2013 WOMEN'S SOCCER COACHES



**CORY
HAND**
Head Coach

Cory Hand, the director of the Girls Youth Development Westside Timbers program and a staff member of the Portland Timbers Olympic Development Program, became the third coach in the 22-year history of women's soccer at George Fox when he was named to the post in January of 2013.

Hand replaced Andy Hetherington, who announced his resignation in November after 11 seasons. Byron Shenk, still an assistant athletic trainer at George Fox, initiated and coached the program during its first 11 years from 1991-2001.

After graduating from Wilsonville (Ore.) High School, Hand went to Whitworth University in 2001 before injuries ended his soccer-playing days. He attended Portland Community College from 2002-05, and began his coaching career during that time as the goalkeepers' coach at Wilsonville High. He also worked as a staff coach for Portland City United from 2001-06 before becoming a staff coach for the Westside Timbers Soccer Club, which he continues to do.

Hand worked at Horizon Christian School in Tualatin, Ore., from 2006-11, where he served as a middle school teacher for two years, a high school teacher for four, and started and coached the girls' soccer program. In six years, he created and developed Horizon Christian's team into one of the best in the state at the 1A/2A/3A level while being competing with teams at the higher levels. From 2009-11, the team made the state playoffs each year, and advanced to the quarterfinals in both 2010 and 2011. Many of his players went on to be recognized as First Team All-Conference and Conference Players of the Year.

This past year, Hand began his duties with the Portland Timbers' Olympic Development Regional Training Center. As both a licensed coach and personal trainer, he was a volunteer coach at the U.S. National Training Center in 2011, and has served as a personal trainer at Trinity Sports Soccer Camps from 2006-present.

Hand has conducted outreach soccer camps with Hispanic youth from 2005-present, worked with youth in Nicaragua in 2011, and for the past 3 1/2 years has trained both coaches and players in the African nation of Rwanda as a part of Play for Hope, a non-profit aimed at bringing professional-level coaching and hope to vulnerable children through soccer.

The program's outreach academy grew from 200 to over 800 in a year-and-a-half, with Hand serving on the academy's board of directors.

Hand was a volunteer leader for Young Life in Wilsonville from 2001-04, and was the student staff/area director of Young Life in Wilsonville from 2004-06. He earned his bachelor of science degree in Leadership in Ministry from Multnomah Bible College in 2012. He and his wife, the former Samara Thornburg, who played at George Fox from 1999-2000, attend Grace Chapel in Wilsonville and have a year-old son, Ezra.

"Coaching, for me, is more than just a game," says Hand. "It is a conduit to help young athletes understand and explore their God-given talents and abilities, to learn how to express those skills in life, and to disciple young people into spiritual maturity. George Fox, as a Christian institution, has the same values I have, with a desire to minister to students not just in their athletic pursuits but in every aspect of life, and I am excited about this new opportunity to pursue my passion for both soccer and discipleship at the college level."

"We are definitely excited about Cory joining our staff and about the next chapter in Bruin women's soccer with him on board," said George Fox director of athletics Craig Taylor. "His soccer credentials are impeccable, and he is a great fit with the values and mission of this institution. He is a high-energy person with an infectious enthusiasm for the game, and we are looking forward to what he can build with our program."

2013 MEN'S SOCCER COACHES



**LUIS
DEL RIO**
Head Coach

Luis Del Rio, who led Woodburn (Ore.) High School to Oregon 5A boys' soccer state championships in 2010 and 2011, begins his second year as the head coach of men's soccer at George Fox University with the goal of reviving a Bruins' program that has not posted a winning record since 2001.

Del Rio is the seventh coach in the history of George Fox men's soccer, which began in 1977, and led the Bruins to a 2-16-1 record in his first season. In the new coach's initial season. The Bruins' last winning record was a 10-7-1 mark in 2001 when they came in second in the Northwest Conference, but the program was very successful in the 1980's and 1990's, winning National Christian College Athletic Association national championships in 1988 and 1990 and participating in NAIA post-season playoffs seven times from 1988-98.

In three years as the coach at Woodburn, Del Rio led the Bulldogs to records of 16-2 in 2009, 17-1 in 2010, and 18-1 in 2011. Woodburn made the state playoffs each of those years, extending a state record of 25 consecutive post-season appearances. The Bulldogs won the 5A titles in the state's second-highest classification in 2010 and 2011, with Del Rio named the State Coach of the Year in 2010 and the Willamette Valley Coach of the Year, covering area schools in all six state levels, in 2011.

Del Rio got his start in coaching when his daughter took an interest in the sport, recalling that "my daughter began playing when she was around 10 years old and I helped her team out then, but the Woodburn Park and Rec season was so short, we decided to found a soccer club to give the young people even more instruction. We established the Woodburn Athletic Soccer Club, advertised for players, and got enough to form four teams. I worked with the U-11B Hawks team, and in our third year we reached the state cup finals, where we were the runner-up. After that, I worked with my son's U-10 Tigres team for four years, then my son played for the Atlas team that won a state champion-

ship. I also worked with the Westside Metros club team for a year before applying for and getting the Woodburn High job.

"I enjoy hard work, I love a challenge, and I saw the George Fox job as an opportunity to take the next step on the road to coaching at the highest level possible for me," declared Del Rio. "I want us to build a program that we can be proud of, and I believe we can be successful here with a beautiful facility, support from the administration and the community, and bringing in talented players. George Fox is committed to developing a good program, and I am willing to put in all my effort to develop a competitive soccer team here again. I want players who are versatile, who can play more than one position so that we have some flexibility in the lineup, and who will play hard every minute they are out there."

In announcing the hiring of Del Rio, director of athletics Craig Taylor commented that "Luis' success on the field and, more importantly, his commitment to the overall development of our student-athletes, makes him a great fit for George Fox University."

A native of Nayarit, Mexico, Del Rio attended the Conalep Technical Institute in Tijuana, Mexico, earning his degree in business administration in 1984. He also earned a degree in micro-electronics from Chemeketa Community College in 1999. He and his wife Brigida have three children: daughter Gillian and sons Luis Angel and Fernando Enrique. He enjoys fishing, exploring rivers, and hiking in the mountains with his children when he has occasional moments of spare time. He and his family are members of the St. Luke's Catholic Church in Woodburn.
