ABOUT GEORGE FOX COLLEGE

George Fox College is the outgrowth of a desire by early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers who established Pacific Academy in 1885 for the Christian education of their children. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. The College is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises more than 8,000 members in 57 churches in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho.

The 60-acre rural, tree-shaded campus a half-hour drive from Portland has undergone major expansion in the last eight years with nine new buildings constructed at a total investment of nearly \$10 million.

College enrollment is 600.

Accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools, the College offers 27 majors in six divisions: Education, Fine and Applied Arts, Language Arts, Natural Science, Religion, and Social Science. George Fox is one of 13 members of the national Christian College Consortium. The College has a student-faculty ratio of 15/1.

George Fox students come from 16 states and 4 foreign countries. Nearly 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

Alumni of the College are primarily in service-oriented vocations. The College's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

GFC ATHLETICS

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall education program at George Fox. Men's varsity athletic teams represent the College in baseball, basketball, track, cross country, and soccer. Women students compete in volleyball, basketball, track, softball, and cross country.

George Fox College competes as an independent on the varsity level. Its schedules are coordinated with the Northwest Conference and with other independents in the Northwest. George Fox is a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), District 2, and the National Christian College Athletic Association, Region 8.

For students not participating in the varsity program, GFC has a complete intramural program including flag football, basketball, and volleyball.

Athletic facilities include the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education; Colcord Field, which includes a football/soccer field and new all-weather rubberized track; and tennis courts. A new athletic field complex containing baseball diamond, two softball fields, soccer field, and archery range was completed in 1981.

Wheeler Center, completed in 1977 in a \$2.7 million project, includes the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium with three basketball courts and seating for up to 2,500; multipurpose, class, and weight rooms; faculty and administrative offices; handball courts; dressing and therapy rooms.

TONIGHT'S GAME

The official George Fox College Homecoming is not for another month, but for the Bruins and their fans the celebration starts tonight.

The nomadic Bruins, after 9 straight road games and 13 of their first 15 on the road, return to Miller Gym for the first time in six weeks.

But that doesn't mean it will be easy. In hosting Northwest Nazarene, the Bruins, atop the NAIA Division 2 East Division, meet the third-place team. The Crusaders are 1-0 in the division, just behind tomorrow night's Bruin foe, College of Idaho.

George Fox, 10-5 overall and 2-0 in division play, will try to extend its 19-game home winning string that covers three years. GFC won its last two home games in 1983-84, all 15 last season, and the first two this year in hosting an NAIA District 2 Tip-Off.

Northwest Nazarene comes to Miller Gym with a 9-7 record, 8-1 at home in Nampa, Idaho, and 1-6 on the road. Last season the two teams split, each winning at home, GFC taking a 70-64 win, and NNC a 106-97 victory.

The Crusaders this season are led by senior guard Robb Warwick, averaging 17.0 points a game, ninth in the district. He's second in district assists with a 6.3 average.

All-District and All-American Kenny Stone continues to pace the Bruins, averaging 20.1 points a game and 9.1 rebounds, with no other player in the district with a better combination. He also leads the Bruins in blocked shots, 48, and has 21 dunks.

Guard Toby Long, named East Division Player of the Week, leads GFC in field goal accuracy at 59.1 percent. He's averaging 15.1 points a contest, eleventh in district scoring. Long, Stone and forward Eric Lautenbach are fourth, fifth and sixth in district field goal accuracy, Lautenbach averaging 14.7 points a game on 57.7 accuracy, tied with Stone.

Forward Curtis Kimbrough tops the Bruins in assists—89 for a 5.9 per game average—fifth in the district, leads in steals with 54 and is second in GFC rebounding at 8.4, sixth best in the district.

Coach Mark Vernon's Bruins are averaging 83.2 points a game, 10.3 more than opponents. GFC leads the district in steals with 203, a 13.5 average, and is second in assists with a 21.1 average.

THE BRUIN NICKNAME

George Fox College is represented by the nickname and mascot "Bruin." But it's not always been so, even though it should have been.

The nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the College's predecessor) was established. The small cub was captured in the coast range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member. When it grew to adulthood it was kept in a pit in what is now known as Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum. When it deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling, so it was left sitting in a corner. Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues 99 years later. "Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag to athletic teams came into popularity with sports writers because of the College's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with a mascot "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat. Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students, and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

BRUINS PARTICIPATE IN NAIA DISTRICT 2

George Fox College men's athletic teams compete in District 2 of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). Fifteen teams currently make up the district, all but two within the state of Oregon.

This year marks a major change in district membership and organization. Four Hawaii teams have dropped from District 2 to form their own new district. And, in basketball, a new Columbia Basketball League has been created, involving all 15 colleges with organization into east and west divisions.

Members of the East Division are College of Idaho, Columbia Christian College, Concordia College, Eastern Oregon State College, George Fox College, Northwest Nazarene College, and Western Oregon State College.

West Division members are Lewis and Clark College, Linfield College, Oregon Institute of Technology, Pacific University, Southern Oregon State College, Warner Pacific College, Western Baptist College, and Willamette University.

The new alignment, established by district basketball coaches, creates a new way to reach post-season playoffs for the right to represent NAIA District 2 in the national NAIA championships.

With the changes the familiar, but somewhat complicated, "Sempert System" of team evaluation is abandoned. Now, the top four teams in each division will be cross-seeded with the top four from the other division. The top team in each division will play the fourth place squad in the other. Number two in one division will play number three in the other. Standings within each division will be

based solely upon the record with the other teams in the division. If there is a tie, overall NAIA District 2 records will be used to determine ranking. Host teams for the playoffs will be those with the best records.

George Fox College has been in the NAIA District 2 playoffs 11 of the last 15 years.
