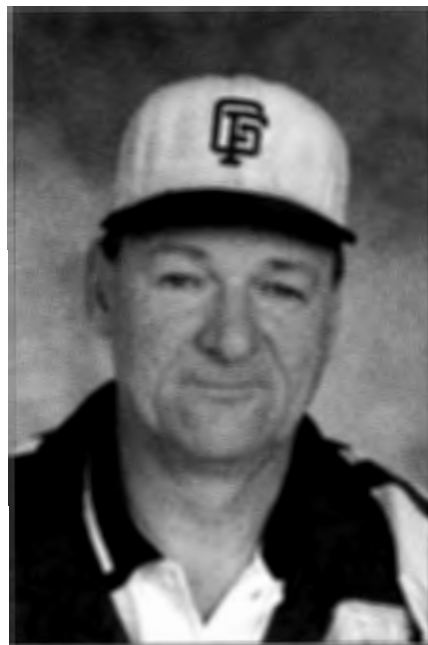
It is not unusual for college athletics programs to hire someone for their coaching staffs with the hope of enticing one of the new coach's sons or daughters to play for the team when recruiting time came, but when George Fox University hired Bob Steenson this past fall as its new softball coach, it was a case of "player first, coach second."

Steenson replaces Tim Hill, who left the part-time George Fox position for a full-time opportunity at Pacific University, and he will be joining his daughter, pitching ace Laura Steenson Seratt, for her senior year.

"Certainly, this being Laura's last year had something to do with it," Steenson admitted, "but this is more than just a one-shot deal. I had been out of coaching for a couple years, but after working with the George Fox team in the fall, I realized that I missed it, and this was a good opportunity to get back into coaching. I'm hoping to be here several more years."

This is Steenson's first venture into college coaching, but he has 14 years of experience as an ASA softball coach, having led teams of various age levels, from the 18-and-under groups on down, to several tournaments and 2 trips to ASA Nationals.

During that time, Steenson struck up a friendship with Hill and was one of those who encouraged him to look into



the George Fox coaching position 2 years ago. Hill led the Bruins to a 25-31-2 record in 2 seasons and was Northwest Conference Coach of the Year in 2000 when the Bruins went 16-14-2, a dramatic improvement over the year before.

"I told Craig [Taylor, the George Fox director of athletics] that I'd help out with the team's fall practices until someone could be found to coach the team, and realized then how much I enjoyed it again," said Steenson. "I'm in a position now at work where I have the free time to do this, so I made them

a proposal to coach the team, and it was accepted."

The Bruins finished the 2002 season with a 9-17 record, and Steenson has no illusions about challenging for the conference title — not yet, anyway.

"Injuries and a lack of depth played a large part in the team's struggles last year," notes Steenson, who watched the team regularly as a fan of his daughter. "We'll have a few more folks out this year, and we should be better both offensively and defensively. Plus we expect to have at least one other pitcher; Laura has a strong arm, but she pretty much wore herself out by pitching every game but one last year."

A native Oregonian, Steenson graduated from Clackamas High, then played football for 1 season at Willamette University and a year of baseball on the 1st team ever at Clackamas Community College. He raced motorcycles and owned a motorcycle dealership for a while before settling into sales of forest products for several years. He presently works as a marketer for Abco Marketing, which sells athletics and corporate logo apparel.

He and his wife, Rosie, have been married for 32 years and live in Milwaukie, Ore. Laura, their only child, has compiled a 27-31 record with a 1.89 ERA and 276 strikeouts in her 3 years as the Bruins staff ace.

Offense woes plague bruins after fast start in 2002

A season that began with loads of promise and an early 5-2 record soured on the George Fox softball team as the Bruins struggled offensively to score runs. As a result, the Bruins won only 4 of their final 19 games, were shut out 6 times, and finished at 9-17, with a 6-14 Northwest Conference mark that left them in 6th place.

The Bruins' fast start included 2 wins over Pacific by a combined 18-0 score and 3 straight wins in the SunWest Tournament in Orange, Calif. Junior first baseman Cori Wulf of Salem, Ore., was NWC Hitter of the Week for her home run and 6 RBIs in the Pacific twinbill, and junior pitcher Laura Steenson of Milwaukie, Ore., earned NWC Pitcher of the Week honors for allowing only 1 earned run in 3 games in the SunWest Tourney.

Wulf led the team with a .311 average and 16 RBIs. Sophomore center fielder Sarah Camp of Hubbard, Ore., was the only Bruin to garner postseason honors, receiving honorable mention for All-Conference after batting .246 and leading the league in stolen bases (15) and hit-by-pitches (8). Steenson was 2nd in the league with 132 strikeouts while going 9-16 with a 2.25 ERA.

Tim Hill completed his 2nd season as the Bruins head coach with a 25-31-2 record before leaving to take a full-time position as softball coach at Pacific University.

Intercollegiate athletics are an important part of George Fox University, home to one of the Northwest's most successful small-college sports programs. Winning programs, of course, are accompanied by a proper balance between academics and athletics. Accordingly, George Fox teams are members of the Northwest Conference and compete in Division III of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, in which need and academic ability, not athleticism, determine scholarships and financial aid.

At George Fox University, student-athletes compete for conference and national titles at a Christ-centered university where professors and

coaches help them grow in mind, body, and spirit. Intercollegiate athletics competition provides for practical application of what is learned in the classroom and at practice. At George Fox, the values of athletics are integrated with the goals of Christian higher education in a process that includes

- Cooperation
- Graciousness in winning and losing

The university fields teams in 13 varsity sports, 7 for women (volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, softball, tennis, and track

More than 15 percent of George Fox's traditional undergraduate students participate in these sports. Their records over the years serve as shining testimonies to the administration's conviction that an institution can play for the glory of God, follow the rules and ethics of its governing organizations, and be successful on the fields and courts of competition at the same time.
