Outlook

A Switch in Time ...

With the main offensive threats gone, defense will be critical for the Bruins in 2002

With almost 70 percent of the points produced by last year's offense, the highest-scoring in the Northwest Conference, not returning, including 3 All-Conference performers, the George Fox University Bruins will look to their defense for strength during the 2002 men's soccer season.

Among the key losses to graduation were **Merrick Brownlee**, the conference's top scorer with 33 points and a school-record 13 assists; **Bryan Erickson**, who was 1st in the NWC in goals per game (0.61) with 11 goals and was 3rd in points with 29; and **Nigel Hunter**, who tied a Bruin record with 4 assists in 1 game. Brownlee and Erickson were First Team All-NWC, while Hunter was Honorable Mention. **Max Sorensen** chose not to return to school after a sophomore season in which he contributed 10 points.

"How do you replace guys like that?" veteran George Fox coach **Manfred Tschan** asks rhetorically. "You don't, at least not with just 1 person. You've got to hope their replacements pick up some of the slack and the returning players step up their production."

That is not to say that the Bruins will be unable to score — there are still several players around who are quite capable of putting the ball into the net — but Tschan admits his team will probably rely more on defense this year if they are to approach last year's 10-7-1 record and 2nd-place tie in the conference standings at 9-5.

Key Defenders

"**Chris Waters** (Jr., Boise, Idaho) and **Andrew Paine** (So., Walla Walla, Wash.) are givens on defense — they did a good job last year and we expect more of the same this year," says Tschan. "**Greg Cobb** (Jr., Eugene, Ore.)

broke his leg right before practice started and will be out at least 6-8 weeks, or he would have given us 3 returning starters in the back.

"We will probably go with 3 defenders, so who replaces Cobb is up in the air right now. **Michael Chapman** (Fr., Garibaldi, Ore., and younger brother of Bruin forward **Nick Chapman**), **Wally Ward** (Fr., Kenai, Alaska), and **Jesse Rasmussen** (So., Portland, Ore.) could all start there."

**David Way** (Fr., Rogue River, Ore.) and **Andrew Folkert** (Fr., Wendell, Ore.) should provide adequate backfield backup.

**Ron Besser** (Jr., Kennewick, Wash.) returns for a 3rd straight season as the starting goalkeeper after ranking among the league leaders with 110 saves and 1.47 goals allowed per game. "Ron is a big, strong, rangy kid who has looked

very good in preseason practice, and I expect a big season out of him," Tschan predicts.

While Besser is penciled in as the starter, Tschan likes newcomers **Samuel Greene** (Fr., Eugene, Ore.) and **Bryce Warren** (Fr., Spokane, Wash.), whom Tschan calls "the best pair of freshman keepers we've had in a while. Both have done a nice job in camp, and I would feel confident with any of our 3 in goal. Warren has looked particularly good, and we could very well give him some starts or at least split playing time."

Midfielders Set the Stage

Tschan anticipates going with 4 midfielders, with the flanks manned capably by **Jesse Johnson** (Sr., Grants Pass, Ore.), who had 4 goals and 2 assists last year, and **Craig Laughland**

(So., Lake Oswego, Ore.), who had 3 starts and 1 goal as a freshman. In the middle, **Jason Kintner** (So., Camano Island, Wash.) has the most experience, having played in all 18 games last year, and should move into a starting role.

The 4th position is up for grabs among **John Wulf** (Fr., Salem, Ore.), whose older sister Cori Wulf starts at keeper for the George Fox women's team, **Benjamin Eichenberger** (Fr., Tualatin, Ore.), and **Mark Frykholm** (Fr., Sequim, Wash.). Other midfield candidates include Stephen Savedra (Fr., Olympia, Wash.) and **Nick Wymore** (Fr., Carlton, Ore.), the latter a pole vaulter for the Bruins' track team last spring.

Forwards March

With Erickson gone, **Derek Dougherty** (Jr., Springfield, Ore.) and **Nick Chapman** (Sr., Newberg, Ore.) step into his shoes as the Bruins' main threats as strikers. Dougherty, who started 7 contests last year with 5 goals and 3 assists for 13 points, and Chapman, with 5 goals and 2 assists for 12 points, are the top returning scorers. They appear up to the task,

and Tschan observes, "Nick and Derek have had their best preseasons ever, so I am certainly optimistic about our abilities to score this year. We may not have the offensive struggles some people anticipated we'd have if they come through for us as I expect.æ

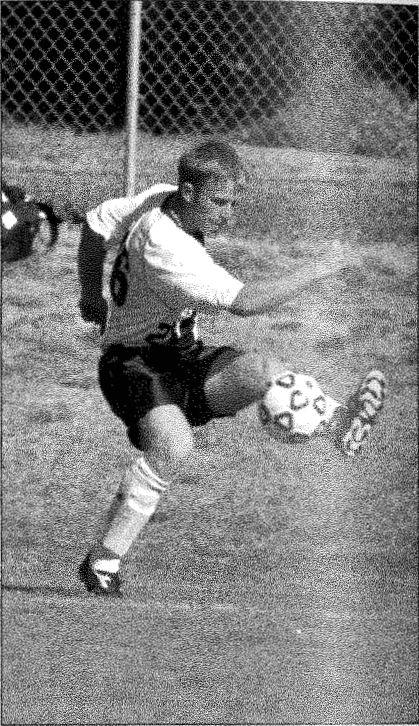
Joining them up front could be Wulf, Eichenberger, **Noah Clark** (Fr., Clackamas, Ore.), or **Ryan Keeler** (Fr., Port Orford, Ore.). "Noah is going to be a threat because he holds the ball well, while Ryan has shown a knack for being in the right place at the right time to put the ball in the net," says Tschan.

Putting the Puzzle Together

"It's hard to say how we're going to do this year," admits Tschan as the season approaches, "because we're still assessing who our starters will be, and we have some players in new positions. We obviously lost some tremendous offensive talent, but we still have a few players who can step up and score when needed. Defense is still likely to be a strength, but the midfield will be the key to our doing better."

Tschan is entering his 14th season as the Bruins' head coach with a record of

160-90-10 (.635). He has an overall record of 224-119-19 (.645) in 19 years total, including 3 years with the women's team at the University of Oregon and 3 years with the men's team at Concordia University-Portland.

## Coaches

**Manfred Tschan***Head Coach*

Entering his 14th year as the head men's soccer coach at George Fox University, Manfred Tschan has established the Bruins as one of the most successful programs in both the Pacific Northwest and the nation.

Tschan's teams have gone 160-90-10 in his 13 seasons at George Fox, a .635 winning percentage.

From 1991-98, the Bruins' last 8 seasons in the NAIA, they were ranked in the Top 25 at some point in 6 of those years. Under his guidance, George Fox has finished 1st or 2nd in its district or conference 10 times. The team also received national exposure by winning 2 National Christian College Athletic Association national championships (1988 and 1990) and making 1 NAIA National Tournament appearance (1993). In 1993, he won NAIA District 2 and NAIA Area 1 Coach of the Year honors. 9 of his players earned NAIA All-American awards.

A former player in the Swiss First Junior and First Amateur divisions, the 46-year-old Tschan has 19 years of coaching experience. Prior to settling in Newberg, he held head coaching positions at Concordia University-Portland (1984-87) and the University of Oregon (1980-81). During his 2 seasons at Oregon, the Swiss native guided the fledgling women's program to a No. 4 Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America national ranking and into the 1981 AIAW National Tournament. His 27-3-3 record at Oregon, along with 37-26-5 mark in 4 seasons at Concordia and his George Fox days, give him an overall career record of 224-119-19, a percentage of .645.



An assistant professor of health and human performance at George Fox, Tschan earned a bachelor of science degree in education in 1976 at The Teachers' College of Hofwil, Switzerland, a master of science degree in motor learning at the University of Oregon, and has

completed Ph.D. course work in sports psychology. He is fluent in German, French, and English and has been published in numerous journals and newspapers in Switzerland and the United States.

Coach Tschan and his wife, Vicki, who is a student loans coordinator at George Fox, reside in Newberg and have 2 children: Twila, 12, and Heidi, 10.

**Jim Maine***Assistant Coach*

Former George Fox University player Jim Maine returns to his alma mater this season to take a whirl at college coaching,

serving as an assistant coach with primary responsibilities for the defense.

Maine joins the George Fox staff after 7 years at the boys' soccer coach at Newberg High School, where he led the Tigers to playoff berths 4 times from 1995-2002. He was named the Pac-7 Conference Coach of the Year in 1997 and the Pac-8 Coach of the Year in 1999.

A native of Yakima, Wash., Maine was a 2-time MVP, team captain, and First Team All-League selection at

Eisenhower High School. After a year at Spokane Community College, he played for George Fox 1992-94, starting every year as a flanker. He also played 4 seasons of professional soccer with the Yakima Reds of the USISL in 1995, the Cascade Surge of the USISL 1997-98, and the Portland Pythons indoor soccer team in 1999.

Earning his bachelor's degree at George Fox in elementary education in 1995, he served as a substitute teacher in school systems in Newberg, Hillsboro, and Beaverton for several years. He spent the 1999-2000 year at Yamhill Middle School, and is now entering his 2nd year as a 6th-grade teacher at Carlton Elementary.

Maine and his wife, Melissa, reside in Beaverton.

**Todd Williams***Assistant Coach*

Todd Williams begins his 6th season as an assistant coach of both the men's and women's soccer teams at George Fox

this year, with primary responsibilities instructing the goalkeepers. He himself was a talented goalkeeper for the George Fox men's soccer team 1990-93, with a career goals-against average of 1.69 and 3 shutouts, numbers which rank as the 4th-best in those categories in team history.

Williams is a 1990 graduate of Churchill High School in Eugene, Ore. He earned a bachelor's degree in biology at George Fox in 1994 and now works for Country Insurance. He is married to former GFU women's soccer player Lisel Goertzen, and they live in Dundee, Ore.



## Support Staff

**Craig Taylor***Athletics Director*

**C**raig Taylor is in his 15th year as the director of athletics at George Fox, but has been associated with the Bruins for 29 years as player, coach, and professor. He first came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior forward for the men's basketball team, and during the 1972-73 season, he helped the Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

Taylor graduated from George Fox in 1974, receiving honors as the Outstanding Man in Teacher Education and Outstanding Physical Education Major. He received a master of science degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a George Fox residence hall director.

From 1974-79, Taylor was the Bruins baseball coach, posting a 47-91 record in 6 seasons, while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm in 1979-81, but returned to George Fox as coach of the women's basketball team from 1981-93, producing a 12-year record of 162-155. He also coached the softball team from 1981-88 and again in 1990, compiling a 77-99-1 record in 9 seasons. In 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Softball Coach of the Year.

Taylor, 51, is responsible for all athletics department functions, including eligibility and compliance with George Fox, Northwest Conference, and NCAA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management. In 1992, he was named NAIA District 2 Administrator of the Year.

Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville and have 3 children: Leah, 28; Bree, 23, a 2001 George Fox graduate who played volleyball for the Bruins; and Casey, 13.

**Pat Bailey***Associate Athletics Director*

**P**at Bailey begins his 8th year as George Fox's baseball coach and 5th year as associate director of athletics, with primary responsibilities for all athletics fund-raising.

Bailey is also director of the Bruin Club, George Fox's athletics booster organization, chairs the Sports Hall of Fame Selection Committee, and assists

in game management for fall and winter sports. His baseball teams have compiled a 191-97 record, making him the winningest coach in Bruin diamond history, and have won or tied for 4 Northwest Conference titles. He earned NWC Coach of the Year honors in 1997, 1999, 2000, and 2002.

Bailey lives in Newberg with his wife, Susan; son Alex, 19, who will play baseball for his father at George Fox this year; and daughter Ann, 16.

**Dale Isaak***Athletic Training Education Program Director*

**D**ale Isaak, a member of the George Fox staff since 1995, was named director of the athletic training education program last year,

supervising all student athletic training activities and studies at the university, after 6 years as the head athletic trainer.

Isaak came to George Fox as the head athletic trainer and assistant professor in the Department of Health and Human Performance following a stint as the head athletic trainer for Hopkins High School in Minnetonka, Minn., and athletic trainer for the Institute for Athletic Medicine in Minneapolis.

A 1990 graduate of Willamette University, Isaak also holds a master of science degree in physical education/athletic training from Indiana State University, and a master of education in physical education from the University of Minnesota. He and his wife, Marin, live in Wilsonville.

**Karen Hostetter***Head Athletic Trainer*

He was official scorer for the Jackson Generals Texas League baseball team for 5 seasons and the Birmingham Barons of the Southern League for 1, scored the 1999 Southeastern Conference Baseball Tournament, and now makes calls for the Portland Beavers of the Pacific Coast League.

High-scoring offense propels Bruins to 2nd-place finish in Northwest Conference

Led by the highest-scoring offense in the Northwest Conference, the George Fox men's soccer team foiled pre-season prognosticators who had tabbed the Bruins for a 7th-place finish in the conference. While posting a 10-7-1 overall record, the Bruins finished in a deadlock for 2nd in the NWC with Linfield, only 4 points behind 1st-place Whitworth.

The Bruins began the season trying to snap a streak of 10 straight losses and 11 straight winless games (the 1st game of the streak was a tie). After knotting Western Baptist 5-5 in the opener, the Bruins dropped 2 tough road games to Colorado College and Nebraska Wesleyan before finally getting that 1st win, a 13-2 romp over Walla Walla.

Snapping those strings seemed to ignite the Bruins, who then reeled off 4 more wins to start conference play, including a 2-0 victory on the road against defending NWC champion Linfield. A scoring slump saw the team go only 2-5 in mid-season, but the Bruins closed with a rush, outscoring Whitman, Whitworth, and Pacific 9-2 to win their final 3 games. Whitworth had already clinched the conference title when the Bruin handed them a 4-0 whitewashing.

As a team, George Fox led the NWC in goals (44), assists (39), and total points (127), and the 13 goals against Walla Walla was the highest number by

any team in the conference during the season. The Bruins had 2 individual conference leaders in seniors Merrick Brownlee, a midfielder from Eugene, Ore., and forward Bryan Erickson from Chehalis, Wash. Brownlee led the league in assists with 13, setting a new George Fox single-season record, and scored 10 goals for a league-leading 33 total points. Erickson was the conference leader in goals per game (0.16) while scoring 11 goals total, and was 3rd in total points with 29. Both

were named First Team All-Conference. Senior defender/midfielder Nigel Hunter of Wenatchee, Wash., was Honorable Mention All-Conference and tied a Bruin single-game record with 4 assists in the Walla Walla match.

Brownlee was later named to the NSCAA/adidas Division III All-West Region First Team, while Erickson was a Third Team selection. Brownlee also was accorded NSCAA/adidas Collegiate Scholar All-American Second Team and Verizon Academic All-America College Division Second Team honors.

Erickson concluded his career 5th in all-time assists (29) and 6th in both goals (35) and points (99), while Brownlee was 6th in assists (25) and 8th in goals (29) and points (83).

Bruin coach Manfred Tschan completed his 13th season at George Fox with a 160-90-10 record (.615), and his 19th season overall as a head coach with a mark of 224-119-19 (.645).
