11/7 - ALL-CONFERENCE: Anderson, Philliber Give Bruins Two All-NWC Volleyball Honorees

NEWBERG, Ore. - Middle blocker **Elizabeth Anderson** and outside hitter **Karina Philliber** of George Fox University have been given All-Northwest Conference accolades for their fine 2006 seasons, Anderson being named Second Team and Philliber receiving honorable mention, in voting by the conference's nine coaches.

Anderson, a junior from Sherwood, Ore., and a three-year starter, led the conference in blocks (124) and blocks per game (1.22) and was 7th in hitting pct. (.248). She led the Bruins in total kills (272) and was 2nd in kills per game (2.67) and service aces (29). She also had 105 digs and 14 assists, and posted her first career triple-double with 13 kills, 10 digs, and 10 blocks against nationally-ranked Linfield College. She was a three-time nominee for NWC Player of the Week. She recorded career highs this year with 21 kills vs. Pacific Lutheran University, 13 digs vs. Pacific University, and 14 blocks vs. the State University of New York-Brockport.

In her career, Anderson has amassed 307 blocks, ranking 5th on the all-time list at George Fox. She is also closing in on the top 10 in career kills (674) and aces (63).

Philliber, a senior from Battle Ground, Wash., began the season as a libero and defensive specialist, but moved into the starting lineup at outside hitter early in conference play. Over her final 14 matches, she averaged 2.85 kills per game, with a career-high 22 in a match vs. Northwest Christian, and was 3rd on the team in total kills (181). She ranked in the top 10 in the conference in digs most of the season, ending with a team-leading 378 digs and 3.74 digs per game. Her career high was 27 digs at Willamette.

A transfer to George Fox last year after two years at Clark College, Philliber ended her Bruin career with 209 kills, 20 assists, 17 aces, 420 digs, and 24 blocks.

The Bruins, under 25-year veteran coach Steve Grant, compiled a 10-17 overall record in 2006 and finished in a three-way tie for 5th in the conference with Pacific and Whitworth College, all at 6-10. Linfield and Pacific Lutheran tied for the NWC championship, and both will represent the conference in the upcoming NCAA Division III National Tournament.

Kati McGinn of Pacific Lutheran was the NWC Player of the Year, while Coach of the Year honors went to PLU's Kevin Aoki. The complete list of All-NWC volleyball players is available on the Northwest Conference volleyball web site at http://www.nwcsports.com/sports/Volleyball/All-NWC.htm.

11/4 - PACIFIC LUTHERAN 3, GEORGE FOX 0: Lutes Gain Share of NWC Title by Sweeping Bruins

TACOMA, Wash. - Staking their claim to a share of the Northwest Conference women's volleyball championship with Linfield College, the 22nd-ranked Pacific Lutheran University Lutes scored a 3-0 sweep of the visiting George Fox University Bruins Saturday night here at Olson Auditorium.

The Lutes ran their overall record to 20-6 overall and their conference slate to 14-2 with their 30-23, 30-25, 30-15 win over the Bruins, who ended their season at 10-17 overall and 6-10 in the league. 14th-ranked Linfield, which defeated Lewis & Clark in three games Saturday, earned the conference's automatic berth in the NCAA Division III National Tournament by virtue of the NWC tiebreaker procedure. The Lutes hope to receive an at-large bid to the tournament, whose field will be announced Sunday evening.

The Lutes hit .300 and used a balanced attack to win the first game, though they had to rally from a 21-19 deficit. They rolled off six straight points, two on kills by Kati McGinn, to take a 25-21 lead, and closed out the win on a block by Kelcy Joynt and Gina Di Maggio. Joynt had six kills and hit .625 to pace the Lutes, while Di Maggio had 18 assists. Karina Philliber had six kills to lead the Bruins' first-game effort.

In game two, George Fox raced out to a 6-1 lead behind a pair of kills by Philliber, but the hosts proceeded to win nine of the next 10 points to go ahead 10-7. The Bruins closed to within two points, 13-11, but never got closer than that. The Lutes took a 29-20 lead on a kill by Kyla Wytko before settling for a five-point win.

The third game was tied 8-8 when a kill by Wytko put the Lutes ahead to stay. Stacie Matz had nine of her match-high 18 kills during the third game.

Philliber was the only George Fox player in double figures in kills, finishing the match with 13. Amy Knight had 27 assists and eight digs to lead the defense, while Elizabeth Anderson had four blocks. The Bruins finished with a .117 attack percentage to .291 for the Lutes.

Joining Matz, who hit .424, in the kills column were Joynt with 16 kills and a .577 hitting percentage, and Kati McGinn with 10. Di Maggio had 46 assists. Megan Kosel was the only Lute in double figures in digs with 12. McGinn had four blocks.

11/3 - GEORGE FOX 3, WILLAMETTE 0: Bruins Close Out Home Season with Win over Bearcats

NEWBERG, Ore. - Closing out the home portion of their 2006 season on a winning note, the George Fox University Bruins downed the Willamette University Bearcats 3-0 in a trio of closely-contested games in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match Friday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

The Bruins posted a 31-29, 30-28, 30-26 victory over the Bearcats in games that were every bit as close as the scores would indicate. Game one featured 10 ties, with neither team holding more than a three-point lead through the first half. Willamette broke a 13-13 tie on a block by Mary Butler and Jessica Drumm and eventually forged a seven-point lead at 26-19 on a kill by Kelly Lindstrom. The Bruins rallied behind a pair of kills from Elizabeth Anderson and Karina Philliber and tied it 28-28 on a service ace by Lani Rasmussen. After trading points, the Bruins took the final two points on a kill by Philliber, who had seven in the game, and a Bearcat attack error.

In game two, the Bruins broke a 10-10 tie on a kill by Sarah Crossfield and never trailed again, but had to hang on for dear life at the end. Ashley Sheller served seven straight winning points in an 8-0 run that extended the Bruins' lead to 25-16, and a Holly Hutchinson kill made it 26-17 Bruins before the Bearcats roared back. With Lindstrom hitting four winners in an 11-3 run, Willamette cut the George Fox advantage to 29-28 before an attack error by the Bearcats gave the game to the Bruins.

George Fox trailed for most of game three, falling behind by six at 19-13 on a kill by the Bearcats' Julie Christine, but recovered with a 6-0 run to tie it at 19-19. After ties of 20-20, 21-21, 22-22, and 23-23, the Bruins finally broke free with a 7-3 burst to close out the match, Philliber doing the honors on the final point with a winning kill.

Philliber, one of two Bruin seniors along with Niki McCorkle, led the Bruins with 13 kills, while Anderson added 12 with a team-high .375 hitting percentage, and Hutchinson had 12. Amy Knight passed for 43 assists. Sarah Burkey led the defense with 15 digs and Philliber added 11. Anderson contributed on five of the six George Fox blocks in the match.

Lindstrom, hitting a solid .448, and Jessica Durham had 15 kills each, the only Bearcats in double figures in kills. Drumm handed out 41 assists. Alora Lyamin with 17 digs and Durham with 15 led the Willamette defense, while Butler was in on five of the Bearcats' seven blocks.

George Fox (10-16, NWC 6-9) visits league-leading and 21st-ranked Pacific Lutheran University while Willamette (4-21, NWC 0-15) goes to the University of Puget Sound to close out the seasons Saturday, both matches at 7 p.m.

10/28 - GEORGE FOX 3, PACIFIC 2: Bruins Rally From Two Games Down to Stun Boxers

FOREST GROVE, Ore. - For only the second time in the five years of rally scoring, the George Fox University Bruins rallied from a two-game deficit to win, stunning the Pacific University Boxers 3-2 in a Northwest Conference volleyball match Saturday night here at the Pacific Athletic Center.

The Bruins overtook the Boxers 17-30, 30-32, 30-22, 30-23, 15-11, winning for the 23rd straight time in the series. Since rally scoring became the norm in college volleyball in 2001, the only other time the Bruins came back from a 2-0 deficit was on October 4, 2003, also against Pacific at the PAC.

The Boxers dominated game one, hitting a sizzling .394, capitalizing on nine George Fox attack errors, and allowing the Bruins only four points off their own serve. Pacific opened up a 20-11 lead on Megan Van Domelen's kill, then watched the Bruins come within five on an ace by Ashlie Keimig. Pacific extended the lead back to 27-17 thanks to four Bruin attack errors before Anela Iseke served the Boxers' final three points for the victory.

The second set was closely contested from start to finish, with neither team leading by more than three points the entire way. Van Domelen hit Pacific to a 23-20 lead with her kill, but the Bruins tied it at 23-23 on a pair of Pacific attack errors. Pacific had two-point leads twice more, only to see the Bruins come back to tie things. With the score tied at 30-30, Van Domelen and Melissa Dunn scored kills for the win.

George Fox raced out to a 10-6 lead on an Amy Knight service ace in game three, but Pacific cut the lead to two before Karina Philliber served three winners, including two on Natalie Pickett kills, for a 17-12 lead. The Boxers never came closer than five the rest of the way as the Bruins rolled to victory, hitting a sparkling .400 in the game.

The fourth game four started tight, with the Boxers opening up a 14-11 edge on kills from Dunn and Caitlin Gollehon. The advantage was short-lived as Jennifer Panico served the Bruins a 15-14 lead with her ace. Lani Rasmussen extended the lead to three with another ace, and Panico again added three winners, two off Pacific errors, for a 29-21 lead. Elizabeth Anderson finished off the game with a kill.

George Fox led early in game five, opening up a 7-4 lead on a Pacific attack error, but Pacific tied it and then went up 9-8 on a Jill Peacock kill. Whitney Kolb took the lead right back for the Bruins with a pair of kills, and Anderson fired off the last three kills for George Fox to sew up the come-from-behind victory.

Anderson led the Bruins with 19 kills, Kolb added 18, and Pickett had 10 in only three games while hitting .562. Knight finished with 54 assists. Panico led a quintet of Bruins in double figures in digs with 17, joined by Philliber with 16, Knight and Kolb with 12, and Sarah Burkey with 10. Anderson had six blocks and Holly Hutchinson four.

Peacock topped three Boxers in double-digit kills with 17, Dunn added 15, and Sarah Braun finished with 11 and a .600 attack percentage. Iseke registered 52 assists. Alyssa Finn led the Pacific defense with 19 digs, Iseke had 16, and Dunn added 14. Joanna Delanty was in on six blocks.

George Fox (9-16, NWC 5-9) hosts Willamette University and Pacific (8-16, NWC 5-9) hosts Whitman College Friday, both matches starting at 7 p.m.

10/27 - LINFIELD 3, GEORGE FOX 0: Wildcats Sweep Bruins with Highly Efficient Offense

McMINNVILLE, Ore. - Hitting the highest offensive percentage against the George Fox University Bruins this season, the 14thranked Linfield College Wildcats dispatched their Yamhill County rivals 3-0 in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match and gained a game on league-leading Pacific Lutheran University Friday night here at Ted Wilson Gym.

The Wildcats hit .358 with 62 kills and only nine errors in cruising to a 30-12, 30-27, 30-16 victory over the Bruins, who managed only a .102 mark for the match. Linfield improved to 19-2 for the season and 12-2 in the NWC, moving within a game of PLU when the Lutes were upset for the first time this season in conference play 3-2 at Whitman College. George Fox dipped to 8-16 overall and 4-9 in conference play.

Linfield led from wire-to-wire in the first game, jumping to leads of 5-0, 10-1, and 16-3. Kelsey French had seven kills in the game and Lauren Kreiger added six for the Wildcats, who hit .500 to the Bruins' .021.

George Fox regrouped in the second game, boosting its hitting percentage to .271. The Bruins held several momentary leads, the last at 26-25, but the Wildcats pulled away from a 27-27 tie to take command of the game and match. Kills by Kreiger, Molly Taylor, and Katelyn Baker closed the game in Linfield's favor.

Linfield bolted to a 13-2 lead in the third game and was never seriously threatened.

The Bruins were led by Elizabeth Anderson with 11 kills and Karina Philliber with 10, while Amy Knight spread around 26 assists. Sarah Burkey had a team-high 19 digs, Philliber added 14, and Jennifer Panico dug 12.

Kreiger had a match-high 18 kills and French added 15 to lead Linfield, with Chelsey Gellatly passing out 43 assists. Hannah Veley led all players with 20 digs, while Gellatly had 18, Kreiger 15, and Meghan Flink 13. Kreiger had five block assists.

George Fox visits Pacific University Saturday for a 7 p.m. match. Linfield is off until next Friday, when the Wildcats go to Pacific Lutheran for a 7 p.m. showdown.

10/21 - WHITWORTH 3, GEORGE FOX 2: Pirates Hit Over .400 Twice to Overtake Bruins

NEWBERG, Ore. - Hitting over .400 in two games, including a .458 percentage in the decisive fifth game, the Whitworth College Pirates rallied from a game down twice to overtake the George Fox University Bruins 3-2 in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match Saturday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

Completing a sweep of the two-match conference season series, the Pirates prevailed 23-30, 30-24, 21-30, 30-28, 15-11. Whitworth had defeated George Fox 3-0 in Spokane, Wash., on Sept. 23.

Game one was tight early, with ties on every number from 6-6 to 12-12. A kill by Sarah Crossfield gave George Fox the lead for good at 13-12, and the Bruins eventually stretched it to as much as eight points at 28-20 on a Pirate attack error. The Bruins' Karina Philliber led the way with seven kills and no errors in 12 attempts, while Angie Florence had six kills to lead the Pirates.

Whitworth posted 18 kills and only one error for a .436 hitting percentage to win game two. The Bruins held the lead throughout the first half of the game before the Pirates battled back to tie it 14-14 on a block Tamra Stark and Nicole VanderMeulen. Down 19-18, the Pirates reeled off five unanswered points, including two kills by Holly Tomlin, to take a 23-20 lead and go on to victory. Whitworth got seven blocks for winners in the game, with Stark in on six of them.

George Fox jumped out to a 9-1 lead in game three, reeling off eight unanswered points in a row that included two kills and two blocks by Elizabeth Anderson and a pair of service aces by Jennifer Panico. The Pirates got no closer than five points the rest of the way as the Bruins led by as much as 12 points twice in coasting to the win. Anderson was a perfect 4-for-4 in attacks and had four blocks in the game.

After four lead changes and eight ties in game four, Whitworth went on a 6-0 run, capped by a pair of Nikki Bardwell kills, to take a 22-17 lead, and they upped that to 27-21 on a putaway by Florence. The Bruins then rallied with a 7-1 spurt and tied it 28-28 on a kill by Whitney Kolb. Back-to-back Bruin attack errors, however, gave the Pirates the equalizing game.

In the deciding game, George Fox held brief leads of 1-0 and 5-4, but could not withstand a pinpoint Whitworth offense that produced 13 kills and only two errors for a .458 hitting percentage. VanderMeulen, Florence and Bardwell combined for 12 kills and a .526 attack mark. A block by Stark and Florence closed out the match.

Philliber led the Bruins with 21 kills, Kolb added 15, Anderson had 13 with a .400 percentage, and Holly Hutchinson had 10. Amy Knight passed out 61 assists. Panico led the defense with 15 digs, and Philliber and Knight had 13 each. Anderson contributed on eight of the Bruins' 10 blocks.

Florence with 22 kills and VanderMeuler with 21 and a .419 hitting percentage paced the Pirates, while Bardwell added 16 kills and Tomlin 13 with a .407 mark. Holly Ridings handed out 65 assists. Cassie Moore had a match-high 19 digs, with Florence making 18, Ridings 16, and Jenna Hays 14. Stark finished with eight blocks out of the Pirates' 10 total.

10/20 - GEORGE FOX 3, WHITMAN 1: Bruins Stage Big Fourth-Game Rally to Upset Missionaries

NEWBERG, Ore. - Down by eight points early in the fourth game, the George Fox University Bruins went on a 24-9 tear to close out the game and complete a 3-1 upset of the Whitman College Missionaries in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match Friday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

The Bruins, avenging two previous losses to the Missionaries earlier in the season (one in a tournament, one in conference), came away with a 30-25, 30-20, 27-30, 30-23 win against an opponent that had swept nationally-ranked Linfield College in its last outing.

Whitman scored the first point of game one, but a kill and two service aces by Elizabeth Anderson sparked the Bruins to a 7-2 lead and the home team never trailed again. The Bruins' largest lead came at 24-15 on a block by Whitney Kolb and Holly Hutchinson. It was 28-20 when the Missionaries rallied with five unanswered points, but a service error and an attack error ended the threat.

Game two was a similar story as the Bruins led from start to finish, hitting .319 to .062 for the Missionaries. Three kills by Anderson, who had six kills and no errors in eight attempts in the game, keyed a 6-0 run that stretched the Bruins' lead from a slim 17-14 to a comfortable 23-14 advantage, and a kill by Kolb closed out the contest.

The Missionaries finally got their offense untracked by going to their big guns, Lydia Hayes and Rose Brey, who had seven and five kills among Whitman's 21 in the game three win. The game was a tight one as neither team held more than a four-point lead at any time, and there were 11 ties, the last at 27-27. The Missionaries used kills by Emily Seider and Alex Graves and an ace by Kate Borsato to secure the win and stay alive.

The Bruins managed to keep the ball away from Hayes in the fourth game, allowing her only six attempts, and held the Missionanes to a minus-.019 hitting percentage. The visitors seemed intent on forcing a fifth game as they raced out to a 14-6 lead, capped by block by Graves and Seider, before the Bruins reversed course. A block by Natalie Pickett and two kills by Kolb ignited the comeback, and Kolb had three more kills along with back-to-back aces by Amy Knight in a 9-0 run that lifted the Bruins from a 22-19 deficit to a 28-22 lead. A kill by Anderson and a Whitman attack error ended the match.

Kolb led the Bruins with 13 kills while Anderson, who hit .345, and Karina Philliber added 12 each. Knight had 39 assists. Sarah Burkey had 21 digs, Philliber 20, Sarah Crossfield 18, and Jennifer Panico 10. The Bruins, conference leaders in blocks, had 13 in the match, Anderson leading the way with six.

Hayes topped the Missionaries with 17 kills and a .286 hitting percentage, with Brey adding 13 and Leslie Compean 10. Borsato and Kristan Brown had 24 assists each. Graves had 21 digs, Kaelyn Merkel 14, Brown 13, Borsato 12, and Meg Clark 10. Seider was in on six of the Missionaries' nine blocks.

10/14 - GEORGE FOX 3, NORTHWEST CHRISTIAN 2: Bruins Beat Beacons in Final Non-Conference Match

NEWBERG, Ore. – In their final non-conference match of the season, the George Fox University Bruins rallied from a 2-1 deficit in games to post their first win of the season in a five-game match 3-2 over the Northwest Christian College Beacons in women's volleyball Saturday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

The Bruins came back for a 30-24, 26-30, 30-32, 30-24, 15-10 win in their first official meeting with the Beacons, who are provisional members of the NAIA and the Cascade Collegiate Conference this year. George Fox defeated Northwest Christian last year in a match that did not count on the Bruins' record because the Beacons' first-year program was still a club sport.

George Fox jumped out to a 5-1 lead in game one thanks a pair of kills by Whitney Kolb and another by Karina Philliber, and led the game throughout except for a brief 14-15 deficit that came on a kill by the Beacons' Charlie VanLoon. Kills by Jennifer Panico, Philliber, and Natalie Pickett, an ace by Elizabeth Anderson, and another spike by Philliber put the Bruins back ahead for good.

After falling behind 12-8 in game two, the Bruins went on a 9-2 run to take a 17-14 lead. The game was tied four times after that, the last at 25-25 before a pair of kills by Ashley Blanchfill broke the deadlock and gave the Beacons the lead for good.

Game three was nip-and-tuck all the way as neither team could mount more than a four-point lead, and there were 10 ties. Cassandra Woods kept the Bruins alive with a kill at game point, knotting it 30-30, but Brooke Stribling and Blanchfill then hit winners to give the Beacons the game.

A 7-0 run early in game four gave the Bruins a 9-3 lead, and they extended it to 10 points at 23-13 on an ace by Anderson. The Beacons then reeled off eight unanswered points, keyed by three aces from Blanchfill, to cut the deficit to 23-21. The Bruins finally regained their composure and control of the game with a kill by Philliber, a Beacon attack error, and a pair of kills by Holly Hutchinson for a 27-21 lead, and a kill by Kolb sent the match to the game five tiebreaker.

George Fox never trailed in the finale, breaking a 1-1 tie on a Northwest Christian attack error and stretching their lead to 12-7 on a kill by Amy Knight. The Beacons got within two at 12-10 on a pair of kills by VanLoon, but the Bruins closed out the match on a kill by Anderson and a kill and a block by Hutchinson.

Philliber led the Bruin offense with 22 kills and a .360 hitting percentage, while Kolb added 15 kills and Anderson 10. Lani Rasmussen and Knight, who split the setting duties, had 33 and 32 assists respectively. Five Bruins had double figures in digs, with Philliber notching 22, Sarah Crossfield 14, Sarah Burkey 12, and Rasmussen and Knight 10 each. Hutchinson and Anderson had three blocks apiece.

Blanchfill paced the Beacons with 27 kills in 74 attempts, Stribling had 18, Melissa Bishops added 11, and VanLoon finished with 10. The Beacons spread the assists around, with 21 by Elisha White, 20 by Alexandria Jee, and 16 by Meagan Hunts. Stribling led the defense with 22 digs, followed by Jee and Mercedes LeClaire with 13, Hunts with 12, and Blanchfill with 11.

George Fox, now 7-14 after winning its first five-game match in four attempts this season, hosts Whitman College Friday at 7 p.m. in a Northwest Conference match. Northwest Christian, now 12-11, hosts Multromah Bible College Friday at 7 p.m.

10/13 - PUGET SOUND 3, GEORGE FOX 0: Hot-Hitting Loggers Beat Bruins to Stay in Conference Race

TACOMA, Wash. – Seeking a much-needed win to remain on the heels of league-leading Pacific Lutheran University, the University of Puget Sound Loggers got what they wanted by hitting a solid .339 to defeat the visiting George Fox University Bruins 3-0 in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match Friday night here at Memorial Fieldhouse.

The Loggers scored a 30-24, 30-25, 30-9 win for their third sweep of the Bruins this season, improving to 12-4 overall and 7-2 in the conference, two games behind PLU. The Bruins dropped to 6-14 overall and 3-7 in league play.

Puget Sound aced its way to the win in game one with seven service aces, three by Monica Groves, who also posted six kills and an excellent .600 hitting percentage. The Bruins, down at one point by 11 at 22-11, rallied behind the arm of Whitney Kolb, who collected five kills, but could get no closer than five points at 28-23.

In game two, the Loggers took the lead at 2-1 and never trailed again, although the Bruins pulled with one point on three separate occasions, the last at 19-18. Kills by Molly Hutchinson and Elizabeth Anderson pulled the Bruins within 26-23, but Puget Sound finished out the game on a kill by Jamie Eggers.

The Loggers hammered out 19 kills in game three and hit .529 while holding the Bruins to only nine points and a negative hitting percentage of -.037. The last time a Logger team held an opponent to single digits was September 12, 2001, in a 30-9 win at Lewis & Clark College. Eggers and Joanna Ricken had five kills each to pace the Loggers.

Kolb was the only Bruin in double figures in kills with 12 while hitting .360, and Amy Knight passed out 25 assists. Ashlie Keimig was the defensive leader with nine digs.

Puget Sound had three hitters in double-digit kills, with Eggers notching 15, Groves 13, and Ricken 10. Jamee Fred had 41 assists. Rachel Gross led the defense with 16 digs, and Groves had five blocks. The Loggers had 54 kills and only 12 attack errors.

George Fox returns home Saturday for its final non-conference match of the season against Northwest Christian College at 7 p.m. Puget Sound hosts Pacific University Saturday at 7 p.m. in an NWC contest.

10/11 - GEORGE FOX 3, LEWIS & CLARK 0: Anderson Sparks Bruins in Payback Sweep of Pioneers

NEWBERG, Ore. - Making sure they would not let victory slip through their fingers as happened the last time they met, the George Fox University Bruins made quick work of the Lewis & Clark College Pioneers 3-0 in a snappy 84-minute Northwest Conference women's volleyball match Wednesday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

Led by middle blocker Elizabeth Anderson's 18 kills and 12.5 blocks by the defense, the Bruins posted a 30-26, 30-27, 30-19 sweep of the Pioneers to split the season series. In their last encounter in the conference opener on Sept. 13 in Portland, the Bruins let leads of 7-2 and 12-7 in the fifth game get away as the Pios rallied to pull off a stunning win, but the Bruins would allow none of that this time

George Fox held a slim lead for the first half of game one, finally taking a five-point lead at 17-12 on a block by Holly Hutchinson and Sarah Crossfield, but the Pios scored five unanswered points, sparked by a pair of Sara Kettler kills, to tie it 17-17. There were five more ties thereafter until back-to-back kills by Karina Philliber, a block by Anderson and Philliber, and a service ace by Amy Knight put the Bruins up 28-24. Hutchinson and Philliber blocked a Pioneer attack for the final point.

It was Lewis & Clark's turn to hold the lead for most of the time in the second game as the Pios built up as much as a six-point lead six times, the last at 24-18 on a Bruin service error. A kill by Anderson and back-to-back spikes by Hutchinson ignited an 8-0 run, however, that put the the Bruins ahead for good 26-24. Whitney Kolb's kill sealed the game for the Bruins.

Anderson had four of her game-high eight kills in a 6-1 Bruin start to the third game, but the Pios ran off a string of six unanswered points of their own to take a brief 7-6 lead. An Anderson kill and service ace, two kills by Hutchinson, and a rare three-player block by Hutchinson, Crossfield and Philliber gave the Bruins an 11-7 lead, and they were never seriously threatened again. Back-to-back kills by Jennifer Panico gave the Bruins their largest lead and ended the match.

Anderson hit .500 and was joined in the Bruin attack by Philliber with 13 kills. Hutchinson and Kolb had eight kills each and hit .333 and .300 respectively. Knight had 41 assists and made 10 digs, as did Sarah Burkey. Hutchinson was the blocks leader with two solos and seven assisted, and Kolb had four aces.

Nicki Smith was the only Pio in double figures with 10 kills, six in the first game, while Kettler added eight. Chase had 18 assists and Melody Kayser 12. Chase and Leah Collins led the defense with 12 digs each, and Chase had three aces.

George Fox (6-13, NWC 3-6) visits the University of Puget Sound Friday while Lewis & Clark (6-13, NWC 4-5) goes to leagueleading Pacific Lutheran University Saturday, both matches starting at 7 p.m.

10/7 - PACIFIC LUTHERAN 3, GEORGE FOX 0: High-Flying Lutes Sweep Bruins for 10th Straight Win

NEWBERG, Ore. – Perhaps someone will slow down high-flying Pacific Lutheran University on down the road, but the George Fox University Bruins were unable to do it Saturday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym as they dropped a 3-0 decision to the league-leading Lutes in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match.

The Lutes, who had knocked off 6th-ranked and previously-unbeaten Linfield College Friday, won 30-26, 30-24, 30-27 for their 10th straight victory, improving to 14-4 overall and 8-0 in the conference. The Bruins, who had their own modest two-game winning streak snapped, fell to 5-13 overall and 2-6 in the league.

Game one was a tight one throughout and featured 17 ties, the last at 26-26 after a Holly Hutchinson block for a winner for the Bruins. A Megan Kosel block on a Bruin attack broke the deadlock, and Stacie Matz sealed the win with three straight kills.

Hitting a sparkling .341 in the second game, the Lutes snapped an 11-11 tie on a kill by Katie McGinn and remained in front the rest of the way, though by only a few points. Matz again ended the game with a kill, giving the Lutes their largest lead.

A pair of kills by Elizabeth Anderson sparked the Bruins to a quick 4-0 lead in the third game, but the Lutes battled back to take their first lead at 13-12 on a Matz service ace. After falling behind 18-13, the Bruins rallied to take a 26-25 lead on a block by Anderson and Sarah Crossfield. The teams then traded attack errors, but with George Fox holding a 27-26 advantage, the Lutes got two kills from McGinn around one by Kelcy Joynt and a Bruin attack error for the final points.

Anderson was the only Bruin in double figures in kills with 12, while Amy Knight passed out 37 assists. Jennifer Panico led the George Fox defense with 17 digs, Knight added 15, Karina Philliber had 14, and Sarah Burkey contributed 11.

Matz had 19 kills and a .350 hitting percentage and McGinn added 14 kills for the Lutes. Megan Kosel, filling in for starting setter Gina DiMaggio who was attending a wedding, handed out 38 assists. Brenna Archibald led a quintet of Lutes in double-figure digs with 17, Matz had 16, Joynt 12, and Kosel and McGinn 11 apiece.

George Fox next hosts Lewis & Clark College Wednesday night while Pacific Lutheran welcomes Pacific University Friday, both matches at 7 p.m.

10/6 - GEORGE FOX 3, WILLAMETTE 1: Middle Blockers Team Up as Bruins Stuff Bearcats

SALEM, Ore. – Middle blockers Holly Hutchinson and Elizabeth Anderson combined for 30 kills, a .393 hitting percentage, and 13 blocks, leading the visiting George Fox University Bruins to a 3-1 win over the Willamette University Bearcats in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match Friday night here at the Cone Fieldhouse.

Winning for the second straight time, the Bruins defeated the Bearcats 35-33, 30-20, 22-30, 30-25 to improve to 5-12 overall and 2-5 in the conference. The Bearcats, falling for the ninth time in their last 10 games, dropped to 4-13 overall and 0-7 in the league.

The match began with a first-game thriller and the third-most points in a game for the Bruins since rally scoring began in 2001. George Fox rallied from a 29-26 deficit to tie it 29-29 and had to come back again when Willamette took leads of 30-29, 31-30, and 32-31. The Bruins took a 33-32 lead, only have Julie Stutzman tie the game at 33-33 with a kill for the Bearcats. The Bruins finally secured the win with a kill by Sarah Crossfield, followed by a winning block assist by Amy Knight and Holly Hutchinson. The game included 46 digs, 77 attacks, and 19 kills by Willamette, and 41 digs, 78 attacks, and 18 kills by George Fox.

In the second game, the Bruins broke a 17-17 tie with three consecutive points, including two kills by Knight. Willamette scored the next point on a kill by Stutzman, but the Bruins answered with seven unanswered points on their way to the win. The Bearcats scored 18 kills and remained in front all the way after taking a 3-1 lead in winning game three.

The fourth game was close most of the way, with neither team achieving a lead greater than two points until George Fox won four points in a row for a 25-22 lead. The Bearcats moved within one point at 26-25 after a Jessica Durham service ace, but the Bruins completed the match by scoring the next four points.

Hutchinson finished with a career-high 16 kills, a .414 hitting mark, and was in on six of the Bruins' 14 blocks, while Anderson had 14 kills, a .375 attack percentage, and contributed seven blocks. Jennifer Panico added 11 kills, and Knight handed out 39 assists. Karina Philliber led the defensive effort, which produced 111 digs, with 27, followed by Knight with 24, Panico with 18, and Ashlie Keimig with 13.

Stutzman had 15 kills and Mary Butler 14 to pace the Bearcats, while Jessica Drum had 24 assists and Brittany Ashby 18. Alona Lyamin had 30 digs to lead the home team, which also had 111 digs, with Christine Dion adding 18, Edyth Lee-Barnes 15, Stutzman 13, and Durham 11. Brooke Smith had six blocks.

In the Bruins' 3-2 loss to the 7th-ranked Wildcats on Friday, she had 13 kills and .273 hitting pct., with 10 digs, 10 blocks, an assist and a service ace. In a 3-1 win over Pacific on Saturday, she had 11 kills, 13 digs, and 6 blocks. Although their overall record against perhaps the toughest early-season schedule in team history is not what they would like it to be, the Bruins have a couple of impressive "firsts" they can point to in demonstration of their competitive spirit. When the 3rd-ranked La Verne Leopards came to Newberg on Sept. 16, they were 7-0 and had not lost a game all year. The Bruins became the first team to win a game off the national power, taking the opener 30-23 before La Verne swept the next three games. On Sept. 29, the Bruins became the first team this season to take a 2-1 lead on 7th-ranked Linfield, winning games 1 and 3 30-23 and 30-27 around a 30-22 win by the visiting Wildcats. Linfield rallied to take the match 3-2, only the second time all season the 'Cats had been pushed to a full five-game set.

* Bruins Continue Mastery over Pacific Boxers

For various reasons, sometimes a team gets on a roll against a particular opponent and runs off a long string of victories. The Pacific Boxers have become that "favorite victim" of the Bruins over the last 10 years. Saturday's 3-1 win was the Bruins' 22nd straight over the Boxers, who last won a match in the series 2-0 in the Pacific Invitational on Oct. 4, 1996. The Bruins also limited the Boxers to a minus-.019 hitting pct. in the match, the second time in the last three meetings Pacific has had a negative hitting pct. The Boxers hit minus-.031 in the Bruins' 3-0 win last year on Oct. 29 in Newberg. Those are the only two times the Bruins have held opponents under .000 hitting in the last four seasons.

9/30 - GEORGE FOX 3, PACIFIC 1: Bruins' Defense Shakes Off Boxers to Sew Up First NWC Win

NEWBERG, Ore. – Behind a fine defensive effort that produced 102 digs and 14 blocks in only four games, the George Fox University Bruins shook off the pesky Pacific University Boxers for a 3-1 win and their first Northwest Conference victory of the season in women's volleyball Saturday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

The Bruins prevailed 30-21, 30-27, 27-30, 30-26, snapping an eight-game losing streak and improving to 4-12 overall and 1-5 in the conference. The Boxers fell to an identical 4-12, 1-5 record.

After falling behind 3-0 to open the match, a Whitney Kolb kill got the Bruins going on a 7-0 run for a 7-3 lead, and the Bruins never trailed again, thought the Boxers stayed within striking distance until late in the game. The Bruins closed the game with a 5-1 run to stretch their lead to its largest margin of nine points at the end, a kill by Elizabeth Anderson closing it out. The Boxers also suffered from the loss of starting middle blocker Sarah Monda, who sprained her ankle when she came down on top of a Bruin player's foot after jumping for an attack.

After a brief 2-1 deficit in game two, the Bruins led the rest of the way, but never by more than six points. Their largest lead came at 25-19 on a kill by Karina Philliber, but a 5-0 spurt by the Boxers closed the gap to one at 25-24. It was still only a 28-27 lead when a Natalie Pickett spike and a Boxer attack error enabled the Bruins to secure the win.

George Fox led 11-8 in game three when the Boxers turned the tables, going on a 7-0 run to take a 15-11 lead. The Boxers led by as much as five before the Bruins battled back for a 27-27 deadlock, but back-to-back blocks and a kill by Joanna Delanty gave Pacific the game.

The Bruins never trailed in game four and built up an eight-point advantage of 18-10 on a Kolb kill before the Boxers stormed back. A 14-6 run brought the Boxers even at 24-24, but consecutive kills by Anderson and Kolb fueled a 6-2 Bruin run to close out the match.

Kolb with 13 kills and Anderson and Philliber with 11 each led the Bruin offense, while Amy Knight passed out 50 assists. The defensive effort was led by Philliber with 23 digs, while Ashlie Keimig added 18, Ashley Sheller 15, Knight 14, Anderson 13, and Jennifer Panico 11. Pickett had eight blocks and Anderson six.

The tough Bruin defense held Pacific to a minus-.019 hitting percentage, with Melissa Dunn the only Boxer in double figures with 12 kills. Anela Iseke handed out 33 assists. Alyssa Finn topped the Boxer defense with 30 digs, Dunn had 25, and Erica Drake picked up 13. Delanty and Megan Van Domelen had seven blocks each as the Boxers blocked 16 for winners as a team.

9/29 - LINFIELD 3, GEORGE FOX 2: Scrappy Bruins Push Ranked Wildcats to Limit Before Falling

NEWBERG, Ore. – Giving 7th-ranked Linfield College one of its sternest tests of the season, the George Fox University Bruins put the Wildcats in a two-games-to-one hole for the first time all year before the visitors rallied for a 3-2 win over their Yamhill County rivals in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match Friday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

The Bruins fell to the Wildcats 30-23, 22-30, 30-27, 19-30, 5-15, dropping to 3-12 overall with their eighth setback in a row and 0-5 in the conference. The Wildcats, pushed to five games for only the second time this season, improved their best start ever to 13-0 overall and 6-0 in the league.

The Bruins benefited from a slow start to the Wildcats' offense in game one, taking a 5-0 lead thanks to a kill by Elizabeth Anderson and four straight Linfield attack errors. The Bruins never trailed, leading by as many as eight points six times. The Wildcats got within three at 15-12 before a kill by Karina Philliber and three more Linfield attack errors put momentum back on the Bruins' side.

Linfield used a 5-0 run early in game two to turn a 6-5 deficit into a 10-6 lead, and gradually pulled away, building as much as a 10point lead at 29-19. The Wildcats took a 22-15 lead in game three before the Bruins rallied. A pair of kills by Anderson sparked a 6-0 run to cut the Linfield lead to one at 22-21, and a kill by the Bruins' Whitney Kolb knotted it 23-23. A Linfield set error broke a 24-24 tie and gave the Bruins the lead for good, with another kill by Kolb sealing the win.

In their deepest hole of the season, the Wildcats responded. A 9-1 run put Linfield ahead early at 13-3 in game four, but the Bruins battled back to within three when a Holly Hutchinson kill cut the gap to 17-14. A pair of kills by Lauren Kreiger and Katelyn Baker ignited a 7-2 run at that point that put the Wildcats back in firm control, and a kill by Emily Vuylsteke forced a fifth game.

The deciding skirmish belonged entirely to the Wildcats, who made sure the Bruins would spring no upset by racing out to 12-3 advantage. The Wildcats scored the final three points of the match for their largest lead of the game.

Anderson led the Bruins with a triple-double, posting 13 kills, 10 digs, and 10 blocks. Jennifer Panico added 10 kills for the Bruins, who hit only .077 for the match. Amy Knight had 35 assists. Six Bruins reached double figures in digs, led by Ashlie Keimig with 19. Knight added 18, Philliber 17, Panico 15, and Lani Rasmussen joined Anderson with 10. Hutchinson was in on nine blocks as the Bruins blocked 19 as a team.

Kreiger with 16 kills, Molly Taylor with 15, and Baker with 10 led the Wildcats, who hit only .093 after entering the match with a league-leading percentage of .230. Chelsey Gellatly passed out 57 assists. Hannah Veley and Meghan Flink had 23 digs each, Kreiger and Gellatly added 20 apiece, and Michelle Wyatt had 11.

George Fox hosts Pacific University in an NWC match Saturday at 7 p.m. Linfield is off until next Friday, Oct. 6, when the Wildcats host the only other team still unbeaten in league play, Pacific Lutheran University, at 7 p.m.

SPOKANE, Wash. - Despite holding sizeable leads in each of the first two games, the George Fox University Bruins let the Whitworth College Pirates slip from their grasp and dropped a 3-0 match in Northwest Conference women's volleyball action Saturday afternoon at the Whitworth Fieldhouse.

The Bruins fell 23-30, 26-30, 26-30 to the Pirates, suffering their seventh straight setback and falling to 3-11 overall and 0-4 in the conference. The Pirates improved to 3-12 overall and 2-2 in the league.

Behind Whitney Kolb's six kills, George Fox took a 14-10 lead in the first game, but Whitworth rallied with an 11-2 run to take a 21-16 lead after a pair of Bruin attack errors. The Pirates stretched their advantage to 27-21 on a kill by Angie Florence before winning the game on another George Fox attack error.

The Bruins moved from a one-point lead to a 20-14 margin in the second game after a block by Holly Hutchinson and four straight attack errors by the Pirates, but the home team again bounced back with a 16-6 run to win the game. The Pirates got a season-high eight team blocks in the game, including five during the winning rally.

In the final, Whitworth led all the way, taking an early 10-2 lead before George Fox rallied to within one at 17-16 after an ace by Amy Knight. Whitworth went back up by four at 24-20 on a service ace by Nikki Bardwell, but the Bruins rallied one more time to within 25-24 on a kill by Natalie Pickett. Back-to-back kills by Bardwell, however, closed out the match for the Pirates.

Kanna Philliber sparkled for the Bruins, posting 12 kills and no errors in 28 attempts for a match-high .429 hitting percentage, but she was the only player in double figure for the Bruins, who struggled to their lowest hitting percentage of the season at .030. Knight had 27 assists. Ashlie Keimig led the George Fox defense with 13 digs, while Knight and Ashley Sheller added 10 apiece.

Holly Tomlin with 13 kills and Bardwell with 10 led the Pirate offense, which hit .153 for the match. Holly Ridings passed out 30 assists. Cassie Moore had 15 digs to lead the Bucs, and Nicole VanderMeulen added 13. Tamra Stark with eight blocks and Florence with six paced the Pirates at the net.

Both teams play again Friday at 7 p.m. George Fox hosts 7th-ranked Linfield College, while Whitworth hits the road to play the University of Puget Sound.

WALLA WALLA, Wash. - Led by Rosa Brey's .550 hitting percentage, the Whitman College Missionaries pounded out a sizzling .356 mark for the entire match and cruised past the visiting George Fox University Bruins 3-0 in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball contest Friday afternoon here at the Sherwood Center.

The Bruins fell 19-30, 18-30, 21-30, dropping to 3-10 overall with their sixth straight setback and to 0-3 in the conference. The Missionaries improved to 6-5 overall and 2-1 in league play.

#### 9/16 - LA VERNE 3, GEORGE FOX 1: Bruins First to Win a Game from Leopards but Drop Match

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Although they became the first team this season to win a game from the 3rd-ranked University of La Verne Leopards, the George Fox University Bruins could not turn their opening-game success into a complete upset and dropped a 3-1 decision to the NCAA Division III national power in a non-conference women's volleyball match Saturday evening here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

The Bruins fell to the Leopards 30-23, 24-30, 13-30, 26-30, and dropped to 3-9 with their fourth straight setback. La Verne, which reached the NCAA semi-finals last year and has won the West Regional five of the last six years, climbed to 8-0 despite losing a game for the first time.

The Leopards opened the match bent on keeping their perfect record intact, roaring out to an 8-2 lead before their offense went south. Four La Verne attack errors around a kill by the Bruins' Cassandra Woods got the home team back in the game. An ace by Sarah Burkey gave George Fox its first lead at 19-18, and a kill by Amy Knight broke a 19-19 tie put the Bruins ahead for good. A block assist by Woods and Holly Hutchinson ended the game and gave George Fox its largest lead. La Verne hit .000 for the game with 13 errors, while George Fox hit .195.

La Verne never trailed in taking the second game, going on a 10-2 run that broke a 2-2 tie and gave the Leopards control of the game. The Bruins battled back within three points at 27-24 on a kill by Woods, but a kill and an ace by Whitney Kranz and a Bruin attack error thwarted the comeback.

Game three was total domination by the Leopards as they hit. 500 with 15 kills and only two errors, while the Bruins struggled to an .000 percentage with nine errors. Kranz sparked the La Verne offense with six kills as the Leopards used a 9-1 run to take a 24-11 lead and coasted to victory.

It appeared the Leopards would stroll through the fourth game as well after forging a 19-6 lead behind three kills from southpaw Jodi Lindsay and a streak of five attack errors by the Bruins. The Leopards began to falter, however, committing four attack errors in the space of five points, as the Bruins rallied. An 18-7 outburst, capped by an Anderson kill, brought the Bruins within two at 26-24, but Lindsay came up with two big spikes to stave off the comeback. The match ended on a Bruin serving error.

Anderson was the only hitter in double figures with 10 for the Bruins, who hit .087 in the match. Knight had 34 assists. Karina Philliber made 18 digs, Knight 12, and Jennifer Panico 10 on defense, while Anderson and Hutchinson were in on five of the Bruins' 10 blocks.

Brianna Gonzales led a quartet of Leopards in double figures with 13 kills, Kranza and Tiona Hobson had 12, and Lindsay finished with 11. The Leopards hit .168. Leslie Flores handed out 51 assists. #### 9/16 - DIXIE STATE 3, GEORGE FOX 1: Bruins Drop Only Match vs. D-II Opponent in Loss to Rebels

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Taking on their only NCAA Division II opponent of the season, the George Fox University Bruins got off to quick starts in three of the four games played but could not sustain that early success, eventually dropping a 3-1 decision to the Dixie State College of Utah Rebels in a non-conference women's volleyball match Saturday afternoon here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

The Bruins fell 24-30, 18-30, 30-28, 22-30 to the Rebels, who are in their first year of competition as a four-year school after many years as a junior college. George Fox fell to 3-8 with its fourth straight loss, while Dixie State won its second in a row and improved to 6-5.

The Rebels opened the match with a 4-0 outburst in game one and stretched it to 10-4 before the Bruins rallied. Down 12-8, the Bruins reeled off five unanswered points and took their only lead of the game at 13-12 on a kill by Amy Knight. The Rebels went ahead for good when a Tera Fish kill broke a 16-16 tie, and gradually pulled away until a Brittney Hamilton killed ended it.

George Fox jumped out to a 5-0 lead to start game two, but Dixie State responded with a 17-4 run to build a solid lead at 17-9. The Bruins got no closer than five points the rest of the way.

The Bruins again took a 5-0 lead to open game three, and upped it to 10-4 on a Rebel attack error. A 9-2 run by the Rebels enabled them to seize a 13-12 lead, but it was the only one they would have. Back-to-back service aces by Whitney Kolb put George Fox up 20-14, but the Rebels rebounded to tie it at 24-24. A kill by Kolb gave the Bruins the lead for good, and she notched her fifth kill of the game to nail down the final point.

Two kills by Kolb and one by Jennifer Panico plus three Rebel attack errors gave the Bruins a 6-0 lead to start game four, but again the home team could not sustain the momentum. The game was knotted at 8-8, 9-9, and 10-10 before Cidney Judkins put one away, igniting a 6-0 run that gave Dixie State an insurmountable 16-10 lead. The Rebels led by as many as 10 at 23-13 before a Breena Bonnett kill ended the match.

Kolb had 15 kills to lead the Bruins, who struggled with too many offensive errors and hit only .048 for the match. Knight passed out 35 assists. Karina Philliber had 20 digs to lead the defense, with Panico adding 18, Knight 15, and Sarah Burkey 10. Elizabeth Anderson had five blocks.

Judkins paced a balanced Rebel attack that hit .136 with 15 kills, Bonnett added 14, and Heidi Erickson had 12. Fish handed out 21 assists and Whitnee Webster had 19. Bonnett led a quartet of double-figure diggers with 20, Webster had 18, Judkins 17, and Nikki Callahan 12. Erickson was in on four blocks.

Both teams are back in action later Saturday evening at 7 p.m. George Fox hosts the University of La Verne, ranked #3 in Division III, in a non-conference match, while Dixie State visits Corban College in Salem.

### 9/15 - PUGET SOUND 3, GEORGE FOX 0: Error-Prone Bruins Rolled Over by Loggers in Home Opener

NEWBERG, Ore. -- Hitting the lowest percentage of the season is not something a team wants to do against the pre-season league favorite, but that was the problem that plagued the George Fox University Bruins in their home opener Finday night here at the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym, resulting in a 3-0 loss to the University of Puget Sound Loggers in a Northwest Conference women's volleyball match.

The Bruins hit only .089, with 23 errors and only 35 kills, in falling 25-30, 25-30, 19-30. The visiting Loggers were much more efficient, hitting .214 with 25 errors but 55 kills. George Fox suffered its third straight setback and is 0-2 in the conference, while Puget Sound climbed to 6-1 overall with its sixth straight win and won its NWC opener.

George Fox led twice early in the first game, but a Bruin service error at 10-10 gave Puget Sound a lead it would not relinguish. The Loggers gradually pulled away, three times taking six-point leads, before closing out the game with a Joanna Ricken kill.

In game two, the Loggers jumped out to a 15-7 lead before the Bruins battled back to make a game of it. The Bruins got within one point three times, the last at 24-23, but kills by Leigh Sumida and Monica Groves and three straight Bruin attack errors enabled the Loggers to regain momentum and hang on.

Puget Sound quickly seized control of the final game, reeling off seven unanswered points to turn a 3-2 lead into a comfortable 10-2 margin. The Loggers had another 7-0 run shortly thereafter, making it 18-5, and took their largest lead at 25-10 on a Groves kill. The Bruins scored nine of the next 12 points to make it respectable, but a kill by Jamie Eggers and a final attack error by the home team ended the match.

Whitney Kolb was the only Bruin in double figures in kills with 12, and Holly Hutchinson added eight with a .300 hitting percentage. Amy Knight passed out 27 assists, while Karina Philliber had 14 digs.

Groves, the NWC leader in kills with 4.88 per game, added to her numbers with 18 more, and Eggers chipped in with 11. Jessica McPhee-Hayes handed out 43 assists. Rachel Gross topped all defenders with 32 digs and Eggers added 13.

George Fox plays two matches Saturday, hosting Dixie State College of Utah at 1 p.m. and 3rd-ranked University of La Verne at 7 p.m. in a pair on non-conference contests. Puget Sound visits Pacific University in an NWC match Saturday at 7 p.m.

#### 9/13 - LEWIS & CLARK 3, GEORGE FOX 2: Pios Burst Bruins' Bubble with Late Outburst in NWC Opener

**PORTLAND, Ore.** – Leading 12-7 in the fifth game, the George Fox University Bruins could not put the final three nails in Lewis & Clark College's coffin and the home-standing Pioneers rallied for a 3-2 win in the Northwest Conference women's volleyball opener for both teams Wednesday night here at the Pamplin Sports Center.

Down 29-21, the Bruins scored three more points before a service error ended the game. In game four, it was the Bruins who rallied after falling behind by four at 18-14. A 9-2 streak gave the Bruins a 23-20 lead, and the game remained tight until an attack error by the Pios' Nicki Smith and a kill by Knight enabled the Bruins to escape with a 30-28 win.

With back-to-back kills by Jennifer Panico and one by Holly Hutchinson, the Bruins jumped out to a 7-2 lead in the decisive fifth game, and were still up by five at 12-7 on a kill by Elizabeth Anderson before the Pios awoke. Kelsey Neussi's kill started a string of seven unanswered points before an Anderson kill halted the skid and made it a 14-13 game, but Smith dropped a soft shot over a Bruins' block attempt and no defender could reach it in time as the ball fell to the court, giving Lewis & Clark the stunning victory.

Panico posted a double-double for the Bruins with a team-high 15 kills and 14 digs. Whitney Kolb added 13 kills, Hutchinson 12, and Anderson 11, while Knight had 43 assists, 12 digs, and four service aces. Karina Philliber had a team-high 15 digs, and Anderson was in on five of the Bruins' seven blocks.

Smith paced all hitters with 24 kills for Lewis & Clark and Holland chipped in with 12. Andrea Chase had 31 assists and Melody Kayser had 12. Defensively, Liz Nguyen made 18 digs and Chase 14, while Holland contributed four blocks to the team's seven.

George Fox plays its first home game Friday as the University of Puget Sound, the pre-season conference favorite, comes to the Wheeler Sports Center/Miller Gym for a 7 p.m. match. Lewis & Clark hosts the University of La Verne Friday at 7 p.m. in a non-conference match with the #3-ranked team in the nation, whom the Bruins will meet Saturday night.

### 9/9 - PACIFIC COAST CLASSIC: Bruins Sweep Whittier but Drop Thriller to CMS on Classic's Day 2

**CLAREMONT, Calif.** – After sweeping the Whittier College Poets 3-0, the George Fox University Bruins pushed the host Claremont-Mudd-Scripps Colleges Athenas down to the wire before dropping a 3-2 thriller on the final day of play in the Pacific Coast Classic women's volleyball tournament here Saturday.

The Bruins rolled past the Poets 30-10, 30-21, 30-25 in a match played at Pomona-Pitzer Colleges, then switched to nearby Claremont's gym where they fell 30-24, 27-30, 30-27, 24-30, 15-11. George Fox was 2-2 in the tournament, having beaten Chapman University 3-1 before losing to Pomona-Pitzer 3-1 on Friday.

Jennifer Panico and Whitney Kolb with eight kills each and Elizabeth Anderson with seven paced the George Fox attack against Whittier, with Amy Knight passing out 21 assists and Lani Rasmussen nine. Kolb hit a sizzling .438 with only one error in 16 attempts. The Bruins made 56 digs, led by Knight with 11, and had 17 blocks, topped by eight from Anderson.

Cassidy Lake led the Poets with six kills, while Andrea Shoup had 12 assists and Lake 10. The Poets were held to a .069 attack percentage. Deena Arenas made 13 digs.

The Bruins had their best hitting percentage of the season with a .296 mark against Claremont but could not put the Athenas away after taking a 2-1 lead in games. Kolb with 16 kills and a .308 percentage and Anderson with 12 kills and a .455 mark paced the Bruins. Knight had 39 assists. Karina Philliber led the defense with 25 digs and Panico added 11, while Holly Hutchison was in on eight of the Bruins' 10.5 blocks in the match.

Hilary Bagshaw with 16 kills, Lindsay Hull with 14, and Alicia Freeman with 11 sparked the Athenas, with Alex Harrison passing out 51 assists. Freeman had 17 digs, and Harrison and Helen Bottemiller made six blocks each on defense for the home team.

George Fox (3-5) now turns its attention to Northwest Conference action, which begins Wednesday as the Bruins visit Lewis & Clark College in Portland for a 7 p.m. match. The first home conference game for the Bruins is Friday, Sept. 15, at 7 p.m. against preseason NWC favorite University of Puget Sound.

#### 9/8 - PACIFIC COAST CLASSIC: Bruins Down Chapman but Fall to Pomona on Classic's First Day

**CLAREMONT, Calif.** – Splitting a pair of four-game matches, the George Fox University Bruins downed the Chapman University Panthers 3-1 but fell to the Pomona-Pitzer Colleges Sagehens 3-1 on the first day of action in the Pacific Coast Classic women's volleyball tournament taking place Friday and Saturday here at Pomona-Pitzer and Claremont-Mudd-Scripps Colleges.

The Bruins spotted the Panthers a game before rallying to win 16-30, 30-26, 34-32, 30-18, then dropped a 24-30, 27-30, 30-26, 29-31 decision to the Sagehens in matches played at Pomona-Pitzer's gym.

In the win over Chapman, freshmen Jennifer Panico and Holly Hutchinson led the George Fox attack. Panico had 15 kills and a .270 hitting percentage, while Hutchinson had 10 kills and a .364 average. Amy Knight passed out 44 assists. Defensively, Karina Philliber made 14 digs, and Hutchinson had one solo block and five block assists.

Nikkie Powers had a match-high 19 kills to lead the Panthers, followed by Christina Chambers with 13 and Brittany Sprague with 10. Jessica Clemons had 47 assists. Linda Ly had 21 digs and Powers and Clemons 17 apiece, while Sprague and Jessica Lockhart had five blocks each.

Panico was at it again in the Pomona-Pitzer match, putting away 20 shots with a sizzling .405 percentage, and Whitney Kolb chipped in with 13 kills and a .370 hitting mark. The Bruins hit .259 as a team, their best showing thus far this year. Knight had 47 assists. Ashlie Keimig was the only Bruin in double figures in digs with 11, although 12 different Bruins had digs. The Bruins also recorded 20 blocks, led by Hutchinson and Elizabeth Anderson, who were in on seven each, and Natalie Pickett with six.

Sarah Amos paced Pomona-Pitzer with 25 kills, Emily Bockman added 18, and Megan Prior had 12. Laura Laakso handed out 54 assists. Amos led the defense with 17 digs, Carla Bagdonas had 11, and Ruchi Patel made 10 digs. Dana Kittrelle had six block assists.

George Fox (2-4) takes on Whittier College at 11:15 a.m. Saturday in the Pomona gym, then switches sites to play co-host Claremont-Mudd-Scripps at 3:45 p.m. to close out the tournament.

#### 9/2 - UPS INVITATIONAL: Bruins Fall to Host Loggers but Get First Win over New York Team

TACOMA, Wash. – Facing their third Northwest Conference foe in as many games, the George Fox University Bruins came away with their third straight setback in a 3-0 loss to the host University of Puget Sound Loggers, but bounced back for a 3-0 win over the State University of New York-Brockport Golden Eagles Saturday in the UPS Invitational women's volleyball tournament here at Memorial Fieldhouse.

The Bruins fell to the Loggers in three competitive games 25-30, 22-30, 30-32, then jumped on the Golden Eagles 30-26, 31-29, 30-17 for their first win of the season. Brockport had opened the tournament Friday with a 3-2 win over Puget Sound.

In game one of the UPS match, the Bruins jumped out to an early 7-2 lead and maintained a lead for most of the game, except for a momentary 12-12 tie. Still leading 20-18, the Bruins surrendered seven unanswered points, including three kills by Jamie Eggers, and fell behind 25-20. They got no closer than four the rest of the way.

Other than an early 1-0 deficit, Puget Sound led all of game two, though George Fox stayed close until late. It was only a 24-21 margin when the Loggers went on a 6-1 run to end the game. Game three was a see-saw affair that saw 12 ties and seven lead changes. The Bruins led 26-21 when three consecutive kills by Eggers keyed a 7-0 UPS run for a 28-26 advantage by the home team. Elizabeth Anderson's kill and a bad set by Eggers enabled the Bruins to take 29-28 and 30-29 leads, but kills by Monica Groves and Lindsey Denman and a block by Groves and Denman gave the Loggers the third game.

Anderson was the only Bruin in double figures in kills with 12 as George Fox hit only .124 for the match to .246 for Puget Sound. Amy Knight had 29 assists. Karina Philliber had 10 digs and Anderson made three blocks on defense.

Eggers paced the Loggers with 20 kills, Groves had 17, and Denman 11, with Jessica McPhee-Hayes passing out 47 assists and making 20 digs. Groves had five blocks.

Against the Golden Eagles from upstate New York near Rochester, the Bruins had to squeeze out narrow victories in the first two games. Game three was a rout, however, as the Bruins jumped out to a huge early lead and never looked back.

Defense carried the day for the Bruins as they recorded 22 total blocks for winners in just three games, over seven a game. Anderson had 14 blocks, six solo and eight assists, while Whitney Kolb and Cassandra Woods chipped in with five apiece. Ashley Sheller came off the bench to lead the team with 14 digs, Ashlie Keimig had 12, and Philliber had 11.

Jennifer Panico paced the Bruins offensively with 11 kills, hitting .417 with only one error in 24 attempts, while Kolb had eight kills. Lani Rasmussen went the distance at setter and had 30 assists.

George Fox (1-3) heads for Claremont, Calif., next weekend for the Pacific Coast Classic hosted by the Claremont-Mudd-Scripps and Pomona-Pitzer Colleges. The Bruins are scheduled to play Chapmari University at 11 a.m. and Pomona-Pitzer at 3:45 p.m. on Friday, and Whittier College at 11:15 a.m. and Claremont-Mudd-Scripps at 3:45 p.m. on Saturday.

#### 9/1 - UPS INVITATIONAL: Bruins Drop Season-Opening Matches to NWC Foes in UPS Tournament

**TACOMA, Wash.** – Opening the 2006 women's volleyball season against some familiar faces, the George Fox University Bruins dropped 3-1 decisions to Northwest Conference foes Whitman College and Pacific Lutheran University Friday here at the University of Puget Sound Invitational Tournament in UPS' Memorial Fieldhouse.

Mixing and matching the entire roster of 15 players in an effort to find the right combination in the opener, George Fox took the first game of the season before falling to the Whitman Missionaries 30-25, 17-30, 27-30, 9-30. The Bruins improved against the PLU Lutes in their second match of the day but still succumbed 21-30, 30-25, 26-30, 27-30.

In the first Whitman game, Whitney Kolb had four kills to lead George Fox as the Bruins held the lead for most of a close game, pulling away at the end. The Missionaries bounced back in game two as the Bruins' offense sputtered, recording as many attack errors as kills (nine each). The Bruins had their best offensive game in the third contest, hitting .250 with 15 kills and only three miscues, but the Missionaries hung on to win another tight one. Jennifer Panico had four kills and Natalie Pickett off the bench gave the Bruins a boost with three kills and no errors with a pair of strong blocks for winners.

Hoping to send the match to a fifth game, the Bruins instead stumbled out of the gate in game four, falling quickly behind 12-2 and never recovering. The Missionaries later ran off a string of 13 unanswered points to extend their lead to 25-4 before the Bruins managed to split the last 10 points.

The Bruins were led offensively by Kolb and Elizabeth Anderson with eight kills each, while Amy Knight passed out 31 assists in three games. The Bruins hit only .115 for the match, although Missionaries were not much better at .131. Defensively, Karina Philliber had 20 digs, Knight and Megan Cornelius 11 each, and Panico had 10. Anderson was in on four of the Bruins' eight blocks.

For Whitman, Rosa Brey had 14 kills and Lydia Hayes 10, with Kate Borsato collecting 36 assists. Six Missionaries were in double figures in digs, led by Alex Graves with 20, while Brey had five blocks among the Missionaries' 13 total.

The Bruins trailed all the way in dropping the first game of the PLU match, but caught fire to win game two, hitting a .360 percentage with 19 kills and only one error in 50 attempts. Elizabeth Anderson had six kills and Kolb five in the game, neither with an error, as the Bruins evened the match. In game three, the Lutes broke a 22-22 tie with four unanswered points to take control, then rallied from a 24-22 deficit in game four to secure the match.

Anderson dazzled in the match, hitting .514 with 21 kills and only two errors in 37 attempts, and Kolb chipped in with 14 kills while hitting .286. As a team, the Bruins improved almost 100 points in their attack percentage, hitting .213. Knight had 42 assists. Cornelius led the defense with 22 digs, followed by Knight with 18, Philliber with 16, and Panico with 15.

Katie McGinn and Stacie Matz had 16 kills apiece for the Lutes, with Gina DiMaggio assisting on 50 winners. Megan Kosel led a group of four Lutes in digs with 26, while Kelcy Joynt had a hand in eight blocks and McGinn in six as PLU made 15 blocks in all.

In other tournament games Friday, the State University of New York-Brockport knocked off Puget Sound 3-2 (30-21, 16-30, 31-29, 19-30, 15-13), Pacific Lutheran dropped Brockport 3-1 (34-32, 30-25, 26-30, 30-23), and Puget Sound spanked Whitman 3-1 (30-25, 30-20, 28-30, 30-25).

Saturday's tournament schedule has Whitman vs. Brockport at 9 a.m., George Fox vs. Puget Sound at 11 a.m., Whitman vs. Pacific Lutheran at 1 p.m., George Fox vs. Brockport at 3 p.m., and Pacific Lutheran vs. Puget Sound at 5 p.m.

#### 8/30 - PREVIEW: Bruins Could Factor in NWC Race with Balance of Vets and Newcomers

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Although 2005 was George Fox University's second winning season in a row and 20th in 24 years under veteran coach **Steve Grant**, it has been a while since the Bruins played a major role in the Northwest Conference women's volleyball race. If the Bruins' mix of returning veterans and talented newcomers melds together as well as hoped for, however, 2006 could mark a change in that.

The Bruins are coming off a 12-11 campaign that saw them finish fifth in the conference standings at 7-9. With the loss of three starters, including First Team All-NWC hitter Linzi Stolsig and Honorable Mention All-NWC libero Haley Stapleton, the Bruins were relegated to a sixth-place prediction in this fall's pre-season NWC coaches' poll.

"That's not surprising, considering who we lost," admits Grant. "We are still going to be a relatively-young team this year, with only one senior in eligibility, but I can say without hesitation that it's been a long time since I have had a group come together as well, chemistry-wise, as this group has. If that carries over into our play on the court, we could surprise a team or two."

Eight players return for the Bruins, including three starters and a fourth player who was a part of the team's regular rotation although she was not officially a "starter": setter **Amy Knight** (Jr., Yakima, Wash. / A.C. Davis HS), middle blockers **Elizabeth Anderson** (Jr., Sherwood, Ore. / Westside Christian HS) and **Cassandra Woods** (Jr., Clatskanie, Ore. / Clatskanie HS), and outside hitter **Whitney Kolb** (Jr., Jefferson, Ore. / Jefferson Christian HS). Knight led the Northwest Conference in assists per game (12.10), which ranked 20th nationally, and was seventh in the league in digs (3.64). Anderson was fifth in the NWC in blocks per game (1.01) while averaging 2.28 kills, and Woods was ninth in blocks (0.81) along with 2.10 kills a game. Kolb, despite starting only nine games, was fourth in the league in kills per game (3.85).

"The setter position is a key role in anything we do," says Grant, "and Amy has assumed a role of leadership on this team by virtue of both her age and her position. Elizabeth is a rock in the middle who is constantly striving to improve; she is not satisfied with staying at the same level and works hard on every area of her game, whether it is defensive blocking, serving, or hitting. We may move Cassandra from the middle to right-side hitter, where she seems to have found herself; she is a very strong player who always gives 100%. Whitney had only two years of organized ball before she came here, and her progress has been phenomenal; she has improved on defense and has stepped up to another level offensively. We are looking for big years out of all four of them."

Karina Philliber (Sr., Battle Ground, Wash. / Bethel HS), the only athletic senior on the squad, averaged 0.9 kills and 1.35 digs a game after transferring from Clark College, a community college in Vancouver, Wash., but will assume a bigger role this season. "She's a 'gap-filler' who will be in there all the time because of her versatility," predicts Grant. "Outside hitter, libero, defensive specialist - wherever there's a leak, she'll plug it."

Also back for the Bruins but shifting from offensive to defensive roles are **Ashlie Keimig** (So., The Dalles, Ore. / The Dalles-Wahtonka HS) and **Ashley Sheller** (So., Gresham, Ore. / Sam Barlow HS). Keimig averaged 0.4 kills and 1.2 digs while Sheller had 1.09 kills and digs in limited action as freshmen. "Keimig has been passing the ball well and is steady in the back row," notes Grant. "Sheller is also shifting to defense, but she has shown flashes of power on offense and will probably play both for us."

Perhaps the most pleasant surprise in the pre-season has been the significant improvement shown by returning middle blocker **Natalie Pickett** (So., Albany, Ore. / West Albany HS), who had 0.57 kills and 0.43 digs in seven matches last season. "She is hitting better, blocking much better, and has the potential to be a dominant force at the net," says Grant.

Outside hitter Niki McCorkle (Jr., Seattle, Wash. / Seattle Christian HS), an academic senior, returns to the team this year after sitting out the past two seasons. She played for the Bruins in 2003, averaging 1.56 kills and 0.78 digs in 24 matches. "I told Niki she would probably be a role player after playing regularly three years ago," says Grant, "but she has a good attitude and is working very hard to fill that role. She has shown remarkable improvement despite not playing for two years and gives us depth on offense."

Grant has two new offensive hitters who are expected to see considerable playing time in **Jennifer Panico** (Fr., Phoenix, Ariz. / Pinnacle HS) and **Sarah Crossfield** (Fr., Pomeroy, Wash. / Pomeroy HS). "Jennifer was well-coached in high school and by her club team coach, giving us an extremely solid, dependable outside hitter," observes Grant. "She hits hard, is smart, and passes like a libero. Sarah has been a pleasant surprise while shifting from the middle to the right side. She hits hard, blocks well, and passes better than anticipated."

The team's tallest player is newcomer **Holly Hutchinson** (Fr., Ephrata, Wash. / Ephrata HS), a 6-1 middle blocker. "Holly has so much potential," says Grant. "She works extra hard and could quickly become an outstanding blocker and offensive player."

Rookie setter Lani Rasmussen (Fr., San Jose, Calif. / Valley Christian HS) is called by Grant "a sparkplug who brings others up to her level of enthusiasm for the game. Even as a freshman, she has assumed a leadership role as well. She has a quick release on sets and responds quickly on defense."

A pair of defensive specialists who will compete for time at libero are **Megan Cornelius** (Fr., Philomath, Ore. / Philomath HS) and **Sarah Burkey** (Fr., Albany, Ore. / South Albany HS). "These two are similar to one another in that they are conscientious, hard workers with good hands and passing skills. Megan participated in a swimming program this summer that has made her that much stronger. Sarah is a scrappy player and encourager who plays with great enthusiasm."

Rounding out the roster is **Jennifer Ayers** (So., Jefferson, Ore. / Jefferson HS), a transfer from Portland Community College. "Jennifer is our '16th' player who will play if we have an injury," says Grant, "but she is so full of potential that we wanted to keep her around. She has long arms and legs and a great reach, enabling her to play 'taller' than she actually is. She is working on her defense and is going to be very good offensively."

Grant enters his 25th season at George Fox with a record of 507-314, ranking 18th among active NCAA Division III coaches in victories, but he won't make any predictions as to how many more wins the Bruins might add to his total this season. "Attitude impacts play, and if that is true, we should do well," is as far as he will go. "All our players have a 'same-page' mentality, they enjoy one another and have quickly developed a strong bond of unity. We have one of our toughest schedules ever, so we must set realistic goals if we are to take a sense of accomplishment from this season, but I am confident that this group will truly make memories for one another."

The season begins for the Bruins this Friday-Saturday, Sept. 1-2, in the University of Puget Sound Invitational Tournament in Tacoma, Wash. On Friday, George Fox plays Whitman College at 11 a.m. and Pacific Lutheran University at 5 p.m., followed Saturday by Puget Sound at 11 a.m. and the State University of New York-Brockport at 3 p.m. Northwest Conference play begins on Sept. 13 at Lewis & Clark College, with the Bruins' home opener on Sept. 15 in a conference match against Puget Sound at 7 p.m. in the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym.

#### 8/14 - NWC POLL: Bruins Tabbed for 6th in 2006 Northwest Conference Volleyball Race

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Needing to replace two All-Conference performers, outside hitter Linzi Stolsig and libero Haley Stapleton, the George Fox University Bruins have been picked to finish sixth in the 2006 Northwest Conference women's volleyball race in a preseason ballot of the league's nine coaches.

The Bruins, who posted a 12-11 overall record and tied for fifth in the NWC with a 7-9 record in conference play in 2005, received 38 points in the voting. George Fox is coming off its 20th winning record in 24 seasons under head coach Steve Grant, who takes a 507-314 lifetime record into the new season and ranks 18th among active NCAA Division III coaches in victories.

Stolsig, a two-time First Team All-NWC selection, was second in the league in digs per game (5.43), setting a new George Fox single-season record, and 10th in kills per game (3.36). She posted 723 kills and 952 digs, falling just short of the all-time top 10 in both categories, in only two seasons with the Bruins. Stapleton, a rare four-year starter for the Bruins, finished fourth in the league in digs per game (4.84). She had 1,556 digs in her career, tying for second all-time in that category with Cindy Warner (1988-91).

The Bruins do return three starters as well as their key "sixth man" who led the team in kills: setter Amy Knight (12.10 assists, 3.64 digs per game), middle blockers Elizabeth Anderson (2.28 kills, 1.01 blocks per game) and Cassandra Woods (2.10 kills, 0.81 blocks per game), and outside hitter Whitney Kolb (3.85 kills per game). Knight led the NWC in assists and was seventh in digs, Kolb was fourth in kills, while Anderson was fifth and Woods ninth in blocks.

Aiming for its first Northwest Conference championship since 2001, the University of Puget Sound is favored to win the NWC volleyball title. The Loggers picked up five first-place votes and totaled 81 points in the poll to top Linfield College. UPS is coming off a 15-6 season in which the Loggers tied Linfield for second in the conference with a 12-4 record and earned an at-large bid to the NCAA tournament. Mark Massey, the 2005 NWC Coach of the Year, welcomes back First Team All-NWC hitter Kayla Roof, along with honorable mention selections Jamie Eggers and Monica Groves.

Linfield had two first-place votes and 70 points in the poll. The Wildcats lost All-American Lindsay Harksen to graduation, but return All-NWC hitter Lauren Kreiger, along with setter Chelsey Gallatly. Linfield was 21-5 last year, losing in the second round of the NCAA tournament.

Pacific Lutheran University, NWC champions in 2004, finished third in the poll with 61 points. The Lutes hope to return to the top of the standings behind all-star setter Gina Di Maggio and middle blocker Katie McGinn.

Whitman College is fourth in the poll with 53 points, but also picked up the final two first-place votes. The Missionaries return nearly all their starting lineup from 2005, including honorable mention All-NWC selections Rosa Brey and Lydia Hayes.

Whitworth, the defending NWC champion who advanced to the regional final of the NCAA tournament, is fifth in the poll (43 points) and returns no starters from 2005. Of the many losses the Pirates suffered to graduation, none would be greater than 2005 NWC Player of the Year and First Team All-American Natalie Danielson.

After George Fox, Lewis & Clark College (31 points) placed seventh, but must replace leading hitter Audrey Dilling. Pacific University (19 points) is eighth in the poll after making solid strides last season and will rely on senior Megan Van Domelen. Willamette (18 points) was ninth in the poll and hopes the experience gained in 2005 will improve on last season's ninth-place finish.

The season begins for George Fox in the Puget Sound Invitational on September 1-2 in Tacoma, Wash. The Bruins play Whitman at 11 a.m. and Pacific Lutheran at 5 p.m. on Friday, and Puget Sound at 11 a.m. and the State University of New York-Brockport at 3 p.m. on Saturday. The team's first home match is Sept. 15 vs. Puget Sound in a conference match at 7 p.m.
