## 11/4 – PUGET SOUND 1, GEORGE FOX 0: Loggers Edge Bruins to Clinch NWC Championship

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Adrienne Folsom, the Northwest Conference's leading scorer, notched her 19th score of the season with 18 minutes left in the game, giving the 14th-ranked University of Puget Sound Loggers a 1-0 victory over the George Fox University Bruins and the NWC women's soccer championship Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Although Puget Sound held firm control of the field for most of the first half, taking 11 shots to two for George Fox and earning six corner kicks to none, the defense for both teams was stout and the first half ended in a scoreless tie. The teams battled through 27 more scoreless minutes in the second half before the Loggers broke through.

Katie Gillette drove the middle until she reached a point about 10 yards outside the keeper's box, then dished off to Folsom on the right wing. Folsom drove into the box past a Bruin defender and launched a shot from 20 yards away that crossed into the left corner of the net for what proved to be the conference-clinching goal.

The Logger defense did the job the rest of the way, holding the Bruins to four shots all game and two on goal. Puget Sound took 17 shots in all, seven on goal. Kallie Wolfer had two saves for the Loggers, while Jessica Cardwell had six for the Bruins.

The game was the final one for four George Fox seniors: defenders Lindsay Jacobs and Melissa Noyd, midfielder Emily Atkinson, and midfielder/goalkeeper Amaris Tronson. Atkinson ended her career ranked 7th at GFU in goals (16) and 11th in total points (35).

George Fox ends its season with a 6-12-2 overall record and a 4-10-2 conference mark. Puget Sound is now 15-1-3 overall and 13-1-2 in the league. The Loggers' 41 points enabled them to edge the Willamette University Bearcats, 3-1 winners Saturday at Pacific University, who had 40 points on a 13-2-1 NWC record. UPS earns the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III National Tournament, the full field to be announced Sunday.

## 10/29 – PACIFIC 2, GEORGE FOX 1: Boxers Beat Bruins in Overtime to Snap 12-Game Losing Streak

FOREST GROVE, Ore. – Meghan Fredette scored two minutes into the first overtime, giving Pacific University a 2-1 win over the George Fox University Bruins and snapping the Boxers' 12-game losing streak in Northwest Conference women's soccer action Sunday afternoon here at Tom Reynolds Field.

Pacific scored the only goal of the first half when Anna Saban-Roach connected off a Kaleigh Stubblefield corner kick in the 9th minute. The kick deflected off of Jenna Johnson-Endo to the feet of Saban-Roach, who shot to the right corner for her second goal of the season.

George Fox turned up the offensive pressure early in the second half, out-shooting Pacific 10-4 in the stanza, and saw it pay off in the 61st minute. Emily Atkinson hit the equalizer, scoring her fourth goal of the season unassisted on a shot from the top of the 18-yard box that hooked into the top left corner.

Kelli Ganiko had a great opportunity to put Pacific back on top in the 65th minute, but her shot from 20 yards out hooked wide of the right post. Fredette also had a game-winning opportunity in the 84th minute when she beat two George Fox defenders, but saw a wide-open shot fall right into the hands of Bruin keeper Jessica Cardwell.

Fredette netted her golden goal with the only shot for either team in the extra period, connecting to the left corner of the goal from 12 yards out off a short pass from Becca Roth. It was her fourth goal of the season.

George Fox out-shot Pacific 15-9, including a 7-6 edge in shots on goal. Shannon Tillman made six saves in goal for the Boxers, while Cardwell made four stops for the Bruins.

The Bruins, who owned a 6-1 victory over the Boxers in their first meeting on Sept. 30, fell to 5-11-2 overall and 3-9-2 in the NWC. The Boxers, notching their first conference victory and ending a 14-game winless streak that included two ties, are now 3-12-2 overall and 1-12-1 in league play.

Both teams end their seasons next weekend with a pair of home games. George Fox hosts Linfield College Friday and the University of Puget Sound Saturday, while Pacific welcomes Puget Sound Friday and Willamette University Saturday. All games start at 11 a.m.

Goalkeeper **Jessica Cardwell** has been named the Bruin Athletic Association Women's Athlete of the Week for the second time this fall and the Northwest Conference Women's Defensive Player of the Week for Oct. 16-22 after posting back-to-back shutouts for the Bruins. In a 3-0 win over Lewis & Clark on Oct. 21, she made 5 saves while facing 8 total shots, then made 10 saves while facing 22 shots in a 0-0 double-overtime tie at Pacific Lutheran on Oct. 22. ## 10/25 – WILLAMETTE 2, GEORGE FOX 1: Bearcats Take NWC Lead with Comeback Win Over Bruins

NEWBERG, Ore. – Scoring twice in the second half, first on a second-chance penalty kick and then on a point-blank shot with 11 minutes left, the 19th-ranked Willamette University Bearcats pulled out a 2-1 win over the upset-minded George Fox University Bruins and moved into first place in the Northwest Conference women's soccer race Wednesday afternoon here at Morse Field.

The first half was a defensive struggle as Willamette managed only six shots and George Fox just five. The Bruins made their one shot on goal count, however, with 47 seconds left in the half as Kayla Weber passed from the right baseline to the middle of the keeper's box, where Kaylee Ross caught the ball and sent it into the left corner of the net for a 1-0 George Fox lead. It was the second goal of the season for Ross.

The Bruins made that slim margin stand until the Bruins were called for a foul on Elizabeth Tatlock inside the keeper's box at 63:27. Jessica Lammers took the penalty kick, and Bruin keeper Jessica Cardwell blocked the attempt with a dive to her right, only to be whistled for taking a step forward on the shot. Given a second opportunity, Lammers this time sent the tying goal into the upper right corner, her third of the season.

Willamette netted the go-ahead goal at 79:03 when Lammers sent a long pass from the left sideline into a clump of players 10 feet in front of the goal. Cardwell, shielded from the ball by the mass of humanity, never saw Emily Gross come up with the loose ball and roll it untouched into the net for her sixth score of the season and the one that put the Bearcats on top of the conference.

The Bearcats out-shot the Bruins 16-9 overall and 11-3 in shots on goal. Cardwell made nine saves for the Bruins, while Kari Woody stopped two shots for the Bearcats.

George Fox is now 5-10-2 overall and 3-8-2 in the conference. Willamette, now 13-2-2 overall and 10-2-1 in the league, has 31 points to 29 for the University of Puget Sound (9-1-2 in the NWC) and 28 for Whitworth College (9-2-1 in the NWC). The Bruins visit Pacific University Sunday while the Bearcats go to Linfield College Saturday, both games starting at 11 a.m.

## 10/1 - WESTERN OREGON 3, GEORGE FOX 1: Bruins Drop Final Non-Conference Game to D-II Wolves

**MONMOUTH, Ore.** - Holding their own in the shots department, the George Fox University Bruins were unable to match Western Oregon University in goals scored, however, and dropped a 3-1 road decision to the NCAA Division II Wolves in their final non-conference women's soccer game of the season here Sunday afternoon at the WOU Soccer Field.

The Bruins dipped below .500 at 4-5-1 on the year, while the Wolves evened their record at 6-6-2. George Fox returns to Northwest Conference play Saturday with a visit to the University of Puget Sound for a 12 noon game. Western Oregon has nine days off before resuming play on Tuesday, Oct. 10, with a home match vs. Southern Oregon University.

## 9/30 – GEORGE FOX 6, PACIFIC 1: Bruins Score Early and Often in Breezing by Boxers

**NEWBERG, Ore.** - Julie Alexander scored a mere 38 seconds into the contest, igniting a quick three-goal strike to start the game that fueled an eventual 6-1 win by the George Fox University Bruins over the Pacific University Boxers in a Northwest Conference women's soccer match Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Alexander's goal from the left side of the keeper's box came after a pass from the left sideline by Kayla Corn. Five minutes later, at 5:22, Molly Schaefer passed to Amber Stevens in the middle, and she scored her first goal of the season to make it 2-0. At 18:35, Schaefer shot from the right side of the box, but the drive was blocked across to Alexander, who sent in her second goal of the day and fifth of the season for a 3-0 lead which the Bruins took into the halftime.

Seventy seconds into the second half, Bethany Zirschky's corner kick was headed into the net by Emily Atkinson, her second score of the season, to make it 4-0. At 52:39, Alexander sent a drive off the crossbar that bounced back to Schaefer, who returned it to the back of the net for her third goal of year and a 5-0 Bruin bulge. Jessica McMorran passed to Kaylee Ross for her first goal of the season to round out the George Fox scoring at the 88:16 mark.

The Bruin defense held Pacific to 12 shots, only six on goal, and the one score the Boxers did get almost didn't make it in. Becca Roth took a shot at the goal from 20 yards out on the left side, and the shot skimmed the crossbar and dropped almost straight down, but crossed the plane of the goal line enough to count as a score at the 59:50 mark.

Bruin keepers Jessica Cardwell and Amaris Tronson combined for four saves (with one team save), the win going to Cardwell, who tended the net the first two-thirds of the game. Sarah Chrusoskie had eight saves for the Boxers as the Bruins took 27 shots, 14 on goal.

## 9/23 – PACIFIC LUTHERAN 2, GEORGE FOX 0: Lutes' Lightning-Strikes in 2nd Half Blitz Bruins

**NEWBERG, Ore.** - After a scoreless standoff through the first 45 minutes, the Pacific Lutheran University Lutes surprised the George Fox University Bruins, who were playing their home opener, with two quick goals to start the second half and made them stand up for a 2-0 win in a Northwest Conference women's soccer game Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

The visiting Lutes out-shot the Bruins 15-5 in the first half but could not punch anything home. Just 45 seconds into the second half, however, the Lutes' Jenny McKinsey picked off a pass as the Bruins were trying to clear the ball from the keeper's box and drilled it home past keeper Jessica Cardwell for her seventh goal of the season, tying Adrienne Folsom of the University of Puget Sound for the league lead.

A mere 32 seconds later, Breann Vanden Box made a steal near the top of the keeper's box and passed to her left to Jackie Oehmcke, who quickly scored past Cardwell. It was Oehmcke's first goal of the season, and was more than enough offense for the Lutes.

PLU took 28 shots, 14 on goal, to 10 overall and six on goal for the Bruins. The Lutes also held a 12-1 advantage in corner kicks. Alyssa Blackburn made six saves in goal to pick up the win for the Lutes, while Cardwell made 11 saves for the Bruins.

## 9/21 – GEORGE FOX 1, LEWIS & CLARK 1 (2 OT): Bruins and Pios Tie after Scoring in First but No More

PORTLAND, Ore. - After trading goals in the first half, the visiting George Fox University Bruins and home-standing Lewis & Clark College Pioneers battled through the second half and two 10-minute overtimes to a 1-1 draw in a Northwest Conference women's soccer game Thursday night here at Griswold Stadium.

The Pioneers took a 1-0 lead 22:46 into the game when a Katie Burnett corner kick deflected off a Bruin defender and into the net past George Fox goalkeeper Jessica Cardwell for an 'own goal'. "Yeah, I knew it would be a card," Cardwell admitted sheepishly, "but I just couldn't stand the thought of giving up a sure goal so easily; we were already down by two, so I figured, 'What the heck'". And Amaris (Tronson, the Bruins' reserve keeper) stopped the penalty kick, so I guess it was worth it."

## 9/2 – GEORGE FOX 6, WARNER PACIFIC 0: Bruins Score Three in Each Half to Take Opener over Knights

PORTLAND, Ore. – Scoring the most goals in a game in two years, the George Fox University Bruins scored three times in each half and coasted to a 6-0 victory over the Warner Pacific College Knights in their women's soccer season opener Saturday afternoon here at Portland Christian High School.

The last time the Bruins scored as many as six goals in a game was a 6-0 win over Cascade College on Sept. 10, 2004. The win was also the Bruins' fourth in as many games in the series with the Knights and the largest margin in any of them.

Bethany Zirschky got the George Fox onslaught going with a goal at 14:29 of the first half with an assist by Julie Alexander. Katie Yoder at 29:18 and Liz Petersen at 40:14 scored their first college goals unassisted to make it 3-0 at the break.

The second half was the Amaris Tronson show as the goalkeeper-turned-midfielder notched a goal at 59:41, assisted by Whitney Hall, and closed out the scoring with a penalty kick goal at 81:29. Only 58 seconds earlier, Kayla Weber had scored her first college goal off a pass from Molly Schaefer.

The Bruin defense shut down the Knights completely, allowing only three shots all game and only one on goal. Keeper Jessica Cardwell picked up the win with one save. Janette Sears made five saves in goal for Warner Pacific but suffered the loss.

George Fox (1-0) heads south next weekend, taking on Simpson University in Redding, Calif., on Friday night at 8 p.m. before visiting Southern Oregon University Saturday at 1 p.m. Warner Pacific (0-2) goes to Western Oregon University Tuesday for a 4 p.m. contest.

## **8/30 – PREVIEW: Bruins Aim to Cook Up Winning Recipe with Plenty of Ingredients in '06**

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Andy Hetherington sounds like a prize-winning gourmet chef when he says, "We have all the ingredients to make the cake, we just need to get the mix right and start cooking."

The recipe Hetherington is concocting, however, is one he hopes will emerge as a winner for the George Fox University women's soccer team in 2006. The Bruins were close in 2005; in a 6-13-1 season, eight setbacks were by a single goal, including five 1-0 heartbreakers. With 13 returning letterwinners, including 10 starters, and a talented class of 11 recruits, the Bruins and their fifth-year coach believe they now have all the ingredients for success.

Defense kept the Bruins in most games last year as they allowed only 26 goals in 20 games, and it will be a strength once again. The last line of defense for the Bruins is goalkeeper **Jessica Cardwell** (Jr., Springfield, Ore. / Thurston HS), a Second Team All-Northwest Conference selection who led the league in saves with 144. Backing her up is **Amaris Tronson** (Sr., Cashmere, Wash. / Cashmere HS), who will also see considerable time at midfield.

"I am absolutely delighted with Jessica in goal; there aren't enough superlatives to describe her," says Hetherington. "She is basically very solid, with the ability to pull off the incredible when needed. No question she is one of the best, if not THE best, in the conference. Amaris is a quality utility player who can fill in at goal if we need her, but she is going to help us considerably in midfield."

The defensive line is anchored by veterans **Lindsay Jacobs** (Sr., Bend, Ore. / Mountain View HS) and **Melissa Noyd** (Sr., Salem, Ore. / Sprague HS), along with **Jasmine Ah Choy** (So., Honolulu, Hawai'i / Moanalua HS), who started immediately as a freshman. Jacobs is a four-year starter in the middle, while Noyd and Ah Choy provide strength on the outsides. **Cheri Beck** (Jr., Renton, Wash. / Liberty HS) was a key player last year who will help out again this year as a center back.

The defense will be extremely deep with the addition of four new backs who are pushing hard for playing time. **Megan Servoss** (Fr., Medford, Ore. / North Medford HS) has proved to be a terrific find at stopper, and **Mari Nagamine** (Fr., Kaneohe, Hawai'i / Moanalua HS) is a talented recruit who is challenging for a starting role at sweeper. **Stephanie Chesnut** (Fr., Seaside, Ore. / Seaside HS) and **Katherine Matsen** (Fr., Vancouver, Wash. / Bellevue HS) are versatile players who can handle any of the back line positions.

The Bruins return three starters at midfield in **Emily Atkinson** (Sr., Fircrest, Wash. / Henry Foss HS), **Bethany Zirschky** (Jr., Gig Harbor, Wash. / Gig Harbor HS), and **Kelli Roots** (Jr., Grants Pass, Ore. / Grants Pass HS). Atkinson and Zirschky are both excellent defenders with good offensive skills as well; Atkinson had three goals and an assist in 2005 while Zirschky scored twice and had two assists. Roots started 16 games and contributed one assist during the season. **Kaylee Ross** (Fr., Poulsbo, Wash. / King's West HS) scored one goal while appearing in 19 games with 11 starts.

**Molly Schaefer** (Fr., Salem, Ore. / Sprague HS), a transfer from the University of Oregon, has looked good at the left midfield position and is "a very good pickup for us", according to Hetherington. **Brooke Peterson** (Fr., Billings, Mont. / Billings HS) and **Jessica McMorran** (Fr., Parkdale, Ore. / Hood River Valley HS) are a couple of offensive midfielders who have joined the Bruins, while **Kayla Corn** (Fr., Garden Grove, Calif. / Pacifica HS) and **Katie Yoder** (Fr., Lynden, Wash. / Lynden HS) give the team two defensive mids.

"The biggest change is going to be on offense," says Hetherington. "I am realistically expecting us to score a lot more goals than the 16 we had last year."

Two keys to that improvement should come up front with a fully-healthy **Amber Stevens** (Jr., Medford, Ore. / South Medford HS) and the shift of **Julie Alexander** (Jr., Salt Lake City, Utah / Brighton HS) from midfield to forward.

Stevens, who led the Bruins in scoring and was sixth in the conference as a freshman two years, suffered a broken foot in the last game of that season and was slowed by it last fall, although she did manage three goals. "She's one of the quickest players in the conference when she's healthy, and she's playing on top of her game right now," observes Hetherington. "I really think she can be a D-I caliber player for us."

Alexander spent her first two years at George Fox as a midfielder, where she set a Bruin record with three assists in one game as a freshman and led the team in scoring last year with three goals and three assists, but the team's strength at midfield has enabled her to move to forward this fall. "That's her best position," says Hetherington, "and pairing her with Stevens could really open up our offense."

Joining them on the scoring front will be **Whitney Hall** (So., Newberg, Ore. / Newberg HS), who had one goal last year and whom Hetherington calls "maybe the fastest player in the NWC." Two newcomers who will add depth to the attack are **Kayla Weber** (Fr., Portland, Ore. / Wilson HS) and **Liz Petersen** (Fr., Newberg, Ore. / Newberg HS). "Kayla is strong and quick and shoots well with either foot," notes Hetherington. "Liz will be a 'multi-tasker' for us; she can play either forward or midfield."

The Bruins went 3-12-1 in the conference last year and finished ninth, a position they were picked for in the pre-season poll of league coaches, but Hetherington thinks his team is ready to spring a few surprises. "Our goal," he declares, "is simply a winning season and a finish at least in the top six of the conference."

"Consistency is the main thing; last year, we'd play well one week and poorly the next. We also had a better record on the road than at home, and we need to do a whole lot better on our own field. But we are much deeper and stronger, so I'm not as worried about injuries as I have been in the past - not that I want any of my players injured, of course."

The Bruins get the new season cooking on Saturday, Sept. 2, when they visit Warner Pacific College at 1 p.m. at Portland Christian High School. Conference play begins on Sept. 16 as the Bruins travel to Whitworth College. The first home game is Sept. 23 vs. Pacific Lutheran University at 12 noon at Morse Field.

## **8/18 – NWC POLL: Bruins Picked 9th in Conference Women's Soccer Race Despite 15 Returnees**

**NEWBERG, Ore.** - With 15 returning letterwinners, including 10 starters, George Fox University hopes to surprise the Northwest Conference coaches, who have picked the Bruins to finish ninth in the nine-team women's soccer race in 2006 in their annual pre-season coaches' poll.

The Bruins, coming off a 6-13-1 record and ninth-place finish at 3-12-1 in the league in 2005, received 18 points in the voting. Eight of the team's losses were by a single goal, but with a veteran lineup and several talented newcomers, fifth-year coach Andy Hetherington believes the Bruins have the potential to reverse those fortunes.

Honorable mention All-Conference goalkeeper Jessica Cardwell, the league leader in saves with 144, anchors the Bruin defense, which also includes a strong back line that allowed only 26 goals in 20 games. The offense struggled in 2005, however, scoring only 16 goals, so Hetherington will look for increased firepower up front from Julie Alexander (3 goals, 3 assists), Emily Atkinson (3 goals, 1 assist), Bethany Zirschky (2 goals, 2 assists), and Amber Stevens (3 goals).

The University of Puget Sound is a strong favorite to win its fifth straight NWC title and sixth in the last seven years. The Loggers, who advanced within a game of the NCAA Division III Final Four after winning last season's conference crown, picked up seven first-place votes to finish ahead of Willamette University. Puget Sound, which finished 18-2-2 overall and 15-0-1 in the NWC, returns two First Team All-Northwest Conference selections in defender Janece Leven and forward Adrienne Folsom. However, the Loggers must overcome the graduation of two-time NWC Offensive Player of the Year Cortney Kjar and 2005 NWC Defensive Player of the Year Katie Wulbrandt.

Willamette, which picked up two first-place votes and 69 total points, will be led by First Team All-NWC midfielders Susan Butler and Laura Uhlmann. The Bearcats, who finished 11-6-3 overall and 9-4-3 in the NWC last fall, have won or shared nine NWC titles in the last 13 years but have not won since 2002. Whitworth College is third in the poll with 56 points, one point ahead of Whitman College. The Pirates (8-8-3 overall, 7-7-2 NWC) played all of last season without former NWC Offensive MVP Jael Hagerott, who is expected to return in 2006. The Pirates return eight other starters as well.

Whitman is fourth in the poll, coming off a 10-6-3 season that included an 8-5-3 conference mark. Forwards Kristen Berndt and Sammie Arthur will lead a potent offensive attack for the Missionaries. Pacific Lutheran University (51 points) is in fifth place in the poll with 51 points. The Lutes (11-6-2 overall, 9-5-2 in the NWC) return a pair of forwards who were Second Team All-NWC selections as freshmen: Megan Shannon and Christina McDuffie.

Lewis & Clark College, which made great improvements as a young program in 2005, is sixth in the poll with 34 points. The Pioneers (7-10-3 overall, 5-9-2 NWC) welcome back leading scorer Lisa Housman. Linfield College (23 points) edged Pacific University (22 points) for seventh place in the poll. The Wildcats (5-11-4 overall, 3-10-3 NWC) hope to improve under new head coach Melanie Langley, while the Boxers (7-12-1 overall, 4-11-1 NWC) hope to do the same under new head coach Joy Boswell.

The 2006 season kicks off for the Bruins on Saturday, Sept. 2, at 1 p.m. against Warner Pacific College at the Portland Christian High School Field. The Bruins' first home game is a conference match against Pacific Lutheran University on Sept. 23 at 12 noon.
