Outlook

The Health Plan

The Bruins need to stay injury-free to improve in the 2002 cross country season.

With 10 runners on the women's squad and 8 on the men's team, the George Fox University Bruins will need to stay injury-free if they are to show improvement in the 2002 cross country season.

"We don't have a lot of margin for error," admits veteran coach Wes Cook, who begins his 16th year with the Bruins. "We recruited a lot of kids, but sometimes you don't get everyone you want. We don't have a lot of depth, just like last year, so we've got to stay healthy."

The Bruins return only 2 runners to the women's team that finished 7th in the Northwest Conference last fall, and 4 men to a team that placed 9th.

Women's Team

The Bruins lost 2 good ones in Kirsten Norgaard, who graduated, and Beth Moyer, a junior who is studying in England this semester. Both were All-West Region performers last year.

Picking up the slack will be **Janelle Goeres** (Jr., Gold Hill, Ore.), an All-Region runner 2 years ago who ran only a couple of races last year for health reasons. She should be among the top runners in the conference with added strength. **Ashley Crisell** (So., Woodburn, Ore.), who earned points in several races as a freshman, is the only other returnee.

The Bruins picked up 1 junior college recruit in **Gloria Gomez** (So., Victorville, Calif.) from Victor Valley Community College. "Her best time there was 20:42, so she will be a welcome addition," says Cook.

"Based just on talent, **Bethany Jertberg** (Fr., Klamath Falls, Ore.) is probably the best runner on the team,"

Cook observes. "She ran 2nd in the state track meet in the 15000 as a sophomore, but has been hurt the last 2 years. She still has some leg pains but is going to try it again, and will be a big help if she can stay pain-free."

Lauren Lewis (Fr., Shoreline, Wash.) and **Ashley Murray** (Fr., Vernonia, Ore.) are 2 rookies from whom Cook expects good things. "Lauren ran a 21:05 in high school, and Ashley has a 20:52," notes Cook. "Ashley was the fastest nonqualifier in the state 800 last year at her school's level and was All-State in cross country. She ran 2 races

in Australia this summer and did well, but she has had stress fractures in the past and is hurting a bit right now."

Rounding out the squad are **Susanne Cordner** (So., Independence, Ore.), a transfer from New York University, **Karissa Edwards** (Fr., Newberg, Ore.), **Nicole Hart** (Fr., Woodburn, Ore.), and **Nancy Kelly** (Cl., City, State). "Susanne hasn't run since her junior year in high school, and Karissa has run in no organized program ever," Cook notes, "but both are working hard and improving, however."

"We're still in a rebuilding stage, but

the girls could be on the way back if we stay healthy," Cook reiterates. "I can see us right in the middle of the pack if it goes well."

Men's Team

The Bruin men lost 3 key runners when Nathan Paisley and Forrest Towne graduated and Kris Clifton transferred, so it will be up to **Matt Burg** (Jr., Newberg, Ore.), the team's MVP, and Most Inspirational runner **Michael Owen** (Sr., Nashville, Tenn.) to lead the team. Another senior who missed all of last season, **Silas Towne** (Sr., Prineville, Ore.), is a welcome returnee.

"Burg and Towne have been hurt all summer, but they will be very important for us if they are healthy again," says Cook. "Owen is trying to build himself up for track in the spring and will not concentrate on his distance events as much, so he will probably only run cross country about every other week, looking ahead to the conference and regional championships."

Also back are **Rob Gaslin** (So., Tualatin, Ore.) and **Chris Kelley** (Jr., Newberg, Ore.), who have worked hard and shown improvement.

Cook points to **Mark Richeson** (Fr., Concord, Calif.) as someone could be a

key to the Bruins' fortunes this season, predicting that "Mark could be really, really good for us right away; he has tremendous untapped potential."

Colby Burrows (Fr., Olalla, Wash.) and **Phil Garrison** (Fr., Olympia, Wash.) have also shown some talent, but Garrison has had ongoing leg problems that could play a factor in the success of his season.

Summing up the men's chances for climbing in the conference standings this fall, Cook says that "if we can make it to the middle of the pack, we would be doing well, and there's no reason we can't if everything falls into place."

Coaches

Wes Cook

Head Coach

In his first 12 years as head coach of the George Fox University men's and women's cross country and track and field teams, Wes Cook turned the Bruins into a nationally recognized power in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The Bruins have not achieved quite the same level of recognition in their first 3 years as full-time members of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), but as Cook enters his 16th season at George Fox, it shouldn't be long before the Bruins are once again among the nation's elite.

All 4 programs under Cook's leadership regularly participated in NAIA national meets and often finished among the top 15 teams in the nation.

In 1992, following the men's 5th-place and women's 2nd-place finishes at the national meet, *Cross Country Express* magazine declared his cross country program best in the nation at the NAIA level.

In George Fox's final year in the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA), Cook's women's cross country team won the 1988 national title with a record score of 19.

Cook was named National Coach of the Year in women's cross country by the NCCAA in 1988 and the NAIA in 1992. In the West Coast region (NAIA Area I), he won Coach of the Year honors for men's cross country in 1990 and 1992. At the district and conference level, he has been named Coach of the Year 12 times, at least once in each sport he coaches, including Northwest Conference Women's Coach of the Year in track and field for guiding the team to the 2000 conference championship. In 1992-93, he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year for all women's sports.

Cook also was involved with the NAIA for several years as a national rater and served on the NAIA women's track and field games committee. Cook's athletes won 80 NAIA All-America awards and 53 NAIA All-America Scholar-Athlete awards.

In 1995, George Fox was the only school to put both men's and women's teams in the top 5 of the NAIA cross country



national meet team scholastic competition.

In the Bruins' 3 years in the NCAA, 3 athletes have earned All-America honors, while 5 cross country runners and 8 track and field athletes have been named Academic All-Americans. The 2000 women's track team had the 2nd-highest cumulative GPA (3.56) in the country and the men were 3rd (3.25), and the 2001 women's track team finished with the highest national GPA (3.95).

A Nebraska native, Cook rose to the rank of Eagle in the Boy Scouts of America before becoming a 4-time conference track scorer at the University of Northern Colorado. He set the UNC record in the 800 meters and helped the mile relay team to 4 consecutive conference titles. He was the national winner of the Holmes Award, given to the most outstanding senior in

Alpha Kappa Lambda, a national collegiate fraternity.

In 1961, he graduated from UNC with a degree in physical education and history, and earned a master of arts in teaching at Lewis & Clark College in 1975.

Cook served 26 years as a head coach at 5 high schools in 3 states. In 15 years at Gladstone (Ore.) High School, his track and cross country teams finished as state champion or runner-up 10 times. His boys' cross country team went undefeated for 51 straight dual meets, and he was named Oregon 2A (now 3A) High School Coach of the Year for all sports 3 times. In 1983, his son Toby set the Oregon 3A state record in the 1,500-meter race.

A member of the United States Track Coaches Association, Cook has served as president of the Oregon Track and Cross Country Coaches Association and the Oregon Association of The Athletics Congress (now U.S. Track and Field). Active in Fellowship of Christian Athletes and summer track and basketball camps, he has led 4 international tour teams and traveled to 15 countries. A frequent speaker at national clinics and seminars, he has also authored articles in various state and national publications.

Cook is associate professor of health and human performance at George Fox. He has 3 adult children: Tammy, Toby, and Brad.

John Mantalas

Assistant Coach



Former George Fox University All-Conference runner John Mantalas returns to his alma mater this year to serve as an assistant coach for both the cross country and track and field programs.

Mantalas, who hails from Gladstone, Ore., was a 2-time All-Northwest Conference performer in the 800 meter run, finishing 2nd in his sophomore year and 3rd in his junior season. As a senior, he earned Second Team All-Conference honors in cross country with an 11th-place finish. He twice qualified for the NCAA National Championships in the 4x800 meter relays, and placed 96th at the NCAA National Cross Country Championships in 1998.

Mantalas earned his bachelor's degree in fitness management in 2000 and an M.A.T. in secondary health and physical education in 2001. He currently serves as a substitute teacher for school systems in Newberg, Sherwood, Tualatin, and Tigard.
