11/20 – ALL-NWC: Three Bruins Earn Honorable Mention for All-Conference Men's Soccer

NEWBERG, Ore. – Three members of the George Fox University Bruins – goalkeeper **Ron Besser**, midfielder **Kris Van Houten**, and defender **Brian Zaro** – have received Honorable Mention recognition for the All-Northwest Conference men's soccer teams for their contributions to the program during a 5-12-2 season in 2003.

Besser, a senior from Kennewick, Wash., and Southridge High, led the conference in saves for the second straight year, collecting 99 in 13 games for a 7.62 per game average. He was NWC Defensive Player of the Week for Nov. 3-9 when he had 8 saves in a 2-0 shutout of Pacific. He was also Honorable Mention All-NWC as a junior when he led the league with 115 saves and a 9.02 average. He completed his career with 386 saves and 7 shutouts, 5th on the Bruins' all-time shutouts list.

Van Houten, a freshman from Beaverton, Ore., and Jesuit High, proved to be one of the top offensive threats in the conference as a rookie. He ranked 3rd in the NWC in shots (55) and assists (9), 6th in total points (21), and 10th in goals. He was NWC Offensive Player of the Week for Sept. 15-21 when he had two goals and an assist for a career-high 5 points in a 7-0 over Northwest.

Zaro, a freshman from Beaverton, Ore., and Westview High, stepped into the backfield breach left when Second Team All-NWC defender Chris Waters went out for the year with a knee injury. In addition to providing first-rate defense while starting all 16 games in which he played, he chipped in with an assist on a critical goal late in the Bruins' 4-3 win over Whitman.

Top honors in the conference went to Tyler Niemack of Puget Sound as NWC Offensive Player of the Year, Sean Chighizola of league-champion Linfield as NWC Defensive Player of the Year, and John Yorke of Pacific Lutheran as NWC Coach of the Year.

He was 27-3-3 as the women's coach at Oregon (1980-81) and 37-26-5 as the men's coach at Concordia-Portland (1984-87).

BRUIN BITS:

*** Besser for Defense, Potter for Offense Earn NWC Players of the Week**

Goalkeeper Ron Besser (Sr., Kennewick, Wash. / Southridge HS) and midfielder Dan Potter (Fr., Medford, Ore. / South Medford HS) earned Northwest Conference "Men's Defensive Player of the Week" and "Men's Offensive Player of the Week" honors for Nov. 3-9 with their fine performances in the Bruins' 2-1 season-ending win over Pacific on Saturday. Besser made 8 saves, adding to his league-leading total and giving him 99 for the year, in posting his first shutout of the season and the 7th of his career. Potter scored his first two goals of the season, the first one in the 5th minute of the game on a shot after assists from Kris Van Houten (Fr., Beaverton, Ore. / Jesuit HS) and Derek Dougherty (Sr., Springfield, Ore. / Thurston HS) to give the Bruins an early 1-0 lead, and the second in the 20th minute on a header off a corner kick from Max Sorensen (Jr., Bothell, Wash. / Bothell HS) for a bit of insurance. Besser and Potter join midfielder Kris Van Houten for Sept. 15-21 as Bruins to earn NWC Player of the Week honors this season.

*** Besser Leads NWC for Second Straight Year**

Despite missing three games due to a badly-bruised knee and not starting three games early in the season while alternating with reserve keeper Bryce Warren (So., Spokane, Wash. / Lewis & Clark HS), George Fox

goalie **Ron Besser** led the Northwest Conference in saves for the second year in a row. He had 115 saves last year, and finished his senior season with 99, two ahead of runner-up Dane Meier of Willamette. His average of 7.62 goals per game in 13 games was also tops in the league (David Eaton of Willamette had an 8.33 saves per game average but only appeared in 6 contests).

*** Bruins Bid Farewell to Seniors Besser and Dougherty**

George Fox bid farewell to seniors **Ron Besser** and **Derek Dougherty** in brief pre-game ceremonies before the final game with Pacific on Nov. 8.

Besser, a goalkeeper from Kennewick, Wash., led the Northwest Conference in saves this year with 99 after leading the league last year as well with 115. He finished his four-year career with 59 games played, 386 saves, and 7 shutouts, ranking 5th all-time in whitewashes.

Dougherty, a forward from Springfield, Ore., ranked second on the team in scoring with 11 points on 4 goals and 3 assists. He had 17 goals in his four-year Bruin career, tying for 14th all-time, and 11 assists for 35 total points.

11/8 – GEORGE FOX 2, PACIFIC 0: Potter Puts In a Pair as Bruins Blank Boxers in Season Finale

NEWBERG, Ore. – **Dan Potter** saved his best for last, picking the perfect time to put in his first two goals of the season to give the George Fox University Bruins a 2-0 win over the Pacific University Boxers in the final game of the year for the two Northwest Conference men's soccer foes Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Both goals came early in the contest. The Bruins' **Kris Van Houten** sent a cross to the middle from the left sideline, where **Derek Dougherty** deflected it to Potter coming in from the right, and he sent a shot into the upper right corner of the net for a 1-0 lead just 5:07 into the game. His second score, on his second and final shot of the game, came at 20:34 on a header off a corner kick from **Max Sorensen**.

The Bruin defense did the rest from that point on, **Ron Besser** recording 8 saves in the game to earn the shutout. The match was evenly contested as the Bruins managed 19 shots (6 on goal) to 18 (8 on goal) for the Boxers. George Fox held the edge in corner kicks 8-5. Boxer keeper Jory Shene made 4 saves in taking the loss.

The Bruins bid farewell to seniors Besser and Dougherty in brief ceremonies before the game. Dougherty ended his four years at George Fox with 13 goals and 9 assists for 35 points, while Besser posted 386 career saves in four years and 7 shutouts, the 5th-highest total in Bruin men's soccer history.

George Fox ended with a 5-12-2 overall record and a 2-10-2 mark in conference play, while the Boxers finished at 6-12 overall and 3-11 in the league.

BRUIN BITS:

*** Kintner Honorable Mention for NWC Offensive Player of the Week**

Midfielder Jason Kintner (Jr., Camano Island, Wash. / Stanwood HS) earned Honorable Mention for Northwest Conference "Men's Offensive Player of the Week" with a fine game at Pacific Lutheran on Nov. 1. Kintner scored both of the Bruins' goals in a 3-2 loss to the Lutes, his first one in the 31st minute giving the Bruins an early 1-0 lead, and his second cutting the Lutes' lead to 3-2 in the 85th minute.

NWC Offensive Player of the Week went to Tyler Niemack of Puget Sound, the conference's leading scorer, who notched his 15th and 16th goals in two Logger wins.

*** Seniors Besser and Dougherty to be Honored before Home Final**

George Fox seniors Ron Besser (Kennewick, Wash. / Southridge HS) and Derek Dougherty (Springfield, Ore. / Thurston HS) will be honored in pre-game ceremonies on Saturday, Nov. 8, prior to the Bruins' final home game vs. Pacific at 1:30 p.m.

Besser, a goalkeeper, received Honorable Mention for All-Northwest Conference last year while leading the league in saves, and is again the NWC saves leader this season. Dougherty has been one of the Bruins' top offensive threats, finishing 3rd on the team in points last year and ranking 4th this year.

The Bruins have two players who are seniors academically but junior athletically and are expected back next season: defender **Greg Cobb** (Eugene, Ore. / Southwestern Oregon CC) and midfielder **Jesse Rasmussen** (Portland, Ore. / Rosslyn Academy, Kenya). Senior **Chris Waters** (Boise, Idaho / Centennial HS), a Second Team All-Conference defender in 2002, has not played this year due to a knee injury and is planning to return for his final year of eligibility before graduating next December.

*** Banged-Up Bruins Battled Valiantly in Losses on Road**

The Bruins made their road trip to Tacoma this past weekend short-handed, and wound up even more short-handed before the trip was through. Missing from action were goalkeeper **Ron Besser** and defender **Brian Zaro** (Fr., Beaverton, Ore. / Westview HS), who banged their knees together during a game at Willamette the week before and were still too sore to play at all against Pacific Lutheran and Puget Sound. Then Bruin defender **Andrew Paine** (Jr., Walla Walla, Wash. / Walla Walla HS) was red-carded for intentionally deflecting a Puget Sound shot away from the goal with his hand, earning an automatic ejection that forced the Bruins to play with only 10 men on the field the rest of the second half.

"Sometimes an intentional deflection might be worth a try if it is late in a tie game and it is obvious the ball is going in," commented Bruin coach **Manfred Tschan**. "They get the penalty kick, which is virtually an automatic goal almost every time, but on rare occasions, it might be the smart play. We were down 3-1 at the time and still in the game, but they made the penalty kick to make it 4-1 and that was pretty much the game. And now Andrew won't be available to us for the final game against Pacific, so I'm not sure it was the best play for us at the time.

"Even though we lost both games, we gave a good effort both times out, but we did miss Ron and Brian on defense, although their replacements (**Bryce Warren** in goal and **Jesse Rasmussen** at defender) did a good job. I'm hopeful they'll be back for the final game this weekend."

*** Red-Card Coincidence?**

Getting a red-card for intentionally deflecting a shot with the hand is a rare enough occurrence in soccer – so what would be the odds that two players from the same school would get red cards for that kind of infraction on back-to-back days?

On Saturday, George Fox women's soccer player **Jill Steinfeld** received a red-card for deliberately deflecting a shot at the goal in a game at Pacific Lutheran. One day later, George Fox men's soccer player **Andrew Paine** received the same penalty for the exact same infraction in a game at Puget Sound!

9/27 – LINFIELD 4, GEORGE FOX 0: Wildcats Whitewash Bruins with Strong Defense and Balanced Offense

NEWBERG, Ore. – Showing why they are the 6th-ranked team in the NSCAA/NCAA Division III national poll, the Linfield College Wildcats used a strong defensive effort and balanced offense to hand the George Fox University Bruins a 4-0 setback in a Northwest Conference men's soccer match Saturday afternoon (Sept. 27) here at Morse Field.

Linfield keepers Phil Haines, who got the win, and Grant Williams turned away two shots each, and the Wildcat defense allowed only nine shots total as the Bruins were shut out for the second straight game. Meanwhile, the Linfield offense took 21 shots, 15 on goal, with four different players scoring one goal apiece.

Harald Haraldsen got the scoring going with a goal 29:04 into the game after quick touches from Aaron Sherrill and Yoshi Kawase. Adam Jaffe made it 2-0 at 39:56 with an assist from Colby Ayonon. SOLID NUCLEUS AND TALENTED NEWCOMERS GIVE BRUINS HIGH HOPES FOR 2003 SOCCER SEASON

Manfred Tschan, George Fox University's veteran men's soccer coach, breaks down his 2003 squad into three groups.

"First, we've got a good group of returning players with 10 lettermen, including nine starters, who give us a solid core of people on which to build," he begins. "We've got a small group of former starters who missed last year because of injuries or personal reasons. And then we've got almost half our team made up of newcomers, several with the ability to play right away.

"All of them have worked hard, both in the off-season and in the pre-season, and I am quite happy with the point we have reached before the season starts. While I won't make any predictions, if we can put them all together, I see us being much improved over last year."

The 2002 Bruins went 4-13-1 and tied for 7th in the Northwest Conference with a 3-10-1 league mark. Six of their setbacks were by a single goal, prompting Tschan to remark, "In soccer, all it takes is a break here or there to turn a game around, and we weren't that far off from a decent record last year if a break here and there had gone our way. I'm hopeful we'll see more of the breaks in our favor this year."

Defense Takes a Hit with Waters Injury

The Bruins will have to play through a bad break that hit them in the pre-season, however, with a knee injury knocking out defender **Chris Waters** (Sr., Boise, Idaho), a Second Team All-Conference selection in '02, for several weeks, and possibly the entire season.

"Chris is one of the best one-on-one defenders in the conference, and we will certainly miss his defense, as well as his leadership as team captain," admits Tschan. "The doctors are still running some tests and believe it may be an ACL. He will definitely miss several weeks, and by the time he could get back into shape, it may be better off for him to let it heal completely and perhaps come back next year as a fifth-year senior."

Tschan believes newcomer **Brian Zaro** (Fr., Beaverton, Ore.) has shown enough to get the job done in Waters' stead along the defensive line, where he will join returning starter **Andrew Paine** (Jr., Walla Walla, Wash.) and **Greg Cobb** (Jr., Eugene, Ore.), a starter two years ago who sat out last fall as a medical red-shirt.

Two other defenders who have looked strong in the early going and will get plenty of opportunities are **Ian Sheppard** (Fr., Yakima, Wash.) and **Bryan Cobb** (Fr., Eugene, Ore.), Greg's younger brother. **Darrick Pope** (Fr., Longview, Wash.) provides defensive depth.

Quality Keepers Abound for Bruins

The last line of defense for the Bruins is well-stocked with three quality goalkeepers, led by Honorable Mention All-Conference keeper **Ron Besser** (Sr., Kennewick, Wash.). Besser, a big, rangy athlete, led the NWC in saves last year (115), and should again see most of the action in the net.

Bryce Warren (So., Spokane, Wash.) had 33 saves in nine appearances, with three starts, as a freshman, and will be the top sub in goal. **Samuel Greene** (Fr., Eugene, Ore.), a red-shirt last year, provides a third capable defender.

Bruins' Cup Overflowing with Midfielders

"We have quite a bit of depth at midfielder," notes Tschan, "which gives us some tremendous flexibility both offensively and defensively. The relative strengths of our opponents could very well dictate what combinations we have on the field at different times, in order to get the best match-ups."

Jason Kintner (Jr., Camano Island, Wash.), who had 3 assists, and **Jesse Rasmussen** (Jr., Portland, Ore.) are returning starters at the center mid positions, but **Max Sorensen** (Jr., Bothell, Wash.) was a starter there before sitting out last season. Sorensen brings back outstanding playmaker skills. **Wally Ward** (So., Kenai, Alaska), who saw limited action as a freshman, and **Dan Potter** (Fr., Medford, Ore.) have also shown they can play the positions.

On the flanks, **Ben Eichenberger** (So., Tualatin, Ore.) returns on the right, with **Kris Van Houten** (Fr., Beaverton, Ore.) a strong candidate for plenty of playing time there as well. **Jon Miller** (Jr., Nipomo, Calif.), who took a semester off from school to get married, is expected to return to the left side, backed up by **Greg Hoiland** (Fr., West Linn, Ore.), or **Craig Laughland** (Jr., Lake Oswego, Ore.) when he is not playing forward.

Fresh Firepower Featured at Forward

The team's top two scorers from last season, Honorable Mention All-Conference pick Jesse Johnson and Nick Chapman, who had 12 points apiece, have graduated, so the Bruins will present a few new faces at forward. **Derek Dougherty** (Sr., Springfield, Ore.) with 11 points and Laughland with 5 points are the top returning scorers, and will be counted upon for even more firepower this fall. **Michael Chapman** (So., Newberg, Ore.), a starter at defender last year, has moved up front and has impressed Tschan, who says, "He's really enjoying sticking the ball into the net."

Offensive depth will come from **Christian Kofi** (Fr., Aloha, Ore.), **Ian Abbott** (Fr., Smithfield, Utah), and **Seth Chapman** (Fr., Palo Cedro, Calif.), who is no relation to the Bruins' other Chapmans.

Summary

"Despite the large number of returning starters, we're still a very young team with a lot of newcomers to the program," Tschan observes. "We have enough talent and depth to actually be much improved, but how well they all jell will be critical to our success. As to what our record might be, there are just too many variables in this game – which makes it such a great sport – for any accurate predictions; we'll just have to wait and see. But we've had good spirited practices, and our players are certainly excited about the new season."

GEORGE FOX PICKED 7TH, LINFIELD EDGES UPS IN 2003 NORTHWEST CONFERENCE MEN'S SOCCER POLL

SPOKANE, Wash. – Coming off a tie for 7th place in the Northwest Conference after going 3-10-1 in league play and 4-13-1 overall, the George Fox University Bruins have been picked to finish in that spot in the 2003 men's soccer race – albeit alone this time – in pre-season balloting by the conference's eight coaches.

The Bruins return nine starters, including Second Team All-Conference defender Chris Waters and Honorable Mention All-Conference goalkeeper Ron Besser, though the team may have to do without the services of Waters for a time due to a knee injury he suffered a pre-season workout. Veteran coach Manfred Tschan, who begins his 15th season with the Bruins, likes his recruiting class and expects his team to spring a few upsets this year.

By the closest of margins, Linfield College is the coaches' pick to win the 2003 title. The Wildcats, runners-up in 2002, picked up three first place votes and 62 total points, narrowly edging defending conference champion University of Puget Sound in the poll. The Loggers totaled 61 points with four first place votes.

Linfield, which finished 15-2-2 overall last season and lost in the first round of the NCAA tournament at UPS, returns a pair of All-NWC performers in Jordan Bebee (Sr., Midfield) and Paul Collins (So. Defender). The Wildcats were selected first or second on every ballot.

Puget Sound also returns a pair of All-NWC players from a team that finished 17-4 and lost in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Loggers welcome back Justin Hughes (Sr., Midfield) and Anthony Fioretti (Jr., Midfield). Despite picking up one more first place vote than Linfield, UPS ended up second in the poll because they were chosen in third place on three ballots.

Whitworth College picked up the other first place vote and is third in the poll with 53 points. The Pirates, NWC champions in 2001, must replace 2002 NWC points leader Scott Kerwien from a team that finished 12-7-1 overall last season.

Linfield, UPS and Whitworth were selected in the top three positions on all eight ballots.

Only four points separated the fourth through sixth places in the poll. Willamette University (30 points) finished fourth after a 6-11-2 campaign in 2002. Whitman College totaled 28 points in the poll for fifth place, which is where the Missionaries finished last season with a 8-9-2 overall record. Pacific Lutheran University picked up 27 points for sixth place in the poll. The Lutes were 7-11-1 last fall.

George Fox (18 points) and Pacific University (17 points) round out the poll in seventh and eighth places, respectively. Pacific was 8-11-1 last fall.

10/18 – GEORGE FOX 4, WHITMAN 3: Fast and Furious Finish Enables Bruins to Notch 1st NWC Win

NEWBERG, Ore. – In a wild game that saw 6 goals scored in the final 22 minutes, **Jesse Rasmussen's (Jr., Portland, Ore. / Rosslyn Academy, Kenya)** empty-net goal enabled the George Fox University Bruins to notch their first Northwest Conference victory of the season, a 4-3 victory over the visiting Whitman College Missionaries, in a men's soccer match Saturday afternoon (Oct. 18) here at Morse Field.

The game began innocently enough, with Niels Larson scoring off an assist from Vico Rust at 34:53 for a 1-0 Whitman lead at the end of the first half. The score remained that way until there were 22 minutes left in the game – and then the craziness began.

Kris Van Houten tied the game for the Bruins by drilling in a free kick at 68:09, but the Missionaries regained the lead at 70:27 when Kirk Thorson hooked a corner kick that deflected off a Bruin defender and into the goal. Van Houten responded by nailing a penalty kick into the left corner of the goal at 75:10 for a 2-2 tie.

George Fox went ahead for the first time 3-2 at 83:09 with a play that went virtually the length of the field. The Bruins' **Jon Miller** corralled a loose ball in the backfield and passed it back to defender **Brian Zaro**, who sent a

tremendous kick toward the Whitman goal. Bruin forward **Michael Chapman** took the kick on the first bounce and headed the ball toward the goal just as Whitman keeper Zach Steel crashed into him, and the ball rolled untouched into the net. Chapman was forced to come out of the game with a bloody mouth, and Steel was given a red card.

With the Bruins trying to keep the ball away from the Whitman offense and run out the clock, the Missionaries' Jeff Waggoner intercepted a pass near the goalkeeper's box, passed to Chris Dorough near him on the right, and Dorough shot the ball off the hand of diving Bruin keeper **Ron Besser** into the left corner to make it 3-3 at 86:33.

With overtime looming, the Bruins got the win instead at 88:50 when **Max Sorensen (Jr., Bothell, Wash. / Bothell HS)** drove the middle of the penalty box, threaded a pass to Rasmussen coming in from the right, and Rasmussen faked past new keeper Eric Dottarar before rolling the ball into an unguarded net.

Whitman out-shot George Fox 23-16 and had 16 shots on goal to 9 for the home team, but Besser came up with 13 saves to 5 for Steel and Dottarar.

10/19 – WHITWORTH 3, GEORGE FOX 0: Bruin Offense Fires Blanks as Pirates Prevail to Stay in NWC Race

NEWBERG, Ore. – A day after posting their second-highest scoring output of the season in a 4-3 win over Whitman, the George Fox University Bruins could get very little going against a stingy Whitworth College defense and suffered their 7th shutout of the season, a 3-0 setback to the Pirates, in Northwest Conference men's soccer action Sunday afternoon (Oct. 19) here at Morse Field.

Matt Knoll got the visiting Pirates on the board in the first half when he recovered a loose ball in front of the Bruin net and sent into the left corner just 13:10 into the game. The game remained that way throughout the rest of the first half.

Whitworth put the game away early in the second half as Niko Varlamos came in as a sub to start the half and scored twice. His first goal came on a pass from the right sideline into the middle by Evan Hendrickson at 47:26, making it 2-0. The second came on a corner kick from Kurt Kagawa, which Varlamos headed in, at 60:32.

NEWBERG, Ore. – A day after posting their second-highest scoring output of the season in a 4-3 win over Whitman, the George Fox University Bruins could get very little going against a stingy Whitworth College defense and suffered their 7th shutout of the season, a 3-0 setback to the Pirates, in Northwest Conference men's soccer action Sunday afternoon (Oct. 19) here at Morse Field.

Matt Knoll got the visiting Pirates on the board in the first half when he recovered a loose ball in front of the Bruin net and sent into the left corner just 13:10 into the game. The game remained that way throughout the rest of the first half.

Whitworth put the game away early in the second half as Niko Varlamos came in as a sub to start the half and scored twice. His first goal came on a pass from the right sideline into the middle by Kurt Kagawa after a throw-in by Evan Hendrickson at 47:26, making it 2-0. The second came on a corner kick from Kagawa, which Varlamos headed in, at 60:32.

The Pirates out-shot the Bruins 21-14 (13 shots on goal to 5), but Ron Besser kept the visitors in check with 10 saves in goal for George Fox. Kevin Bostock made 5 saves in posting the win and the shutout for Whitworth.

George Fox is now 4-9-1 overall and 1-7-1 in the conference, while Whitworth remained in the midst of the conference race by improving to 9-4 overall and 6-3 in the league.

The Bruins visit Willamette University Saturday (Oct. 25) in a game rescheduled from 1:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m., and it will be played at Willamette's football stadium instead of the school's soccer field. The Pirates travel to Pacific Lutheran University Saturday for a 1:30 p.m. contest. Both men's games will be preceded by women's games, the George Fox at Willamette game set for 12:00 noon at the soccer field, and Whitworth at Pacific Lutheran at 11:00 a.m.

11/20 – NSCAA ACADEMIC AWARDS: 2002 George Fox Men's Soccer Receives Team Academic Award

NEWBERG, Ore. – Based on their team members' classroom performances for the entire school year, the 2002 George Fox University men's soccer team ranked 16th out of 71 teams which have received the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Team Academic Awards for 2002-03.

The 2002 Bruins under head coach Manfred Tschan compiled a cumulative grade point average of 3.28. The top men's team, with a GPA of 3.51, was the University of Rochester.

The NSCAA Team Academic Award is a nine-year-old program that has consistently grown. Only nine schools were honored the first year, but 335 (men's and women's combined) earned accolades for the past year.

The awards, which will be presented during the 2004 NSCAA Convention in Charlotte, N.C., Jan. 14-18, are based on the academic performance of a team during the previous academic year (both semesters). To be eligible for the award, a team must have a minimum grade point average of 3.00 for the year, based on a 4.00 scale. Only athletes who appear on a varsity roster during the soccer season are eligible in calculating the grade point average. All soccer players on the roster must be included in the calculation.

10/18 – GEORGE FOX 4, WHITMAN 3: Fast and Furious Finish Enables Bruins to Notch 1st NWC Win

NEWBERG, Ore. – In a wild game that saw 6 goals scored in the final 22 minutes, Jesse Rasmussen's empty-net goal enabled the George Fox University Bruins to notch their first Northwest Conference victory of the season, a 4-3 victory over the visiting Whitman College Missionaries, in a men's soccer match Saturday afternoon (Oct. 18) here at Morse Field.

The game began innocently enough, with Niels Larson scoring off an assist from Vico Rust at 34:53 for a 1-0 Whitman lead at the end of the first half. The score remained that way until there were 22 minutes left in the game – and then the craziness began.

Kris Van Houten tied the game for the Bruins by drilling in a free kick at 68:09, but the Missionaries regained the lead at 70:27 when Kirk Thorson hooked a corner kick that deflected off a Bruin defender and into the goal. Van Houten responded by nailing a penalty kick into the left corner of the goal at 75:10 for a 2-2 tie.

George Fox went ahead for the first time 3-2 at 83:09 with a play that went virtually the length of the field. The Bruins' Jon Miller corralled a loose ball in the backfield and passed it back to defender Brian Zaro, who sent a tremendous kick toward the Whitman goal. Bruin forward Michael Chapman took the kick on the first bounce and headed the ball toward the goal just as Whitman keeper Zach Steel crashed into him, and the ball rolled untouched into the net. Chapman was forced to come out of the game with a bloody mouth, and Steel was given a red card.

With the Bruins trying to keep the ball away from the Whitman offense and run out the clock, the Missionaries' Jeff Waggoner intercepted a pass near the goalkeeper's box, passed to Chris Dorough near him on the right, and Dorough shot the ball off the hand of diving Bruin keeper Ron Besser into the left corner to make it 3-3 at 86:33.

With overtime looming, the Bruins got the win instead at 88:50 when Max Sorensen drove the middle of the penalty box, threaded a pass to Jesse Rasmussen coming in from the right, and Rasmussen faked past new keeper Eric Dottarar before rolling the ball into an unguarded net.

Whitman out-shot George Fox 23-16 and had 16 shots on goal to 9 for the home team, but Besser came up with 13 saves to 5 for Steel and Dottarar.

George Fox is now 4-8-1 overall and 1-6-1 in the conference, while Whitman is 5-8 overall and 1-7 in the league.

The Bruins host Whitworth College and the Missionaries visit Pacific University Sunday (Oct. 19), both games starting at 2:30 after women's games at 12:00 noon.

9/6 – EVERGREEN STATE 6, GEORGE FOX 0: Geoducks Cruise Past Bruins Behind "One-Man Show"

OLYMPIA, Wash. – In what was probably the finest one-man scoring spree by an opposing player in George Fox University men's soccer history, Joe Gjertsen scored 5 goals and assisted on another for 11 points, leading the Evergreen State College Geoducks to a 6-0 win over the Bruins Saturday afternoon (Sept. 6) at the Campo de Quatro.

Gjertsen didn't get rolling until the 26:14 mark, giving the Geoducks a 1-0 lead at that point, but he scored again two minutes later and added a third goal just before the half. Nathan Ford scored the fourth goal for Evergreen midway through the second half, and Gjertsen finished out the scoring with two more goals in the final 15 minutes.

"He didn't shoot that much, but it seemed like every time he did, he hit it hard on a perfect angle to the far post," remarked George Fox coach Manfred Tschan of Gjertsen's performance, which came on only 8 shots on goal.

The 11-point output was not the best showing in a George Fox game, however, as the Bruins' own Dan LaVeine once scored 7 goals and had 3 assists for 17 points in a game against Northwest College on Oct. 14, 1989.

Despite the seeming mismatch, the Bruins were able to muster 14 shot attempts of their own to 20 for Evergreen, but could not finish off their attacks. Each goalkeeper – Bryce Warren for the Bruins and Tom Kneeshaw for the Geoducks – had 7 saves apiece.

George Fox fell to 1-1 on the season while Evergreen State climbed to 2-2. The Bruins head south next weekend, visiting the University of California-Santa Cruz on Friday (Sept. 12) at 3:00 p.m., and California State University-Hayward on Saturday (Sept. 13) at 1:00 p.m.
