COREY BEALS has been teaching at George Fox University for the last eight years. He worships at Newberg Friends and participates in an unprogrammed meeting there. He has a Ph.D. in British Literature from Rutgers University and has published numerous articles in Quaker publications, edited several books, and given workshops at the FGC gathering, Pendle Hill, Quaker Center, and other venues. He is a member of Santa Monica Friends Meeting, where he serves as clerk of Pastoral Care and the Peace and Social Action Committee.

ARTHUR O. ROBERTS is Professor at Large at George Fox University, where he began teaching in 1953. Arthur has served as Editor of *Quaker Religious Thought* (1989-2000) and has authored twenty books, including *Early Quaker Writings* (with Hugh Barbour), *Tomorrow is Growing Old*, and *Through Flaming Sword; The Life and Legacy of George Fox* (revised, 2008). Arthur is working on the history of evangelical Quakerism for the *Oxford Handbook of Quaker Studies*, and is author of *The Wit and Wisdom of Jack Willcuts* (2000).

BARBARA S. WORDEN has taught in several colleges, including George Fox University and Barclay College. She is now Emeritus Professor of Spirituality and Gender Studies at the Houston Graduate School of Theology. She has a number of publications and has been a representative to meetings of the Friends World Committee for Consultation and to the Faith and Order Commission of the National Council of Churches.
