Dear Friend:--

Today I turned over to Emmett W. Gulley, for the use of the Gulley for Senator Committee the \$40.00 which you sent me, and I am enclosing his receipt made out to me but recognizing that the money came from somebody else.

President Gulley was deeply grateful for this contribution to his campaign fund, and asked me to express his sincere appreciation. He was naturally curious to know the source of the gift, but I had cashed the check and turned the actual money over to him without any hint as to the source of it. Some day I hope he can know who gave this liberal contribution.

We missed you at the candidate's meeting at the Chamber of Commerce today. Neither you nor Mr. Bennett was there, but both of you were favorably mentioned. Senator Burke introduced the various candidates, and he has told me that he is supporting you in this campaign. The candidates that were present were Eugene E. Marsh, Emmett W. Gulley, Carl H. Francis, George Fullenweider, A. W. Youngberg, E. L. Ketcham, Homer Parrett, Frank Muhs, and one lone democrat, Rufus E. Wood. Each was allowed three minutes time, but some who were unopposed did not take their full quota.
