Bruins to Rely on Unproven Lineup, Untested Pitchers in 2002

With eight regulars returning in the batting order, the George Fox University Bruins anticipate scoring plenty of runs during the 2002 baseball season. It will be up to an untested pitching staff, however, to make sure the opposition doesn't do the same if the Bruins are to challenge again for the Northwest Conference crown.

After starting the 2001 season 0-6, the Bruins bounced back and closed with a rush, going 12-3 in their final 15 games to finish 22-21, the sixth winning record in as many years at George Fox for head coach Pat Bailey. The Bruins tied for third in the Northwest Conference with a 15-9 league mark.

As a team, the Bruins hit .302, and only third baseman Aaron Bliss is gone from that lineup that now has an additional year of experience under its collective belt. However, the pitching staff was decimated by the loss of seven hurlers, four of whom received All-Northwest Conference honors of one kind or another.

"The biggest strength for this year's team, no doubt, is the maturity of the lineup," says Bailey. "That, and depth — we've got a good freshman class that will help immediately and we can go two deep at virtually every position. We lost a lot in the pitching department, to be sure, but from what I've seen in preseason workouts, we have some talented freshman and a couple of juco transfers who can help, and we could well go 10 deep in the pitching staff."

Infield

Bliss (.304-4-23) is gone at third, but the rest of the infield is a senior-laden, experienced group, with Kyle Langeliers (Sr., Pleasant Hill, Ore.) covering first, Ryan Dearing (Sr., Vancouver, Wash.) at second, and Paul Gramenz (Sr., Sequim, Wash.) at shortstop.

Langeliers (.296-2-32) is a defensive whiz who was second on the team in RBIs. He skipped soccer in the fall to concentrate on baseball, and is poised for an outstanding senior season. His backup will be Eric Bell (Jr., Spokane, Wash.), who spent most of last year as the designated hitter, and will do that again with occasional spells at first. Bell earned First Team All-NWC and First Team All-West Region honors with a .410 average, nine home runs, 41 RBIs, and a league-leading 20 doubles.

Switch-hitting Joshua Sargent (So., Oak Harbor, Wash.) hit .296 in 27 at bats, and is a budding talent who "will start somewhere down the road," says Bailey.

Dearing (.343-0-12) earned First Team All-Conference honors while platooning with lefty-swinging Kevin Tucker (Jr., Forest Grove, Ore.), who posted numbers of .278-1-13. Both should continue to command plenty of

playing time while supplying timely hitting and sound defense on the right side of the infield. Tucker might get a look at the wide-open third base position as well.

Gramenz (.274-2-17) is a sure-handed glove at short who will be counted on for increased offensive production, but he could be pushed by talented newcomer David Peterson (Fr., Aloha, Ore.), who can also play second.

The third-base job is up for grabs among three candidates. Seann Hammon (So., Port Orchard, Wash.) is the only one with experience, having hit .321 in 28 at bats as a sub last year. J.D. Russell (Fr., Mountlake Terrace, Wash.), a redshirt last year, and Scott Hyde (Fr., Grants Pass, Ore.) are also in the running. Russell and Hyde are versatile, and can play other infield positions as well.

Outfield

Travis Maffey (Sr., Boise, Idaho) had an outstanding season in center, going .393-3-11 with 32 runs scored and seven stolen bases in eight attempts to earn Third Team All-West Region honors (yet surprisingly was left off the All-Conference team). Bailey expects even better things from his leadoff man this season, noting that "he has improved so much even from last year, and he's awesome defensively."

The flanks around Maffey will be rotated among three top fly chasers: returnees Grady Shaver (So., The Dalles, Ore.), Jake Johnson (Jr., Newberg, Ore.), and Yakima Valley Community College transfer Josh Randall (Jr., Bellingham, Wash.), all left-handed hitters. Shaver went .279-0-9, and will get the nod in right because of his strong arm, while Johnson was .244-3-19 with 11 stolen bases in as many attempts, and will handle left.

Outlook

Randall is capable of playing all three positions.

Outfield depth will be provided by redshirt **Stephen Donohue** (So., Gresham, Ore.) and rookie **Don Jenkins** (Fr., Ruch, Ore.)

Catchers

In **Mike Halverson** (Jr., Redmond, Wash.) and **Greg Dombek** (So., Vaughn, Wash.), the Bruins have a pair that Bailey calls "the best defensive unit I've ever had behind the plate. No one is going to take an extra base on these guys very often."

Halverson (.307-1-12), a left-handed hitter, and Dombek (.297-1-21), a righty, not only provided solid offense, but combined to throw out 43 percent (26-61) of the base runners who tried to steal on the Bruins last year.

Providing depth at backstop is **Luke Wolf** (Jr., Boise, Idaho), who got into only five games last season, but is a team leader who has improved through hard work and extra effort.

Pitchers

Staff ace **Paul Andrewjeski** (6-5, 3.61, 69 K's) was a First Team All-Conference pick, while starters **Damon Lorenz** 6-3, 3.71) and **Brody Wilson** (1-6, 4.37) and closer **Glenn Boss** (2-1, 4.47, a Bruin-record six saves) all received honorable mention for All-Conference honors in 2001 — but all are gone.

Expected to take over the top two spots in the rotation are right-hander **Mike Beck** (So., Livermore, Calif.), who was 2-1 with a 5.09 ERA with 22 strikeouts in 23 innings, and southpaw **Cory Dixon** (So., Springfield, Ore.), who was 1-3, 7.65 in 20 innings. "They are our only experienced pitchers, so we're placing a big load on them to lead our staff," admits Bailey, "but they've thrown well in the fall and early spring."

When he is not playing third, **Scott Hyde** could get a chance to show his stuff on the mound. "Scott was a double-figure winner in high school and will be a good one for us before long," predicts Bailey. "He has a great curveball

and a good fastball, and he might wind up as our closer."

Another top candidate for a starting spot is Mount Hood Community College transfer **Ash Anunsen** (Jr., Jefferson, Ore.), who played as a freshman at Stetson University, a strong Division I program in DeLand, Fla., before deciding to play closer to home. Bailey calls him "a strike machine — he'll throw 70-80 percent strikes, he has four pitches, his ball cuts or runs, and he has a very good understanding of the art of pitching."

In the bullpen, Bailey can choose from among **Hammon**, who pitched in high school; **Nathan Green** (So., Portland, Ore.), who redshirted two years ago while also playing basketball at George Fox but attended Warner Pacific College last year; **Bryan Manor** (Jr., Williams, Calif.), a southpaw transfer from a good Division III program at Louisiana College; and **Brad Aeschliman** (Fr., Woodinville, Wash.). All could see action in middle relief.

Hyde, Anunsen, and Hammon may all get a chance to show what they can do as the staff closer. Hammon, who did not pitch at all last year, can mix in a split-finger and slider with an 81-85 mph fastball.

Thomas Chivers (Fr., Chimacum, Wash.), **Kyle Koontz** (Fr., Albany, Ore.), and southpaw **Jimmie Baynes** (Fr., Joseph, Ore.) round out the staff, but are projected as future contributors rather than immediate prospects. Koontz can also play the infield if needed.

Summary

"Offense and depth will be our obvious strengths this year," says Bailey. "We have experience at every position except third, and we have depth at every position, in many cases with a lefty-righty platoon. If we have to face a particularly tough righty, for example, we have the flexibility to insert six or seven left-handed hitters into the lineup."

"Defensively, we were not settled in early last year, but improved greatly as the year went on. We're still improving

with a tremendous combination behind the plate, our outfield will chase down everything and won't allow runners to take the extra base, and our infield is shaping up nicely."

"We lost a lot of pitchers, but so did most of the conference. I like the arms we have, and believe we'll be able to go eight to 10 deep in the staff. We don't have a lot of innings returning, but our pitchers will only get better as they add the innings to their experience."

"All in all, we're expecting to be right in the thick of the conference race again," says Bailey, who is 164-82 (.667) in his six seasons at George Fox, and has guided the team to three NWC firsts, two seconds, and one third in his tenure. He needs only eight more wins to pass **Pat Casey** (171-113-1, 1988-94), now the coach at Oregon State, as the all-time winningest coach in Bruin history.

2001 in Review

Bruins Finished Strong in 2001 to Post Another Winning Season

Strong finishes have been a characteristic trademark of Pat Bailey-coached teams, and the 2001 George Fox Bruins were no exception. A closing rush in which the Bruins went 12-3 enabled the team to rescue what had been a poor start to the season and finish with a record 22-21, the sixth straight winning season in as many seasons under Bailey.

A 0-6 start that included four setbacks in the La Verne Tournament in California and a pair of losses at Hawaii Pacific made it seem as if the Bruins would never see the light of .500. The skid ended when the Bruins swept the Division II Sea Warriors in a double-header to split the series on the "Big Island."

A series sweep by eventual-Northwest Conference-champion Willamette put the Bruins in a hole in the conference race, and the 2000 NWC champions were thus unable to successfully defend

their crown. The hot streak at the end of the season included an 8-2 record against conference opponents, however, and enabled the team to tie for third with a 15-9 league mark.

Individual postseason honors abounded for the Bruins. Designated hitter Eric Bell, second baseman Ryan Dearing, and ace southpaw Paul Andrewjeski earned First Team All-Conference honors, while third baseman Aaron Bliss, starting pitchers Damon Lorenz and Brody Wilson, and reliever Glenn Boss were Honorable Mention. Center fielder Travis Maffey was named to the NCAA All-West Region Third Team, while Bell was named to the West Region First Team and was an Honorable Mention All-American. Andrewjeski was voted to the Verizon Academic All-District VIII Team.

Bell led the conference in on base percentage (.509) and doubles (20), one short of the George Fox record,

Dearing led the league in hit-by-pitches (10), and Boss set Bruin records while leading the league in saves (6) and appearances (23).

Bailey completed his sixth season as the George Fox coach with a record of 164-82 (.667), and needs just eight more victory to surpass Pat Casey as the winningest coach in Bruin baseball history.

Background on the Bruin Nickname

George Fox's Bruin nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the University's predecessor) was established. The small cub was found in the Coast Range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member.

When it grew to adulthood, it was kept in a pit in Hess Creek canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table, and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum. When the hide deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling so it was left sitting in a corner.

Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today.

"Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came into popularity with sportswriters because of the University's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with the mascot "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat. Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students, and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

The Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Fields

George Fox University baseball, soccer, and softball teams have played home games on the Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Fields since 1989.

Across from Wheeler Sports Center on Fulton Street and Villa Road, the fields were renovated using a donation from Curtis and Margaret Morse. Using labor from Volunteers on Wheels, new dugouts and a press box were constructed for the baseball field.

The Morse family has a long association with George Fox. Four generations have attended the University in Newberg.

The baseball diamond was moved to the current location in the early '80s when construction on Bauman Auditorium displaced the old field.

The baseball facility continues to improve. In 1991, Smurfit Newsprint Corp., Newberg, donated all lumber for an indoor hitting facility located in the northwest corner of the complex.

The baseball Bruins are tough to beat at Morse Field, going 122-31 (.797) in their 11 years at the complex. In the last four years, they've gone 54-7 in Newberg, an .885 winning percentage.

Field dimensions are 340 feet down the left-field line, 375 in the left-center-field alley, 400 to straight-away center, 370 in right center, and 335 down the right-field line.

Coaches

Pat Bailey

Under the leadership of Pat Bailey, who begins his seventh season as head baseball coach at George Fox, the Bruins have established themselves as one of the premier programs in the Northwest Conference, and one that is beginning to make waves even at the NCAA Division III national level.

With six straight winning records (25-16, 29-14, 25-13, 32-8, 31-10, and 22-21), Bailey has a career record of 164-82, and needs only eight more wins to becoming the



winningest coach in Bruin baseball history (Pat Casey was 171-113-1 from 1988-94). His .667 winning percentage is the best of any Bruin coach, and ranks 27th among active coaches in Division III with five or more years' experience.

One of the aspects of the program Bailey takes pride in is getting his teams to improve as each season wears on. In evidence of his success, in the final 15 games in each of his six seasons at George Fox, the Bruins have gone anywhere from 11-4 to 14-1.

Bailey's teams were NWC runners-up in 1996 and 1998, champions in 1997 and 2000, and co-champions in 1999. In 2000, their first year of NCAA eligibility, the Bruins advanced to the NCAA Division III

West Regional and earned the regional's No. 1 seed.

The Northwest Conference honored Bailey as its Coach of the Year in 1997 and 2000, and in 1999, he was Co-Coach of the Year with Linfield's Scott Carnahan as the two rivals shared the league crown.

Many of Bailey's players have earned all-conference, all-district, all-region, and/or all-America recognition, including seven members of last year's team. In 1999, first baseman Nate Barnett became his first NAIA First Team All-American, and in 2000, staff ace Ryan Alvis was named to the NCAA Division III All-America Third Team.

Bailey took over the Bruin program immediately after guiding West Linn High School into the Oregon Class 4A state championship game. At West Linn, his teams advanced to the Class 4A state playoffs seven times, and in his final season were edged 2-1 in the 1995 state championship game.

Four times Bailey was named Three Rivers League Coach of the Year. He was at West Linn for 10 years as head baseball coach and assistant football coach. His baseball teams won five league titles and reached the Oregon semifinals in 1989, 1991, and 1995. From 1989-95, his combined record as a high school and American Legion coach was 315-105 (.750).

Prior to West Linn, Bailey taught and coached at Willamette High School in Eugene, Ore., for three years. He has worked at various baseball camps, and served as a pitching coach at the University of Portland in 1992.

"George Fox really matches up with me personality-wise and philosophically," says Bailey. "As a coach, I want to make sure every kid is making the most of his God-given talent. I want them to be a class act in the classroom and the community. I want the kids to match the school and my personality. I stress to my team that we're a family. Family members are more important than themselves. If you're going to be a leader, you must be a servant first."

Bailey is a 1974 graduate of Moscow High School in Idaho, where he played football, basketball, and was the baseball team's MVP. He earned two letters in baseball at North Idaho College in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, then two more as a starting outfielder and team captain during his senior season at the University of Idaho. He continued playing semi-

professionally until age 28.

In 1978, Bailey completed his business education degree, and earned a master of education degree in educational administration at the University of Oregon in 1983.

At West Linn, Bailey was also a business instructor, and in 1994 was named to Who's Who Among America's Outstanding High School Teachers. In 1995, he was one of 30 outstanding educators honored with a 1995 Education Excellence Award, given by Associated Oregon Industries.

At George Fox, Bailey is also associate director of athletics, chair of the school's Sports Hall of Fame Committee, and a teacher in the Department of Health and Human Performance.

Bailey and his wife, Susan, live in Newberg with their children, Alex, 18, and Ann, 15.

About the University

George Fox University, an evangelical Christian liberal arts college, is expanding, both in size and in reputation. One of the fastest-growing institutions of higher learning in the United States, George Fox has seen its enrollment more than quadruple in the past 14 years, increasing from 549 in 1986 to 2,730 in the fall of 2001.

Since 1986, George Fox has been named one of "America's Best Colleges" 13 times by *U.S. News & World Report*. In October 2000, George Fox ranked first in academic reputation and second overall among Western regional liberal arts colleges. The magazine also named the University one of the region's best values among schools in its category.

The school's history began in 1885 when Willamette Valley Quaker set-

tlers established Pacific Academy. It was during those early days that George Fox's most prominent alumnus attended the school — Herbert Hoover, who later became the 31st president of the United States.



The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction, and the name was changed to Pacific College. In 1949, because of the

many schools in the West with "Pacific" in their title, another change was made, this time to George Fox College, honoring the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church.

In 1996, with the addition of Western Evangelical Seminary, George Fox became a university, offering students a Christ-centered education and the choice of 35 undergraduate majors and nine graduate degrees. On Jan. 1, 2000, the seminary was renamed George Fox Evangelical Seminary.

George Fox University is located in Newberg, Oregon (pop. 18,084), 25 miles southwest of Portland, the state's largest metropolitan center of 1.7 million, and 32 miles northwest of Salem, the state capital.

Coaches

Mike Thompson



Former NAIA All-American outfielder Mike Thompson enters his second season as an assistant coach at George Fox, where he has a major

responsibility in assisting head coach Pat Bailey with hitting instruction for Bruin batters.

Thompson, a native of Bellevue, Wash., first came to George Fox after two years at Edmonds (Wash.) Community College. He was an Honorable Mention All-American center fielder during his junior year in 1994 under former coach Pat Casey, now the head coach at Oregon State, but missed the 1995 season with a medical redshirt year. As a senior in 1996 in Bailey's first year as coach, he earned All-Northwest Conference honors. He graduated in 1996 with a B.S. degree in fitness management.

After leaving George Fox, Thompson coached at Ingomar High School in Bothell, Wash., for two years, and also coached American Legion ball. He returned to Oregon in August 2000 to open his own private hitting instruction business.

Thompson is married to former George Fox athlete Liz Stevens, an NAIA All-American in the 400 and an All-Conference basketball player in 1996, and now a firefighter in the Portland area. The Thompsons reside in southeast Portland.

J.R. (Jim) Reichenbach



After a year away from the George Fox baseball program, Jim Reichenbach returns for his fourth season as an assistant coach with the

Bruins, with primary responsibilities coaching the outfielders.

Reichenbach was a two-time all-city selection at Cleveland High School in Portland, Ore., setting the school career RBI record with 53. He graduated in 1987, and then played at Portland State University for two seasons.

As a coach, Reichenbach has experience at Cleveland High and with Newberg's American Legion and Babe Ruth teams.

Reichenbach currently works with Jugs Inc., the pitching machine company in Tualatin that also sponsors the annual Jugs Baseball Spring Classic. He and his wife, Diane, have three children: Katrina, Nathaniel, and Andrew. They reside in Newberg.

Mike Shear



Former George Fox hurler Mike Shear returns to his alma mater this season to take over duties as the pitching coach, charged with

the responsibility of shaping a staff composed entirely of underclassmen into a championship-caliber collection of arms.

Shear knows what it takes to be a winner, having become one at George Fox. During his four-year career with the Bruins (1996-99), the right-hander blossomed into a consistent winner, going 4-2 as a junior and 6-0 as a senior while working as a spot starter and middle reliever. In '99, he also posted a 4.01 earned run average and struck out 30 in 42.2 innings, appearing in 17 ballgames and earning honorable mention All-Northwest Conference honors. In his career, he was 11-5 with a save and 71 strikeouts.

Shear was a Second Team All-Sky Em League selection as a senior at Junction City (Ore.) High and the team's Most Inspirational Player. At George Fox, he has returned to complete his degree and will graduate in the spring.

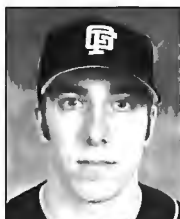

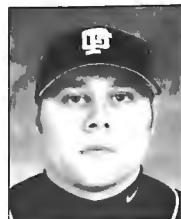

Intercollegiate Athletics at George Fox University

Intercollegiate athletics are an important part of George Fox University, home to one of the Northwest's most successful small-college sports programs. Winning programs, of course, are accompanied by a proper balance between academics and athletics. Accordingly, George Fox teams are members of the Northwest Conference and compete in Division III of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, in which need and academic ability, not athleticism, determine scholarships and financial aid.

At George Fox University, student-athletes compete for conference and national titles at a Christ-centered university where professors and coaches help them grow in mind, body, and spirit. Intercollegiate athletic competition provides for practical application of what is learned in the classroom and at practice. At George Fox, the values of athletics are integrated with the goals of Christian higher education in a process that includes

- Physical conditioning
- Managing emotions
- Courage
- Teamwork
- Cooperation
- Being gracious in winning and losing

The University fields teams in 13 varsity sports, seven for women (volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, softball, track and field, and tennis) and six for men (soccer, cross country, basketball, baseball, track and field, and tennis). More than 15 percent of George Fox's traditional undergraduate students participate in these sports. Their records over the years serve as shining testimonies to the administration's conviction that an institution can play for the glory of God, follow the rules and ethics of its governing organizations, and be successful on the fields and courts of competition at the same time. Consider the growing legacy:

- George Fox teams won district or conference titles in 10 sports during the past decade.
- George Fox athletes have earned almost 300 All-American and All-American Scholar-Athlete awards.
- Seven of the 10 coaches on staff have been named district or conference Coach of the Year at least once.
- George Fox coaches have held their positions for an average of more than eight years, and together have accumulated more than 1,000 collegiate wins.
