1/25 – ACADEMIC ALL-CONFERENCE: Nine Bruins Named Men's Soccer Academic All-Northwest Conference

NEWBERG, Ore. – Nine members of the men's soccer team are among a total of 28 George Fox University athletes who have been named to the 2005 Academic All-Northwest Conference fall sports teams as announced by the league office recently.

Bruins who have been honored include **Matt Chang**, a sophomore defender from Bend, Ore.; **Ryan MacKenzie**, a sophomore defender from Redmond, Ore.; **Jon Maroni**, a sophomore defender from Redmond, Ore.; **Darrick Pope**, a sophomore defender / midfielder from Longview, Wash.; **Dan Potter**, a junior midfielder / forward from Medford, Ore.; **Kyle Putnam**, a sophomore goalkeeper from Bend, Ore.; **Joshua Smith**, a freshman midfielder / forward from Central Point, Ore.; **Bryce Warren**, a senior forward / goalkeeper from Spokane, Wash.; and **Brian Zaro**, a junior defender from Beaverton, Ore.

Chang is a Business Administration major with a 3.54 GPA. He appeared in 16 games this season with 10 starts, and had one assist on the Bruins' second goal of a 2-2 tie with Pacific.

MacKenzie is a Biology major with a 3.80 GPA. He played in 14 games, starting 13, and missed four games with an early-season injury. He scored his only goal on a penalty kick in the Bruins' 4-1 loss to Linfield. He was also named to the ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII College Division First Team.

Maroni is a Christian Ministries major with a 3.67 GPA. He started all 18 of the Bruins' games this season, scoring his lone goal in the Bruins' 2-1 setback at Whitman.

Pope is a Chemistry major with a 3.64 GPA. He appeared in two games, picking up an assist in the Bruins' 5-1 win at Cascade.

Potter is an Engineering major with a 3.84 GPA. He started all 18 games for the Bruins this season, and was fourth on the team with 15 shots. He scored his only goal as the game-winner in a 5-1 triumph at Cascade.

Putnam is a Business Administration major with a GPA of 3.91. He played in 13 games, all starts, missing five games in mid-season due to injury, and recorded 72 saves, fifth in the conference. His average of 5.54 saves per game ranked third in the NWC. He was named to the ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII College Division First Team as well.

Smith is an undeclared major with a 4.00 GPA. He appeared in 16 games this season, with 13 starts, and recorded one assist on the Bruins' only goal in a 2-1 setback against McMurry.

Warren is a Biology major with a 3.63 GPA. He played in 13 games with eight starts, including five at goalkeeper while regular keeper Kyle Putnam was injured. He posted 13 saves, and picked up the win in a 2-1 victory at Pacific.

Zaro is a Religion major with a 3.83 GPA. He played in 16 games, all starts, with one goal and one assist. He scored the first goal to start the Bruins off to a 501 win at Cascade, and assist on the second score in a 3-2 loss at Whitman. He was also named to the All-NWC Second Team.

All athletes who are on a sport's varsity roster and who have a cumulative grade point average of 3.50 or higher, no matter what year they are in school, receive Academic All-Conference honors.

11/10 – ALL-NWC: Bruin Defender Zaro Named to All-NWC Second Team

NEWBERG, Ore. – Despite a disappointing year in terms of wins and losses, the George Fox University men's soccer team battled hard throughout the 2005 season, and perhaps their most competitive player, defender Brian Zaro, has been rewarded for his efforts by being named to the All-Northwest Conference Second Team by a vote of the NWC coaches.

The Bruins scored only 13 goals during a 2-15-1 season, so defense had to be the team's strength, and Zaro was the key to a defensive effort that held opponents to two or fewer goals 12 times. A quick player with good instincts for the game, he rarely found himself out of place and could always be counted on to find the ball and stop an opponent's run toward the goal. He also found time to score one goal, the Bruins' first one in a 5-1 win over Cascade College, and had one assist on the Bruins' second goal in a 3-2 setback to Whitman College.

Zaro, a junior from Beaverton, Ore., and Westview High School, earned All-Conference Honorable Mention honors as a freshman when he stepped immediately into the lineup. During his sophomore season, he spent more time at midfield and scored two goals while tying for the team lead in assists with three. He has three goals and five assists for 11 career points.

Zaro was the only Bruin named to the All-NWC First, Second, and Honorable Mention squads. Kevin Murray of Pacific Lutheran University won Offensive Player of the Year honors, Todd Sabrowski of league champion Whitworth College was named Defensive Player of the Year, and Eric Watson of league runner-up Linfield College was voted Coach of the Year.

11/5 – LINFIELD 5, GEORGE FOX 0: Bruins Clawed by Wildcats as 2005 Season Comes to a Close

WEST SALEM, Ore. – Still hopeful of an at-large bid to the NCAA Division III National Men's Soccer Tournament, the Linfield College Wildcats did everything they could to impress the selection committee as they rained goal after goal on the George Fox University Bruins for a 5-0 win Saturday afternoon here at West Salem High School.

The contest, originally scheduled for the Linfield soccer field, was moved two days ago to West Salem's artificial turf due to extremely wet conditions on the field in McMinnville.

Offensively, Linfield took 23 shots, 13 of them on goal, and scored in almost every way possible. George Fox keeper Kyle Putnam did have 8 saves but couldn't catch the rest. Defensively, the Wildcats limited the Bruins, who have struggled to score all year, to 5 shots, 3 on goal. As a consequence, the Bruins were handed their 12th shutout setback of the season. Linfield keeper Grant Williams, with 3 saves, registered his 7th shutout and lowered his goals-against average to 0.67, equalling the second lowest in the school record book.

The Wildcats first got on the board at 23:05 when Nick Powers shot left to right after a long pass from Jason Wong and a short one from Kevin Popich. Tyler Lundy made it 2-0 when he headed in a pass from Mike Grabast at 24:42. It became 3-0 at the break when Chris Paradis lobbed a ball over a drawn-out Putnam 17 seconds before the half ended.

The Bruins added to their own demise when a George Fox defender inadvertently knocked in the ball while trying to clear out in front of the goal at 52:06 in the second half. The Wildcats closed out the scoring in more conventional style when Greg Schufft made a 10-yarder from the right side to the left corner after a pass from Wong at 72:15.

George Fox ends its season at 2-15-1 overall and 1-12-1 and in 8th place in the conference. Linfield, which will find out Sunday evening when bids are announced if it has qualified for post-season play, is now 11-4-4 overall and finished 2nd to Whitworth College in the league standings at 10-1-3.

11/4 – PUGET SOUND 1, GEORGE FOX 0: Bruins' Offensive Woes Continue as Loggers Take One-Goal Win

TACOMA, Wash. - Josh Hedrick drove through the George Fox University defense and beat Bruin keeper Kyle Putnam in the 33rd minute of the first half, and the University of Puget Sound Loggers hung on to defeat the visitors from Oregon 1-0 in a Northwest Conference men's soccer game Friday afternoon here on Peyton Field at Baker Stadium.

The two teams combined for 24 shots on the day, the Loggers with 17 and 9 on goal to 7 total and 5 on goal for the Bruins, but Hedrick's was the only one that was able to find the back of the net. It was his 5th of the season.

Logger keeper Brian Lawson made 5 saves in earning the shutout as UPS improved to 10-2-3 overall and 9-2-2 in the NWC. Putnam made 7 saves for the Bruins, who fell to 2-14-1 overall and 1-11-1 in the NWC. The Bruins' offensive struggles continued as they suffered their 11th shutout setback of the season, including their 5th 1-0 defeat, extending a team record.

Both teams wrap up the regular season tomorrow at 1:30 p.m. George Fox visits Linfield College in a tilt which was moved, due to wet field conditions at Linfield's soccer pitch, to West Salem (Ore.) High School. Puget Sound hosts Pacific University at 1:30 p.m.

11/3 – ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT: Bruins' MacKenzie and Putnam Named to Academic All-District Team

NEWBERG, Ore. – Defender Ryan MacKenzie and goalkeeper Kyle Putnam of George Fox University have been named to the ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA College Division Men's Soccer Academic All-District VIII Team as voted on by members of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

MacKenzie, a sophomore from Redmond, Ore., has appeared in 12 games with 11 starts for the 2-13-1 Bruins this season, anchoring the defensive back line. He missed four games early in the season due to some minor injuries. He has scored one goal this season, on a penalty kick against Linfield College. As a freshman, he was used extensively on offense the first half of the season and would up tied for second on the team in goals (4) and points (9). He has compiled a 3.80 grade point average as a pre-med major.

Putnam, a sophomore from Bend, Ore., missed five games in mid-season due to a shoulder injury but still ranks third in the Northwest Conference in saves per game (5.18) and fifth in total saves (59). He has appeared in 11 games, all starts. He posted a season-high 10 saves vs. Whitworth, equaling his career best. As a freshman, he led the NWC in saves (120) and saves per game (6.32), and had 10 saves in a game vs. Willamette. A business major, he has a grade point average of 3.82.

Both George Fox players, along with other members of the All-District team, are automatically submitted to the CoSIDA constituency for consideration for the Academic All-America Team. Joining MacKenzie and Putnam on the District VIII team are Trevor Osborne (D), Adam Loeffler (D), and Chris Johnson (F) of Whitworth College, Matt Davey (M) of the University of California-San Diego, Adam Jensen (M) and Alex Chursky (F) of Seattle University, David Epstein (M) of the University of Redlands, and Andy Willis (F) of Seattle Pacific University. District VIII of CoSIDA consists of institutions in Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, Arizona, California, and Hawaii.

The Academic All-America Teams program honors 816 male and female student-athletes annually who have succeeded at the highest level on the playing field and in the classroom. Individuals are selected through voting by CoSIDA, a 2,000-member organization consisting of sports public relations professionals for colleges and universities in the United States and Canada.

To be eligible, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by his/her sports information director. Since the program's inception in 1952, CoSIDA has bestowed Academic All-America honors on more than 14,000 student-athletes in Divisions I, II, III and the NAIA.

Now in its second season of sponsoring the Academic All-America Teams program, ESPN The Magazine – winner of the 2003 National Magazine Award for General Excellence – is a provocative and innovative sports publication. 10/29 – GEORGE FOX 2, PACIFIC 2 (2 OT): Bruins and Boxers Deadlock in Final GFU Home Game

NEWBERG, Ore. – They came into the game with identical records and tied in the Northwest Conference standings, and after 110 minutes, they were still that way as the visiting Pacific University Boxers and the George Fox University Bruins, in their final home game of the season, battled to a 2-2 standoff in men's soccer Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

After 41 minutes with plenty of action but no results, the Bruins finally broke the scoring ice on Ben Eichenberger's goal at 41:37 in the first half. Erich Hangartner's shot from the right corner of the keeper's box was stopped by Pacific's Jory Shene but not controlled, and Eichenberger followed up with his fourth goal of the season on a wide-open tap-in.

Danny Williams scored his sixth goal to knot it at 1-1 at the 52:44 mark of the second half, putting back a rebound off Bruin keeper Kyle Putnam, who had just deflected a shot by Todd Gienger. The tie was short-lived, however, as Erich Hangartner drilled home a shot from the right corner of the keeper's box after an assist from Matt Chang 22 seconds later, giving the Bruins a 2-1 lead. It was Hangartner's second score of the year.

Sean Healy's first goal of the season from 10 yards away, sending it right to left into the net after a pass from Williams, retied the game 2-2 at the 74:16 mark and eventually sent the game into overtime. Each team got three shots in the first overtime and two in the second. The Boxers had a goal nullified by an offside call early in the first extra period, and the Bruins missed a scoring opportunity midway through the same period when Garrett Blizzard's shot was blocked to Matt Chang, whose try skirted the left post by inches.

George Fox took 25 shots and Pacific 19, with each team taking 11 shots on goal. Each keeper, Shene for Pacific and Putnam for George Fox, had 9 saves. The Bruins took 8 corners to 6 for the Boxers.

Both teams are now 2-13-1 overall, 1-10-1 in the conference, and hit the road for games next Friday at 1:30 p.m., George Fox visiting the University of Puget Sound and Pacific traveling to Willamette University.

10/16 – WHITMAN 3, GEORGE FOX 2: Two Quick Strikes Early in 2nd Half Lift Missionaries by Bruins

WALLA WALLA, Wash. – A pair of goals 75 seconds apart early in the second half enabled the Whitman College Missionaries to overcome a 1-0 halftime deficit, sparking the Missionaries to a 3-2 win over the visiting George Fox University Bruins in Northwest Conference men's soccer action here Sunday afternoon.

The Bruins drew first blood in the match, scoring just past the midpoint of the first half at 22:46, when Garrett Blizzard put back a rebound off the crossbar. It was freshman Blizzard's third goal of the season, tying him for the team lead with Ben Eichenberger.

Whitman's offensive flurry began with 41:53 remaining in the second half when Cole Sherman skied over everyone and headed in Kirk Thorson's free kick from the left side. That goal proved crucial as George Fox's Jon Maroni notched his first goal of the season from the left side off a free kick from Brian Zaro with less than three minutes left in the game.

The Bruins out-shot the Missionaries 15-13 in the game and 8-5 in shots on goal. Whitman keeper Brett Axelrod finished with six saves, while Warren had two saves for the Bruins.

Both teams return to action Saturday, George Fox (2-11, NWC 1-8) hosting Pacific Lutheran University and Whitman (7-7, NWC 5-4) visiting Pacific University. Starting time for each game is 2:30 p.m.

10/8 – LINFIELD 4, GEORGE FOX 1: Wildcats Pile On Bruins in Second-Half Downpour

NEWBERG, Ore. – In the midst of a second-half downpour, the Linfield College Wildcats rained in a trio of goals to break open a close game and posted a 4-1 win over the George Fox University Bruins in Northwest Conference men's soccer action Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Each team had only one shot on goal in the first half, but the Wildcats cashed theirs in. Mike Grabast sent a cross from the right side into the middle near the top of the keeper's box to Tyler Lundy, who flicked the ball over to Kevin Popich. George Fox keeper Bryce Warren got a hand on Popich's line drive shot and deflected it upward, but not enough as the ball sailed just under the crossbar for a 1-0 Linfield lead 5:43 into the game. It was Popich's 3rd goal of the season.

A pair of quick goals in the second half put the Wildcats firmly in control. Chris Nicoletti notched his 2nd goal when he scored unassisted at 55:19, and Grabast hammered home his 2nd of the year at 58:36 with an assist from Chris Paradis.

George Fox finally got on the board at the 81:58 mark when Jon Johnson was fouled in the keeper's box just as he attempted a shot at a wide-open net, and Ryan MacKenzie converted the ensuing penalty kick with a drive into the right corner. Jason Wong got that one back, however, when he headed in a cross from Brice Lang for his 3rd goal of the season at the 88:25 mark.

The Bruins were held to only three shots, all on goal, by the Linfield defense, with keeper Grant Williams making two saves. The Wildcats were a model of efficiency, getting 13 shots total and converting four of their five on goal into scores. Warren, starting his second game in a row in place of injured regular Kyle Putnam, had one save for the Bruins. Linfield held a 7-0 advantage in corner kicks as well.

Both teams play again Sunday at 2:30 p.m., George Fox (2-8, NWC 1-5) hosting the University of Puget Sound and Linfield (5-3-3, NWC 4-0-2) welcoming Pacific Lutheran University.

10/1 – GEORGE FOX 2, PACIFIC 1: Offensive Breakthrough Nets Bruins 1st NWC Win over Boxers

FOREST GROVE, Ore. – Not only did the George Fox University Bruins finally break through for their first goal in Northwest Conference play after four games of being shut out this season, they got a second one in the 86th minute, courtesy of Ben Eichenberger, that led to their first league win, 2-1 over the Pacific University Boxers, Saturday afternoon here at Tom Reynolds Field.

Pacific took a 1-0 lead 16 minutes into the game when Derek Atta scored on a shot that bounced off the hands of George Fox keeper Bryce Warren and hit just inside the left post. Warren, a reserve goalkeeper last year who has played most of the time at forward this season, was starting in goal in place of Kyle Putnam for the first time this season.

Nine minutes later, the Bruins' Erich Hangartner scored his first goal of the season as he nailed a shot from 20 yards out past Pacific tender Jory Shene. 9/25 – PACIFIC LUTHERAN 6, GEORGE FOX 0: All-Out Offensive Assault Powers Lutes by Bruins

TACOMA, Wash. – Jay Pettit and Mike Ferguson scored two goals each and Derek Karamatic and Andrew Croft added one each as the Pacific Lutheran University Lutes put on an offensive show in a 6-0 win over the George Fox University Bruins in a Northwest Conference match Sunday afternoon on the PLU soccer field.

PLU dominated the game in every offensive category. The Lutes had 20 shots compared to George Fox's 5, and also tallied 10 more shots on goal (12-2) than the Bruins.

The second, assisted by Karamatic, found the bottom right side of the net from 25 yards out at the 49:37 point.

Karamatic converted his goal eight minutes later after receiving a short pass from Ferguson as he connected from the right side from 20 yards away. The Lutes' final goal came in the 80th minute when, after a shot by Ferguson was deflected by George Fox goalkeeper Kyle Putnam, Croft kicked the ball into the bottom left of the net from 10 yards inside the goal box.

NEWBERG, Ore. – Gaining a measure of 'payback' for their only Northwest Conference loss of 2004, the 14th-ranked Whitworth College Pirates got goals from Brett Kagawa and Chris Johnson and blanked the George Fox University Bruins 2-0 in men's soccer action Sunday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Whitworth went 12-1-1 in the NWC last season en route to the league championship, their only loss a 2-0 setback to the Bruins in Newberg. The Bruins were unable to pull off another upset this year, however, as the Pirates controlled the game offensively, taking 28 shots (15 on goal) while holding the home team to only 9 shots (5 on goal). Whitworth held a 7-3 edge in corner kicks as well.

With George Fox defender Jon Maroni closely guarding Whitworth's Niko Varlamos all game long, the 2004 NWC Offensive Player of the Year took only two shots, but his teammates picked up the slack. Kagawa broke a scoreless deadlock at the 29:11 mark in the first half when he deflected a sideline pass from Ali Seyedali with his head into the goal for his first score of the season. Johnson added an insurance goal, his second this year, at the 52:43 mark in the second half with an angled shot into the left corner of the net off a pass from the right side by Jonathan Carlson.

Scott Barnum posted 5 saves in goal for the Pirates, while Bruin keeper Kyle Putnam kept his team in the game with 10 saves, and his fellow defenders blocked 3 other Whitworth shots that might have gone in also.

Both teams play again Saturday. George Fox (1-5, NWC 0-2) visits Pacific Lutheran University while Whitworth (5-1, NWC 2-0) hosts Pacific University. Both games are at 2:30 p.m. following women's games at 12:00 noon.

That was all that was needed in a defensive struggle that saw the host Tigers get only eight shots on goal and the visiting Bruins only two. David Kuehn made two saves in recording his second shutout for the Tigers, while the Bruins' Putnam had seven saves.

George Fox dropped to 1-2 on the season and will play again Saturday at 2:00 p.m. (1:00 p.m. Pacific time) against McMurry University at SkySox Park in Colorado Springs. Colorado College will take on McMurry on Sunday.

8/31 – PREVIEW: Bruins' Hopes for Improvement Depending on Mix of Veterans and Rookies

NEWBERG, Ore. – If the George Fox University Bruins are to improve upon their men's soccer record of a year ago, veteran coach **Manfred Tschan** will have to depend upon a proper blend of returning veterans and talented but untested recruits to determine a winning formula.

"Our newcomers will definitely have to contribute some because of the losses we sustained by graduation," admits Tschan, "but the key people will be our returnees. Our juniors and seniors have stepped it up in fall practice and have shown good leadership, and I'm very pleased with that. If the new players can follow their lead, we have a chance to be a better team."

The 2004 Bruins went 5-12-2 overall and finished 7th in the Northwest Conference with a 4-9-1 league mark. Included in the season's victories were impressive wins over NCAA playoff-bound Colorado College and newly-crowned NWC champion Whitworth College. Eleven letterwinners and five starters from that team are gone, including leading scorer Craig Laughland (five goals, three assists) and defensive stalwart Chris Waters.

Defense

Defense is expected to be one of the Bruins' strong points this season, starting with goalkeeper **Kyle Putnam** (So., Bend, Ore. / Mountain View HS), who led the conference in saves (120) as a freshman. "Kyle worked hard in the off-season and has put on some muscle, and we expect him to be very solid this season," says Tschan. **Bryce Warren** (Sr., Spokane, Wash. / Lewis & Clark HS), a backup to Putnam last year, will fill in at keeper if needed but will play primarily as a forward this year.

The defensive line will be strengthened this season as **Ryan MacKenzie** (So., Redmond, Ore. / Redmond HS) moves into a full-time role as a defender. MacKenzie spent the first half of the '04 season up front and tied for second on the team in scoring (four goals, one assist), but defense is his forte. **Brian Zaro** (Jr., Beaverton, Ore. / Westview HS), who had two goals and three assists, also returns, with his enthusiastic style of play, on defense. Other candidates vying for back-row starting spots are returnee **Matt Chang** (So., Bend, Ore. / Mountain View HS) and newcomers **Joel Morgan** (Fr., Portland, Ore. / De La Salle North Catholic HS) and **Jon Johnson** (Fr., Portland, Ore. / Benson Polytech HS).

Midfield

Erich Hangartner (So., Central Point, Ore. / Crater HS), who had two goals and two assists last year, is ticketed for one of the two center midfield spots. "Erich reported for practice quicker and sharper and has been impressive," notes Tschan. **Wally Ward** (Sr., Kenai, Alaska / Kenai Central HS) has shown steady improvement over his career and could secure the other center mid position.

The outside midfield slots will likely be filled by returnees **Ben Eichenberger** (Sr., Tualatin, Ore. / Westside Christian HS) and **Jon Maroni** (So., Redmond, Ore. / Redmond HS), versatile athletes who can also fill in at defender if needed. Eichenberger had one goal and three assists last year, while Maroni, a part-time starter, had one assist.

Offense

In an effort to improve the scoring, Tschan is shifting **Dan Potter** (Jr., Medford, Ore. / South Medford HS) from midfield to forward to take advantage of his offensive skills. Potter tied MacKenzie for second on the team in scoring last year with four goals and an assist. Veterans **Greg Hoiland** (Jr., West Linn, Ore. / West Linn HS), who had two goals in a reserve role, and the much-improved **Christian Kofi** (Jr., Aloha, Ore. / Oca-Monrovia HS, Liberia) are also forward candidates.

Tschan has high hopes for rookie **Garrett Blizzard** (Fr., Las Vegas, Nev. / Bonanza HS), whom Tschan calls "the first out-and-out striker we've had in three years. He was the Male Athlete of the Year at a high school he didn't even attend; his private school didn't have sports, so he ran track and played soccer elsewhere!"

Joshua Smith (Fr., Central Point, Ore. / Crater HS) is another athlete who can play multiple positions, either forward or midfield. Forward **Jeong Pil Kim** (Fr., Gwang Ju City, South Korea / Bomoon HS) and defender **Jonathan Tamashiro** (Fr., Kahului, Hawaii / Maui HS) are upper classmen who are trying to win spots after sitting out the last year or two.

Summary

"The deciding factors for us in recent years have usually been teamwork, playing smart, and staying healthy," says Tschan, "and this year should be no different. I have no illusions about our team, talent-wise as compared to the top teams in the conference, but we are and will always be competitive. It is a matter of keeping focus, reading situations well, playing with energy, and concentrating on defense. If we do those things, we will give ourselves a chance to be in every game."
