#### Rissmiller Wraps Up Basketball Career as Conference Player of Year

Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges coaches have voted George Fox wing **Nancy Rissmiller (Sr., Tigard HS, Ore.)** as the league's Player of the Year.

Rissmiller finished the regular season second in conference scoring (16.5), fourth in rebounding (8.9), eighth in blocks (0.8) and fourth in steals (2.5).

Rissmiller will leave George Fox with top-12 career records in five different categories: scoring (second - 1,403), rebounding (third - 907), steals (second - 205), blocks (11th - 65) and assists (12th - 166). Her career scoring average of 13.4 is the second-highest ever at George Fox.

Rissmiller now begins her final track season, where she is the two-time defending NAIA national high jump champion and a member of the women's All-American 4x400 relay team.

#### Greller Becomes Highest-Honored Freshmen With Second-Team Honors

Post **Katie Greller (Fr., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)** is the only freshman to receive first or second team Northwest Conference honors this year. Greller earned second-team honors after setting the George Fox school record for season field-goal accuracy at .582. Her mark put her second in the NCIC and she finished 10th in free-throw percentage (.775) and seventh in rebounding (7.2). She was George Fox's second-leading scorer (13.0).

#### LAST WEEK:

George Fox 52, Puget Sound 63

TACOMA, Wash. - Wing **Nancy Rissmiller's (Sr., Tigard HS, Ore.)** team-highs of 17 points, six rebounds, five assists and four steals weren't enough as University of Puget Sound took advantage of 25 George Fox turnovers to knock the Lady Bruins from the Northwest Conference playoffs with a 63-52 win Wednesday (Feb. 25).

UPS's Kasa Tupua returned from a foot injury to score a game-high 19 points on 8 of 11 shooting.

George Fox was within six points in the final minute. Wing **Tabitha Dawson (Fr., Eagle HS, Idaho)** hit a 3-pointer with 51 seconds left to pull the Lady Bruins within 57-51. She finished with four 3-pointers and 14 points.

UPS hit its final six free throws.

### **BRUIN BITS:**

\*\*\* For the third consecutive year, George Fox's women's basketball team was ranked in the NAIA Div. II top-25 national poll. The Lady Bruins ranked 23rd in the first regular season rating on Dec. 2. They received votes in the final poll, but were not ranked.

\*\*\* George Fox this season tied its NAIA-era school record for consecutive wins with eight straight. The Lady Bruins also went 11-1 at home, making them 47-13 (.783) over the last five seasons.

\*\*\* In addition to post **Katie Greller's (Fr. MOC/Floyd Valley HS)** single-season field-goal accuracy record, George Fox individuals set two other school records this season. Both came in the season opener against Hamline University. Wing **Nancy Rissmiller (Sr., Tigard HS, Ore.)** hit 11 of 11 free throws and wing **Tabitha Dawson (Fr., Eagle HS, Idaho)** tied the single game 3-point accuracy record by hitting 5 of 5. Dawson led the Northwest Conference in free throw accuracy (88.6) and would have easily set the season school record, but did not meet the minimum attempts standard. She also was fourth in 3-point accuracy (36.7).

\*\*\* George Fox has made 10 NAIA post season appearances in the last 12 years. The Lady Bruins have finished <sup>3rd</sup> in their conference <sup>seed</sup> for five consecutive seasons - three of those times behind two teams that advanced to the NAIA national tournament.

\*\*\* Point guard **Cherish Carroll (Sr., West Valley HS, Fairbanks, Alaska)** and wing **Tonya Miller (Sr., West Linn HS, Ore.)** will put their names in the George Fox record book. Carroll is sixth with 219 career assists (five away from fifth), and Miller is 10th with 180.

\*\*\* Tid bits from the final regular season Northwest Conference report: **Rachel Powell (So., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.)** was third in blocks per game (1.0), point guard **Cherish Carroll (Sr., West Valley HS, Fairbanks, Alaska)** was second in assists (5.1), wing **Tonya Miller (Sr., West Linn HS, Ore.)** was eighth in 3-point percentage (35.7).

### **SCOTT SAYS:** (Comments from second-year Head Coach Scott Rueck)

*On UPS:* "Playing in Tacoma is tough. Playing a very good team in Tacoma is really tough. UPS and PLU have lost only two games against other conference schools at home in the past two years. We knew things would have to go perfect to get out of there with a win and they did not quite go our way. We played as well as we have up there, but it wasn't enough. Puget Sound did a great job of using a containment press to control the tempo and we didn't attack it as well as we needed to. I feel we lost our best chance for nationals when we lost to Linfield and gave up home court advantage."

*On Season:* "I am very happy with the season we had. I'm disappointed with the finish because we were so close to our goals and didn't quite get there. But realistically, with the understanding that we didn't have a true recruiting season because of the instability of the coaching position last spring, this team was amazing. I thought our seniors did an outstanding job of leading a very young team and our freshman class stepped up and filled the holes left by graduation. The characteristic I was the most proud of was their unbelievable attitude, perseverance, and desire to be great. They never quit working and improving. This team should be very proud of their effort this year."

*On Next Season:* "With the amount of contribution we had this year from underclassmen, I am very optimistic of our future. We obviously need to replace the point guard and wing positions, and I don't know if we will do that through recruiting or the development of our younger players. With the nucleus of talent that we have returning I am hopeful that we will remain a competitive playoff contender."

*On Nancy Rissmiller:* "Nancy Rissmiller is one of a kind. We will never be able to replace her. People see the stats, the scoring average, the rebounds, the steals, how she could take a team's best offensive player out of a game with her defense, and her patented driving and slashing moves to the basket. What people never see is the thing that makes Nancy an invaluable asset to a team, and that is her leadership by example. Her work-ethic is awesome, her attitude is business-like, but cheerful and positive, and her desire to win and be the best is second to none. I am so happy for her that her consistency was recognized by the other coaches in our conference. She is, without a doubt, deserving. She has had an impact on this program from day one when she arrived four years ago, and I know that she has left a lasting impression on this year's freshman. Hopefully her example has rubbed off on them. Nancy is awesome."

## George Fox Women's Basketball Announces Team Awards

George Fox University's women's basketball team has handed out its 1997-98 team awards.

NAIA Second-Team All-American wing **Nancy Rissmiller (Sr., Tigard HS, Ore.)** is the Lady Bruins' Most Valuable Player. She finished the regular season second in Northwest Conference scoring, averaging 16.5 points a game. Rissmiller was also fourth in rebounding (8.9); eighth in blocks (0.8); and fourth in steals (2.5). She was voted the NCIC Player of the Year by Northwest Conference coaches. Rissmiller will leave George Fox holding three top-10 career records, finishing second in scoring (1,403); second in steals (205); and third in rebounding (907). Rissmiller's career scoring average of 13.4 is the second-highest in George Fox history.

Guard **Tonya Miller (Sr., West Linn HS, Ore.)** earned the team Best Defense award. Averaging more than 30 minutes a game, Miller was fifth on the team in rebounding with 3.0 a game and had 27 steals for the season. She was eighth in the NCIC in three-point percentage, hitting 20 of 56 (.357) and averaged 2.12 assists a game.

Most Inspirational is post **Rachel Powell (So., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.)**, who returned from a knee injury that ended her 1996-97 season. She averaged 27 minutes, 6.2 rebounds, and 1.4 steals a game. Powell was third in the NCIC in blocks, averaging almost one (.96) a game. She had a career-high four blocks against Whitman College this season.

The Lady Bruins voted **Joani Kroon (Fr., Wasilla HS, Alaska)** as Most Improved. A reserve post, she averaged 1.0 points, 1.2 rebounds and four minutes a game.

### **Rissmiller Becomes Highest Honored Lady Bruin With Second-Team All-American Award**

Forward Nancy Rissmiller (Sr., Tigard HS, Ore.) will end her college basketball career as the highest-honored player in George Fox women's basketball history.

The 5-foot-10 Northwest Conference Player of the Year has been named an NAIA Div. II Second-Team All-American. Only one other Lady Bruin has received All-American honors; 1994-95 honorable mention point guard All-American Heidi (Rueck) Newkirk.

Rissmiller finished second in the Northwest Conference in scoring (16.5), fourth in rebounding (8.9), eighth in blocks (0.8) and fourth in steals (2.5).

She leaves George Fox with top-12 career records in five categories, finishing second in scoring (1,403), third in rebounding (907), second in steals (205), 11th in blocks (65) and 12th in assists (166). Her career scoring average (13.4) is the second-highest ever at George Fox.

Rissmiller also competes in track, where she is the two-time defending NAIA high jump champion (personal best 5-10) and a member of George Fox's All-American 4x400-meter relay team.

George Fox finished the 1997-98 season with a 16-9 record and tied for second in the Northwest Conference with a 13-5 league record.

#### George Fox Heads Back to Tacoma for Playoff Game

George Fox will make its 10th NAIA post season appearance in the last 12 years Wednesday (Feb. 25) at University of Puget Sound. A 2-0 final regular season week for UPS combined with a 0-2 George Fox finish tied the two teams for second place in the Northwest Conference. Tie-breaker criteria determined that UPS would take the No. 2 seed and George Fox the No. 3 seed.

#### Northwest Conference Title Slips From George Fox's Grasp

Pacific Lutheran University declined to share its Northwest Conference title with George Fox, holding off the Lady Bruins Saturday (Feb. 21) in Tacoma. A George Fox win in the final game would have tied the teams for the regular season title.

#### Win Streak Ends at Eight Straight/Lady Bruins Finish 11-1 at Home

George Fox came up just shy of its NAIA-era school record for consecutive wins, falling to Linfield College on Friday (Feb. 20). The loss also kept the Lady Bruins from an undefeated home record. George Fox finishes the season with an 11-1 record in Miller Gym.

#### Record-Tying Eighth-Straight Win Moves George Fox Into First Place

George Fox last week tied its NAIA-era school record with its eighth-straight win and won its 11th consecutive at home. The Lady Bruins' 3-0 week - coupled with Whitman's 61-59 upset victory over Pacific Lutheran - moved George Fox into a first-place tie with PLU in the Northwest Conference at 13-3.

#### Lady Bruins Clinch Playoff Berth/Face Showdowns with Linfield and PLU

George Fox will make its 10th NAIA post season appearance in the last 12 years on Wednesday, Feb. 25. The opponent and where that game will be played will be determined this weekend when the Lady Bruins host fourth-place Linfield and visit co-leader PLU. PLU hosts Willamette on Friday. Two George Fox wins would earn the regular season title and secure an automatic berth to the NAIA Div. II national tournament held March 11-17 in Sioux City, Iowa. The last time George Fox won a Northwest Conference title was 1982, when it was called the Women's Conference of Independent Colleges.

The NCIC playoffs likely will pit the No. 1 seed versus the No. 4 seed and No. 2 vs. No. 3. All games will be played at the site of the higher seed. In the event of a first-place tie, the No. 1 and No. 2 teams would meet in the first round. The winner would receive the automatic berth to the national tournament and the loser would play the winner of the No. 3-No. 4 game for the NCIC's other national tournament berth.

#### Record-Tying Eighth-Straight Win Moves George Fox Into First Place

George Fox last week tied its NAIA-era school record with its eighth-straight win and won its 11th consecutive at home. The Lady Bruins' 3-0 week - coupled with Whitman's 61-59 upset victory over Pacific Lutheran - moved George Fox into a first-place tie with PLU in the Northwest Conference at 13-3.

#### Lady Bruins Clinch Playoff Berth/Face Showdowns with Linfield and PLU

George Fox will make its 10th NAIA post season appearance in the last 12 years on Wednesday, Feb. 25. The opponent and where that game will be played will be determined this weekend when the Lady Bruins host fourth-place Linfield and visit co-leader PLU. PLU hosts Willamette on Friday. Two George Fox wins would earn the regular season title and secure an automatic berth to the NAIA Div. II national tournament held March 11-17 in Sioux City, Iowa. The last time George Fox won a NAIA Conference title was 1982, when it was called the Women's Conference of Independent Colleges.

The NCIC playoffs likely will pit the No. 1 seed versus the No. 4 seed and No. 2 vs. No. 3. All games will be played at the site of the higher seed. In the event of a first-place tie, the No. 1 and No. 2 teams would meet in the first round. The winner would receive the automatic berth to the national tournament and the loser would play the winner of the No. 3-No. 4 game for the NCIC's other national tournament berth.

After falling behind 33-28 with three minutes left in the first half, Pacific went scoreless for the next eight minutes of play, reaching into the second half.

George Fox's biggest lead came at 3:50 when the Lady Bruins went up by 24, 63-39.

For Pacific, Angela Edwards had five 3-pointers and 17 points.

\*\*\* For the third consecutive year, George Fox's women's basketball team has been ranked in the NAIA Div. II top-25 national poll. The Lady Bruins ranked 23rd in the first regular season rating on Dec. 2. They are not currently ranked.

\*\*\* Wing **Nancy Rissmiller (Sr., Tigard HS, Ore.)** continues to climb the George Fox career lists. She now lists in five different categories: scoring (second - 1,360), rebounding (third - 888), steals (second - 197), blocks (11th - 64) and assists (12th - 158).

\*\*\*Point guard **Cherish Carroll (Sr., West Valley HS, Fairbanks, Alaska)** and wing **Tonya Miller (Sr., West Linn HS, Ore.)** will put their names in the George Fox record book as well. Carroll is sixth with 209 career assists, and Miller is 10th with 173.

**SCOTT SAYS:** (Comments from second-year Head Coach Scott Rueck)

*On Willamette:* "Tuesday's game was a huge one for us. We got excellent play from everyone and shot over 50 percent for the second-straight game. We are playing consistently - home and away - and that is a tribute to our team maturing. This was a big win for our playoff hopes."

*On Puget Sound:* "Puget Sound was without their top post player. We came out with lots of energy and desire and played the best defensive game that I have seen a George Fox team play. Midway through the second half we led by 38 over one of the most efficient offensive teams in our conference."

*On Pacific:* "Pacific totally changed their style of play. It was as if we hadn't played them before. I know we'll be ready to go."

Post **Katie Greller (Fr., Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)** scored a career-high 26 points and made four steals. Wing **Tabitha Dawson (Fr., Eagle, Idaho)** made four of her five 3-point attempts in the first half, finishing the game with 18 points. Guard **Cherish Carroll (Sr., West Valley HS, Fairbanks, Alaska)** passed out a career-high 10 assists—the eighth-highest single-game total in George Fox history.

The Lady Bruins saw a 15-point lead at 11:44 dissolve into a five-point deficit with 1:45 to go. George Fox scored one point in the 10-minute span, getting stuck on 48 for eight minutes.

Point guard Cherish Carroll (Sr., West Valley HS, Fairbanks, Alaska) hit a 15-foot jumper and two free throws in the final minute. She finished with 12 points and five assists. Wing Tabitha Dawson (Fr., Eagle HS, Idaho) hit a 3-pointer to tie the game at 1:26 and grabbed a key rebound in the final 20 seconds. She came off the bench for 11 points and four steals.

The Lady Bruins took a 48-36 lead with 9:48 to go and promptly misplaced their offense. While Western Baptist made a run, George Fox could not get 48 off the scoreboard for a stretch of more than eight minutes of game time. After the Lady Bruins rallied to win, staff on press row enjoyed the irony of the situation. Dec. 9 was Wirta's 48th birthday.

# Seat in stands hard to take for McIntire

## But clash with UW coach makes her return unlikely

**F**or Jocelyn McIntire, this basketball season has been like many others she has seen in her 15 years in the sport — and like no other.

McIntire, who ranks among the University of Washington's career leaders in assists, free throw accuracy and 3-point shot accuracy, runs the court two, three, maybe five nights a week. She is a point guard with a deft handle, sweet shot and keen court sense.

She runs the show — only this show is off, off-Montlake Boulevard, home of the Husky team she played 91 games for between 1989-91. This show is for Mama's Mexican Kitchen, the sponsor of one of two city league teams McIntire plays for in order to satisfy her roundball appetite.

The UW senior from Lake Oswego, Ore., longed for the chance to finish her collegiate career in a Husky uniform this season. She even formally sought a return to the team in December. But today McIntire realizes that was a chance she forfeited long ago.

So this Saturday night, when the 15-10 Huskies play what should have been McIntire's home finale against Washington State, a savvy point guard will sit in the student section of Edmundson Pavilion watching a young Husky team struggle — in part because it does not have a savvy point guard.

"It was hard to watch the games," McIntire said. "I wanted to be out there contributing with the team. But I guess I need to say that (not playing) has gotten easier to accept with time."

Last May McIntire and UW Coach Chris Gobrecht called a truce in a three-year battle of personalities. They signed an agreement in which McIntire could continue to pursue her degree in psychology, to train and study with her teammates, to retain her basketball scholarship.

But coach and player thought it best that she not play for the Huskies this season, so McIntire became a redshirt.

Gobrecht denies ever being contacted about McIntire's possible return and reiterates that she and McIntire have not spoken since May. Yet Gobrecht, who has admitted that lack of an experienced point guard has been a trying problem this season, insists that McIntire's absence has little to do with the Huskies' woes.

"What is going on with the team, it was irrelevant — whether we were going to go 28-0 or 0-28 — it was irrelevant to the situation involving Jocelyn."

"We never said, 'Jocelyn, you're not going to play next year because we don't need you.' That has nothing to do with it."

Then what is the issue that precluded speaking with McIntire about the possibility of returning this season?

"That's between Jocelyn and myself," Gobrecht says. "I realize everybody's got an opinion on it, but so far nobody's even been close."

"I'd be the first to say, yeah, sure we needed Jocelyn (this season). But that was irrelevant to why the decision was made then."

McIntire refuses to speculate on what difference she could have made to this Husky team, which might miss the NCAA tournament for the first time in Gobrecht's seven-year tenure and since 1984.

Each admits to some regrets, but neither McIntire nor Gobrecht will specify why they agreed to disagree to the extent that it should end McIntire's UW career prematurely.

McIntire, 21, does not expect to use her final season of eligibility as a Husky.

She thinks her problems with Gobrecht were based on "miscommunications" that were all too common.

Those miscommunications included swapping words on the bench at the 1991 NCAA West Regional in Las Vegas, where UW was buried under a Stanford second-half avalanche in a 73-47 season-ending loss.

Gobrecht brought McIntire to the bench after a couple of Stanford 3-point shots.

"I understood why I was being taken out of the game," McIntire recalls of her last UW game, "but I guess you could say we had some words that weren't probably appropriate."

In the aftermath of that loss, graduating seniors Laurie Merlino and Karen Bryant were suspended from the team for breaking a team rule about drinking alcohol. That divided team and coach for a time.

When the annual spring one-to-one discussion with Coach Gobrecht approached, McIntire was not ready to talk. So McIntire told Gobrecht that she "needed time for the wounds to heal."

McIntire told her coach via a letter.

"She didn't take to that too kindly," McIntire says of her coach's response.

So player and coach decided on a one-year hiatus.

In her words she thought I was being continuously disruptive," McIntire said. "That could be interpreted a variety of ways, I guess. But I think we were never on the same page."

So McIntire watches from the outside. But initially that was very difficult.

In December she wanted to end her exile. McIntire contacted Kit Green, UW associate athletic director, to see if the door was open. It was sealed shut.

"Under no circumstances" Gobrecht replied, Green said.

"We had an agreement with Jocelyn that was in writing," Green said. "That was formalized last spring. I think the coach wanted to stay true to that agreement."

"I would like to think that I would have been able to help them out," she says. "There were a lot of close games that they should have won. But there's no guarantee that I would have made a difference."

She will graduate this spring with her degree in psychology and she is pursuing admission to one of three graduate programs in physical therapy, including the UW's. The burden of graduate courses probably precludes her pursuing one more season of college basketball, regardless where she is enrolled.

If her career is over, "it didn't end the way I wanted it to end," McIntire said. "But I was ready for basketball to be over after this year. I'm ready to move on and do other things. Basketball is fun, but it's not everything."

**I**t's a good thing Jocelyn McIntire doesn't rattle easily.

Sunday she gets her first start as point guard for the Washington Huskies against one of the best teams in the world, the Soviet National Team, at 3 p.m. in Hec Edmundson Pavilion.

"I haven't played against the Soviet Union before," McIntire said, "but I know they are very physical and their guards are great outside shooters."

McIntire, a 5-foot-8 junior who averaged 2.5 points during her limited playing time last season, has been handed the reins to Washington's offense by Coach Chris Gobrecht.

She could be as important to the Huskies' season as All-American candidate Karen Dedden and sharpshooter Laurie Merlino, the team's two senior starters.

"Last year Jocelyn had a certain role and she played it well," said Gobrecht, who pointed out that during key situations in big games McIntire often ran the offense instead of senior starter Jacki Myers.

"I think you are just going to get more of what you have seen from her," Gobrecht said.

Last year when Washington upset top-ranked Stanford 81-78, McIntire took over the offense in the final minutes. Trailing, Stanford went to a trapping defense, but McIntire was able to handle it.

This year the former star of Lake Oswego (Ore.) High School may have a new role, but she is handling it with the same poise.

"Nah," she says when asked if she feels pressure. "I think I'm going to play more and probably have more responsibility, but I don't feel any real pressure. I've got four people out there with me all the time. It's not just me."

Point guard is a question mark for Washington this year in terms of matching up with elite teams. Last year Myers gave the Huskies

speed and ball-handling skills. Against teams with great quickness, she was able to hold her own.

Lack of speed in the backcourt is a major concern of Gobrecht's.

But McIntire says she can make up for her lack of speed.

"Practicing against Jacki for two years really helped," she said. "For a long time it seemed like I was getting my tail whipped every day, because she was so much quicker. I had to learn how to play her or else."

McIntire said she learned to use position to make up for the speed differential. She learned to anticipate and to never, ever leave her feet.

"Not that I could block anybody's shot anyway," she said.

"The main thing I learned is that if I could guard Jacki in practice for two years, I can stick with anybody else I'm gonna see."

With McIntire, Gobrecht also gets the bonus of a having an outside scoring threat.

"If people try to sag on us this year, Jocelyn McIntire won't hesitate to put it up from outside," said Dedden, casting a teasing look at her teammate.

McIntire has never been shy about shooting. In fact she has never been shy about anything.

"I was always aggressive and outspoken as a kid," she said.

It's that aggressiveness and brashness that adds to her toughness. And Gobrecht thinks it could help make the Huskies tougher.

"Last year Jackie wouldn't hesitate to throw herself into a group of bodies, but I always worried about her getting hurt when she did," Gobrecht said. "I don't worry about Jocelyn. She's pretty tough."

McIntire has developed her own sort of bump-and-run defense, but claims she doesn't really like physical basketball.

"I don't like it if there is a lot of pushing and shoving — unless I'm doing the pushing and shoving," she said.

Merlino and freshman reserve forward Tara Davis added 12 apiece. Davis had 11 rebounds while Deden added 10.

McIntire gave Washington a 10-point lead at halftime, 38-28, canning a 3-point field goal after taking the ball across midcourt with time running out. It was the end of the half — but just the beginning of the end for UA.

McIntire scored her third consecutive 3-pointer with 18:05 to play in the game, then connected on a two-pointer and two more threes. The junior guard from Lake Oswego, Ore., was true on seven shots in a row, including six from 3-point range.

"Jocelyn did a pretty good job of picking Arizona apart offensively in the second half," Gobrecht said. "The whole team got involved in the second half, which was important because Karen and Laurie were struggling."

Deden hit just 4 of 14 shots while Merlino was slightly better (6-13).

"They were just not having good senior nights," Gobrecht said. "It's nice to have other people step forward and do what they need to do."

Timi Brown led Arizona with 21 points despite a broken shooting hand.

# McIntire eyes Stanford

## Point guard matchup critical

Jocelyn McIntire had the best half of her career last Saturday against Iowa, tossing in 17 points to help Washington hold off the frustrated Hawkeyes.

McIntire, a 5-7 junior point guard, may need that kind of effort Thursday night when the 24-4 Huskies clash for the third time this season with 24-5 Stanford, the Pac-10 champion, in an NCAA West Region first-round game at Thomas and Mack Arena in Las Vegas.

Georgia, 27-3 and third-ranked in the country, meets Long Beach State, 24-7, in the second game.

Washington and Stanford tip off at 5:07. The game will be shown live on Prime Sports Northwest (Channel 6, FCI Cable).

"It's going to take everything that it took the last game against them or the game that we played against Iowa to win," McIntire said just before boarding the bus Tuesday for the ride to Sea-Tac and the plane trip to Vegas. "We're going to have to come out and play some good team defense, and at the same time be able to execute our offense."

"We're going to have to play each (ball) possession like it's our last possession, and we are going to have to board well."

Washington and Stanford have split two games this season. The Cardinal won at Hec Edmundson Pavilion, 75-71, snapping Washington's 22-game home-court win streak. The Huskies later beat Stanford 69-68 at Maples Pavilion, snapping the Cardinal's 42-game home-court win streak.

The match-up is interesting enough with both teams employing tough man-to-man defense and both enjoying strength inside. But the key may be out front where McIntire is paired against Sonja Henning, a 5-8 senior All-American.

But McIntire, a tireless performer both in the classroom and on the court, is not afraid to tread in dangerous waters. She relishes a good fight.

"She (Henning) is the top point guard in the nation and she's going to be tough to play against, but there are a lot of tough guards to play against once you get into the regionals," McIntire said.

McIntire's performance against Henning this year has amounted to a collective 5-for-13 shooting from the field, 2-for-3 from 3-point range and 3-for-6 from the line. She grabbed seven rebounds and had 11 assists.

Most telling, however, is the 11 turnovers she had in the two games.

For the season, McIntire is averaging 9.6 points and has a team-high 142 assists. She also has 57 steals, second to Laurie Merlino's 59.

"This is a real good match-up," McIntire says. "But we're not going to get into the hype of it being Washington versus Stanford. We're looking at it as the first game of regionals."

Coach Chris Gobrecht, who got in trouble with UW administration a year ago when she said she hated Stanford, also downplayed tonight's battle.

"We're going to try to key in that it's a first-round region game and not Stanford and Washington," Gobrecht said. "I don't know if we can pull that off, but we'll try."

"There's a little too much hype in this (the Stanford rivalry)," McIntire protested. "No matter who we play, we have to play well."

Which she did against Iowa, knocking down three three-pointers at crucial times in the second half that blunted a surge by the Hawkeyes. It wasn't until much later that McIntire realized that she had equaled her career high of 22 points.

"I was actually focused in on my defense," McIntire explained. "Usually if my defense goes well, everything else seems to go well. And I was just fortunate to be left open and I was able to get my shot off."

"It's going to be tougher to do that against Stanford, just because everybody knows how everybody else plays. But hopefully they will leave me open."

Iowa coach C. Vivian Stringer complained that the officials Saturday let Washington be too physical and that took her team out of the game, especially in the first half. Stringer is anxious to see how Washington will play if the game is called more closely, as might happen Thursday night.

McIntire doesn't think that's going to be a problem.

"We play an aggressive man-to-man defense and people see it as physical, but really it's not," she said. "You can't be physical because if you do, you foul them. We look to not have contact."

Gobrecht backed up her point guard.

"I think so much of the contact that happens with us defensively is often initiated by the offense trying to get rid of us."

# McIntire, Gobrecht strive to keep their bridge from burning

Jocelyn McIntire, the feisty University of Washington point guard who on Monday had her end-of-the-season suspension upgraded to redshirt status for next year, said she is leaving the door open for her return in the 1992-93 season.

And Husky women's basketball coach Chris Gobrecht said, "We don't want to burn any bridges and put ourselves in a position that would prohibit that from happening."

But while Gobrecht and McIntire insisted on sticking to an agreement restricting their comments regarding each other and the redshirt settlement, the player's father said a personality conflict was at the root of their problems.

"Over the last three years there was definitely a personality conflict between Jocelyn and Chris," Patrick McIntire said yesterday from his home in

McIntire became a crowd favorite as a junior starting guard last season because of her tough, aggressive approach to the game. But she discovered that approach wasn't always well received off the court, especially by her coach.

After the season, Gobrecht suspended McIntire, but the senior was given time to think about it and then could appeal the decision later.

That appeal was held Monday in a meeting that involved Gobrecht, McIntire, her mother Janet and acting athletic director Chuck Armstrong.

"The decision to redshirt was Jocelyn's decision," Patrick McIntire said.

"I think it was the best decision for everybody concerned," Jocelyn McIntire said.

Gobrecht said she would not be against her playmaker returning after next season.

"Jocelyn had an extremely difficult responsibility that requires a great deal of her," Gobrecht said. "Our hope is that the time away will let her recharge for that responsibility."

The McIntires said it was important that Jocelyn's status be

changed from suspended.

"Jocelyn is a good student with a 3.5 grade point average," Patrick McIntire said. "She's always been outspoken, but not disrespectful."

The McIntires and Gobrecht would not discuss specifics that led to the suspension and redshirt status, but Jocelyn McIntire doesn't think the year off will alter her personality.

"I don't see myself changing who I am," McIntire said. "I think who I am will get me to where I want to go."

Gobrecht said she didn't want to reflect negatively on McIntire.

"We are two elements trying to evolve into a relationship that can work," Gobrecht said. "The decision right now is that some time off would be healthy."

The coach said the McIntire situation has nothing to do with the suspension of Laurie Merlino.

Merlino, the Huskies' other starting guard, and Karen Bryant were suspended for being out after curfew and drinking after the team's 73-47 loss to Stanford in the NCAA West Regional in Las Vegas. Both players have completed their eligibility.

Gobrecht and Merlino yesterday declined to discuss specifics of the suspension.

**SEATTLE, Wash.** -- University of Washington head women's basketball coach Chris Gobrecht and junior guard Jocelyn McIntire today jointly announced that McIntire will red-shirt during the 1991-92 season.

This is a joint decision made by McIntire and the coaching staff in the best interest of all concerned. The reasons for the decision are personal.

"For anyone not close to this situation, it will be difficult to understand why this decision has been made," Gobrecht said. "I truly hope that our fans can accept it as a joint decision that was made in the interest of the team, Jocelyn McIntire and the coaching staff. This was by no means an easy decision for anyone."

"I want to be sure the fans know how much I've appreciated their support during my career here," McIntire said. "Husky basketball fans provide us outstanding support. This has been a difficult decision on my part because of the feelings I have for the team. I look forward to getting my degree as a Husky."

McIntire, who will be a senior next fall, retains her scholarship and will continue to pursue her degree in psychology at the University of Washington. She has completed three years of an available four years of collegiate athletic eligibility, earning a Washington varsity letter each season. All student-athletes under the jurisdiction of the National Collegiate Athletic Association are allowed five years to complete four years of eligibility.

McIntire earned a starting role at point guard for the first time during the recently completed season. She was an honorable mention Pacific-10 Conference All-Academic team selection at the conclusion of the season. At the conclusion of her junior season, she is ranked second in career 3-point field goal shooting percentage (.394), fourth in Husky career free throw shooting percentage (.761), and ninth in career assists (270). McIntire ranks second on the Husky single-season assist list (151 in the 1991 season), fourth (.402, 1991) and sixth (.353, 1989) on the season 3-point field goal percentage list and eighth on the single-season free throw percentage list (.779 in 1991).

The Huskies return seven letterwinners for the 1992 season, and Gobrecht signed five high school seniors to letters of intent.

#### No. 24 George Fox Ends Record-Breaking Season

Despite the best winning percentage in school NAIA history, NAIA Div. II No. 24-ranked George Fox will have no postseason.

The Lady Bruins tied No.18-ranked University of Puget Sound for the best record among the three Northwest Conference teams in the NAIA Pacific Northwest Region. UPS won the tie-breaker (based up results versus conference opponents in descending order) and will advance to play Western Oregon in the Pacific Northwest sectional championship on Tuesday (March 2).

George Fox 18-6 (.750) surpassed the 20-9 (.689) record of the 1987-88 team.

The Lady Bruins also became the fourth George Fox team to tie the school record with eight consecutive wins.

George Fox set new team school records for most three-pointers attempted (27 vs. Puget Sound, Feb. 19)) and made (11 vs. Whitman and Willamette) in a game. The Northwest Conference's top scoring team (67.0 ppg) oddly also tied the record for fewest points scored in a game (35 vs. Pacific Lutheran Feb. 27).

#### Seniors Leave Their Mark on Record Book

Two George Fox players finished their collegiate careers on Saturday.

Post **Rachel Powell (Sr., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.)** completed her four-year career as the team's defensive leader. Despite being limited by an injury to three games as a sophomore, Powell finished her career No. 7 on George Fox's career blocks list with 70.

She averaged 1.4 blocks per game this season, tops among Northwest Conference players. Powell just missed the George Fox top-10 in career rebounds, grabbing 449. The No. 10 spot was 450. She was third in the NWC in rebounds per game (8.3).

Guard **Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.)** transferred to George Fox for her senior year after leading Azusa-Pacific University (Calif.) in scoring for three straight years. In her one year, Brock set four school records, and ranks in the top five in three other categories.

The Northwest Conference leading scorer (17.5 ppg), Brock established new records for three-pointers made (7) and attempted (12) in a game, and three pointers made (74) and attempted (195) in a season. Her 35 points against Savannah College on Dec. 29 is the second-highest point total in George Fox NAIA history. She finished fourth all-time for both season free-throw accuracy (.811) and three-point accuracy (.379). Her 419 points is the fifth highest single-season total in George Fox history. Brock was named NAIA Div. II Pacific Northwest Independent Section Player of the Week three times, and was named to the Pacific Northwest All-Sectional Team.

In addition to leading the NWC in scoring, Brock was seventh in the conference in assists (3.2) and ninth in free-throw percentage (.811).

George Fox tied its school record with its eighth consecutive win, pulling away from Seattle University 72-59 on Friday (Jan. 26).

The Lady Bruins led by one, 35-34 in the first minute of the second half, but held SU to two points in the next five minutes while building an 11-point lead. The Lady Chieftains cut the lead to six with six minutes to go, but would come no closer.

Guard **Christy Brock** (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.) scored a game-high 21 points, hitting four three-pointers. Guard **Nicole Prazeau** (Fr., Central Catholic HS, Portland, Ore.) had 13 of her 20 points in the second half and contributed five steals.

Post **Katie Greller** (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa) had 13 points, eight rebounds and two steals.

#### George Fox 35, Pacific Lutheran University 61

George Fox had three more points than turnovers as Northwest Conference champion Pacific Lutheran ended George Fox's eight-game win streak and its post-season hopes by swarming to a 61-35 victory on Saturday (Jan. 27).

PLU forced George Fox into 32 turnovers and held George Fox to nearly half of its scoring average. George Fox's 35 points tied a team record for fewest points scored in a game. The Lady Bruins never led and were put away during a 15-0 run early in the second half.

Post **Katie Greller** (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa) was the only GFU player in double figures with 12 points. Post **Rachel Powell** (Sr., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.) finished her final collegiate game with nine points, eight rebounds and two blocks.

Post **Wendy Clark** (Jr., Bainbridge HS, Wash.) had eight points, eight rebounds and four blocks.

#### Brock Breaks Record/Named Conference and Region Player of Week

Guard Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.) this weekend surpassed the George Fox single-season three-point record with her 67th of the year and was named both Northwest Conference and NAIA Div. II Pacific Northwest Region Player of the Week.

Brock has hit 67 three-pointers this season. The old record was set by Kerry (Aillaud) Rueck, who hit 61 in 1994-95.

Brock also is a threat to Rueck's single-season three-point accuracy mark. Rueck — head coach Scott Rueck's wife — hit 41.4 percent (58-140) of her three-pointers in 1993-94. With four games left in the regular season, Brock has the identical percentage: 41.4 (67-162).

In two George Fox wins last week, Brock connected on 10 of 20 three-pointers and averaged 22.5 points, 5.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds.

Brock also broke the single-game three-point record by sinking 7 of 12 versus Whitman. She leads the Northwest Conference with 18.8 points a game.

#### Hot Shooting George Fox Wins Sixth Straight

George Fox hit 20 of 40 three-point attempts in two road wins last weekend as the Lady Bruins stretched their unbeaten streak to six games. On Friday at Willamette, George Fox tied its school record with 11 three-pointers. Saturday at Linfield, the Lady Bruins knocked down 7 of 12 treys in the first half, and finished 9 of 18 for the evening.

#### Do or Die Versus 12th-Ranked Puget Sound on Friday

George Fox is on track for its best record since joining the NAIA in 1981, but appears unlikely to make the playoffs unless it wins its final four games.

The Lady Bruins trail NAIA Div. II 12th-ranked University of Puget Sound by one game in the race for a single NAIA playoff berth. The schedule is not easy. George Fox hosts the Loggers on Friday (Feb. 19) for the first of two Homecoming contests. George Fox still must play at league-leading PLU in the final game of the regular season. The Lady Bruins have never won at PLU, going 0-5 since 1981.

In a stunning weekend, George Fox claimed a one-game lead over NAIA Div. II No. 14-ranked University of Puget Sound in their race for an NAIA playoff berth.

Friday (Feb. 19), George Fox beat Puget Sound 72-64 to pull even with the Loggers in the Northwest Conference standings. Then Saturday, as George Fox won its annual Homecoming game 61-51 over Lewis & Clark, Puget Sound suffered a shocking 70-65 loss to Pacific University in Forest Grove.

The top NAIA-affiliated team (George Fox, Puget Sound or Seattle) in the Northwest Conference standings will travel to either Evergreen State College or Western Oregon University on Tuesday, March 2 for a one-game playoff for the right to advance to the NAIA Div. II national tournament.

#### 1998-99 Team Claims its Spot in Record Books

It appears George Fox will have a new record for best season winning percentage after this year. No Lady Bruin team has won more than 70 percent of their games since George Fox joined the NAIA in 1981. George Fox currently has a 17-5 record (.773) with two regular season games to play.

George Fox set a new team record with 27 three-point attempts. The Lady Bruins hit seven, but none in the final 11 minutes as UPS made a late run. The Loggers pulled within six in the final minute, but George Fox held them off at the free-throw line.

Point guard **Becky Thompson (Fr., Colton HS, Ore.)** led George Fox with 19 points, seven rebounds and five assists. She hit 10 of 11 free throws.

Center **Wendy Clark (Jr., Bainbridge HS, Bainbridge Island, Wash.)** came off the bench to spark George Fox to a 39-24 halftime lead with four first-half steals. She finished with 11 points.

Center **Katie Greller (So., Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)** fouled out with 16 points and five rebounds. Guard **Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.)** and **Tabitha Dawson (So., Eagle HS, Idaho)** each had 10 points. Center **Rachel Powell (Sr., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.)** grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds.

Guard Kristina Goos led UPS with 18 points, nine rebounds and four assists.

UPS hit 25 of 30 free throws, out rebounded George Fox 40-35, but committed 26 turnovers, compared with GFU's 15.

### George Fox Women Put Two on All-Northwest Conference First Team

After their inside-outside combination led George Fox to its best-ever NAIA-era record, guard **Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.)** and center **Katie Greller (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)** earned first-team all-Northwest Conference honors.

Just five players were named to the first team in the 10-team league.

Brock led the Northwest Conference in scoring (17.5 ppg). She finishes her career with four first-team all-conference honors. She transferred to George Fox for her senior year after three times earning first-team all-Golden State Athletic Conference honors at Azusa-Pacific University (Calif.). In her one season, Brock set four school records, and ranks in the George Fox top five in three other categories.

Brock established new records for three-pointers made (7) and attempted (12) in a game, and three-pointers made (74) and attempted (195) in a season. Her 35 points against Savannah College on Dec. 29 is the second-highest point total in George Fox NAIA history. She finished fourth all-time for both season free-throw accuracy (.811) and three-point accuracy (.379). Her 419 points is the fifth-highest single-season total in George Fox history. Brock was named NAIA Div. II Pacific Northwest Independent Section Player of the Week three times, and was named to the Pacific Northwest all-independent sectional team.

She was named Northwest Conference Player of the Week once.

In addition to leading the NWC in scoring, Brock was seventh in the conference in assists (3.2) and ninth in free-throw percentage (.811).

Center **Katie Greller (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)** finished her second season ranked fourth in the Northwest Conference in scoring (14.2), sixth in rebounding (7.8), fourth in field-goal percentage (.496).

Greller was named NAIA Div. II Pacific Northwest Independent Section Player of the Week three times, and was named to the Pacific Northwest all-independent sectional team.

She was Northwest Conference Player of the Week twice.

NAIA Div. II No. 24-ranked George Fox (18-6, .750) posted the best winning percentage in school NAIA history. The Lady Bruins also tied the school record of eight consecutive wins.

### Greller Again Named Conference and Region Player of Week

For the third consecutive week and fourth time this season, George Fox center **Katie Greller** (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa) is the NAIA Div. II Pacific Northwest Region Player of the Week. She also is the Northwest Conference Player of the Week for the third time this season. Greller averaged 21.5 points and 12.5 rebounds in George Fox's sweep of Whitworth and Whitman last weekend. She shot 49 percent (16 of 33) from the field and 79 percent (11 of 14) from the free-throw line.

#### Brock Breaks Record/Named Conference and Region Player of Week

Guard Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.) this weekend surpassed the George Fox single-season three-point record with her 67th of the year and was named both Northwest Conference and NAIA Div. II Pacific Northwest Region Player of the Week.

Brock has hit 67 three-pointers this season. The old record was set by Kerry (Aillaud) Rueck, who hit 61 in 1994-95.

Brock also is a threat to Rueck's single-season three-point accuracy mark. Rueck — head coach Scott Rueck's wife — hit 41.4 percent (58-140) of her three-pointers in 1993-94. With four games left in the regular season, Brock has the identical percentage: 41.4 (67-162).

In two George Fox wins last week, Brock connected on 10 of 20 three-pointers and averaged 22.5 points, 5.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds.

Brock also broke the single-game three-point record by sinking 7 of 12 versus Whitman. She leads the Northwest Conference with 18.8 points a game.

#### Hot Shooting George Fox Wins Sixth Straight

George Fox hit 20 of 40 three-point attempts in two road wins last weekend as the Lady Bruins stretched their unbeaten streak to six games. On Friday at Willamette, George Fox tied its school record with 11 three-pointers. Saturday at Linfield, the Lady Bruins knocked down 7 of 12 treys in the first half, and finished 9 of 18 for the evening.

#### Do or Die Versus 12th-Ranked Puget Sound on Friday

George Fox is on track for its best record since joining the NAIA in 1981, but appears unlikely to make the playoffs unless it wins its final four games.

The Lady Bruins trail NAIA Div. II 12th-ranked University of Puget Sound by one game in the race for a single NAIA playoff berth. The schedule is not easy. George Fox hosts the Loggers on Friday (Feb. 19) for the first of two Homecoming contests. George Fox still must play at league-leading PLU in the final game of the regular season. WALLA WALLA, Wash. -- Guard **Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.)** hit a school-record seven 3-pointers as George Fox used a hot second half to erase a nine-point half time deficit and defeat Whitman 71-67 on Friday (Jan. 8).

The Lady Bruins shot 24.2 percent in the first half -- including 1-12 from 3-point range -- and trailed 32-23 at the break.

The second half was another story, with George Fox hitting 51.5 percent from the field and 10 of 14 3-pointers (71.4 percent). The Lady Bruins scored 15 straight early in the second half and with 10 minutes to go had turned the nine-point deficit into a nine-point lead 57-48. Whitman responded with back-to-back 3-pointers, but couldn't regain the lead. In the final 2:30, the Missionaries didn't hit a field goal and converted just 2 of 6 at the free-throw line.

Brock finished with 28 points - including GFU's final nine - and six rebounds.

Post **Rachel Powell (Sr., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.)** had a game-high 10 rebounds, helping George Fox win the rebounding battle 36-28.

#### George Fox 56, Whitworth College 70

SPOKANE, Wash. -- George Fox lost its first road game of the season 70-56 at Whitworth College on Saturday (Jan. 9).

Forward **Nicole Prazeau (Fr., Central Catholic HS, Portland, Ore.)** was the Lady Bruins' second-leading scorer with 16 points.

##### George Fox University 81 Seattle University 55

NEWBERG, Ore. -- George Fox pulled away in the first half and cruised to a 81-55 Northwest Conference win over visiting Seattle University.

The game was close for five minutes. George Fox held the Lady Chieftains to two points in a nine-minute stretch and led 36-18 at the half. The final margin was the Lady Bruins' biggest lead.

### **BRUIN BITS:**

\*\*\* George Fox picked up three votes in the first regular season NAIA Div. II national poll released Dec. 1, ranking 47th.

\*\*\* In Saturday's 81-55 win over Seattle, guard **Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.)** was 4 for 11 from 3-point range, tying the school record for most 3-pointers attempted in one game. She tied teammate **Tabitha Dawson (So., Eagle HS, Idaho)** who attempted 11 against Rio Grande on Dec. 28, 1997. Before Dawson, the record was 10 set by Becci Harper versus Azusa Pacific in 1996. Coincidentally, Brock played for Azusa Pacific in that game.

\*\*\* Post **Katie Greller (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)** was the highest honored freshman in the Northwest Conference last season. She was named to the all-Northwest Conference second team - the only freshman to be named to either the first or second teams.

\*\*\* Post **Katie Greller (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)** and wing **Tabitha Dawson (So., Eagle HS, Idaho)** shot their way into the record book last year. Last season, Dawson led the Northwest Conference in free throw percentage at 88.6, missing only five free throws all year. She also tied a school record for single-game 3-point accuracy by hitting 5 of 5 against Hamline University.

### **SCOTT SAYS:** (Comments from second-year Head Coach Scott Rueck)

*On Western Baptist:* "Western Baptist came in Tuesday night with revenge on their minds and just took it to us. They were intense defensively and executed well offensively. We came out a little flat thinking that we would be able to beat them again and just couldn't get going on the offensive end. We didn't match their intensity all night. It was a disappointing performance, but a good lesson before our conference schedule hits."

*On PLU:* "Our intensity was at a very high level and I thought our new players were outstanding. We made too many mistakes down the stretch to win a game against a team as good as PLU. Their freshman, Jessica Iserman, was the difference in this game. She just abused our posts on the inside."

*On Seattle:* "We took a step forward Saturday night. We put together a very good game. **Rachel Powell** played their top player, Mandy Matzke, perfectly and held her in check. Overall, I thought our team defense was solid and we executed our offense as well as we have so far this season. We were very happy with the performance of our reserves. Everyone played well."

*On Pacific:* "Pacific is playing a slow-down style this year. They have been zoning the entire game, and walking the ball up the floor. They are forcing other teams to play their tempo and doing it well. I think rebounding will be the key to this game. We cannot allow second shots."

*On Concordia:* "Concordia is playing everyone tough. Renee Kesting gives them a big 6-foot-3 presence on the inside and they have two outstanding athletes on either side of her. They are tough defensively and always play well at home. It will be a great challenge for us."

**George Fox University**  
**1998-99 Women's Basketball Outlook**

How good was the recruiting year for George Fox women's basketball coach Scott Rueck?

Consider this. After losing three starters - including Northwest Conference Player of the Year Nancy Rissmiller - he's using words like "deeper" and "more talented" to describe his 1998-99 team.

Will this group be better than last year's 16-9 squad that ranked in the NAIA Div. II national top 25?

"I feel we can be at least as competitive as last year," says Rueck. "Overall, we have better skill throughout our team. From one through 14, this is the most offensive talent we've had since I've been here. But, there's a lot more youth this year, so there still are questions to be answered"

Last year's squad ranked third in the conference in scoring at 66.7 points per game, but Rueck thinks that number could climb higher.

"I know we can score. We've got several players who can shoot it. We have the potential to have four 3-point shooters on the court at a time. In one year, we went from being a team that struggled to score to having scoring be our strength."

Although the Lady Bruins have added outside shooting, the offense starts inside where George Fox returns three post players. When the ball goes to 6-foot **Katie Greller (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)**, there's a good chance it will find its way into the hoop. Last year - in her first season in a George Fox uniform - she broke the school field-goal percentage record by shooting 58.2 percent. She was the second-leading scorer on the team at 13.0 points a game and pulled down 7.2 rebounds. Northwest Conference coaches awarded her second-team all-conference honors - making her the highest honored freshman in the conference.

Defense is the forte of 6-foot post **Rachel Powell (Sr., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.)**, who was one of the conference leaders in blocks (0.9 a game). She also pulled down 6.2 rebounds a contest.

**Trish Rathka (So., Banks HS, Ore.)** was limited to five games last year by a stress fracture, but she may earn more playing time this year thanks to her solid shooting touch inside 15 feet.

Five-foot-11 junior college transfer **Wendy Clark (Jr., Bainbridge HS, Bainbridge Island, Wash.)** played on the Skagit Valley College (Wash.) team that went 32-0 last season. She was named Skagit's Female Athlete of the Year, but won't join the basketball team until her duties with the George Fox volleyball team end.

"Our post position has gotten better," says Rueck. "Our emphasis is inside. Everything revolves around the post and this year it will be tough for other teams to double-down on our posts."

That's because of the shooting threat of his perimeter players.

After losing his two starting guards, Rueck restocked his backcourt.





NAIA Div. I transfer **Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.)** is a proven scorer. A 5-9 guard, Brock scored more than 1,400 points in three years at Azusa Pacific University, leaving as their No. 3 career scorer. A three-time all-conference first-team selection, she holds APU records for 3-pointers in a career (153) and game (7).

Rueck has high hopes for 5-10 wing **Nicole Prazeau (Fr., Central Catholic HS, Portland, Ore.)**, a first-team all-Mt. Hood League pick who broke the career-scoring record at Central Catholic with 667 points. He predicts her offensive skills and athletic ability could make her one of the most talented players ever to play at George Fox.

Returners at the wing position are **Melissa Heuberger (Jr., Yamhill-Carlton HS, Yamhill, Ore.)** and hot-shooting **Tabitha Dawson (So., Eagle HS, Idaho)**. Dawson came off the bench to hit 46 of 130 3-pointers (35.4) last year, averaging 8.6 points a game. She led the Northwest Conference with a 88.6 free-throw percentage.

Perhaps the biggest question mark for the team is at the point, where Rueck must find a replacement for graduate Cherish Carroll.

"Cherish's shoes will be tough to fill at the beginning of year, but I'm confident our point guards can meet challenge," says Rueck. "I think we can be better defensively at the point. We may not be as good at creating, but we'll be better in perimeter scoring."

Four players will battle for playing time. Last year's back-up was **Michelle Fresvik (So., David Douglas HS, Portland, Ore.)**. In limited action, she showed a solid shooting touch.

Oregon Class 2A Player of the Year **Becky Thompson (Fr., Colton HS, Ore.)** has the top credentials of the three freshmen at the position. Thompson averaged 15.1 points, 6.6 assists, 6.4 steals while leading Colton High to a 28-1 season and the state title.

The two others were both all-league selections in high school. **Jill Barram (Fr., Salem Academy, Ore.)** is the quickest player on the team, while Rueck gives high marks to all-league **Karen Glover (Fr., Shoreline Christian HS, Snohomish, Wash.)** as a fierce competitor.

Rueck says George Fox has more than just talent.

"We've got great chemistry on this team," he says. "The chemistry hasn't been this good since the first year I was here. That's absolutely huge."

Although the Lady Bruins should be tough to stop, defense, not offense, may determine the season's outcome. George Fox gave up 61.2 points a game last year - second stingiest in the Northwest Conference.

"This year we have more polished offensive talent, but it is yet to be seen whether this year's team can rise to the defensive level of last year's team. Our goal is to always hold our opponents under 60





points a game. If we get to a level where we defend as well as last year, we should have a successful season."

This is the last shot George Fox will have for making the NAIA Div. II national tournament since the school is joining NCAA Div. III next season. Achieving that goal will require finishing ahead of the two other NAIA teams in the Northwest Conference - Seattle University and University of Puget Sound - and winning a playoff game against either Western Oregon University, The Evergreen State College (Wash.) or Hope International College (Calif.).

### George Fox Women's Basketball Adds Proven Scorer

Christy Brock, a high-scoring, three-time all-conference guard at NAIA Div. I Azusa Pacific University, will finish her basketball career at George Fox.

Brock - a 5-foot-9 graduate of North Eugene High School - led Azusa Pacific in scoring for three seasons and is No. 3 in career scoring at Azusa Pacific with 1,432 points. Her career scoring average is 16.8 points a game. She averaged 18.2 points a game as a freshman, 17.3 as a sophomore and 15.2 as a junior in 1996-97. She did not play last season.

Brock holds APU school records for 3-pointers in a career (153) and game (7). She twice has scored 30 or more points in a game. As a junior she averaged 5.6 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals a game. She shot .397 from the field, .375 from 3-point range and .724 from the free-throw line. She earned Golden State Athletic Conference First-Team honors three times.

At North Eugene, Brock averaged 19.3 points and 8.0 rebounds and won Oregon Class 4A all-state third-team honors in 1993-94.

Brock will be the only senior on the George Fox team and will provide experience at the guard position, where the Lady Bruins lost two seniors last year.

"Christy is a proven scorer at the collegiate level," says third-year head coach Scott Rueck. "Although we get her for only one season, she will be able to teach our younger players how to score. She's someone who can post up, but she also can score from the perimeter. It gives us another legitimate 3-point threat."

Rueck has seen Brock in action. She had a game-high 18 points and nine rebounds in a 71-69 overtime win over George Fox during the 1996-97 season.

"All I remember is she was throwing in shots from everywhere," says Rueck. "I felt she basically beat us herself."

Rueck previously announced the enrollment of three other top recruits, including Becky Thompson, the Oregon Class 2A Player of the Year.

George Fox lost three senior starters off of last year's 16-9 team that ranked as high as 23rd in the NAIA Div. II national poll.

### George Fox Women's Basketball Snares Oregon 2A Player of Year

Three impact players including the Oregon Class 2A Player of the Year will join the George Fox women's basketball team for the 1998-99 season.

Becky Thompson, a 5-8 point guard from Colton High School led her team to a 28-1 season and the 2A state title. She scored 20 points in the championship game. She was named state player of the year after averaging 15.1 points, 6.6 assists, 6.4 steals and just 1.6 turnovers. She shot .580 from the field and .393 from 3-point range. She twice was named Tri-River League Player of the Year. Thompson played for her father, Vic, who was named 2A Coach of the Year.

Thompson and three others will vie for the point guard responsibilities left open with the graduation of Cherish Carroll and Tonya Miller.

"With Cherish and Tonya leaving, Becky comes into the program at a time where she could earn a lot of minutes early in her career," says head coach Scott Rueck. "We are excited and fortunate to get a player of her ability."

Rueck also has a potential replacement for graduated second-team All-American forward Nancy Rissmiller. Nicole Prazeau, a 5-10 forward, set the school record for career scoring (667 points) at Central Catholic High School in Portland. Prazeau was a First-Team all-Mt. Hood League selection as a junior and a second-team pick as a senior. She was the team MVP twice and the leading scorer. As a senior, she averaged 14.8 points, 5.5 rebound, 1.3 assists and 1.7 steals. She shot .431 from the field and .293 from 3-point range.

"We're fortunate to have Nicole coming here," says Rueck. "She potentially could be one of the best ever to play here."

Volleyball/basketball recruit Wendy Clark transfers from Skagit Valley College in Mt. Vernon Wash., where she was named the school's Female Athlete of the Year.

Last year the Skagit Valley College basketball team went 32-0 and won the Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges championship last season. Clark, a 5-11 forward/center, averaged 7.5 points and 6.2 rebounds.

In volleyball, Clark was the Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges (NWAACC) Northern Region MVP as well as making the NWAACC first team. She also was volleyball team captain and a two-time NWAACC Scholar-Athlete.

She was an all-Olympic League basketball selection at Bainbridge Island High School, averaging 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds.

"Wendy's style of play fits perfectly with what we like to do," says Rueck. "She can play the perimeter and defend the post. She has a high basketball I.Q."

George Fox went 16-9 last season, ranking as high as 23rd in NAIA Div. II.

### Former UW Point Guard Joins George Fox Women's Basketball Coaching Staff

Jocelyn (McIntire) Malvar, the starting point guard for the University of Washington team that reached the 1991 NCAA West Regionals, has been hired as an assistant women's basketball coach at George Fox University.

Malvar was an honorable mention Pacific-10 Conference All-Academic team selection for the Huskies. At the conclusion of her final season, she ranked second in career 3-point field goal shooting percentage (.394), fourth in Husky career free-throw shooting percentage (.761), and ninth in career assists (270). Malvar ranked second on the Husky single-season assist list (151 in 1991), fourth (.402, 1991) and sixth (.353, 1989) on the season 3-point field goal percentage list and eighth on the single season free-throw percentage list (.779 in 1991).

At Lake Oswego High School, Malvar was an Oregon third team all-state selection and was named to the state all-tournament second team after helping her team to a sixth-place Class 3A (now 4A) finish. She set school records for most steals (105) and assists (147) in a season.

Since graduating from Washington, she has assisted at summer basketball camps and was assistant for the girl's basketball team at Lake Oswego High School.

Malvar earned her degree in psychology at UW and currently is a science teacher at Sherwood Middle School. She lives in Milwaukie, Ore. with her husband, Caesar and her two children: Zachary, 3 and Caitlin, 1.

Malvar joins head coach Scott Rueck, who in two seasons at George Fox has taken two teams to the Northwest Conference playoffs and compiled a 31-19 record. Both teams have earned top-25 NAIA Division II rankings.
